BOLTON CLOSING IN ON PURDUE STOLEN BASE RECORD

- **Mike Bolton Jr.** stole his 60th career base during the Minnesota series and is now just nine shy of Dave Scheitlin's team record (71) that has stood since 1991. Bolton is just the fourth Boilermaker to reach the 60-steal plateau and among a group of seven Purdue players with three consecutive seasons of 10-plus steals.

WEEKEND ROTATION HELPS PURDUE WIN 3 STRAIGHT SERIES OPENERS, POST 18 CONSECUTIVE SCORELESS INNINGS

- Starting pitching is a big reason why the Boilermakers have been able to open Big Ten play at 5-4 despite a 6-12 rough patch overall dating back to March 10. Purdue has won the series opener of three consecutive Big Ten series for the first time since sweeping three straight series in 2018.
- **Khal Stephen, Jonathan Blackwell** and **Kyle Iwinski** teamed up to surrender just five runs on 14 hits over 19 1/3 innings vs. Northwestern. The trio's 14 strikeouts vs. two walks was among the most impressive accomplishments. They posted a combined 15 zeros.
- Stephen and Blackwell both kept Minnesota off the scoreboard in their outings in Minneapolis. Purdue won the series opener 3-0 and blanked the Gophers until the eighth inning in game 2. From the ninth inning April 4 vs. Evansville through the eighth inning April 8 at Minnesota, Purdue enjoyed a streak of 18 consecutive scoreless innings. It was the program's longest streak since a stretch of 22 straight vs. Valparaiso and Penn State in March 2019.
- The 2.33 ERA for the starting pitchers vs. Northwestern ranked as their second-best showing in a weekend series this season, trailing only the four-game set vs. Akron (2.08). It was Purdue's best starting pitcher ERA in a three-game series since 2022 vs. Illinois State (1.62) and the best mark in a three-game Big Ten series since 2018 vs. Michigan (1.65).
- Blackwell has worked at least five innings in each of his first eight starts as a Boilermaker. That's a rare feat that has not been achieved by a Purdue pitcher since 2017 and done only twice before (Gareth Stroh in 2017, Jordan Minch in 2014) in the program's Alexander Field era (since 2013). Coincidentally, each of the last three pitchers to do it have been lefties.

LONG BALLS ADDING UP FOR JARVIS

- **Jake Jarvis** went deep twice in the game 2 win at Minnesota, posting his second multi-homer game of the season and connecting for his second grand slam. With eight homers for the season, the lefthanded slugger now shares the team lead with **Paul Toetz**. Jarvis has hit six homers in his last 12 starts since March 10. His eight homers overall are the most by a Purdue lefty since Kyle Wood connected for 12 as an All-Big Ten honoree in 2016.
- The Boilermakers have two players with at least eight home runs for the second year in a row. **Cam Thompson** (13) and Troy Viola (8) did it last year. The two players with eight-plus homers is a feat Purdue has now accomplished in consecutive years for the first time since 1998 and 1999. Two Boilermakers with 10-plus homers is also a rare feat, previously achieved only three times since 1990 – 1993 (Mike Biltmeyer, Alfredo Suarez), 2003 (Daniel Underwood, Nick McIntyre) and 2008 (Dan Black, Ryne White).

COOK'S HISTORIC DEFENSIVE VERSATILITY DEMONSTRATED OVER 8-GAME STRETCH

- **Lukas Cook** is the first Boilermaker since at least the start of the 2001 season to start games at all four infield positions in a season. Remarkably, he did it in the span of just eight games from March 28 to April 9.
- Cook made his first start as a Boilermaker on March 28 at Indiana State, starting the game at second base and later moving to third base to begin the bottom of the fourth inning. Then in the span of just two weeks, he made his first five starts as a Boilermaker at five different positions. He was the designated hitter April 2 vs. Northwestern, first baseman April 4 vs. Evansville, third baseman April 8 at Minnesota and shortstop April 9 at Minnesota.
- Last season, **Cam Thompson** was the only Boilermaker to make multiple starts at two different field positions (excluding DH) – 37 at first base and 13 in right field. As an All-Big Ten at-large selection in 2019, Cole McKenzie was the last Boilermaker to make starts at four different field positions – all three outfield spots plus first base. Three players – Ryan Howe, Tyler Powers and Owen Jansen – also started games at three infield positions that season. Howe went on to start games at all four infield positions over the course of his career (2019-22).
- Before settling in as an All-Big Ten catcher as a junior in 2018, Nick Dalesandro was among the program's most versatile players in the field across his underclassman years. He started games at pitcher, catcher and all three outfield positions in 2016. The following year, it was catcher and all three outfield spots. Teammate Cody Strong made starts at four positions in 2016 (2B, 3B, LF, RF). Including DH, Jack Pichiotti made starts at five positions (C, 3B, LF, RF, DH) in 2015.

WALK-OFF EXCITEMENT RETURNS WITH COOK'S HEROICS

• **Lukas Cook's** walk-off home run in the 10th inning Sunday vs. Northwestern was the latest entry in the many chapters of walk-off thrillers the Boilermakers have authored in recent years. Cook joined **Evan Albrecht (2)**, **Cam Thompson (2)**, **CJ Valdez**, **Jake Stadler** and **Jake Parr** among active Boilermakers with a walk-off RBI. Thompson hit a walk-off home run vs. Longwood in March of last season and Purdue now has a walk-off homer in three straight years after going without one from 2007 to 2020.

• The nightcap of the doubleheader with Northwestern was the rubber game of the series after NU won the first game Sunday. Purdue has now won the rubber game of a traditional three-game Big Ten series at home in consecutive years after going 11 seasons without such a win from 2010 to 2021. The program had lost 13 consecutive (traditional) Big Ten rubber games at home during that stretch. A rubber game win vs. Illinois at Lambert Field on the final day of the 2009 regular season stood as the program's last such win at home for the longest time.

ELITE STRETCH ON THE MOUND TO OPEN BIG TEN PLAY

• **Khal Stephen, Aaron Suval** and **Jonathan Blackwell** teamed up for 13 innings of one-run ball over the first half of the Michigan State series, accounting for a combined 12 zeros from the third inning of game 1 through the sixth inning of game 2. Considering it came on the road against a potent lineup that scored 16 runs over the final 10 innings of the series, it certainly ranks as Purdue's finest stretch of the season on the mound.

• Friday in East Lansing, the Boilermakers overcame a four-run deficit of its own for the first time since an 11-inning win vs. Longwood in the finale of the eight-game North Carolina road trip last season. Purdue did it in conference play for the first time since the 2021 season finale vs. Minnesota.

• The 13 innings of one-run ball is a feat the Boilermakers have now accomplished five times under head coach Greg Goff (2020-present). Purdue did it twice last year and also achieved a stretch of 15 innings of one-run ball vs. Michigan State in 2021. **Calvin Schapira** led the way in 2021 with eight innings of one-run ball in a 2-1 pitcher's duel Purdue won on an 11th-inning walk-off in Champaign.

• In the Akron series the first weekend of March, **Kyle Iwinski's** seven-inning complete-game shutout buoyed a stretch in which Purdue had 10 consecutive scoreless innings and allowed just two runs over 14 frames.
