STORY LINES

- After the first road trip of the season, Purdue Football returns home for a Homecoming matchup against Nebraska to begin Big Ten play. Kickoff is set for noon from a sold-out Ross-Ade Stadium.
- · Saturday's contest is the only home contest over a four-game stretch that began last week in Corvallis.
- The Boilermakers are 54-43-4 in Homecoming games with Saturday marking the 102nd edition.
- Last season against Nebraska (Oct. 28, 2023), Kydran Jenkins recorded a career-high 4.5 TFLs, the most by a Boilermaker since 2017. Jenkins also added a 55-yard fumble recovery for his first career touchdown.
- Also in last year's matchup, Dillon Thieneman and Cole Brevard tied single-game school records. Thieneman forced two fumbles, while Brevard recovered a pair of fumbles.
- The Boilermakers won the previous matchup with the Cornhuskers at Ross-Ade Stadium, a 43-37 victory behind a career-high 178 yards from Devin Mockobee (Oct. 15, 2022). Purdue tied a school record with 38 first downs.
- Kydran Jenkins leads the Big Ten in sacks (1.17 per game) and ranks seventh nationally. The senior linebacker also ranks second in the conference and 10th in the country with 1.8 tackles-for-loss per game.
- Jenkins is coming off a career game at Oregon State, recording a personal-best 16 tackles and matching his career high with a pair of sacks. Through three games, he leads Purdue in tackles (27), TFLs (5.5) and sacks (3.5).
- Recording 168 yards on the ground at Oregon State, junior Devin Mockobee recorded his seventh career 100-yard rushing game. Mockobee became just the ninth Boilermaker to produce seven 100-yard rushing games, the first since Kory Sheets (2005-08).
- Mockobee averages 7.67 yards per carry this season, ranking eighth nationally.
- Purdue boasts the nation's ninth-best passing defense, allowing only 123.3 yards per game through the air. The Boilermakers have only allowed two touchdown passes by opposing quarterbacks this season.
- · Tight end Max Klare leads the Boilermakers in receptions (10), receiving yards (153) and receiving touchdowns (2). Klare's receptions and yards are double his nearest teammate.
- · Purdue is one of six Big Ten teams to win at least 15 conference games over the past three seasons (lowa, Michigan, Ohio State, Penn State, Wisconsin), The Boilermakers finished second in the Big Ten West in 2021 before capturing the Big Ten West title in 2022. Last season, Purdue tied for fourth in the final year of divisional play.
- Sharing time in the backfield, the duo of Mockobee and Reggie Love III combine to average 147 rushing yards per game (Mockobee - 92.0 vpg, Love - 55.0 vpg).
- Sophomore Will Heldt has recorded a TFL in each game this season, bringing his season total to 4.0, Heldt also has 2.5 sacks to rank second on the team in both categories.
- Purdue has produced four All-Americans over the past three seasons (Dillon Thieneman 2023, Charlie Jones -2022, David Bell - 2021, George Karlaftis - 2021), the most in a three-year stretch since 1967-69.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Purdue has scored 11 touchdowns through three games but is one of only two teams (Navy) that has not attempted a field goal this season.

With two sacks at Oregon State, Kydran Jenkins became just the eighth Boilermaker in program history to record 20 career sacks.

Purdue is averaging 230.5 yards per game on the ground over the past six games, dating back to last season.

With a season-high 168 yards at Oregon State, Devin Mockobee eclipsed 2,000 career rushing yards, becoming the 14th Boilermaker to reach that number.

PURDUE FOOTBALL IS BACK

- The Boilermakers kicked off their 137th season of football in 2024 with a 49-0 shut out victory of Indiana State.
- Ross-Ade Stadium has been Purdue's home for 100 seasons, marking the 2024 campaign as the 101st full season; Ross-Ade will turn 100 years old on November 22 when the Boilermakers play at Michigan State.
- Purdue closed out the 1924 season with its first game at Ross-Ade, a 26-7 Homecoming win over Indiana (Nov. 22, 1924).

YEAR 2 OF THE WALTERS ERA

- Ryan Walters is in his second campaign in West Lafayette.
- The three pillars of Walters' program: Competitive, Tough, Disciplined.
- Known as a players' coach, Walters has established a culture in which everyone in the program feels like family.
- Hired at age 36 after being named the 2022, 0n3 Coordinator of the Year Walters, now 38, is one of the youngest coaches in college football - the fourth youngest among the Power 4 conferences (Kenny Dillingham - 34, Dan Lanning - 38, Sherrone Moore - 38).
- Despite the record not being what Walters and Purdue wanted, facing one of the toughest schedules in the country, there were several positives the Boilermakers could take away from Walters' first year in West Lafayette to build off of heading into the 2024 season.
- Purdue brought in a consensus top-10 transfer class this offseason.

DIFFICULT SCHEDULE

- A season ago, Purdue did not face a team with a losing record at the time of the game until battling Indiana for the Old Oaken Bucket in the season finale. This year's schedule may be even tougher.
- Purdue's schedule was ranked the 11th hardest in the nation by ESPN's Football Power Index, fourth by College Football News, seventh by College Football Network and sixth by Sports Grid.
- Four preseason Top 10 teams appear on the Boilermakers' 2024 schedule: No. 2 Ohio State (Nov. 9), No. 3 Oregon (Oct. 18), No. 7 Notre Dame (Sept. 14) and No. 8 Penn State (Nov. 16).
- No other team in the country plays more Top 10 teams than Purdue. Only Florida matched the Boilermakers with four Top 10 opponents.
- Three of the Top 10 matchups are at home, as Purdue hosts Notre Dame, Oregon and Penn State at Ross-Ade Stadium.

JACKPOT 7-7-7

- In the 49-0 victory over Indiana State, all seven of Purdue's touchdowns were scored by different Boilermakers.
- The seven Boilermakers that scored (Elijah Jackson, Max Klare, Reggie Love III, Jaheim Merriweather, De'Nylon Morrissette, Leland Smith, Jaron Tibbs) all found the end zone for the first time in a Purdue uniform.
- Before the 2024 season opener, the last time seven different Boilermakers scored a TD in a game: vs. Eastern Michigan, Sept. 15, 2012.
- Will Heldt and Antonio Stevens led Purdue with seven tackles apiece, both career highs.
- Making his collegiate debut, freshman kicker Spencer Porath was a perfect 7-for-7 on PATs.

MISSING BULLDOGS-TURNED-BOILERS

- Purdue has been without two of its highest-ranked transfers to start the season.
- Nyland Green, the No. 7 rated transfer and highest ranked cornerback in the portal according to 247Sports, was expected to make an immediate impact to the Purdue secondary before suffering an injury in fall camp.
- Wide receiver CJ Smith, one of four Boilermakers to transfer from Georgia, was injured in fall camp.

HOMECOMING HISTORY

TEAM NOTES

- Saturday's game will be Purdue's 102nd Homecoming game.
- The Boilermakers are 54-43-4 in Homecoming contests.
- After losing six straight Homecoming games from 2012-17,
 Purdue has won four of the past six.
- Last season, Ryan Walters and the Boilermakers dominated his former squad with a 44-19 Homecoming victory over Illinois.
- Purdue hosts Nebraska for Homecoming for the first time.
 The Cornhuskers become the Boilermakers' 17th different
 Homecoming opponent throughout history. Wisconsin is
 Purdue's most common Homecoming opponent (21 matchups).

KJ IN LINCOLI

- A season ago, Kydran Jenkins had arguably the best game of his career at Nebraska (Oct. 28, 2023).
- Jenkins recorded career highs in TFLs (4.5) and sacks (2.0) while forcing a fumble and returning it 55 yards for his first career touchdown.
- The 4.5 TFLs against Nebraska were the most by a Boilermaker since Gelen Robinson recorded 5.5 TFLs against Nebraska exactly six years to the day (Oct. 28, 2017).

SHUT DOWN THE SYCAMORES

- The Boilermakers dominated on all sides of the ball against Indiana State in a 49-0 shutout, Purdue's first in a season opener since winning 51-0 over Syracuse in 2004.
- Ryan Walters became the fastest Purdue coach to record a shutout (13 games) since Jim Young in 1977 (9).
- The 59,488 in attendance at Ross-Ade Stadium was the highest tally for a season opener since 2005.
- Twenty-five different Boilermakers set new career highs in the season opener against Indiana State (10 offense, 13 defense, 2 special teams).
- Three Boilermakers made their first career starts, five made their first starts as a Boilermaker, 21 appeared in a game for the first time in their careers and nine suited up for Purdue for the first time.

STARTING THEM YOUNG

- True freshmen Tarrion Grant and Shamar Rigby turned heads during preseason camp to earn starting spots on opening day.
- Grant and Rigby joined Dillon Thieneman, George Karlaftis, Jalen Graham and Ja'Whaun Bentley as the only true freshmen to start week one for the Boilermakers in the 21st Century.
- They were the first rookie duo to start together since Karlaftis and Graham suited up in 2019.
- Based on in-depth research, Rigby is the first offensive player to start a season opener for Purdue in over 25 years.

RECAP OF 2023

- Purdue's first 11 opponents on its 12-game 2023 schedule did not have a losing record at the time of their matchup against the Boilermakers, resulting in one of the nation's most difficult schedules
- The Boilermakers battled throughout the season to finish tied for fourth in the Big Ten West, while winning both rivalry games (Indiana - Old Oaken Bucket), Illinois - Cannon Trophy) for the third straight season.
- In Walters' debut season guiding the Old Gold and Black, Purdue found success in all three phases of the game. The offense led the Big Ten in rushing in conference contests, averaging 184.6 yards per game. Purdue's defense recorded 35 sacks, the most since 2004 and the third-most in program history, and the special teams unit averaged 24.2 yards per kickoff return, Purdue's best since 2004 and the fourth-most all-time.
- Individually, Dillon Thieneman became an All-American (Third Team – AP) and was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after setting school records for interceptions (6) and solo tackles (74) by a freshman.

ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- Saturday will be the 13th meeting in the series history between Purdue and Nebraska, dating back to 1958 when the Boilermakers blanked the Cornhuskers 28-0 in West Lafavette.
- Purdue has rolled recently with four wins in the last six contacts.
- Devin Mockobee set his career high with 178 yards on the ground during the 2022 matchup, setting the Boilermaker freshman single-game record.

OUR LAST MATCHUP VS. NEBRASKA

- In cold and blustery conditions, Purdue's defense forced four turnovers, scored on a fumble recovery and allowed just 277 yards of total offense, but an early Nebraska lead proved too much to overcome in a 31-14 loss on the road.
- Dillon Thieneman paced the Boilermakers on the defensive end racking up 12 tackles.
- Thieneman forced a pair of fumbles for his fourth and fifth takeaways of the year. The first came in the third quarter when he stripped Nebraska quarterback Heinrich Haarberg at the Huskers' 13-yard line. He stonewalled Haarberg again in the fourth at the Nebraska 24-yard line. Cole Brevard came away with the ball both times.
- Dillon Thieneman and Cole Brevard matched single-game school records with two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, respectively.

BEST GROUND GAME IN THE BIG TEN

- Last season, Purdue's ground game was the best in the Big Ten in league games with 184.6 rushing yards per game.
- The Boilermakers tallied 300 yards on the ground in back-toback weeks (353 vs. Minnesota, 303 at Northwestern), a first for Purdue since 1968.
- It marked just the fifth and sixth times Purdue recorded over 300 yards rushing in a Big Ten game since 1996. Both were the lone 300-yard games in the Big Ten last season.
- Purdue was the only school in the 14-team league to have two running backs rush for more than 500 yards in Big Ten games (Devin Mockobee - 625 yards, Tyrone Tracy Jr. - 624 yards).
- Purdue's 2,029 yards on the ground were the most in a season since 2012.

SUCCESS ON THE GROUND

- Through the past six games, dating back to last season, Purdue has averaged 230.5 yards per game on the ground.
- In the first road game of the year, the Boilermakers rushed for a season-high 263 yards for the third most under head coach Ryan Walters.
- Devin Mockobee and Reggie Love III have led the way, combining to average 1470 yards per game splitting time in the backfield. Mockobee's 92.0 ypg ranks eighth in the Big Ten, while Love's 55.0 ypg is good enough for 20th.
- The Boilermakers opened the season with 248 yards rushing on the ground, third most on opening weekend by a Big Ten team
- Three different Boilermakers found the end zone on the ground against the Sycamores, including Elijah Jackson's 69-yard score, Purdue's longest rushing score since Rondale Moore's 74-yard scamper against Northwestern in 2018.

HERE COMES THE MOCK TRAIN

- From walk-on to phenom, Devin Mockobee has certainly made a name for himself in his time in West Lafayette.
- With a season-high 168 rushing yards at Oregon State,
 Mockobee became the ninth Boilermaker to produce at least seven 100-yard rushing games over a career and the first since Kory Sheets (2005-08) recorded nine over his career.
- He also became the sixth Boilermaker since 1996 to record a 100-yard rushing game in three separate seasons.
- Breaking open a 63-yard rush against the Beavers, he eclipsed 2,000 rushing yards for his career to move into 14th on Purdue's all-time rushing list.
- Mockobee also sits in a tie for 12th with 16 rushing touchdowns.
- He started his career by setting a new Purdue freshman record with 968 rushing yards while also adding nine touchdowns.
- After being put on scholarship in the first official act of the Walters era, he led the team in rushing once again with 807 yards and six touchdowns in 2023.
- In doing so, Mockobee became the first Boilermaker to lead the team in rushing in back-to-back seasons since Markell Jones, who did it three years running (2015-17).
- The Boonville, Ind., native is one of only four Big Ten players to rush for more than 800 yards in each of the past two seasons.

MAD MAX

- Max Klare has not missed a beat since he returned to the lineup at the start of the season.
- The sophomore tight end leads Purdue in receptions (10), receiving yards (153) and receiving touchdowns (2).
- His reception and yardage totals are double his nearest teammate, proving to be a primary target for quarterback Hudson Card.
- Klare was on pace to be one of the best tight ends in the country before his 2023 season was cut short. However, the sophomore bounced back in the 2024 season opener with five catches for 71 yards, both team highs.
- Klare also caught Purdue's first touchdown of the season, a 9-yard strike from Card on the opening drive.
- Klare was also tabbed to the Comeback Player of the Year Award Watch List ahead of the year.

HUDDY TUDDY

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Quarterback Hudson Card started his senior season by etching his name in the NCAA record books, completing 24-of-25 passes in the win over Indiana State.
- Completing 96 percent of his attempts, Card tied the FBS record for completion percentage in a single game (min. 20 completions), matching Greyson Lambert (Georgia) in 2015 against South Carolina.
- Card set a new school record, passing Kyle Orton's old mark of 88.5% set against Ball State in 2004.
- The Austin, Texas, native finished his day with 273 yards and a career-high four touchdowns, playing just a little more than one half of football.

SMITH'S STATEMENT

- One of the newest Boilermakers, sophomore wide receiver Leland Smith made a statement in his debut donning the Old Gold & Black.
- Smith caught a pair of passes in the season opener, including a spectacular 31-yard touchdown for his first TD as a Rollermaker.
- In the fourth quarter, he showcased his versatility by blocking a punt on special teams. It was the first blocked punt by a Boilermaker since Jackson Anthrop did it in 2021 against Nebraska

THE ADMIRAL

- Gus "The Admiral" Hartwig once again leads the Purdue front line in his fifth year starting for the Boilermakers.
- The four-time All-Big Ten honorable mention honoree has played in 42 games, starting 39. He first start came at right guard against Minnesota during his freshman season in 2020.
- He was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List each of the last three seasons, a trophy presented annually to the most outstanding center in college football.
- A cerebral leader at the heart of the offense, he has been named Academic All-Big Ten three times and is also a member of the NFF Hampshire Honor Society.
- He finished as a Campbell Trophy Semifinalist in 2023.
- · Hartwig graduated with a bachelor's in Finance with honors and is now working on his master's in Global Supply Chain Management.

THREE-STRAIGHT AT ROSS-ADE

- With the win over Indiana State, Purdue posted a home winning streak of three games, dating back to last season.
- The Boilermakers' offense found its groove in its final two home games during the 2023 season with a 49-30 win over Minnesota and a 35-31 come-from-behind victory to retain the Old Oaken Bucket against Indiana.
- Purdue tallied over 450 yards of total offense over three home games, including a 604-yard outing against Minnesota.
- Hudson Card threw for over 250 yards in each game, combining for 799 yards, 10 touchdowns and no interceptions.
- Purdue's ground game tallied 779 yards, averaging 260 per contest. Devin Mockobee led the rushing attack with 95 yards per game, including his sixth career rushing 100-yard performance against Minnesota last season.
- Purdue committed just one turnover in those home contests.







DEFENSIVE / SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

THE NO NAME DEFENSE

- When asked at his introductory press conference if his defense had a name, head coach Ryan Walters responded, "It's so unique that there's really no name for it yet."
- Walters' a proven defensive guru, as well as current defensive coordinator Kevin Kane, unleashed a versatile defensive scheme that aims to get even better in 2024.
- It starts with three down linemen at 290 pounds and over, backed up by a fierce RUSH END and linebacker corps, followed by a ball-hawking secondary featuring a single-high safety.

TACKLES-4-LOSS

- One of the major anchors of the defense is senior Kydran Jenkins (KAY-dran), who ranks eighth in Purdue history with 20.0 career sacks and 13th with 37.0 tackles-for-loss.
- The senior linebacker leads the Boilermakers in tackles (27),
 TFLs (5.5) and sacks (3.5) through the first three games of the season.
- Jenkins' 1.17 sacks per game tops the Big Ten and ranks seventh nationally, while his 1.8 TFLs per contest is good enough for second among Big Ten defenders and 10th nationwide.
- Jenkins had a huge game against Oregon State, recording a career-high 16 tackles to go along with 3.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks.
 With his second sacks of the contest, he became the eighth Boilermaker in program history to make 20 career sacks.
- As a junior, Jenkins finished second in the Big Ten in tacklesfor-loss with 15.5 on the year, ranking 18th in the country and the most by a Boilermaker since George Karlaftis in 2019 (170).
- He garnered All-Big Ten Honorable Mention for the second straight year in 2023.
- A versatile player, Jenkins moved from RUSH END to middle linebacker ahead of the 2024 campaign, a position he played in high school and a spot the coaching staff believed would do more to impress NFL scouts.

NO-FLY ZONE

- Purdue ranks ninth nationally in pass defense, allowing only 123.3 yards per game.
- The Boilermakers have only allowed 33 completions through the first 3 games, the second fewest in the country.
- Ryan Walters' defense has surrendered only two passing touchdowns on the year, zero coming from starting quarterbacks.

HIGHWAY TO HELDT

- After recording only 12 tackles throughout his freshman season, sophomore rush end Will Heldt has made 16 tackles in the first three games of the 2024 campaign.
- Heldt started the season with a team-high seven tackles, 3.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks in the win over Indiana State.
 Prior to the season opener, Heldt's career high in tackles were two
- Heldt ranks second on the team in sacks (2.5) and TFLs (4.0) as his averages rank third and fifth in the Big Ten, respectively.
- He has recorded a TFL in each of the first three games of the season.

SEASON-OPENING DOMINANCE

- After their Week 1 game against Indiana State, Purdue led the Big Ten in scoring defense (0), opponent 3rd down% (8.3%), passing yards allowed (50) and TFLs (11.0).
- Holding the Sycamores to 50 passing yards marked the first time Purdue limited the opposition to 50 passing yards or less since 2019 (Illinois 26 yards).
- Purdue's defense racked up 11 tackles-for-loss against Indiana State in the season opener.
- It was the first time since the 2014 matchup against Notre Dame that the Boilermakers had four different players earn multiple TFLs in the same game.
- Will Heldt (3.0) and Damarjhe Lewis (2.0) both set new career highs in the contest.

"THE MOST FEARED DEFENSIVE BACK IN THE COUNTRY"

- Dillon Thieneman is one of the best defensive backs in the nation. Period.
- David Hale of ESPN wrote that, "Dillon Thieneman might be the most feared defensive back in the country."
- Thieneman has 11 tackles, eight solos, and one sack on the year.
- The Westfield, Ind., native added punt returning to his repertoire this season and ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 9.7 yards per return.
- The sophomore was tabbed Third Team All-America, the FWAA Defensive Freshman of the Year and Thompson-Randle El Big Ten Freshman of the Year.
- Thieneman racked up five Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors, becoming the first defender in conference history to win any weekly award five times in a single season.
- He ranked third nationally in interceptions (6) and solo tackles (74), leading all freshmen and setting new Purdue freshman records. His solo tackle record passed Rod Woodson's mark of 67 that stood since 1983.
- He became the first Purdue freshman to record multiple double-digit tackle games since Ja'Whaun Bentley (New England Patriots)
- Thieneman was the No. 83-ranked player in EA College Football 25 with an overall rating of 90.
- The Westfield, Ind., native also garnered a spot on Bruce Feldman's 'Freaks List', checking in at No. 96. Since his arrival on campus, Thieneman has put on 11 pounds of muscle, trimmed body fat and added to his already ridiculous speed.

CREATING NEGATIVE PLAYS

- The Boilermakers have one of the top units in the Big Ten to create negative plays on the defensive side of the ball.
- Purdue ranks third in the league with seven stops behind the line per game. The Boilermakers have 21 tackles-for-loss.
- The Boilermakers are one of three Big Ten teams (Iowa and Michigan State) with four different players recording 2.5 tackles-for-loss or more (Kydran Jenkins, Will Heldt, Shitta Sillah and Damarjhe Lewis).
- All four players rank in the top 25 of the Big Ten in stops behind the line.

ANOTHER AUSSIE

- Keelan Crimmins has quickly become Purdue's most reliable punter in at least seven seasons.
- Crimmins is second in the Big Ten and ranks 12th nationally with a 46.2-yard average.
- Against Notre Dame, Crimmins punted 10 times for a 47.3-yard clip with a pair of balls over 50 yards and three inside the 20-yard line.
- It was only the 6th time a Big Ten punter averaged over 47 yards when punting 10 times. Iowa has three of them.
- · His career-long 64-yard kick against the Irish was just the 20th ball of 64 or more yards by Purdue punter since 1996.
- He tallied a 46.7-yard average against Indiana State on three boots.
- The Aussie was the No. 3-ranked punter by ProKick Australia.
- · He played cricket and high level Australian Rules Football.
- Crimmins is the second straight Purdue punter from Australia, joining Jack Ansell (2021-23), who also wore No. 30.

TACKLES BY TONE

- After battling injuries to start his career, Antonio Stevens has cemented his spot in the starting lineup on defense, following time on special teams during his first three seasons.
- After ranking sixth in the Big Ten in tackles through two games,
 Stevens sits 18th in the league with 6.0 per game.
- Through three games, Stevens has 18 tackles. He had 25 in his first four years at Purdue.
- The Nashville native recorded a career-high eight tackles against Notre Dame, after a team-high seven stops against Indiana State in the season opener.

in his second season as head coach of the Boilermakers. Walters was announced as the 37th head coach in Purdue Football history on Dec. 13,

During his first season at Purdue, Walters and the Boilermakers faced one of the toughest schedules in the country. As the Boilermakers prepared to play Northwestern in their 11th game of the season, all 11 teams on Purdue's schedule up to that point, including the Wildcats, did not have a losing record. Despite the gauntlet, Purdue tied for fourth in the Big Ten West and won both rivalry games to keep possession of the Cannon Trophy (Illinois) and the Old Oaken Bucket (Indiana) for the third straight season.

In Walters' debut season guiding the Old Gold and Black, Purdue found success in all three phases of the game. The offense led the Big Ten in rushing in conference contests, averaging 184.6 yards per game. That included the Boilermakers rushing for more than 300 yards in back-to-back games for the first time since 1968. The 2,029 rushing yards were the most since 2012, while Purdue became the only team in the Big Ten with two running backs eclipsing 500 yards in conference games (Devin Mockobee 625, Tyrone Tracy Jr. - 624). Purdue joined national champion Michigan as the only two teams to score seven touchdowns in a Big Ten contest.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Boilermakers recorded 35 sacks, the most since 2004 and the third-most in program history. Individually, Dillon Thieneman became an All-American (Third Team - AP) and was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after setting school records for interceptions (6) and solo tackles (74) by a freshman; both marks ranked third nationally by any defender in college football throughout the 2023 campaign. In Walters' defense, the duo of Nic Scourton and Kydran Jenkins had more sacks and TFLs than any other teammates in the conference, as both Boilermakers cracked the Big Ten's Top 3 in both categories.

The 2023 special teams unit averaged 24.2 yards per kickoff return, Purdue's best since 2004 and the fourth-most all-time. Tracy returned a kick 98 yards for a touchdown in the season opener, the first by a Boilermaker since 2013, while ranking second in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in kick return average (25.5).

Walters brought energy and excitement to Purdue Football, as season tickets nearly reached 40,000 and broke the 30,000 mark for the first time since 2007. The Ross-Ade Brigade, Purdue's student section, sold out season tickets for the first time in five years. Ross-Ade Stadium averaged 58,249 fans at each home game, the highest average attendance since 2007.

Hired at age 36 after spending two seasons as Illinois' defensive coordinator and creating the nation's No. 1 scoring defense (12.3 ppg in 2022), Walters became the fourth-youngest coach in the Power 5 conferences behind Kenny Dillingham (32-Arizona State), Kane Wommack (35-South Alabama) and Dan Lanning (36-Oregon) and eighth youngest in

Walters elevated Illinois' defensive unit from the back of the pack into one of the nation's elite in just two seasons. Following the 2020 season, in which the Fighting Illini ranked 97th nationally in scoring defense (34.9) and 114th in yards allowed per game (466.8), Walters' first year in Champaign saw his side of the ball rise to 29th (21.9) and 49th (367.0), respectively. In 2022, the results were shown nationwide as Illinois went into the bowl schedule No. 1 nationally in scoring defense (12.3) and No. 2 in yards allowed per game

Considered one of the nation's fastest rising young coaches, Ryan Walters is A former safety at Colorado (2004-08), Walters tutored two of the nation's top defensive backs during his two-year stint in Champaign. Among six Illini defenders to earn All-Big Ten recognition in 2021 was safety Kerby Joseph, who was Illinois' first All-Big Ten First Team defensive back since 1989. Two more Illinois defensive backs accomplished the feat in 2022, with Devon Witherspoon and Sydney Brown earning first team accolades from the conference. Witherspoon, notably, became Illinois' first Jim Thorpe Award (top defensive back in college football) finalist in school history this past

> Walters spent six seasons at Missouri prior to his tenure with the Illini, including three as defensive coordinator. He oversaw an impressive transformation of the Tigers' defense into one of the Southeastern Conference's top units. His 2019 defense ranked in the nation's Top 20 in several categories, including total defense (14th NCAA; 3rd SEC - 312.0) and scoring defense (17th NCAA; 6th SEC - 19.4), while excelling as a Top 10 pass defense (8th in passing yards allowed NCAA; 2nd SEC - 179.3).

> Walters previously served as co-defensive coordinator for the 2016 and 2017 seasons in Columbia before being promoted to defensive coordinator permanently ahead of the 2018 season, with Missouri's overall defensive improvement leading the way to an eight-win season and bid to the 2018 AutoZone Liberty Bowl. Previously during bowl preparation in December 2017, Walters ascended to the role of defensive coordinator before the squad's 2017 Texas Bowl appearance after assuming control of the entire secondary ahead of that season. He had focused on the safeties in his first two seasons with the program.

Prior to making the move to Missouri in 2015, Walters coached at Memphis where he spent the 2014 season as cornerbacks coach and oversaw a defense that was among the most improved in the nation when the Tigers

A native of Aurora, Colorado, Walters was a football student-athlete at Colorado, where he was a standout safety for the Buffaloes (2004-08). He started 33 times in 46 career appearances as a Buffalo and earned All-Big 12 Conference Honorable Mention his senior season. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Colorado, working with the secondary in 2009, and then spent two years on staff at Arizona, where he was a graduate assistant in 2010 before being promoted to defensive backs coach for the 2011 season.

From Arizona, Walters moved to Oklahoma as a graduate assistant cornerbacks coach in 2012, as the Sooners went 10-3 and played in the 2013 Cotton Bowl. He moved to North Texas for the 2013 season, where he oversaw cornerbacks and helped lead UNT to a 9-4 record in its first year in Conference USA.

Prior to his arrival at Illinois, Walters was one of 12 coaching participants in the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches' inaugural Coalition Academy in April 2020, a first-of-its-kind mentorship program pairing influential athletic directors with minority football coaches.

Walters earned his degree in history from the University of Colorado in December 2008 with dual majors in history and ethnic studies. Walters and his wife Tara have two sons, Aaron and Cason.

IN-STATE OPPOSITION

- A schedule rarity, Purdue will play three opponents from the state of Indiana this season.
- The Boilermakers opened the year with a 49-0 shutout win over Indiana State on Aug. 31.
- Purdue faces Notre Dame for the Shillelagh Trophy (Sept. 14) for the first meeting in Ross-Ade Stadium since 2013.
- Sticking with tradition, Purdue closes out the regular season by battling Indiana with the Old Oaken Bucket up for grabs.
- The last time three in-state opponents were on Purdue's schedule occurred during the 2013 season, with four such seasons this century.

ROSS-ADE PACKED ALL SEASON LONG

- With three of Purdue's six home games coming against preseason Top 10 teams, Ross-Ade Stadium is expected to be packed all season long.
- Purdue's sellout against Notre Dame matched the highest attendance at Ross-Ade Stadium since 2014 when renovations began that trimmed capacity by nearly 10,000 seats.
- Purdue's attendance of 59,488 against Indiana State was the largest in a season opener for Purdue since 2005.
- The Boilermakers' next home game against Nebraska is already sold out.
- The 2023 season featured Purdue's highest home attendance, both average and total, since the 2007 campaign, but those marks might be broken this season.
- With more than 42,000 season ticket holders, including more than 5,000 new season ticket holders, season tickets sold out for the 2024 season.
- Student season tickets also sold out five hours after going on sale, a record-breaking time.
- Purdue's in-state matchup against Notre Dame sold out one day after going on sale to the public.

STAFF RETENTION

- One benefit from the offseason that has Purdue poised to take another step under Ryan Walters is the fact the coaching staff largely remained together.
- Of the 10 handpicked position coaches from Walters' first season, only one staff member departed, as tight ends coach Seth Doege accepted the offensive coordinator position at Marshall.
- Walters looked in-house to fill out his staff this year, promoting analyst and veteran special teams guru Chris Petrilli to the title of special teams coordinator in January.
- After the NCAA passed legislation permitting additional coaches, Walters gave a well-deserved promotion to senior offensive analyst and one of the best tight ends in Purdue history Justin Sinz to work with the tight ends. Sinz spent the last 10 years at his alma mater filling various roles from analyst, quality control and recruiting.

BOILERMAKERS TO THE NFL

TEAM NOTES CONTINUED

- The 2024 NFL Draft marked the fifth straight year that at least two Boilermakers were chosen, totaling 14 over the span. That last time Purdue had a five-year streak of multiple Boilermakers drafted was 1998-2002.
- Tyrone Tracy Jr. was the first Boilermaker off the board, as the New York Giants selected the running back in the fifth round with the 166th overall pick. Despite sharing the workload in the backfield with Devin Mockobee, Tracy tallied 716 yards on the ground, while leading the team in touchdowns (eight rushing, one kickoff return) and pacing the Big Ten in all-purpose yards in conference games (1274 ypg).
- Tracy averaged 6.3 yards per carry on 113 attempts, the secondbest single-season rushing average in school history.
- -The Baltimore Ravens drafted defensive back Sanoussi Kane with their final pick (7th Round 250th Overall). A four-year letterman, Kane played in 45 games over his Purdue career. He made 25 starts for the Old Gold and Black, totaling 161 tackles that included 115 solo stops.
- Kane became the first Boilermaker drafted by the Ravens, although Hall of Famer and Boilermaker legend Rod Woodson helped lead the team to a victory in Super Bowl XXXV and Bernard Pollard helped Baltimore win Super Bowl LVII.

THE TRENT FAMILY

- Walk-on offensive lineman Ethan Trent came to West Lafayette with a family legacy already deeply entrenched in Purdue history.
- His older brother Tyler became a an inspiration for the Boilermaker faithful during the 2018 season. The Purdue superfan continued passionately cheering on his favorite team despite his battle with a rare form of bone cancer.
- Tyler's story was shared on ESPN College GameDay ahead of the Boilers' matchup against No. 3 Ohio State. In what became known as "The Tyler Trent Game," Purdue dominated the Buckeyes in a 49-20 upset rout in Ross-Ade.
- Ethan, who appeared multiple times in the GameDay piece, was the one pushing Tyler's wheelchair as the pair stormed the field along with thousands of other fans.
- The Tyler Trent (T2) Student Gate was dedicated during the 2019 season in memory of the Purdue superfan who passed away at the age of 20 from osteosarcoma.
- Ethan came to Purdue five years later after receiving a preferred walk-on offer from the previous staff that was then honored by new head coach Ryan Walters.

HAPPY 100th ROSS-ADE

• Ross-Ade Stadium will turn 100 years old on Nov. 22.

- The Boilermakers celebrated its 100th season in Ross-Ade Stadium last year, capped by their 300th win since moving in.
- Purdue opened Ross-Ade Stadium with a 26-7 rout of in-state rival Indiana on Nov. 22, 1924.

ACADEMIC ACES

- In just the first year under Walters, the Boilermakers recorded their highest ever semester (Spring 2024) and cumulative GPA in program history.
- This spring, over 50% of the team had higher than a 3.0 GPA and 26 student-athletes earned higher than 3.5.

OFFENSIVE NOTES CONTINUED

AIR RAID INNOVATION Offensive coordinator Graham Harrell is in his second year as the play caller in West Lafayette.

- An innovative play caller and a member of the Mike Leach coaching and playing tree, Harrell has installed his dynamic offense to the Cradle of Quarterbacks.
- Harrell helped Ryan Walters land Hudson Card as Purdue's quarterback in the winter of 2022, and the duo's bond continues to grow on the field. Their close bond off the field made for a seamless transition to the quarterback communication link starting this season.
- Purdue has spread the wealth around on offense with 13 different receivers catching a pass.
- The Boilermakers launched a dual attack last season with six games of 150 yards or more rushing and five games with over 250 yards passing, including a career-high 323 through the air for Card against Syracuse.

CARD CHAPTER ONE

- Hudson Card had a productive first season in West Lafayette, overcoming several significant injuries to his offensive line and key recieving targets in 2023.
- The Boilermaker signal caller appeared in 11 games last year and threw for 2,387 yards and 15 touchdowns during his first campaign at Purdue in 2023.
- He guided Purdue to a win over Indiana in the Old Oaken Bucket Game, recording 360 yards of offense (275 passing, 85 rushing) and four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing) to become the first quarterback since Drew Brees (2000) to pass for at least 275 yards and rush for at least 85 yards in the same game.
- Card was one of two quarterbacks in the Big Ten last season to throw for 15 scores and rush for five more on the ground, joining Maryland's Taulia Tagovailoa.
- Card is the fifth Purdue quarterback since 1956 to reach those marks in a single season:

EXPERIENCE IN THE TRENCHES

- Purdue's offensive line is one of its most experienced groups in 2024 with a combined 151 starts.
- The line is anchored by four-time All-Big Ten honoree center Gus Hartwig. In his final season in West Lafayette, Hartwig has the most starts of any active player at Purdue with 36. He was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List for the third straight campaign, as well as his first nod on the Senior Bowl Watch List.
- Marcus Mbow, Mahamane Moussa and Jalen Grant return after making starts for Purdue last season. Mbow garnered a preseason spot on the Senior Bowl Watch List.
- 2024 will be the third straight year Hartwig, Mbow and Moussa have started on the line together.

NEW LOOK RECEIVING ROOM

- One area that head coach Ryan Walters and his staff attacked during the signing and transfer periods was at wide receiver.
- The Boilermakers brought in some serious height and speed, as the average height is up to 6-foot-2 for those listed on the depth chart, compared to the 5-foot-11 for available receivers late in the season last year.
- One of Purdue's biggest additions was already on the roster as FAU transfer Jahmal Edrine will be available after missing last season due to injury.
- Purdue added a pair of national champions to the receivers room in Georgia transfers CJ Smith and De'Nylon Morrissette.
- Smith's speed has already caught some eyes as a key target for Hudson Card. The Apopka, Fla., native posted a 10.3 second 100-meter dash in high school.
- Standing 6-feet-4, junior college transfer Leland Smith has quickly made himself a down field threat in the offense, while freshman Shamar Rigby was the only rookie to land on the initial depth chart after a strong camp.
- While the new additions have made early impacts, several returners have stepped into new roles after the departure of last year's leading receivers.
- Jaron Tibbs jumped onto the scene late in the season last season, securing five catches for 42 yards, including four receptions in the final two games.
- Jayden Dixon-Veal made 16 catches for 142 yards and a touchdown in his first season at Purdue last year.
- Arhmad Branch will be an effective tool for the receiving corps after developing for a year in 2023.
- The old reliable hands of Andrew Sowinski are back for a final campaign in West Lafayette.

BIG BOYS UP FRONT

- If you play offensive line against Purdue, you're going to have a long day, as Purdue's three down linemen all weigh north of 290 pounds.
- The initial starting trio of Jeffrey M'Ba (302), Cole Brevard (333) and Joe Anderson (290) have a combined weight of 925 pounds. That's more than the weight of a grand piano... all game long.
- When you factor in all seven linemen on the depth chart, that equals out to 2,100 pounds clogging the holes in the middle.
- Cole Brevard is the lone returning starter from a season ago, with the addition of last year's rotational linemen Joe Anderson and Jeffrey M'Ba.

THE GREEKS

- Yanni Karlaftis is in his first full season as a starter after playing his way into the lineup in the middle of the 2023 campaign.
- He set career highs last year with 55 total tackles and 28 solos, including 47 stops in the final eight games of the year.
- Karlaftis grew up in Greece with his family and won a world judo championship at age 11.
- Yanni's older brother is Purdue All-American and two-time Super Bowl champion George Karlaft's of the Kansas City Chiefs.

DB DEPTH

- Purdue's secondary received a major infusion of depth this offseason from the transfer portal and high school signees.
- After injuries plagued the group in 2023, the defensive backs room is poised in multiple phases of the game.
- Dillon Thieneman headlines the group as one of the top defensive backs in all of college football following his All-America campaign as a freshman last year.
- Emerging this offseason as a defensive leader, senior Antonio Stevens trimmed his body fat down and added 15 pounds of muscle compared to last season.
- Out on the perimeter, Nyland Green has considerable experience from three seasons, including a pair of national championships with the Georgia Bulldogs.
- Markevious Brown and Kyndrich Breedlove reunited after starting their careers as roommates at Ole Miss.

RUSH END

- A key part of Purdue's defense is the RUSH END position.
- A hybrid standing lineman with pass rushing, run stopping and pass coverage duties, the RUSH ENDs are set up to have one of the biggest impacts on the field for the Boilermakers.
- Standing 6-foot-6, Will Heldt has cemented his spot as one of the leading RUSH ENDs on the team. The Carmel, Ind., native posted eight tackles with one for-loss last season.
- Two transfers have emerged as key pieces at RUSH END in CJ Madden (Georgia) and Shitta Sillah (SHEET-ah) (Boston College). Madden won the 2022 National Championship with the Bulldogs, while Sillah played 39 games with 80 tackles, 12 for-loss and 6.5 sacks over five seasons with the Eagles.

SACK SQUAD

- Purdue's defense tallied a trio of sacks in the opener against Indiana State, before getting to the quarterback three more times each against Notre Dame and Oregon State.
- Purdue ranks seventh in the Big Ten with 2.67 sacks per game.
- The Boilermakers made a living in the opposition's backfield last year, as the Boilermakers racked up 35 sacks on the year, the highest tally in West Lafayette since 2004 and tied for third on the single-season charts.
- At 2.92 sacks per game, the Boilermakers ranked 13th in the nation and second in the Big Ten.
- Thirteen different Boilermakers posted a sack last year with six returning to this year's squad, led by Kydran Jenkins' careerhigh 7.5 sacks.

SEASON OPENING SHUTOUTS

Oppopont Pocult

- Purdue's season-opening shutout of Indiana State was the 32nd by the Boilermakers in a game to start the year and the first in 20 years.
- Since 1954, Purdue has opened a campaign with a shutout just nine times.

ODDS AND ENDS

- The Boilermakers scored twice on defense last year, ranking third in the Big Ten. Kydran Jenkins took a fumble 55 yards to the house against Nebraska, while Malika Langham recovered a fumble in the end zone against Illinois.
- Purdue finished fourth in the Big Ten with a 4th-down defense conversion rate of 45%.
- The Boilermakers recovered eight fumbles last season to finish fifth in the Big Ten. Cole Brevard tied the single-game record with a pair of recoveries at Nebraska last season.
- Purdue finished with just a hair under six tackles-for-loss per game last season, ranking fifth in the Big Ten.

THE RETURN GAME

- Special teams coach (last year senior analyst) Chris Petrilli added something that Purdue had not seen in a decade, a reliable kick and punt return scheme.
- Elijah Jackson has quickly made an impact on the kickoff return unit leading the Big Ten, and 19th nationally with 23.5 yards per kick return.
- Dillon Thieneman is fourth in the Big Ten with 9.7 yards per punt return.
- The Boilermakers tallied 24.3 yards per kick return last season to rank 12th in the nation and second in the Big Ten.
- It was Purdue's highest kickoff return average since 2013, when Miami Dolphin's running back and Big Ten 60 and 200-meter champion Raheem Mostert returned kicks.
- Tyrone Tracy Jr. housed a 98-yard kickoff return in the season opener against Fresno State for Purdue's first touchdown by that unit since 2013.

THE VET AND THE ROOK

- True freshman Spencer Porath made his Purdue debut as the field goal kicker, connecting on all seven of his PAT kicks.
- Senior Ben Freehill opened the season as the kickoff specialist.
- Freehill went 6-of-11 on field goals in his first season as the placekicker, but blood clots in his leg held him out for most of the season. He was 5-of-8 in conference play.
- Porath was tabbed the No. 8 kicker in the class of 2024, a U.S. Army Bowl All-American and Indiana Mr. Football position award winner.

ROSS-ADE HISTORY

- Ross-Ade Stadium was dedicated Nov. 22, 1924, ahead of its first game when Purdue hosted Indiana. The Boilermakers demolished their in-state foes in a 26-7 rout.
- The two men for whom the stadium is named after, David E. Ross and George Ade, were instrumental in building a stadium that has served as the backdrop to Purdue lore over the last 101 seasons. Ross conceived of the idea for a new stadium to replace Stuart Field, a 5,000-seat stadium that hosted Purdue Football from 1892 to 1924 and was located where the Elliot Hall of Music stands today.
- The original capacity for Ross-Ade Stadium in 1924 was 18,500, including standing room tickets. Over the years and several renovations, the capacity grew to its largest at 69,200 in 1970.
- The largest crowd ever to see a game at Ross-Ade is 71,629 against Indiana on Nov. 22, 1980, when Purdue outlasted the Hoosiers, 24-23, on the shoulders of consensus All-Americans quarterback (and current John Purdue Club Director of Leadership and Alumni Engagement) Mark Hermann and tight end Dave Young.
- Additional upgrades to the stadium included a new press box, luxury boxes and premium club areas in 2003 as a part of a \$70 million project. Permanent lighting was installed in 2017 and a new sound system in 2018.
- The Tyler Trent (T²) Student Gate was dedicated during the 2019 season in memory of Purdue superfan Tyler Trent who passed away at the age of 20 from osteosarcoma. The T² Gate was relocated to the south side of the stadium after the 2023 student section renovations were completed.

PHASE 1

The 2023 season saw the completion of the Phase I of a multi-phased renovation project at a cost of more \$45 million, fully funded by gifts to the John Purdue Club.

The three main enhancements to the stadium were the Tiller Tunnel, the south end zone student section and the team dining facility, which opened in July, on the north side of the stadium, bringing the total capacity up to 61,441

SOUTH END ZONE PROJECT

The Purdue student section and the All-American Marching Band have a new home in the south end zone of Ross-Ade Stadium. As a part of the Phase I project, the dedicated student section enhancements included the addition of a new Tyler Trent student entrance area, safe standing seats, patio and deck areas, rail seating, and enhanced concessions.

The completion of the bowl, in addition to the investment in the size of the concourse, allows for a more accessible fan experience as fans will now be able to traverse the entire stadium at the concourse level.

TILLER TUNNEL

The Boilermakers run onto Rohrman Field at Ross-Ade Stadium via the Tiller Tunnel. Completed in 2023, the tunnel provides direct access to the team back to the Kozuch Football Performance Center.

The tunnel is named in honor of the Purdue Hall of Fame inductee Joe Tiller, the winningest coach in the history of Purdue Football. Tiller left an incredible legacy on the program and Boilermakers everywhere. The result was 10 bowl games, including the 2001 Rose Bowl, and a Big Ten Conference championship in 2000.

DEN OF DEFENSIVE ENDS

Throughout its history, Purdue has produced many outstanding defensive ends, creating an institution unlike any other in college football - The Den of Defensive Ends.

The tradition of The Den of Defensive Ends dates to the days of Leo Sugar and Lamar Lundy from the late 1940s to the mid-1950s and Keena Turner in the late 1970s, but it has flourished more recently. While Purdue's high-powered offense has made headlines under head coaches Joe Tiller, Jeff Brohm and Ryan Walters, the Boilermakers' defense made a name for itself principally for the play of its ends.

CRADLE OF QUARTERBACKS

The Cradle of Quarterbacks has evolved over the last 70 years as a defining feature of Purdue football. Boilermakers have set numerous NCAA and Big Ten Conference records, many have been chosen as All-Americans and national awards winners or finalists.

Fifteen former Purdue signal-callers have gone on to play in the National Football League. Drew Brees, Dawson and Griese combined to win four Super Bowls. Purdue is one of just two universities that can claim three Super Bowl champs at the position. (Alabama)

The reference to Cradle of Quarterbacks was added in the late 1970s when the poster was updated to include Mark Herrmann.



In front of Ross-Ade Stadium's largest crowd (59,488) for a season opener since 2005, the Boilermakers steamrolled to a 49-0 victory over Indiana State.

Senior quarterback Hudson Card tied the all-time FBS record for completion percentage (minimum 20 completions). completing 24 of 25 passes (96%). He threw for 273 yards and a career-high four touchdowns before being pulled near the end of the third guarter once the game was already in hand.

The Purdue offense posted its highest passing output of the Ryan Walters era so far, totaling 335 yards and four touchdowns, with 12 different players catching a pass. Seven different Boilermakers scored a touchdown for the first time since Sept. 15, 2012 vs. Eastern Michigan.

Tight end Max Klare led the aerial attack with a career-high 71 receiving yards and his first career touchdown, a nine-yard dot from Card on 3rd-and-Goal for the team's first score of 2024.

The Purdue rushing attack combined for 31 carries for 248 yards (8.0 average) and three touchdowns, with junior running back Devin Mockobee leading the way on 11 carries for 89 yards.

The Boilermaker defense made life difficult for the Sycamores all afternoon, holding both phases of the offense in check. Purdue forced six three-and-outs, facing the minimum 12 offensive plays in Indiana State's first four drives.

Purdue gave up just 50 yards on five passes, the lowest total allowed in a game since 2019 and the fifth time since 1996 that the Boilermakers allowed 50 passing yards or fewer. The rushing defense was stout as well, allowing 104 yards on 53 carries, just 2.4 yards per attempt.

Will Heldt and Antonio Stevens tied for the team lead with seven tackles, career highs for both players.

Purdue dropped a 66-7 decision to No. 18 Notre Dame on Saturday afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium.

Senior running back Reggie Love III led the rushing attack, logging 10 carries for 61 yards and a 6.1 average against a stout Notre Dame defense.

Quarterback Hudson Card completed 11-of-24 passes for 124 yards and a touchdown. After a tough first half, he got the Boilers moving down the field with a 52-yard pass to Kam Brown in the third quarter.

Two plays later, Card tossed a five-yard touchdown to De'Nylon Morrissette, scoring the Boilermakers' only points of the afternoon. It was Morrissette's second score of the season.

Leading the team in catches again was Max Klare, who recorded three receptions for 36 yards.

On defense, sophomore Dillon Thieneman was Purdue's leading tackler for the ninth time in his young career, finishing with nine stops (six solos) and his first sack of the season.

Shitta Sillah notched his first sack as a Boilermaker, dropping quarterback Steve Angeli for a 10-yard loss in the third quarter. Will Heldt and Kydran Jenkins also combined for a sack in the fourth quarter.

Punter Keelan Crimmins averaged 47.3 yards per kick on his 10 reps Saturday with two balls over 50 yards, a long of 64, and three inside the 20-yard line.

Notre Dame built up a 42-0 lead at the break and led by 49 before Purdue got on the board with Morrissette's touchdown grab with 9:33 to play in the third.

Purdue dropped its first road game of the season, falling 38-21 at Oregon State.

Running back Devin Mockobee eclipsed 2,000 career rushing yards. He gained 100 yards for the first time this season and the seventh time in his career, finishing with 168 yards on 16 carries for a 10.5-yard average and a touchdown.

The junior led the backfield as Purdue posted its highest rushing output (263 yards) since combining for 303 yards on the ground at Northwestern on Nov. 18, 2023.

Early Purdue turnovers spelled trouble after a promising defensive start, when the Boilers turned the Beavers over on downs just four plays into the game. The offense took the ball at the Oregon State 28-yard line and had three carries for 17 yards before a lost fumble spoiled a red zone trip.

On the next offensive possession, Hudson Card's pass to the flat took an unfortunate bounce off the leg of his target and was picked off and returned for a touchdown by the Beavers' defense.

On a two-play, 47-yard drive, Max Klare hauled in a 32-yard heave from Card for Purdue's first score, cutting the Beavers'

The score was 24-7 before Purdue answered again in the fourth quarter, when Reggie Love III capped a 7-play, 75-yard drive with his second touchdown of the season.

After another Oregon State score, Mockobee broke free for a 63yard gain, the longest run of the night. It set up his three-yard touchdown two plays later, making the tally 31-21, Beavers.

Purdue ultimately gave up one more touchdown and fell to 1-2 on the season.
