

Through hard work and dedication to getting better, Zach Edey has become the most-dominant force in college basketball and the front-runner for National Player of the Year honors. Here are his numbers.

30-10 IS A WHO'S WHO AT PURDUE

- **Zach Edey's** consecutive 30-10 games in the Big Ten Tournament were the first back-to-back 30-10 games since **Glenn Robinson** in the first two rounds of the 1994 NCAA Tournament.
- Became the fourth player to have consecutive 30-10 games in a conference tournament (**DeAndre Ayton**, **Evan Turner**, **Tim Duncan**).
- His eight 30-10 games this season are more than every player at Purdue produced COMBINED since the 1994-95 season.
- Edey's eight 30-10 games are the second most for a major-college player in the last 20 years.

- Edey's eight 30-10 games lead the country this season and are the second most for any player since 2010-11. The rest of the Big Ten has six combined 30-10 games this season (Dickinson - 2; Murray - 2; Jackson-Davis - 1; Young - 1).

- **Zach Edey** leads the country in 25-10 games with 11, easily the most for a Big Ten Conference player since the 2007-08 season.

MAKING BIG TEN HISTORY

- Edey is the first Big Ten player in over 60 years to have at least 700 points and 400 rebounds in a season. Only Edey and Ohio State legend **Jerry Lucas** have accomplished the feat.

THE 30-20 CLUB

- **Zach Edey** became the newest member of Purdue's 30-20 club when he recorded 31 points and 22 rebounds in the win over Minnesota.

- Edey is the first Purdue player since **Terry Dischinger** had 46 points and 22 rebounds against Minnesota on Feb. 24, 1962, to record at least 31 points and 22 rebounds in the same game.

- Edey had 22 rebounds, outrebounding the Golden Gophers by himself. He became the only major-conference player to outrebound an opponent by himself since 2009-10.

- He is one of two players nationally this season to have at least 31 points and 22 rebounds in the same game (**Oscar Tshiebwe**). He is 1-of-5 players since 2010-11 to have a 31-point, 22-rebound game.

RANKING IN THE TOP 10 IS A RARE FEAT

- **Zach Edey** currently ranks sixth in the country in scoring and second in rebounds. Just five other players in the last 25 seasons have ranked in the top six in both.

- Edey is on pace to be the first player in the NCAA database to rank in the top 25 in points, rebounds, blocks and field goal percentage.

• **Zach Edey** became just the second player in school history to have at least 38 points, 13 rebounds and 3 assists in game when he reached those marks vs. Michigan State on Sunday. When you add three steals to it, he is the first player with those stats.

THE ULTIMATE ANALYTIC

• Via sports-reference.com, **Zach Edey** is on the list for one of the greatest seasons in its database. Edey currently owns a 40.2 Player Efficiency Rating (PER), which would be the third-best PER of any player in its database.

• Oh, and Edey also holds the No. 1 spot in the list, when he also posted a 40.9 PER rating a year ago. His 2021-22 season is better than the ridiculous season by Duke's **Zion Williamson** in 2018-19.

• Edey owns two of the top three spots on the list. Chattanooga's **Jake Stephens** is second this season, way back there at 35.5 PER.

ELITE BIG MAN CLUB

• **Zach Edey** became the fifth Purdue player to join the 1,000-point, 600-rebound, 100-block club at Purdue, when he did so against Penn State. He was the second-fastest Boilermaker to reach that milestone behind 1980 No. 1 NBA Draft selection **Joe Barry Carroll**, doing so in just 80 games (JBC - 75).

• **Zach Edey** is the only active junior nationally with at least 1,500 points and 800 career rebounds, and is one of 14 players overall (any class). Edey has played 2,191 minutes. The next fewest minutes played among the 13 other players is **Oscar Tshiebwe** (3,077 minutes).

• **Zach Edey's** 13.1 rebound per game average in league games is the most for a Big Ten player since Michigan State's **Lindsay Hairston** averaged 14.2 during the 1973-74 season.

• Edey's combined 35.0 points and rebounds per game are the second most behind the sensational season of Purdue's **Glenn Robinson** in the 1993-94 season, a year he won National Player of the Year.
