#### THE OPENING TIP TEAM CHART ON LAST PAGE

- The rivalry is renewed. Indiana's only national championship programs will meet for the first time since 2012-13 in the regular season when Purdue travels to Notre Dame on Sunday.
- Purdue will look for its fourth ranked win under head coach Katie Gearlds. Purdue defeated No. 17 Florida State in 2021-22, before back-to-back wins over No. 22 Illinois and No. 2 Ohio State last year, the latter being the first true road win over an AP Top-5 team in program history.
- Sunday will be a homecoming for a trio of first-year Boilermakers as Rashunda Jones, Mila and Amiyah Reynolds return to South Bend where they created a dynasty at South Bend Washington rewriting the record books and taking the Panthers to the 2022 IHSAA 3A State Championship. The trio went 68-17 over three seasons on the same team under head coach Steven Reynolds Jr., Mila and Amiyah's father.
- Jeanae Terry recorded the only non-point double-double in the nation against SEMO. Entering Sunday with 7.4 rebounds and 6.3 assists per game, she is one of four players nationally (Caitlin Clark - lowa, Kiki Rice - UCLA, Jenna Annecchiarico - Charleston) averaging over six rebounds and assists per game.

- Mary Ashley Stevenson took over the top spot in Big Ten rookie rebounding at 5.5 rebounds per game with a career-high 11 boards against Minnesota. The New York City native and fellow freshman Rashunda Jones are two of the five Big Ten freshmen averaging over nine points and three rebounds per game.
- Purdue has held eight opponents to 60 or fewer points this year, which is tied for fifth most in the nation this year.
- Madison Layden has found her shooting touch behind the arc with 21 triples over the last six games. Layden is shooting 49.1% from distance to lead the Big Ten and rank 21st nationally. Her 26 triples on the year sits fourth in the league.
- Abbey Ellis scored in double figures in all 10 games this season.
   The Australian international is fifth in the Big Ten at an 87.2 free throw clip. Her 88.1% clip for her career in West Lafayette ranks second in program history behind Courtney Moses.
- The Voice of Purdue Women's Basketball Tim Newton will call his 999th game for the Boilermakers on Sunday. He will join the 1,000-game club against Indiana State on Wednesday. Purdue will celebrate his impact with Tim Newton Night on Jan. 2 vs. Rutgers.

- The Boilermakers dropped a heartbreaker in the opening game of the Big Ten season on Sunday in Minneapolis.
- Purdue led by four with a minute to go, but late turnovers and a costly foul called with three seconds left allowed Minnesota to sink two late free throws to win.
- Jeanae Terry finished with nine assists and 15 rebounds, nearly recording her second straight non-point double-double.
- Madison Layden tallied 16 of her 17 points in the third quarter when she was a perfect 6-of-6 from the field with four 3-pointers.

# **BOILER NOTES**

#### BOILERMAKER BASKETBALL

- Purdue Women's Basketball is in its 49th season in 2023-24.

   Purdue was the 40th program in NCAA Division Lipitory to
- Purdue was the 40th program in NCAA Division I history to reach 900 wins.
- The Boilermakers are the only team from the Big Ten to win a national championship, hoisting the title in 1999.
- The program has reached the NCAA Tournament 27 times with 12 Sweet 16s, eight Elite 8s, three final fours and a trio of national championship game appearances.
- In addition to its NCAA success, Purdue owns the Big Ten record for most tournament titles with nine.

#### THIRD SEASON OF THE KG ERA

- Head coach Katie Gearlds is in her third season at Purdue after guiding the Boilermakers to back-to-back postseason bids, including the first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2017.
- In two short seasons, Gearlds has transformed Purdue back into an NCAA Tournament squad with eyes on taking the Boilermakers back to the nation spotlight when she was on the floor 20 years ago.
- Gearlds took over the program 47 days before her first campaign in 2021-22 when Purdue was coming off a seven-win season. She guided Purdue to a 17-15 mark and reached the WNIT after the program failed to reach the postseason in the previous three years.
   Purdue finished the 2022-23 season with a 19-11 record and its first return to the NCAA Tournament since 2017.
- Gearlds joined Boilermaker legends Carolyn Peck and Lin Dunn as the only Purdue head coaches to post win improvements in each of their first two seasons.
- When Gearlds moved into the head coach role, Purdue had lost 19 straight games to ranked opponents. Over her first two years, Gearlds has racked up three ranked wins, including the program's first true road AP top-5 victory against No. 2 Ohio State in 2022-23.
   Gearlds was initially hired as the associate head coach with plans to become the head coach at the start of the 2022-23 season.

#### WAIT, HOW MANY SISTERS ARE ON THIS TEAM?

- If a team is a family, Purdue is taking that to a whole new level with three sets of siblings on the 2023-24 roster - Madison & McKenna Layden, Mila & Amiyah Reynolds, Caitlyn & Alaina Harper
- The Boilermakers are the only team in the nation with three sets of sisters. Utah Tech is the only other program with more than one pair of siblings.
- Based on the tireless research of a communications intern, 39 teams across Division I have one pair of sisters of the roster this year.
- McKenna and Madison Layden became the first Boilermakers to play on the floor together in program history, playing 6:29 together in the season opener at UCLA.
- Alaina Harper and Caitlyn Harper were the second set of siblings to play in the same game at Purdue, when Alaina checked in for her big sister in the fourth quarter against UCLA.

# STEVENSON & SPIDER

- Mary Ashley Stevenson and Rashunda Jones have been instant impacts for the Boilermakers as freshmen.
- They are two of the five freshmen from the Big Ten averaging over eight points and three rebounds per game.
- They rank third and fifth among conference rookies in scoring.
- Against Valparaiso, the duo achieved feats not reached by Purdue freshmen for over five years.
- Stevenson's 14 points and 10 rebounds marked the first pointsrebound double-double by a Purdue rookie since Sam Ostarello's 17 points, 14 rebounds against Evansville on Dec. 19, 2009.
- Jones was the first Purdue freshman to reach 20 points twice since Karissa McLaughlin in 2017-18.

#### FRESHMAN OUTPUT

- With six freshmen on the roster, five active, the rookie class for the Boilermakers have quickly made an impact in West Lafayette.
- The six-player class was Gearlds' primary focus during her first years back at Purdue.
- Mary Ashley Stevenson jumped into the starting lineup for the first time in her career against Southern, tallying 13 points, all in the second half. She has finished in double figures five times.
- Rashunda Jones scored 20 points against Texas A&M, the first 20-point game by a Purdue rookie since 2017-18, later topping it with a 22-point outing against Valparaiso.
- McKenna Layden sprang for eight points and six rebounds against Southern Indiana.
- Emily Monson has been effective in her time on the floor, notching four assists in eight minutes against Valpo.
- After missing the first five games of the year with an injury,
   Sophie Swanson sprang for eight points and two triples vs. Valpo.

#### RIVALRY RENEWED

- The rich history between Purdue and Notre Dame will add another chapter after a decade hiatus in the regular season. The game Sunday will make Notre Dame Purdue's most common non-conference opponent, breaking a tie with Ball State (27).
- Unique to this year's matchup is the fact that both head coaches and two assistants on both sides (Purdue – Gearlds, Komara, Guyton and Notre Dame – Ivey, Mabrey, Allen) have a wealth of experience in the rivalry.
- The six coaches who played for their respective alma maters appeared in 17 of the previous 27 games in the series.
   Katie Gearlds went 2-2 against the Fighting Irish. Purdue's last win over the Irish in 2005 came when Gearlds, then a junior, scored 13 points with three rebounds and a pair of assists to lead No. 24 Purdue to a 65-54 victory over No. 10 Notre Dame.
- Irish head coach Niele Ivey split her six matchups against the Boilermakers as a player, including the final game in the 2001 National Championship Game when Notre Dame outlasted Purdue 68-66.
- Ivey is no stranger to Purdue after her playing days, as her son Jaden was a 2022 Consensus Second Team All-American, First Team All-Big Ten and a pick to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. He was selected fifth overall in the 2022 NBA Draft to the Detroit Pistons where he was named to the NBA All-Rookie Second Team.
   Indiana is one of four states to have produced multiple national championship programs in Purdue and Notre Dame, tied for second with California (USC and Stanford) Louisiana (Louisiana Tech and LSU) and behind four from Texas (Baylor, Texas, Texas

#### HARPER HITTING HER STRIDE

Tech and Texas A&M).

- In her sixth year of college basketball, Caitlyn Harper might be
  in the best shape of her career playing over 30 minutes in six
  games this season. She bested 30 minutes just thrice last year.
   Harper scored in double figures in seven outings, sitting third
  on the team with 11.0 points per game at a 56.3% shooting clip.
- She is one of 10 post players from the Big Ten averaging double figures and shooting over 50% from the field
- After a rough night without scoring against Valpo, Harper
   bounced back to drop her Purdue best 22 points against SEMO.





# **BOILER NOTES**

#### A SOUTH BEND HOMECOMING

- A trio of first-year Boilermakers will return to their hometown this weekend. Rashunda Jones and the Reynolds sisters were a part of a South Bend Washington dynasty that amassed over 100 wins over five seasons, won the 2022 IHSAA 3A State Championship, three conference, sectional and regional titles.
- Mila finished second in career scoring at South Bend Washington with 2,099 points, behind Skylar Diggins-Smith.
- Amiyah ended her career ranked second in assists with 564.
- Rashunda also etched her name high in the record books with 1,791 career points, 497 rebounds, 427 assists and 419 steals.
- The trio played under head coach Steven Reynolds Jr., the Reynolds' father, and assistant coach Marcy Reynolds, their mother.

#### **ELITE ELLIS**

- Abbey Ellis is her final campaign in West Lafayette after honorable mention All-Big Ten nods each of the last two years.
- The Australian leads the team in scoring with 14.3 points per game and has reached double figures in all 10 games.
- Ellis is third in the Big Ten with a 87.2% mark at the line (34-39). Her career 88.1% mark at Purdue is second in program history.
- Ellis paired with Rashunda Jones to become the first Boilermaker duo to score 20 points in a game since 2019-20 when they both scored 20 against Texas A&M.
- Ellis' 10-game streak to start the year marked the second straight season Purdue had a player hit double figures in the first 10 games, following Lasha Petree's 11 games last year.

#### THE NAME IS MARY ASHLEY STEVENSON

- Mary Ashley Stevenson looks to be a force her first season in West Lafayette, joining the starting lineup in her second career game.
- Stevenson is fifth on the team with 9.3 points per game, which ranks fifth in the Big Ten among freshmen. She leads league rookies with 5.5 rebounds per game.
- In her college debut at UCLA, she finished with eight points, two rebounds one assist, one steal and one block in 27 minutes in the season opener at No. 4 UCLA, becoming the first Purdue rookie since Sam Ostarello in 2009 to record at least five points and one block, rebound, assist and steal in the first game of the year.
- Her double-double vs. Valpo was the first points-rebounds by a Purdue rookie since 2009. She is one of two rookies from the Big Ten this season to record a double-double (Natalie Potts, NEB)
- She won three state championships (2 NY,1SC) and went 80-12 in high school with 2,552 points and 1,575 rebounds in 125 career games.
   Before she stepped on campus, she legally changed her last name from Groot to Stevenson, taking the name of her stepdad Gary.

# THE SPIDER - RASHUNDA JONES

- Rashunda Jones was the first South Bend Washington commit before the Reynolds sisters joined to reunite the powerful trio.
- Coming off the bench, Jones is second on the team with 10.9 points per game while shooting 44.9% from the field with five 3-pointers.
- She is the first Boilermaker rookie to score 20 points twice in a season since Karissa McLaughlin in 2017-18.
- She earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week, Purdue's first since 2017-18, when she scored 20 points against Texas A&M.
- She scored 22 points against Valpo, the most by a Purdue freshman since Dominique McBryde in 2015-16.
- Jones was tabbed the 2023 Indiana Miss Basketball and a member of the Max Preps National Player of the Year Watch List.
- She guided the Panthers to a 95-18 record in her career and a 2022 IHSAA 3A Championship and three conference titles.
- Her versatility earned her the nickname "Spider" from her high school head coach and Amiyah & Mila's father Steven.
- She finished her career with 1,791 points, 497 rebounds, 427 assists and 419 steals.

#### LOCK DOWN DEFENSE

- The Boilermakers have held seven opponents to 60 or fewer points this season, tied for sixth in the nation.
- Purdue is 6-2 in those games and 22-3 under Katie Gearlds when keeping a team to 60 points or fewer.
- Since the opener at UCLA, Purdue has allowed 57.1 points per game.
- Purdue is generating 14.8 points per game off 15.6 opponent turnovers this season.

#### NUMBERS TO KNOW IN THE GEARLDS ERA

- Purdue is 35-5 when leading after the first quarter and 40-7 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter.
- Purdue is 26-15 when knocking down seven or more 3-pointers.
   Purdue is 16-11 when shooting 35% from distance or better and 34-12 when shooting 40% or better overall, including 14-1 with a field goal clip above 50%.
- The Boilermakers are 29-6 when outrebounding opponents.
   The Boilermakers hold a 29-5 record when scoring 70 or more points, while also posting a 38-11 mark when holding opponents below that mark.

#### MILESTONE WATCH

- Abbey Ellis is 164 points away from joining the 1,000-point club at Purdue. The Australian already has over 1,500 points in her career.
   Caitlyn Harper is seven 3-pointers away from 100 in her career.
- Madison Layden needs 168 points to join the 1,000-point club.
- Jayla Smith is 85 points away from 500 for her career.
- Jeanae Terry needs 104 rebounds for 1,000 in her career.
- Terry is 64 assists away from 500 during her time in West Lafayette, which would make her the seventh player in program history to hit that mark.

#### TERRY'S TIDBITS

- Jeanae Terry has shown herself to be even more of a pass-first point guard in her final season of college basketball.
- Terry notched the first non-point double-double of the year against SEMO with 11 assists and 10 rebounds. Accomplishing the feat four times, Terry has the most non-point double-doubles since at least 2009-10.
- She is the only active player in the country to be a part of the 800-rebound and 600-assist club and the second in Big Ten history.
- During her time in West Lafayette, Terry has set the program record for triple-doubles and non-point double-doubles.
- Terry has 427 assists at Purdue to rank ninth in program history.
   With 16 assists over games against Georgia, Southern Indiana and Dayton, Terry passed Katie Gearlds, Kelly Komara and Ukari Figgs on the all-time assist charts.
- A pass-first guard, Terry has three games over five points, rebounds and assists. She trails Caitlin Clark (59) for the most 5-5-5 games in the country since she joined Purdue with 35 outings.

#### MONEY MADS

- Senior Madison Layden is in her fourth campaign as one of the top all-around producers for the Boilermakers.
- Layden is second on the team with 11.5 points per game. - She leads the Big Ten in 3-point percentage with a 49.1% clip (26-53). She has five games with four or more triples.
- Layden has climbed up to 11th in program history in career triples.
- She opened her home campaign with a career-high 21 points against Southern on 5-of-6 shooting with four triples.
- Layden went 11-of-17 from behind the arc in games against Georgia, Southern Indiana and Dayton.
- Layden was a perfect 6-of-6 with four 3-pointers for 16 points against Southern Indiana.
- A scorer, shooter, facilitator, rebounder and defender, Layden was one of 12 players in the Big Ten last season to tally six points, four rebounds, three assists and one steal per game.
- She set the single-game Purdue freshman record for triples in a game with six against lowa in 2020-21.
- She was tabbed All-Big Ten honorable mention as a sophomore and named to the All-Freshman team in 2020-21.

#### RANKED MATCHUPS

- Head coach Katie Gearlds has guided Purdue to three ranked wins during her time in West Lafayette. Purdue had lost its last 25 games to ranked opponents before the Gearlds era started.
- Purdue recorded back-to-back ranked wins for the first time since 2018 during the 2022-23 campaign.
- With a 73-65 win over No. 2 Ohio State in Columbus, the Boilermakers tallied their first ever top-five win on the road.
- Purdue snapped the program's 19-game skid to ranked teams with a 66-61 win over No. 17 Florida State last season.
- Gearlds was 23-22 against ranked teams during her playing days in West Lafayette.

After posting a perfect 16-0 record in Big Ten play and winning the league tournament, Purdue carved through the NCAA Tournament as a No. 1 seed, before defeating Duke 62-45 in the National Championship Game.

- Last season, she was one of three players (lowa's Caitlin Clark and Notre Dame's Olivia Miles) to record at least 6.0 points, rebounds and assists per game.
- Terry and Clark are the only two players in the nation to dish out 150 assists and haul in 200 rebounds in each of the last two years.
- Terry holds the second and third spots on the single-season assist lists, as well as the program's lead for career assist-to-turnover ratio.
- The Detroit native is the only player in Purdue men's or women's basketball history to amass multiple triple-doubles in a season and a career, a feat she achieved during the 2021-22 campaign.
- In both of her triple-double performances, the last category Terry hit double digits in was points.
- Terry is also the only Boilermaker to record a non-point double-double. Jeanae Terry recorded the mark four times since the start of last season, the most of any player in the nation since 2009.

   Player of the Year following her junior campaign.
- She set the school record for points in a season (750), 3-pointers in a year (86), thrice set the school mark for points in

- Head coach Katie Gearlds continues to bring the magic back to Mackey Arena, as more fans come through the turnstiles.
   Three of Purdue's first four games topped 5,000 fans to rank
- fourth, fifth and sixth for best attended games of the Gearlds era.
- Purdue set the program attendance record against Indiana last season with a sellout of 14,876.
- Purdue has sold its most season tickets since 2012-13.

#### DISHING OUT DIMES

- The Boilermakers are 16-0 over the last three seasons when dishing out 20 or more assists.
- Against Southern, the Boilermakers dished out 19 assists on 20 made field goals. They were the fifth most of the Gearlds era, while the 95% assist rate was the best by Purdue since 2015 against Minnesota (24 ast, 25 FGM).
- Purdue then dished out 24 assists against Southern Indiana, which ranked third in the Gearlds era.

#### NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

- Purdue has an 24-6 non-conference mark under Gearlds.
- $\bullet$  The 18 wins in non-conference regular season action over her first two seasons tied for third in the Big Ten.
- Last season, the Boilermakers went 9-1 for the third-best clip in team history and the best since Gearlds' freshman season in 2003-04.
- Purdue went 9-2 in regular season non-conference action during Gearlds' first campaign, which tied for the second best mark by a first-year head coach at Purdue.

#### MAGIC MCKENNA

- McKenna Layden has shown poise on the floor this year as a quality defender rebounder and one of the first subs.
- She reunited with her sister Madison following a 78-17 career record at Northwestern High School and was named an Indiana All-Star as a junior and senior.
- She set the Northwestern single-game record with 47 points with nine 3-pointers against Taylor in 2021.
- In addition to her success playing for her mother Kathie, including reaching the IHSAA 4A Championship Game as a freshman alongside Madison, Layden won two sectional titles in volleyball and tennis each.

### FRESHMEN STAND STALL IN OPENER

- Against UCLA, the active freshman quartet of Mary Ashley Stevenson, McKenna Layden, Rashunda Jones and Emily Monson combined for 20 points.
- The output was the most by a Purdue freshman class in a season opener since Karissa McLaughlin went for 21 points in the season opener against Central Michigan in the 2017-18 season.
- Stevenson finished with a rookie best eight points, two rebounds, two assists, one block and one steal. She was the first Purdue freshman to score five points and record a block, steal, rebound and assist to start a year since Sam Ostarello against Western Illinois in 2009-10.
- Stevenson, Layden and saw early action against the Bruins. The trio were on the floor together for a combined 10:57 during their career game at Purdue.

#### MURFREESBORO MONSON

- Emily Monson has taken steps forward during her time on the court this season, making 3-pointers against UCLA and Valpo. She dished out a quartet of assists in eight minutes vs. Valpo.
- She came to West Lafayette after garnering an Naismith High School All-America honorable mention nod.
- Monson powered Blackman High School throughout her career going 107-16 with an 81-8 mark as a three-year starter.
- Monson finished her career with 1,066 points, tallying a careerbest 15.8 points per game as a senior. She recorded more points her senior season than her first three years combined.

#### JAYLA'S JUMP

- Jayla Smith emerged as the top sub off the bench last season when she set career highs for single-game and season stats.
- Smith tallied 7.8 points per game while shooting 45.5% from the field and finished second on the team with 30 steals.
- Smith's biggest impact came with the Boilermakers' season on the line in the Big Ten Tournament. The Indianapolis native laced a wing 3-pointer with less than five seconds remaining and down one to beat Wisconsin 57-55, a victory that likely edged Purdue into the NCAA Tournament.

#### MILA MAKES HER WAY HOME

- Mila Reynolds set career highs with six points and five rebounds against Valparaiso.
- The sophomore returned to her home state and reunited with her little sister Amiyah after playing her freshman season at Maryland.
- Mila was the No. 60 player in the nation by ESPN and finished third in Indiana Miss Basketball voting in 2022.
- $\bullet$  She won the 2022 IHSAA 3A State Championship with Amiyah and Rashunda Jones.
- The eldest Reynolds totaled 2,099 career points, second in Panther history behind 2010 graduate Skylar Diggins-Smith.

#### **ALIRGHT ALAINA**

- Alaina Harper has been one of the program's most improved players since the start of the summer.
- · Alaina and her sister Caitlyn are on the same team for the first time in their lives
- She has provided impactful minutes to give the starting front court rest during games.
- Following a freshman season at Grand Canyon that saw her average five points and 2.2 rebounds, Alaina transferred to Purdue to play with Caitlyn and be closer to home.
- She was tabbed the No. 6 player in the state by prep Girls Hoops and was named WBCA First Team All-State in Wisconsin twice.

#### PURE LEADER AMIYAH REYNOLDS

- Amiyah Reynolds completed a prolific career for South Bend Washington, going 95-18, winning an IHSAA State Champion and three conference titles.
- Reynolds ranked second in South Bend Washington history with 564 assists.
- Her 1,000th point came off an assist from Rashunda Jones.
- Sadly, due to an injury that ended her senior campaign in February, Reynolds will redshirt for the 2023-24 season.
- Despite sitting out drills, Gearlds has made a point to work with Reynolds during practice to ingrain her in the offense.

### THE NEXT GENERATION

- National Signing Day brought Purdue a trio of talented high schools seniors, as Katie Gearlds welcomed Jordyn Poole, Lana McCarthy and Kendall Puryear to the Boilermaker family.
- Out of Fort Wayne Snider High School, Poole is a 5-7 guard and a candidate for Indiana Miss Basketball. Poole was the No. 54 player in the nation and averaged 16.7 points, 3.6 rebounds and 4 assists per game as a junior. Her uncle is Purdue legend Roosevelt Barnes and cousin was Purdue Big Ten Player of the Year Caleb Swanigan.
- Puryear, a 6-2 forward from Lee's Summit, Mo., averaged 15.9 points, 9.9 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game as a junior to be ranked the No. 2 player in the state.
- McCarthy, a 6-4 forward from Bedford, N.H., is the No. 1 player in the state and averaged 21.7 points per game while reaching her third straight state championship game. McCarthy also won four straight volleyball state titles and set the state record in career blocks.

#### DOWN UNDER DOWNTOWN ABBEY

- Abbey Ellis is her final campaign in West Lafayette after honorable mention All-Big Ten nods each of the last two years.
   Ellis was one of the most clutch free throw shooters in the
- Ellis was one of the most clutch free throw shooters in the country last season finishing third nationally at 91.7% while leading the Big Ten overall.
- Ellis is one of Purdue's go-to options in tight situations averaging 11.5 points per game during her time in West Lafayette with a 45.9% clip from the field and 33.3% from behind the arc.
- She joined the 1,500-point club for her career last season.
- In the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals against lowa last year, Ellis made her 100th career start.
- She earned a spot on the Big Ten Honor Roll following wins over No. 22 Illinois and No. 2 Ohio State last season.
- Purdue's first Australian rocks a ribbon in her hair during games from a selection that her mother sends her to wear.
- The senior has also gained a following on TikTok \ @abbeye\_22 with videos shared by BarstoolSports, Slam and more.

#### PACKING A PUNCH IN THE PORTAL

- While setting up her first true high school signing class, Katie Gearlds has found some instant impacts in the transfer portal during her time back at Purdue.
- Gearlds landed Abbey Ellis and Jeanae Terry mere weeks after she was hired on staff. Terry started every game for the Boilermakers during her first two seasons, while Ellis has been a spark plug that has lit up Mackey Arena on numerous occasions.
- Last season, Caitlyn Harper and Lasha Petree provided some much-needed veteran experience and scoring talent into the starting lineup. Petree paced Purdue with 14.7 points per game and Harper was one of 12 players in the Big Ten to average double figures and shoot over 50% from the field.
- Gearlds dipped back into the portal to bring two sisters to the program who played their freshman campaigns elsewhere. Alaina Harper joined after a rookie season at Grand Canyon, and Mila Reynolds made the move to West Lafayette after reaching the Elite Eight last season with Maryland.

# BEEN THERE. THEY'RE BACK

- Purdue's coaching staff features a trio of alumnae who left their marks on the program during their playing days.
- Head coach Katie Gearlds was one of the best pure scorers in Purdue history, reaching four NCAA Tournaments, three
   Sweet 16s and an Elite Eight. She continues to rank in the top-10 of numerous career stat categories and was named an All-American in 2007 as a senior.
- 1999 National Champion and new associate head coach Kelly Komara returned to West Lafayette for her second stint on the sidelines. Komara was the 2002 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and helped the Boilermakers reach two national title games, winning the lone championship in Big Ten women's basketball.
- Alex Guyton is in her fifth season on staff and third as an assistant coach. Guyton reached three NCAA Tournaments and one the Big Ten championship her four-year career for the Boilermakers
- Another new addition to the coaching ranks at Purdue is dynamic recruiting assistant coach Mark Stephens. After spending the last five seasons on staff at Toledo and Xavier, Stephens returns to the state to lead the Boilermakers' posts and recruiting operations. Stephens' in-state ties run deep after serving as a coach at several high schools and managing Indiana Elite as well as other AAU programs.
- While they didn't play for Purdue, director of video and recruiting Lakan Hasser-Smith and graduate assistant Abby Downard are in-state products with deep ties to Katie Gearlds after playing their entire careers for her at Marian.
- Director of operations Amie Anthrop is well-accustomed to the bright lights of Purdue. After an award-winning career as a guard at Southern Indiana, she married Jade Anthrop, brother to Dru (basketball), Danny (football) and Jackson (football).

# **BOILER NOTES**

# THE VOICE OF THE BOILERMAKERS

- In his 34th season calling Purdue women's basketball, playby-play man Tim Newton is closing in on his 1,000th game with Purdue women's basketball.
- He has called 998 games in his time with the Boilermakers.
- Purdue is 680-318 in games called by Newton. He has been on the air for 998 of Purdue's 1,469 total games.
- Newton has provided the call for all seven Big Ten regular season titles, all nine Big Ten Tournament Championships, three Final Fours and 25 of 27 NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Perhaps Newton's best call came in the final seconds of the 1999 National Championship as Purdue became the only Big Ten team to capture the national title.
- "Ladies and gentlemen, the national champion team resides in West Lafayette, Indiana, as Katie Douglas throws the ball skyward. It's over. Purdue wins 62-45, capturing the national championship."
- His first game was on WBAA (920 AM) on Jan. 3, 1991 when No. 3 Purdue downed Ohio State at Mackey Arena 105-45.
- Based on the best research available, Newton and LSU's playby-play voice Patrick Wright will be the only active radio voices to reach 1,000 games called.

#### A WEEKEND FOR THE CHAMPS

- Purdue welcomed home its legendary 1998-99 team this weekend to celebrate the 25-year anniversary of the Big Ten's only national championship in women's basketball over the weekend of Nov. 10-12.
- The championship squad was honored in front of a sold-out Mackey Arena for the men's basketball game on Friday, before an on-field ceremony at the football game on Saturday. The weekend culminated with a halftime ceremony at the women's game in front of 5,002 fans on Sunday.
- Head coach Katie Gearlds unveiled a new trophy display for the Sears Trophy at the front of Mackey Arena, complete with photos and quotes of players from that magical year.
- A major piece from the celebration involved a Boilermaker who was gone too soon. Tiffany Young, a charismatic junior guard passed away four months after winning the title in a car accident. Throughout the 2023-24 season, Purdue will reopen the Tiffany Young Scholarship Endowment to provide a women's basketball student-athlete a scholarship in her name.

### THE BIG TEN'S ONLY NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- Led by National Coach of the Year Carolyn Peck, the Boilermakers finished the year with a program-best 34-1 record, a perfect 16-0 mark in Big Ten play, a Big Ten Tournament title and a 62-45 win in the National Championship Game over Duke.
- The 1998-99 season opened when Purdue knocked off threetime defending national champion and No. 1-ranked Tennessee at Mackey Arena 78-68.
- Stephanie White was named an All-American, the Honda Award winner and the Wade Trophy honoree, as well as the Big Ten Player and Athlete of the Year. Ukari Figgs earned an honorable mention All-America nod and was named the 1999 Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Tournament.
- The victory was bittersweet as guard Tiffany Young tragically died when she was killed by a drunk driver just over four months after winning the national championship. The 1998-99 team have continued to bring back their memories and love for Young over the last 25 years to ensure her impact on their lives will never be forgotten.

#### **PROBOILERS**

- Purdue has four players currently rostered on professional teams in Europe.
- Aya Traore, a teammate of Gearlds' during her playing time in West Lafayette, plays for Lleida in the Spanish LF2 Division.
- Ae'Rianna Harris, a 2020 Purdue graduate, is with Picken Claret in the Spanish LF2 Division.
- Andreona Keys signed to play for Arad in the Romanian Liga Nationala.
- Lasha Petree is suiting up for Vimpelin Veto in the Finnish Korisliiga.

# SELLING OUT MACKEY

- For the third time in program history and the first since 2000, Mackey Arena sold out for a women's basketball game when the Boilermakers faced No. 4 Indiana last season.
- The crowd of 14,876 set a new record for the program and was the then-16th highest-attended game in Big Ten history.
- Following an Indiana-record 17,222 fans when Purdue and Indiana played on Feb. 19, the grand total of fans who watched the best rivalry in college basketball came to a record 32,098.
- The attendance, at the time, was the second largest on campus nation this season behind Missouri at South Carolina (15,444) and Florida at Oklahoma (19,236).
- Purdue was the fifth Big Ten team to go over 10,000 in attendance this season (Michigan, Maryland, Iowa, Indiana).
- In the regular season, Purdue played in the third and ninth most attended games in the nation last year.

#### BACK IN THE BIG DANCE


- The Boilermakers made their return to the NCAA Tournament for the 27th time in program history in 2022-23.
- Led by Carolyn Peck, the Boilermakers won the 1999 national title, the only women's basketball championship earned by a Big Ten program.
- In addition to the championship, Purdue has reached two title games (2001 loss to Notre Dame), three Final Fours, eight Elite Eights and 12 Sweet 16s.
- Six Boilermakers have been named to the Final Four All-Tournament Team, including 1999 Most Outstanding Player Ukari Figgs.
- Eighteen players have garnered NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team honors, with Katie Gearlds garnering the laurel in 2007.
- · Purdue has a 47-26 all-time record in March Madness.

#### A WINNING HISTORY

- Putting on the Old Gold & Black carries with it a standard that was set more than three decades ago when the Boilermakers lifted their first Big Ten title in 1991.
- Purdue is the only Big Ten team to win a national championship in women's basketball.
- Reaching the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2016-17 last season with a bid to the First Four, the Boilermakers' 27 NCAA Tournament appearances are tied with Ohio State for second in the Big Ten behind lowa's 29.
- With its last Big Ten Tournament tile coming in 2013, Purdue owns the record for most league tourney championships with nine (1998-99-2000-03-04-07-08-12-13)
- Purdue has won seven Big Ten regular season championships, good for fourth in the league, with the last one coming in 2002.

### SOMETHING ABOUT A TRUCK

- A heartfelt story told by the Big Ten Network during the 2022-23 season centered around Gearlds' relationship with her parents.
- As a freshman at Beech Grove High School, Gearlds made a deal with her parents that if she was named Indiana Miss Basketball, they would buy her the car of her dreams.
- Four years and an incredible high school career later, her father Tony traded in his truck to surprise Katie with a 2002 yellow Ford Mustang in the family garage. Tony took over Katie's 1988 Chevy Celebrity, driving it until the wheels fell off.
- In the summer of 2022, Katie returned the favor and surprised her dad to buy him any brand new he wanted. The only rule, it could not be red.

- Madison and McKenna Layden are back together for the first time since Madison's senior year of high school in 2020, when the duo guided Northwestern to the 4A IHSAA State Championship game.

- The tandem played basketball, volleyball and tennis together throughout their high school careers.
- Kathie won five Indiana State championships as a head coach, the most by a non-private school head coach, during her career that she retired from in 2023 after 23 seasons.
- Madison claimed a trio of sectional titles and back-to-back 3A state titles, before McKenna joined the high school ranks.
- McKenna owns the Northwestern High School record for points in a game with 47 off nine 3-pointers during her senior year.
- The Laydens were honored in a Hamburger Helper commercial when McKenna and Madison were children.







- Mila finished her career with a 78-30 mark and amassed 2,099 career points, second in program history to Skylar Diggins-Smith.
- Amiyah was the No. 43 player in the nation and the second highest Big Ten signee in the class of 2023, per ESPN. She finished her career ranked second in assists with 564 and in the top 10 in points. Revnolds' senior season came to an abrupt ending due to an foot/ankle injury that will rule her out of the 2023-24 season.
- The unofficial third sister of the group is fellow South Bend Washington Panther Rashunda Jones who created an unstoppable backcourt with Amiyah. The duo went 95-18 over their four years on the court.
- Rashunda finished as the runner up for the 2023 Indiana Miss Basketball.
- · Their father Steve was the head coach of South Bend Washington assisted by their mother Marcy, both of whom played professionally overseas.
- · Mila and Amiyah are two of the seven Reynolds children.
- The Reynolds and Rashunda Jones have played together since grade school after attending church together as children.

#### AN IMPACT BACK IN WEST LAFAYETTE

- In two seasons back at her alma mater, Katie Gearlds has guided the Boilermakers back to the postseason twice.
- After posting a 19-win campaign in 2022-23, Gearlds joined the elite company of Carolyn Peck and Lin Dunn as the only Boilermaker head coaches to post win improvements in each of their first two campaigns.
- The Boilermakers made their return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017 with a bid to the First Four last year.
- Prior to her arrival, Purdue had dropped its last 19 games against a ranked opponent. In two seasons, Gearlds has racked up three, including the program's first AP top-5 win in a true road game against No. 2 Ohio State in 2022-23.
- Katie Gearlds reached the 250-win plateau for her career against Harvard, reaching the feat in 315 career games.

#### HITTING THE RECRUITING TRAIL

- The 2023-24 freshmen made up Gearlds' first true recruiting class through an entire cycle.
- Landing five signees in November of 2022, the 2023 class ranked No. 21 in the nation, before Gearlds welcomed in top-50 player Amiyah Reynolds to the program the following May.
- A former Indiana Miss Basketball, Gearlds has placed a major emphasis on recruiting and ensuring the best talent in the state comes to Purdue.
- Gearlds has also found success in the transfer portal with Jeanae Terry and Abbey Ellis garnering All-Big Ten nods, while Lasha Petree and Caitlyn Harper powered the offense in 2022-23.

#### THE JOB SO FAR

- Gearlds guided the Boilermakers on another step forward in 2022-23, making the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017.
- After having a full offseason to prepare, the Boilermakers went 19-11 and tallied a pair of ranked wins over No. 22 Illinois and No. 2 Ohio State.
- The Katie Gearlds era started sooner than expected in 2021-22, when she took over the program a mere 47 days prior to the season opener.
- Purdue finished 17-15 on the year, winning 10 more games than the previous campaign. It was the best win improvement by firstyear head coach at Purdue and the third best in program history.
- The Boilermakers finished 10-2 in the non-conference, marking the second-best clip by a first-year head coach.
- The Boilermakers reached the postseason for the first time since 2017-18, ending the campaign in the second round of the WNIT.

#### COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Spent eight seasons taking Marian University winning back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2016 and 2017.
- Went 228-50 record, an 82% clip with the Knights.
- Three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year, won 10 total Crossroads League titles and made seven appearances in the NAIA Tournament.
- Guided 12 WBCA NAIA All-America selections, compared to just five in the first 37 years of the program's existence.

### PROFESSIONAL CAREER

- Played professionally over six seasons
- Spent three seasons in the WNBA with the Seattle Storm,
- Was taken with the seventh overall pick in the 2007 WNBA Draft, the highest selection ever from Purdue
- Two of her closest teammates and friends over the years are WNBA legend Sue Bird and fellow WNBA great and New Orleans Pelicans Vice President of Basketball Operations Swin Cash.
- Gearlds is the highest draft pick in Purdue history, going seventh overall to the Seattle Storm in 2007.

- Ranks fourth in program history with 1,974 points and was the ninth fastest to join the 1,000-point club.

- She also shared the court in Seattle with Swin Cash (V.P. New Orleans Pelicans), Adia Barnes (Arizona head coach) and Lauren Jackson (owner Melbourne Boomers).
- She competed against Chris Paul in the skills challenge ahead of the 2003 McDonald's All-America Game.

#### AN INDIANA LEGEND


- One of the best products of Indiana basketball, Gearlds claimed a state title, a Big Ten championship and a national title with programs from the Crossroads State.
- Named Indiana Miss Basketball as a senior at Beech Grove in 2003, Gearlds guided the Hornets to a 3A state championship, setting a state record across all classes with 33 points in the final. Today, she ranks 11th in state history with 2,521 career points.
- As a Boilermaker from 2003-07, Gearlds reached the NCAA Tournament four times, won two Big Ten Tournament titles, sits fourth in Purdue history with 1,974 career points and holds the record for points in a season with 707 with Stephanie White.
- Following a six-year professional career, Gearlds took over the reins at Marian in Indianapolis, posting a 227-49 record over eight years, winning three NAIA Coach of the Year honors and claiming two national championships.


