### THE NOTES TO KNOW

- One of America's greatest rivalries returns to the hardwood on Saturday night, when No. 17-ranked Indiana arrives in Mackey Arena to take on the No. 5-ranked Boilermakers. The 7:30 p.m., tip marks the first time the game will be played in primetime on a weekend in Mackey Arena since the 2000-01 season. The 43 combined victories between the two teams equal the most in series history.
- Saturday's meeting marks the first time that Indiana and Purdue are ranked in the top 20 in a Mackey Arena contest since Jan. 18, 1994.
- Purdue righted the ship in its last outing – an 82-55 win over Ohio State that snapped a two-game losing streak. The Boilermakers won their 56th straight game when shooting over 50 percent from the field, 40 percent from the 3-point line and 70 percent from the free throw line.
- Purdue is now 15-1 on the season when not ranked No. 1 in the country following the win over Ohio State. The Boilermakers fell to No. 5 in Monday's AP poll, but has been ranked in the AP Top 5 in a school-record 13 consecutive weeks.
- The Boilermakers are looking for their 25th win, which would make this year's team just the seventh season of 25 regular-season victories. **Matt Painter** is looking for his 10th season of 25 or more victories.
- Purdue has won at least 12 Big Ten games for the eighth time in the last nine seasons and is close to locking up a double-bye in the upcoming Big Ten Tournament. Purdue is the only program that has received a double-bye in every year that has been played under the current format.
- Purdue is 53-12 since the start of last season. The 53 wins over a two-year span are already the seventh most in school history and Purdue needs just four wins to tie the record for most wins in a two-year span (57 in 2017, 2018). Iowa is second among Big Ten teams with 43 wins.
- The Boilermakers are nearing their league-leading 25th Big Ten Championship, needing the combination of one win and / or Northwestern loss to clinch at least a share of the title. Purdue (Indiana, at Wisconsin, Illinois) owns a 13-4 record, while Northwestern (at Maryland, Penn State, at Rutgers) has an 11-6 mark. There are five Big Ten teams tied for third in the loss column with seven setbacks.
- Purdue has **MADE** 419 free throws this season, while opponents have **SHOT** just 293. Purdue has made 206 more free throws (419 to 213) than its foes this season, the highest discrepancy in the nation (Purdue +206, Portland +164, North Carolina +155, Texas A&M +150).
- Purdue is shooting 75.8 percent from the free throw line this season, currently the Big Ten leader (all games played) and the third-highest percentage in school history (1982-1989; 1969-1980).
- In Purdue's last six home games (all wins by an average of 16.3 points), it boasts an offensive efficiency of 123.4 and a defensive efficiency of 87.9. It is shooting 48.3 percent from the field and 38.3 percent from long distance, while outrebounding foes by 17.0 boards per game. It has averaged at least 1.22 points per possession in five of the six games during that stretch (PSU, Ohio State, Iowa, Neb, MSU).
- Purdue has been ranked in the nation's top five in 25 of the last 35 polls dating to the preseason poll a year ago. Gonzaga (21), Houston (16) and Kansas (15) are the only other programs to have at least 15 weeks ranked in the top 5.
- Sixteen of Purdue's 24 wins have come against the KenPom top-100, the second-highest number of top-100 wins in the country (Kansas - 16). Purdue is also second behind Kansas in top-50 victories with 10 (Kansas has 13).
- Purdue is in search of its fourth No. 1 seed in school history, previously earning the No. 1 seed in 1988, 1994 and 1996. In addition, **Zach Edey** is the leader to earn consensus National Player of the Year accolades. The last time Purdue earned a No. 1 seed, it was led by its last consensus National Player of the Year recipient, **Glenn "Big Dog" Robinson**. Since 2000, eight players have earned consensus National Player of the Year accolades and led their team to a No. 1 seed, including four times in the last eight years (Williamson, Brunson, Mason, Kaminsky).
- Zach Edey** surpassed 750 career rebounds in the win over Ohio State and is the only active junior (or younger) in the country with 1,350 career points and 750 rebounds. He and former No. 1 NBA Draft pick **Joe Barry Carroll** are the only Purdue players to ever do it.

FILLING UP THE QUAD-1 COLUMN

- Purdue owns one of America's best resume, ranking second in the country in quad-1 wins behind Kansas (13).
- There are only three teams (Purdue 9-4; Alabama 7-4; Miami 7-4) nationally that have played at least 11 quad-1 games and have four or fewer setbacks this season.
- In addition, Purdue is one of seven teams to not have a quad-2, 3 or 4 loss this season (UCLA, Purdue, Missouri, Kansas, Baylor, Texas, Oral Roberts).
- Purdue is also 14-4 in quads 1 and 2, the second-most wins in quads 1 and 2 combined (Kansas - 17).

THE NEW COURT-STORMER STANDARD BEARER

- Previously, it was always Duke that got court-stormed in road losses, but Purdue has taken over that recognition.
- From the 2011-12 season to the 2020-21 season, Purdue was court-stormed twice (Nebraska in 2017, Wisconsin in 2018). The Boilermakers have now been court-stormed in seven of its last eight road losses (Indiana 2x, Rutgers, Michigan, Wisconsin, Northwestern, Maryland).

THE LITTLE THINGS ADD UP

- Basketball is a game of single plays that can determine the outcome of the contest at any given point and the Boilermakers have lived that the last two seasons.
- Purdue has lost 10 Big Ten games since the start of last season. Five of the losses have come by opponents hitting a 3-pointer in the last 10 seconds of the game, and another three coming by six or fewer points.
- Outside last year's loss at Michigan (24 points) and Thursday's setback to Maryland (14 points), Purdue's other 10 losses since the start of last year have come by a combined 40 points (4.0 PPG).

IT'S UNANIMOUS

- With research tracking back to the 2002 season, Purdue and Gonzaga are the only teams to be voted a unanimous No. 1 selection in the AP poll in consecutive seasons. Purdue received all 62 first-place votes last week, while also doing so last year (Dec. 6, 2021).

TOP 5 STREAK

- Purdue has been ranked in the top 5 in 13 consecutive weeks, the longest streak in school history.
- Purdue's 25 weeks in the top 5 since the start of last year are the most in the country.

BOILERMAKERS MOVE TO THE TOP SPOT

- A year ago, Purdue ascended to the top spot in the AP Top 25 poll for the first time in school history on Dec. 6, 2021. Purdue has already surpassed the number of weeks it has held the top spot when voted No. 1 seven times this season.
- Purdue is the first Big Ten program to be ranked No. 1 in consecutive seasons since Indiana in 1975 and 1976. It has only happened three previous times for a Big Ten program in AP poll history.

GLASS WORK

• Purdue has only been outrebounded in three games this year, leading the country by a significant margin in rebound margin.

• However, Purdue's -12 (23-35) rebound margin to Maryland was its lowest margin in over three years (-16 vs. Illinois on Jan. 21, 2020).

• In addition, Purdue's three offensive rebounds were its fewest since having two against Ohio State on Feb. 7, 2018.

• Purdue, however, righted the ship against Ohio State, outrebounding the Buckeyes by a 44-21 advantage, grabbing 14 offensive rebounds.

• Purdue has outrebounded six Big Ten opponents by at least 15 rebounds, including four of its last six foes (Ohio State +23, Iowa +20, Indiana +16, Penn State +19).

• Purdue leads the country in rebound margin by 2.1 rebounds over UConn. The margin is the fourth-highest for a leader since 2009-10.

HEAD COACH MATT PAINTER

- **Record at Purdue:** 408-196 (.675) / 18th year | **Career Record:** 433-201 (.683) / 19th year
- With six Sweet 16 appearances, 13 NCAA Tournament berths, three Big Ten regular-season championships, a Big Ten Tournament title, an Elite Eight and an international gold medal on his résumé, 18th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
  - He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.
  - Painter was named the 2019 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to seven straight NCAA Tournaments – the sixth-longest active streak in America. Included in that stretch are Sweet 16 appearances (and beyond) in four of the last five tournaments.
  - Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
  - Painter will enter the 2022-23 season second on the school's all-time wins list (384) behind legendary mentor **Gene Keady** and ahead of **Ward “Piggy” Lambert**, both of whom have been inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame.
  - Has averaged almost 23 wins a season in his 17 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 23.5 wins per year over the last 15 seasons.
  - Has won at least 25 games in 10 of his 18 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
  - Painter's four Big Ten Coach of the Year honors are the third most in league history (**Gene Keady - 7; Bobby Knight - 5; Bo Ryan - 4**).
  - Painter has averaged 11.4 wins per year in conference play, the fifth-best average in Big Ten Conference history.
  - Painter's 13 NCAA Tournament appearances in the last 15 events are the eighth most in the country.
  - Coach Painter's 14 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2023 – Painter is 52 years old).
  - Purdue has finished first, second or third in Big Ten play in nine of the last 15 years.
  - Has had 73 Academic All-Big Ten honorees in his 17 previous years at Purdue.
  - Lastly, the five winningest classes in school history have come during the Painter era (2019, 2018, 2012, 2011, 2010).
