STORY LINES

- A victory would move the Boilermakers into a tie atop season. Kickoff from Memorial Stadium is set for 12 p.m. against Illinois ET on ESPN2.
- The Boilermakers have won five of the past six Cannon Trophy games, as well as five in-a-row in Champaign dating back to 2010.
- The last time the two teams met, the Boilermakers 94-yard drive by Aidan O'Connell coming off the bench.
- The Boilermakers have limited negative plays on offense, fourth most in the country. seventh in the nation.
- The Purdue defense ranks Top 25 nationally in third conference play (300.5 yards per game). down defense (12th), fourth down defense (19th) and . The Boilermakers have controlled time of possession in rushing defense (25th).

- The Cannon Trophy is not the only thing that is up for Wide receiver Charlie Jones ranks top 10 nationally in grabs when Purdue Football travels west to face Illinois. receptions per game (2nd-9.2), receiving touchdowns (4th-9) and receiving yards (6th-944). Last year with the Big Ten West with just two weeks remaining in the lowa, Jones returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown
 - Purdue leads the Big Ten in passing offense (298.0 yards per game), ranking 16th nationally. The Boilermakers improve that to a conference-best 300.5 yards per game in league action.
- Aidan O'Connell paces the Big Ten in passing yards per protected their home field with a 13-9 victory behind a late, game, averaging 304.8 yards to also rank ninth nationally. The sixth-year senior completes 28.6 passes per game,
- allowing only 3.78 tackles-for-loss on average to rank O'Connell enters the contest as the only Big Ten quarterback to average more than 300 passing yards in
 - eight straight games, and their time of possession (33:07) ranks 13th in the nation.

NUMBERS TO KNOW



Charlie Jones is one of only three wide receivers in the country averaging nine receptions per game. His 9.2 mark ranks second nationwide.



Aidan O'Connell has completed 67 percent of his passes throughout his Purdue career, ranking first in school history for career completion percentage.



Although it's the 98th meeting between the two programs, Saturday's game is the 71st edition with the Cannon Trophy at stake. Purdue holds the advantage in Cannon Trophy matchups 38-30-2.



Purdue is the only team to average more than 300 passing yards in Big Ten play, above the Boilermakers' overall season average (298).

CHUCK'S SIZZLIN'

- · Wide receiver Charlie Jones has made an immediate impact since transferring to Purdue from Iowa, ranking second nationally in receptions per game (9.2), fourth in receiving touchdowns (9) and sixth in receiving yards (944).
- · Jones has recorded six 100-yard games this season, including four in B1G play, to become the sixth Boilermakers to accomplish the feat in a single year.
- · In conference action, Jones has hauled in 9.0 receptions per game to average 94.0 yards per game; both marks lead B1G
- · He is one touchdown away from becoming the 10th receiver in Purdue history to record 10 touchdowns in a single season.
- It's safe to say Jones enjoys the Purdue offense. After making 21 catches for 323 yards and three touchdowns during the entire 2021 season, it only took him three games to surpass last year's totals with the Hawkeyes.
- · With three multi-touchdown games, Jones is just the sixth Purdue receiver since 2000 to have three-or-more multitouchdown games in a season.
- Jones ranks among the nation's best in several statistical categories.

RECEIVER U

- · With 47 receptions to begin his Purdue career, Charlie Jones became the only Big Ten receiver since 2000 to haul in 45 or more passes in the first five games of a season.
- After Jones, David Bell caught 43 passes to start the 2020 season; now a member of the Cleveland Browns, Bell was a 2021 consensus All-American and Biletnikoff Award finalist.
- · Minnesota's Eric Decker hauled in 43 receptions in 2009 to break up the list of Boilermakers, while Rondale Moore rounds out the top five with 41 catches to begin the 2018 season.
- Jones joined Taylor Stubblefield as the only receivers from the Big Ten to record seven touchdown catches in the first four games of a season. Stubblefield, currently the wide outs coach at Penn State, was a consensus All-American in 2004.

THE RECONNECTION

- Playing youth football together, Aidan O'Connell and Charlie Jones were reunited at Purdue this offseason. Years passed since they were teammates, but you would not have known it in the season opener versus Penn State.
- O'Connell found Jones 12 times in his Purdue debut, and the duo connected for 153 yards through the air, both career highs.
- A week later, the pair connected nine times for 133 yards and three scores against Indiana State.
- Jones notched his third straight 100-yard receiving game with a career-high 188 yards and a score from 11 receptions at Syracuse.

ADDED TO BILETNIKOFF

- As one of the nation's leaders in multiple receiving categories, Purdue Football wide receiver Charlie Jones was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.
- The Boilermakers have a history with the Biletnikoff Award. Taylor Stubblefield won the honor in 2004, while David Bell was a finalist just one season ago.
- Named Mid-Season All-America by the Associated Press, Pro Football Focus, The Athletic and Athlon.

- · Brohm has led a trio of Boilermakers to All-America honors in Rondale Moore (2018 First Team), David Bell (2021) and George Karlaftis (2021).
- Of the 10 Purdue coaches who have spent at least five seasons in West Lafayette, Brohm has the best winning percentage (.692) and the most total wins (9) by a coach during his fifth year.
- Purdue has averaged over 300 yards passing per game each of the last four years under Brohm, a first in program history.
- During the Brohm era, eight Boilermakers have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including three in the 2022 NFL Draft (George Karlaftis - 1st Round, Kansas City Chiefs; David Bell -3rd Round, Cleveland Browns; Zander Horvath - 7th Round, Los Angeles Chargers).

BROHM AND THE BOILERMAKERS: YEAR 6

- Jeff Brohm is in his sixth year at the helm in West Lafavette.
- Brohm boasts a career record of 63-43, a .594 winning percentage, with more than half of those wins coming at Purdue. · A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior · Purdue would be tied with Illinois at 4-3 alongside the winner

memorable 2021 campaign.

- The Boilermakers have made three bowl appearances in five years under Brohm, joining Joe Tiller and Jim Young as the only twice under head coach Jeff Brohm (2018, 2021), seeking their first Purdue coaches to accomplish that feat.
- Over Brohm's six seasons at the helm, the Purdue offense has averaged 309 yards per game and 27.6 points per game.
- Purdue has had three All-Americans since Brohm's arrival: the Boilermakers only had three All-Americans from 2004-17.
- Boilermakers have won five individual Big Ten honors under Brohm's guidance: Big Ten Freshman of the Year (Rondale Moore - 2018, David Bell - 2019), Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year (Moore - 2018, Bell - 2021), Big Ten Tight End of the Year (Brycen Hopkins - 2019).

CANNON TROPHY HISTORY

- · The Cannon was conceived by Purdue students more than · Wide receiver Charlie Jones leads the BIG in receptions per 100 years ago but was first presented as a trophy by an Illinois game (9.2), receiving yards per game (104.9) and receiving yards alumnus 76 years ago.
- · It all started in 1905 when a group of Purdue students took the weapon to Champaign in anticipation of firing it to celebrate a victory. Although Purdue did win the game 29-0, Illinois supporters, including Quincy A. Hall, had discovered the Big Ten. the Cannon in its hiding place - in a culvert near the old Illinois field - and confiscated it before the Purdue students could start their "booming" celebration. Later, Hall moved the Cannon to his farmhouse near Milford, Illinois, where it survived a fire between the two schools when the rivalry was resumed in 1943 after a 12-year lapse.
- The Tomahawk Service and Leadership Honorary at Purdue and Illini Pride now share the maintenance duty.

BATTLE FOR THE CANNON TROPHY

- of the past six battles. The Boilermakers have collected 13 wins in victories away from Ross-Ade Stadium, their most since 1943. the last 17 matchups dating back to 2003.
- The two schools first played in 1890, with Purdue holding a BOWLING ON THE HORIZON slight 46-45-6 edge in the all-time series.
- The Boilermakers broke the all-time series tie with a 13-9 win in fourth time in six seasons under head coach Jeff Brohm. West Lafayette a season ago.

- · Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell has had some memorable moments against the Illini over his career.
- He tossed his first career touchdown pass in the 2019 game, an a Purdue freshman running back since Brandon Jones in 2002. 11-yard connection to Payne Durham.
- Leading Purdue to a 31-24 victory in 2020, O'Connell threw for RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS 371 yards and two touchdowns to record the first 300-yard game of his career.

BIG WINS AWAY FROM HOME

- Playing on the road in Big Ten play hasn't fazed Purdue lately. The Boilermakers have won five of their past seven conference and gathered dust until Hall suggested it be used as a trophy games away from home, including the two this season against Minnesota (Oct. 1) and Maryland (Oct. 8).
 - Two of those victories were over ranked teams. Purdue beat No. 2 Iowa 24-7 last season (Oct. 16, 2021), while knocking off No. 21 Minnesota this October.
- · Last season, Purdue went 3-1 in B1G games away from home. which included a neutral site win over Northwestern at Wrigley - Purdue leads the Cannon series 38-30-2, including winning five Field. The Boilermakers ended the 2021 campaign with five

- · Purdue is one win away from becoming bowl eligible for the
- · Taking the Boilermakers to another bowl game, Brohm would join Joe Tiller as the only coaches in Purdue history to make four bowl appearances in their first six years guiding the program.
- The last time Purdue went to four bowls over a six-year span, Tiller led the Boilermakers for four appearances in five years (2003-2007). In 12 seasons under Tiller, Purdue reached 10 bowls, including a Rose Bowl trip during the 2000 campaign.

- Don't underestimate redshirt-freshman Devin Mockobee. The walk-on running back leads the Purdue rushing attack with 626 yards and six touchdowns, averaging 5.4 yards per carry.
- In regards to freshman running backs throughout Purdue history, Mockobee ranks fourth in yards, fifth in touchdowns, sixth in attempts and seventh in yards per carry.
- Mockobee's 78.3 yards per game on the ground rank fourth nationally among freshman running backs, while leading the B1G.
- · He has produced three 100-yard games this season, the most by

- While Purdue is primarily known for its passing game, the Boilermakers have rushed for 14 touchdowns compared to 18 through the air.

- Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell and Illinois tight end Michael Marchese both attended Stevenson High School in Long Grove, III.
- Purdue long snapper Nick Zecchino and Illinois quarterback Tommy DeVito are both from Cedar Grove N.J. • In the win over Nebraska, the line paved the way for 217 rushing
- Purdue defensive end Jack Sullivan and Illinois linebacker yards, the most by a Purdue offense in four years. Malachai Hood are both from Plainfield, Ill.
- Purdue wide receiver Collin Sullivan and Illinois wide receiver Casey Washington are both from Round Rock, Texas
- Purdue head coach Jeff Brohm was previously the quarterbacks coach at Illinois in the 2010-2011 season.
- Purdue wide receivers coach Garrick McGee spent the 2016-17 seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Illinois.

STING LIKE A 100-YARD MOCKOBEE

- All three of Devin Mockobee's 100-yard games this season have come in Big Ten games, and his 5.4 yards per carry rank fifth in the conference.
- · He produced his second straight 100-yard game, rumbling for 108 yards and a touchdown at Wisconsin.
- · The Boonville, Indiana, native had his best game as a Boilermaker in the win over Nebraska, recording 206 all-purpose yards (178 rushing, 28 receiving). His 178 yards on the ground set a new single-game record for rushing yards by a Purdue freshman, and Mockobee was rewarded Big Ten Freshman of the Week for his performance.
- Mockobee produced his first 100-yard game at No. 21 Minnesota, recording 112 yards rushing on only 11 carries to average 10.2 yards per rush. Late in the fourth quarter with Purdue ahead by three points, Mockobee broke free for a 68-yard run and motored into the end zone from two yards out on the following play to put the game on ice.
- Mockobee became the first Purdue freshman to rush for 100 yards since Brian Lankford-Johnson in 2016 (127 yards at Illinois
- The 68-yard rush at Minnesota was the longest run by a Boilermaker since Rondale Moore scampered 76 yards against Northwestern (Aug. 30, 2018).

BRING ON THE PAYNE

- Tight end Payne Durham has been an important piece of the Purdue offense, hauling in 41 catches for 411 yards and four PICKS CENTRAL touchdowns to rank second among Boilermakers in all three . The Purdue defense has recorded 10 interceptions through the categories.
- · Durham's 41 catches rank fifth in the nation among tight ends, including second in the Big Ten.
- In the win over Nebraska, Durham eclipsed 1,000 receiving yards for his career to become just the eighth Purdue tight end to accomplish the feat.
- Durham came through in the clutch against Maryland (Oct. 8), catching the go-ahead touchdown pass before rumbling 56 yards to set up another late Purdue touchdown. He made seven catches for 109 yards, both team highs, to record the third 100yard game of his career.
- Durham sits into a tie for 10th in program history with 17 As a unit, the Purdue secondary has 44 career interceptions. receiving touchdowns, second among tight ends, trailing Dave Young (27,1977-80). He is tied with Jim Beirne (1965-67) and Calvin FOUR IN-A-ROW Williams (1986-89) on Purdue's all-time receiving TDs list.
- Durham's progression in college from backup to all-conference caliber is made more impressive when you consider he played one year of high school football after playing lacrosse all his life.

STRENGTH ON THE LINE

- · Purdue veteran offensive line has been a major factor for success on that side of the ball.
- · The Boilermakers allow only 3.78 tackles-for-loss per game, ranking second in the Big Ten and seventh in the nation.
- The trio of Gus Hartwig, Spencer Holstege, and Eric Miller have started the past 24 games alongside one another. Holstege leads the way with 27 straight starts, followed by Hartwig (25) and Miller (24).

AIDAN ADDING TO HIS LEGACY

- Beginning his career as a walk-on and eighth on the quarterback depth chart, Aidan O'Connell worked his way up to the starting role and didn't stop there. The sixth-year QB has etched his name in the school record books, and he continued to rise up the career charts this season.
- O'Connell already ranks in the program's Top 10 in several career categories: completion percentage (1st - 67.0%), 500-yard games (T1st - 2), 400-yard games (2nd - 5), 300-yard games (2nd - 13), touchdown passes (6th - 58), passing completions (6th - 735) and passing yards (6th - 8,167).
- Aidan O'Connell paces the Big Ten in passing yards and total offense. Completing nearly 30 passes per game, he sits fourth in the country. His 304.8 passing yards per game rank ninth
- O'Connell has kept up his game against conference opponents, throwing for an average of 300.5 yards in B1G games to lead the
- In his 13 300-yard games over his career, O'Connell has eclipsed 350 yards in 12 of them. Prior to Saturday, he threw for 300 yards in three straighth games, accomplishing the feat for the second time in his career. Drew Brees and Jim Everett are the only other QBs in Purdue history to produce three straight 300-yard games twice over a career.
- O'Connell torched the Syracuse defense with a season-high 424 passing yards and three touchdowns. He has five career 400yard passing games; only Brees has more (7).

- The Boilermakers have tallied seven interceptions in conference contests, the second-most in league play.
- Two of the interceptions have been returned for touchdowns, one by Chris Jefferson against Penn State and the other by Cam Allen versus Indiana State.
- Allen leads the way with three interceptions, while Jefferson is close behind with two.
- With 15 interceptions for his career (13 at Findlay, 2 at Purdue), Jefferson ranks second on the NCAA active career list across all divisions.
- Allen has 10 as a Boilermaker, ranking 10th in program history.

- · Purdue put together a four-game winning streak prior to the loss at Wisconsin for the first time the 2018 season.
- The Boilermakers won four straight games in 2018, which included the memorable 49-20 victory over No. 2 Ohio State.
- The 2018 and 2022 seasons are the only ones over the past 15 years that have featured four-game winning streaks. The 2006 and 2007 Boilermakers won their first four games of each season under loe Tiller.

- In the 43-37 win over Nebraska, the Boilermakers popped the Cornhuskers for 608 yards of total offense for the eighth-most vardage in school history.
- The Boilermakers racked up 391 yards through the air and 217 on the ground, just the second time in the past 25 years that they (77%). surpassed 350 passing yards and 200 rushing yards (Oct. 13, 2018 at Illinois). Both instances have occurred under Jeff Brohm.
- · Purdue rushed for 217 yards, the most on the ground in a B1G game since the 2018 game at Illinois.
- The offense ran 101 plays while tying a school record with 38 SPOILERMAKERS first downs.

- · The Boilermakers have been successful in the red zone this season, scoring 35 out of 38 times for a 92 percent rate and ranking No. 13 in the country.

- · Last season, Purdue knocked off previously unbeaten No. Boilermakers two wins over Top 5 teams for the first time since 1960.
- The Boilermakers beat three ranked teams during the 2018 campaign, Brohm's second season, for the most victories over ranked teams in a single-season since 2003.
- Prior to Brohm's arrival in West Lafayette in 2017, Purdue only won two out of 27 games against AP-ranked teams over the

- With starting running back King Doerue missing five games due to injury, a pair of walk-ons took over the backfield.
- Dylan Downing and Devin Mockobee have rushed for 951 yards this season, including 477 yards over the five weeks with Doerue out of the lineup.
- Downing ran for a career-high 113 yards in the win over FAU, the first 100-yard game of his career.
- One week later, Mockobee led the way with 112 yards on the ground that included a pair of rushes for 70 yards that resulted in a touchdown and clinched Purdue's victory over No. 21 Minnesota.
- Downing and Mockobee's performances gave the Boilermakers different 100-yard rushers in consecutive games for the first time since 2017 when Markell Jones recorded 217 yards in a win over Indiana and D.J. Knox added 101 yards in a Foster Farms Bowl victory (vs. Arizona).

SMILE FOR THE CAM

- Senior safety Cam Allen factored in two of Indiana State's three turnovers, recovering a fumble on the first play of the game before returning an interception for a touchdown in the third quarter.
- After recording a pair of interceptions to help Purdue earn a 20-10 victory at No. 21 Minnesota, senior safety Cam Allen was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.
- Allen earned the accolade for the second time in his career. His other weekly award came following a two-interception game against a ranked opponent as well, Purdue's win over No. 2 lowa (Oct. 16, 2021).
- · Against Indiana State, Allen became the first Boilermaker to · Despite playing in just five games this season, Graham ranks record an interception and fumble recovery since Anthony Brown third on the team in total tackles (27); his 5.4 tackles per game accomplished the feat, also against Indiana State (Sept. 12, 2015).

Kane's came on the first play of the game against Indiana State and Wahlberg's sealed the win on a fourth down against FAU. Jenkins and Jalen Graham have also forced fumbles this season.
- · Purdue's defense has recovered 2-of-4 fumbles it has forced this year.

- Over the Jeff Brohm era, the Boilermakers have averaged 307.3 yards passing per game at a 65.1% completion clip with 152 touchdowns.

- With All-B1G quarterback Aidan O'Connell unavailable due to injury, fellow sixth-year senior Austin Burton heard his name called to start as Purdue's quarterback versus FAU.
- The start was Burton's first since Oct. 5, 2019 when he was UCLA's starting quarterback against Oregon State.
- The Newton, Massachusetts, native completed 72.4 percent of his passes (21-of-29) for 166 yards and three touchdowns.
- · Two of Burton's three touchdown passes were to his roommate, Charlie Iones.
- Burton didn't seem to have much rust, marching the Boilermakers down the field on the opening drive by completing all six of his passes that resulted in a touchdown toss to Jones.

BROHM AIR RAID

- · Head coach Jeff Brohm's offensive air-raid style has produced dividends over his coaching career at Purdue and Western
- Over his two coaching stops, Brohm's offenses have accounted for 16 400-yard passing games (8 at Purdue, 8 at WKU).
- Since Brohm got his head coaching start in 2014, only two coaches have had more 500-yard passing games than him - Mike Leach (14) and Kliff Kingsbury (11).

- After Purdue ranked last in the Big Ten a season ago in punting, sophomore Jack Ansell has completely turned around the Boilermakers' punt game and earned a spot on the mid-season Ray Guy Watch List.
- · Ansell averaged 38.3 yards per punt as a freshman, but the Aussie has increased his output to 42.8 yards per punt this year.
- · Against FAU, Ansell booted a career-long 67-yard punt that was downed at the 4-yard line; the punt was the longest by a Boilermaker since 2019.
- · Despite only punting three times against the Owls, Ansell took advantage of his opportunities to flip the field by averaging 55.3
- The Australian boomer followed up that performance with a trio on five balls of 50-yard punts at No. 21 Minnesota.
- Ansell has forced eight fair catches, dropped eight balls inside the 20-yard line, launched seven 50-yard boots and caused a trio of muffs.
- Ansell worked with ProKick Australia to prepare to play collegiate football in the United States, following a high school career as a Victoria state champion triple jumper in Australia.

- Purdue's 56-0 win over Indiana State was the largest margin of victory since beating Southeast Missouri 59-0 in 2011.
- · The victory was the second shutout of the Jeff Brohm era, joining the 49-0 win over UConn last season.
- · Purdue allowed only 145 yards of total offense, the lowest output by an opponent since Oregon mustered just 143 yards in 1979.
- · The Boilermakers held the Sycamores to just 51 yards on the ground, the third time in the Brohm era that Purdue has held an opponent to less than 60 rushing yards (Nov. 11, 2021 vs. Indiana, 58; Oct. 28, 2017 vs. Nebraska, 40).

300-YARDERS

- Aidan O'Connell started his 2022 campaign with 365 yards passing against Penn State for his ninth career 300-yard game, before adding his 10th with a 424-yard performance at Syracuse.
- With five this season, O'Connell is up to 13 in his career for the second most in program history.
- · Last year, he joined Drew Brees as the only Purdue quarterbacks to record multiple 500-yard games over a career, while becoming the only one to reach the 500-yard mark twice in a single season.
- O'Connell threw for a career-high 536 yards in an upset victory over No. 3 Michigan State before ending the year with 534 passing yards to help Purdue beat Tennessee in the Music City Bowl.
- The gunslinger produced six 300-yard games in 2021, the thirdmost in a single season and the first Purdue quarterback to accomplish the feat since Curtis Painter in 2007.
- Drew Brees owns the record with 16.
- All but one of O'Connell's 13 300-yard passing games have been for 350 vards or more.

BIG PLAY POTENTIAL

- So far this season, Purdue has 17 plays of 30 yards or more, including six passes from Aidan O'Connell to Charlie Jones and both interceptions returned for a touchdown.
- since Rondale Moore carried 76 yards in his record breaking season, a 56-0 over Indiana State. performance against Northwestern in 2018.
- The Boilermaker offense tallied 29 plays of 30 yards or more in 2020, as well as 11 of 50 yards or more.
- O'Connell has 38 career throws over 30 yards or more and 12 over 50 yards.
- · Purdue's three longest plays from 2021 all came in that exhilarating TransPerfect Music City Bowl with O'Connell finding Broc Thompson for touchdowns of 75 and 70 yards and Durham for a 62-yard catch-and-score.

99th SEASON AT ROSS-ADE STADIUM

- The Boilermakers call Ross-Ade Stadium home for the 99th season in 2022.
- A roughly two-year construction process for \$237,500 (\$3.76 million) with funds raised by Purdue alumni David E. Ross and George Ade helped replace Stuart Field, which had hosted Purdue Football since its inception.
- Ross-Ade Stadium had the perfect dedication and opening, a 26-7 drubbing of Indiana for homecoming on Nov. 22, 1924.
- · Originally seating 13,500 with an additional 5,000 standing spots, Ross-Ade Stadium now can hold up to 61,320, including non-ticketed personnel.

OUR MAN MITCH

- Mitchell Fineran is 10-for-14 on the year on field goals with a long of 46 yards.
- · Fineran is fourth among active kickers across all divisions with 75 made kicks.
- Fineran has made 34 kicks during his time at Purdue, which moved him into sole control of sixth in program history.
- His 79.1% (34-43) field goal clip sits atop Purdue's career leaderboard by kickers with 15 or more attempts.
- Fineran was tabbed honorable mention by the Big Ten coaches and media last season after going 24-of-29 on the year with a long of 49.
- · Fineran's 112 points were the second most in a season in program history behind the late Leroy Keyes' 114 in 1967.
- Fineran is a career 79.1% kicker and is 59-of-73 (80.8%) on kicks inside 40 yards.

IN MEMORY OF DAVE BUT7

- Dave Butz, a legend of Purdue Football who was inducted in the College Football Hall of Fame, passed away Friday (Nov. 4) at the age of 72.
- Butz (1970 to 1972) was elected into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2014. He was a consensus All-American as a senior, the recipient of the Zipp Award as college football's outstanding player and a finalist for the Lombardi Award (presented to the best lineman or linebacker).
- Butz earned the reputation as the NFL's iron man, missing merely four games over the course of his career that included 216 contests. He was named NFL Defensive Player of the Year and was selected to the Pro Bowl after recording a career-high 11 sacks in 1983. Butz played in three Super Bowls with Washington: XVII (a 27-17 win over the Miami Dolphins), XVIII (a 38-9 loss to the Oakland Raiders) and XXII (a 42-10 win over the Denver Broncos).

SECOND SEASON WITH ENGLISH/HAGEN

- Purdue is in its second season with co-defensive coordinators Ron English and Mark Hagen. The duo, along with fellow codefensive coordinator Brad Lambert who left for Wake Forest during the offseason, provided some much-needed stability to the defensive side of the ball.
- · With Hagen's focus on the defensive line and English handling the defensive backs, Purdue trimmed opponents' passing yards per game down to 208.7 yards in 2021, which ranked fifth nationally and second in the Big Ten.
- The Boilermakers also posted their first shutout since 2011 with Devin Mockobee's 68-yard rush was Purdue's longest a 49-0 drubbing of UConn before recording another shutout this

REMEMBERING LEN DAWSON

- The Boilermakers bid farewell to one of the iconic greats and a pioneer of the Cradle of Quarterbacks in Len Dawson, who passed away Aug. 24 at the age of 87.
- · A three-year starter at Purdue, Dawson was named All-Big Ten and led the conference in passing and total offense all three seasons. He set then-records at Purdue with 3,325 yards and 29 passing touchdowns.
- Over a 19-year career for Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Houston/Kansas City, Dawson threw for 28,711 yards and 239 touchdowns and netted numerous honors, including a win in Super Bowl IV. Super Bowl IV MVP honors, his No. 16 retired by the Kansas City Chiefs and induction to the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- Following his playing career, Dawson served several roles as a broadcaster around football, hosting HBO's "Inside the NFL" for 25 years, landing him back in Canton for a second time as a broadcaster.

GETTING THE SQUAD BACK TOGETHER

- · With the newest additions from the transfer portal, several Boilermakers reunited with old teammates from their youth football days.
- · Quarterback Aidan O'Connell connected with his old youth receiver Charlie Jones from their time together on the Buffalo
- · Receivers Broc Thompson and Tyrone Tracy and defensive back Reese Taylor reunite from their days playing in the Indiana Elementary Football Association. All three started their careers at different schools, but transfered to Purdue over the last two years. Taylor was the quarterback during their youth careers playing with a powerhouse trio of receivers in Tracy, Thompson and David Bell. In high school, Taylor was named Indiana Mr. Football at Ben Davis and Tracy was tabbed Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year in 2017 at Decatur Central.
- Two other players who started their careers elsewhere have reunited at Purdue. Running back Dylan Downing (UNLV) and defensive tackle Cole Brevard (Penn State) led Carmel High School to an Indiana State Championship in 2018.

NATIONAL LEADERS IN 2021

- Completing 70.8 percent of passes, Purdue led the Big Ten and ranked second in the country.
- The Boilermakers limited making penalties, committing a conference-low 4.5 per game that was the 10th-fewest nationally.
- · Purdue's passing offense ranked fifth in the country and second in the Big Ten with 355.4 yards per game.
- Opponents were only been able to convert 8 of 22 fourth down attempts for a .364 conversion rate, putting the Boilermakers 11th nationally in defending fourth downs.
- · Purdue's red zone defense also ranked 23rd in the country.

All-AMERICANS TO THE NFL

- Purdue had to replace a pair of All-Americans in WR David Bell and DE George Karlaftis as the two were taken in the 2022 NFL Draft (Karlaftis - 1st Rd, 30th, Kansas City, Bell - 3rd, 99th, Cleveland)
- · A finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, Bell was named First Team All-America from four (AFCA, AP, FWAA, Walter Camp Football Foundation) of the five outlets recognized by the NCAA to just miss out on being a unanimous selection; however, the Purdue wide receiver became the 21st consensus All-American in Purdue
- Bell earned the Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year as the best receiver in the Big Ten, leading the conference in catches per game (8.5) and receiving yards per game (116.9); both marks ranked Top 5 in the country.
- · Karlaftis became the first defensive Boilermaker to earn All-America honors since Ryan Kerrigan (2010).
- Karlaftis led the Boilermakers in tackles for loss (11.5), sacks (5.0), forced fumbles (3), fumble recoveries (2) and quarterback hurries (8), earning First Team All-Big Ten honors along the way.
- Along with the two All-Americans, Zander Horvath (7th Rd, 260th, Los Angeles Chargers) gave Purdue three Boilermakers taken in the 2022 NFL Draft; it marked the most Boilermakers selected in a single draft since 2008.

HARD KNOCKS BOILERS

- · The long-running HBO series Hard Knocks has several ties to the Purdue Boilermakers during the 2022 season.
- Quarterback David Blough was featured on the preseason edition while with the Detroit Lions. The show highlighted his preseason campaign, as well as his relationship with his wife Olympic sprinter Melissa Gonzalez. After training camp, Blough joined the Minnesota Vikings as a member of their practice
- · Wide receiver Rondale Moore is a part of the in-season version of Hard Knocks later this year. The 2018 consensus All-American is in his second season with the Arizona Cardinals.

2021: A HISTORIC SEASON

- Purdue finished the 2021 season with nine wins for the first time since 2003, when the Boilermakers also were 9-4.
- The nine wins were second-most in program history, as the Boilermakers record at least nine wins for the 12th time in the team's 134-year history.
- Two of those victories were over previously unbeaten No. 2 Iowa (Oct. 16) and No. 3 Michigan State (Nov. 6), giving the Boilermakers two wins over Top 5 teams for the first time since 1960.
- · Purdue finished with a record of 6-3 in Big Ten play, the most conference wins in a season since the 2003 team went 6-2.
- The Boilermakers tied for second in the Big Ten West, finishing in the division's top three for the third time in five seasons under head coach Jeff Brohm (2017, 2018, 2021).
- · Purdue won five games away from home for the first time since 1943, going 5-2 away from Ross-Ade Stadium.
- · Purdue entered the College Football Playoff rankings at No. 19 on Nov. 9, the first-ever in the CFP era for the Boilermakers.
- The season was capped off with a thrilling 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl.
- The Boilermakers held four opponents to fewer than 10 points in 2021, the first time it has achieved the feat since 1978, when six opponents were held to single-digit point totals.

DEGREES IN HAND

- Purdue's 2022 roster features 18 college graduates. Thirteen of those graduates obtained a Purdue undergraduate degree, while five transfers graduated from their previous school.
- · Quarterbacks Aidan O'Connell and Austin Burton have both earned their master's degrees at Purdue.

- Originally announced on April 8, the \$45.4 million initial phase of renovations will strategically enhance several areas of the student-athlete and fan experience within the Ross-Ade footprint, creating a game day environment that is second to none for future generations of Boilermakers.
- The approval granted for Ross-Ade's phase one includes plans for renovations including the construction of a new team entrance/tunnel from the Kozuch Football Performance Complex to Rohrman Field, the conversion of the existing team store into a student-athlete nutrition/dining facility and the construction of a stadium addition adjoining seating in the south end zone.

Jeff Brohm enters his sixth year at the helm of the Purdue Football. A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior to Brohm's arrival, Purdue matched that output in one season - a memorable 2021 campaign - as the Boilermakers continue to be on the rise under Brohm's leadership.

Brohm's three fundamental concepts - playing harder, tougher and smarter than the opposition - have been the benchmarks for his program. His calling cards of creative play-calling and an explosive, high-powered offense has led Purdue to average 419.8 yards per game and 27.6 points per game in his first five seasons.

Playing in Brohm's offense, Boilermakers have been recognized across the league and nationally. They have collected a variety of individual honors, including back-to-back Big Ten Freshman of the Year awards (Rondale Moore - 2018, David Bell - 2019), two Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year awards (Moore - 2018, Bell 2021), the Big Ten Tight End of the Year award (Brycen Hopkins - 2019), and the 2018 Paul Hornung Award winner (Moore) as the nation's most versatile player.

Three Boilermakers have become All-Americans during Brohm's tenure in West Lafayette. Rondale Moore became first true freshman consensus First Team All-American in Big Ten history in 2018 before wide receiver David Bell and defensive end George Karlaftis earned All-American honors following the 2021 season. Bell was a consensus All-American, joining Moore as the second under Brohm and the 21st in Purdue history.

Brohm and his staff continue to make moves on the recruiting trail, signing two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in school history 2019 and 2020. Purdue's 2019 class was ranked 25th nationally - the highest since Joe Tiller inked the No. 20 class in 2004.

The 2021 season featured a 9-4 record, the second-most wins in a single season in Purdue history. The Boilermakers tied for second in the Big Ten West, which included a pair of Top 5 victories over No. 2 Iowa and No. 3 Michigan State. The season was capped off with a thrilling 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee at the TransPerfect Music City Bowl in Nashville.

Purdue exceeded all expectations in his first season in 2017 and made noise throughout college football. The Boilermakers won seven games, recaptured both of its rivalry trophies (the Cannon and the Old Oaken Bucket), and capped the season with Foster Farms Bowl victory over Arizona. They followed that up in 2018 with another Bowl appearance, and Top 25 victories over Boston College, Iowa, and a historic victory over No. 2 Ohio State.

Brohm was hired Dec. 5, 2016, as the 36th full-time head football coach in Purdue history. Widely regarded as one of the most innovative offensive masterminds in college football, he became the first former quarterback to engineer the Boilermakers since Bob DeMoss in 1970.

Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a remarkable 30-10 overall record from 2014 to 2016. The Hilltoppers were league champions in 2015 and 2016. They

won the 2014 Bahamas Bowl and the 2015 Miami Beach Bowl, as well as the 2016 Boca Raton Bowl.

Under Brohm, the Hilltoppers averaged 44.6 points, 356.6 passing yards and 526.2 yards of total offense per game over three seasons. Western Kentucky broke more than 75 school offensive records since 2013, when Brohm served as assistant head coach,

offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Western Kentucky ranked in the top 10 nationally in scoring offense, passing offense and total offense each of Brohm's three seasons as head coach.

Previously, Brohm served as an assistant coach at Louisville (quarterbacks 2003-06, assistant head coach/passing game 2007, assistant head coach/offensive coordinator 2008), Florida Atlantic (quarterbacks 2009), Illinois (quarterbacks 2010-11), UAB (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks 2012) and Western Kentucky (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks 2013). He began his career as the head coach of the Louisville Fire in the af2 in 2002.

Brohm enjoyed an outstanding collegiate career at Louisville from 1989 to 1993. A three-year starter, he still ranks among the Cardinals' career leaders in touchdown passes, total offense, completion percentage, passing yards, passing efficiency, passing attempts and completions through the 2020 season. Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player during both his junior and senior seasons, and his number 11 became part of the Louisville Ring of Honor in 2006.

Brohm played in the NFL six different franchises. In eight career games - all with the 49ers - he completed 37 of 58 passes (63.8%) for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception. His best game came Oct. 27, 1996, when he completed 19 of 30 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown to lead San Francisco to a 10-9 win over the Houston Oilers. In 2001, Brohm played in the XFL for the Orlando Rage and was named first-team All-XFL.

Brohm was a standout player at Trinity High School in Louisville, Kentucky. He won the Kentucky Mr. Football Award as a senior in 1988 while leading the Shamrocks to a state championship and undefeated season. Brohm was named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and was inducted into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in

A native of Louisville, Brohm (born April 24, 1971) earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1994. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Brady, and a daughter, Brooke. Jeff is one of four family members to be a football letterwinner at Louisville - father, Oscar (quarterback 1966-69), and brothers, Greg (wide receiver 1989-92) and Brian (quarterback 2004-07). The Brohm family, including mother, Donna, and sister, Kim, was inducted into the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

A late Penn State touchdown with 57 seconds remaining sent the Purdue football team to a 35-31 loss in the 2022 season opener at Ross-Ade Stadium.

The Boilermakers (0-1) held a 31-28 advantage after Chris Jefferson intercepted Penn State (1-0) guarterback Sean Clifford and returned it 72 yards for a touchdown with 8:29 to play. Purdue held Penn State to just seven plays and 14 yards on its next two possessions, taking the ball back on offense with 4:28 on the clock. Penn State's defense forced Purdue to punt with 2:22 remaining.

The Nittany Lions then took eight plays to cover 80 yards in 1:25 with Clifford hitting Keyvone Lee for 10 yards and the game-

Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell finished the night going 30-59 passing for 365 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions. The sixth-year thrower crossed the 300-yard mark for the ninth time in his career, moving him into sole control of fifth in program history. Running back King Doerue found the end zone twice for his second career multi-score game.

Clifford threw for 282 yards on 20-of-37 passing with four touchdowns and an interception.

Both sides had one giveaway that led to points. Purdue's fumble with 30 seconds remaining in the second saw Penn State score with two seconds left in the first half, while Jefferson's interception return for a touchdown swung the momentum in the fourth.

O'Connell connected with former youth football teammate Charlie Jones in his Purdue debut 12 times. Jones posted a career night receiving with 12 receptions for 153 yards and a touchdown.

PURDUE **INDIANA STATE**

Purdue's defense forced a fumble on the opening play of the game to set the tone in a 56-0 rout of Indiana State on Saturday at Ross-Ade Stadium. The 56-point margin of victory was the largest for Purdue since a 59-point shutout win over Southeast Missouri in 2011.

The Boilermakers (1-1) tallied 521 yards of total offense with a balanced 232 on the ground and 289 through the air. Purdue's defense held the Sycamores (1-1) to 145 yards of total offense.

The defense posted its second shutout of the Jeff Brohm era. Purdue racked up seven tackles-for-loss, three sacks, two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Sanoussi Kane delivered a punishing hit to Indiana State Tee Hodge on the opening play of the game to pop the ball up in the air into safety Cam Allen's

In the third quarter, Allen picked off an Indiana State pass and took it to pay dirt for a 65-yard touchdown. It marked the first time Purdue has interception returns for a touchdown in backto-back weeks since Ricardo Allen achieved the feat in 2010.

Offensively, Purdue scored a touchdown on seven of its first nine drives. The only two drives the Boilermakers failed to score on started inside their own two-vard line.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell was efficient in his one half of action with four touchdowns and 211 yards on 17-of-19 passing. Charlie Jones added to his early haul as a Boilermaker with his second straight 100-yard receiving game. The Deerfield, III., native snagged nine passes for 133 yards and three touchdowns.

Redshirt freshman Devin Mockobee led the rushing attack with 78 yards on 13 touches with one score. Dylan Downing added 55 yards from 11 rushes. Purdue topped 200 yards rushing for the first time since Oct. 13, 2018, in a win over Illinois.

32 SYRACUSE 29 PURDUE

SEPT. 17, 2022 JMA WIRELESS DOME - SYRACUSE, N.Y.

A Syracuse touchdown with seven seconds left to play handed Purdue a 32-29 loss in its road opener on Saturday in the JMA Wireless Dome.

The Boilermakers (1-2, 0-1 B10) held a 9-3 lead over the Orange (3-0, 1-0 ACC) at the end of the first half thanks to a Devin Mockobee 15-yard touchdown run and a Mitchell Fineran 41-yard field goal in what looked to be a defensive dogfight. Purdue's defense held quarterback Garrett Shrader and the Syracuse offense to just 134 total yards and a field goal in the first half of play.

The script would flip in the second half however, as both offenses exploded for a combined 49 points, 42 of which came in the fourth quarter. Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell posted season highs in completions and yards as he finished 39-of-55 for 424 yards, three touchdowns and one interception.

A back and forth second half saw the lead change hands on five different occasions. The teams traded touchdowns until O'Connell's first career pick-six gave the Orange a 25-15 lead with 8:08 left in the game. The Boilermakers would battle right back, as O'Connell found Charlie Jones for a 55-yard bomb to cut the deficit to three before tight end Payne Durham caught his second touchdown of the day to give Purdue a 29-25 lead with just 51 seconds remaining.

Penalties against Purdue aided Syracuse on their final possession as they took five plays to go fifty yards capped off by Shrader finding wide receiver Oronde Gadsden II for a 25yard touchdown to win the game for the Orange.

O'Connell's connection with Charlie Jones continues to drive the Boilermaker offense. Jones racked up a career-high 188 yards and added a touchdown to become just the fifth power five player to have 100 yards receiving and a touchdown in his team's first three games. Two 50-plus yard strikes from O'Connell to Jones sparked Purdue's fourth quarter comeback bid that ultimately fell short.

Behind a balanced offensive attack, the Purdue football team capped the 100th Homecoming celebration with a 28-26 win over FAU on Saturday night at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers used a trio of defensive stops in the fourth quarter along with a four-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Austin Burton to TJ Sheffield to hold on for the

Twice in the fourth quarter, Purdue's defense stepped in front of passes from FAU (2-3) quarterback Nkosi Perry to keep the Boilermakers (2-2) in the lead. Midway through the period, Chris Jefferson intercepted a pass at the Purdue 10-yard line and returned to the FAU 35-yard line. Jefferson's second pick of the season led to a four-yard touchdown catch by TJ Sheffield to extend the lead to 28-20.

Following FAU's touchdown with 5:21 to play that cut the Boilermaker lead to two, Cam Allen dove in front of a doublepass on the Owl's ensuing two-point conversion in the endzone to keep Purdue ahead.

The defense stopped FAU's final drive cold on fourth down with 46 seconds remaining. As Perry reached over a pile on fourthand-one, linebacker Jacob Wahlberg punched the ball free, and Sanoussi Kane pounced on the loose ball to seal the win.

Purdue quarterback Austin Burton, starting in place of the injured Aidan O'Connell, threw for a career-high three touchdowns on 21-for-29 passing and 166 yards. The sixth-year passer worked around an interception in the third quarter to lead Purdue to a scoring drive in each quarter.

The Boilermakers finished with more rushing vards than passing for the first time since 2018 against Eastern Michigan, ending with 188 yards on the ground and 166 through the air. Running back Dylan Downing crossed the century mark for the first time in his career to end the night with 133 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown.

Downing was the first Boilermaker to rush for over 100 yards since Zander Horvath ran for 101 yards against Rutgers in 2020.

Purdue's defense intercepted three passes, while the offense rushed for 160 yards and two scores to pull off a 20-10 win over No. 21 Minnesota on Saturday afternoon at Huntington Bank Stadium. The Boilermakers moved to 3-2 on the year and 1-1 in Big Ten play with their first win in Minneapolis since 2007.

Purdue's defense stymied Minnesota (4-1, 1-1) all afternoon long with a trio of interceptions, seven tackles-for-loss, two sacks and six pass breakups. Safety Cam Allen delivered a pair of momentum swings with an end zone interception in the second quarter, before the game-sealing pick late in the final

Facing an offense that averaged 294.5 yards rushing over its first four games, the Boilermakers were stout defensively, limiting the Golden Gophers to just 47 yards rushing. It was the first time Purdue held a team to 50 or fewer rushing yards since 2017 when Nebraska recorded 40 yards on the ground.

Linebacker Semisi Fakasiieiki led the way defensively with eight stops, including a pair behind the line. Seven different Boilermakers contributed to a tackle-for-loss. Purdue's defense allowed just three points off three giveaways on Saturday.

The Boilermakers jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the first quarter. Running back Dylan Downing pounded his way into the end zone for a two-yard touchdown to start the scoring. Mitchell Fineran later added a season-long 43-yard field goal. The defense meanwhile stood tall on Minnesota's opening four drives, forcing a three-and-out, interception by Jacob Wahlberg,

Purdue's offense found its rhythm in the fourth. Fineran put the Boilermakers back in front with a 25-vard field goal with 4:57 to play. The Boilermakers made it a 10-point gap when redshirt Devin Mockobee found the end zone with 3:13 left on a twoyard rush, following a career-long 68-yard carry.

The defense for Purdue came up big for the second straight week against a potent offense. The Boilermakers produced three sacks to go with six tackles for loss and four break ups.

Head coach Jeff Brohm's squad produced two crucial stops with their backs against the wall. Safety Cam Allen blocked an extra point in the fourth that kept it at a six-point game. Then the Terrapins were turned away by a stout defensive effort on their two-point attempt to tie it up with 0:35 seconds left.

Senior linebacker Jalen Graham returned to the field for his first action since the opener against Penn State and led the team with nine tackles (one for loss). Defensive end Khordae Sydnor had a big day of his own, recording a career high two sacks.

Redshirt senior cornerback Cory Trice nabbed his first interception of the year to give Purdue a pick in five of six games this season. Trice's takeaway led to the first touchdown of the day for the Boilermakers.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell led the way for the offense, going 30-of-41 for 360 yards and two touchdowns. He found ten different receivers on the day to drive Purdue another crucial conference victory at the midway point of the season.

His primary target on the day was tight end Payne Durham. The big man went for 109 yards on seven catches and a touchdown and his huge fourth quarter helped seal the win for the Boilermakers. An endzone snag with 3:19 left tied the game and then a season-long 56 yard catch and rumble down to the two yard-line led to a Devin Mockobee touchdown that sealed the game.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell threw for four touchdowns, running back Devin Mockobee rushed for 178 yards and the defense intercepted a pair of passes as Purdue outlasted Nebraska for a 43-37 win. The Boilermakers pulled within one win of bowl eligibility and improved to 5-2 on the year and 3-1 in Big Ten play.

The Boilermakers are now 3-2 in one-possession games this season.

Purdue jumped out to an early 10-0 lead early in the first after a two-yard touchdown toss from quarterback Aidan O'Connell to TJ Sheffield and a 37-yard field goal by Mitchell Fineran. The Cornhuskers (3-4, 2-2) responded with 10 straight points to even the score midway through the second.

O'Connell started a 17-point run before the half by the Boilermakers with a 31-yard pitch-and-catch to Charlie Jones. Fineran nailed another 37-yard kick before running back Mockobee found pay dirt from one yard out.

After Nebraska rolled off 13 unanswered points to cut the gap to four late in the third quarter, Sheffield danced around the Cornhusker defense for a 28-yard touchdown. Fineran, who went 3-for-4 on the night, tacked on a 34-yard kick in the fourth, before Jones added his second touchdown catch from two yards out with 6:55 to play to open a 43-30 lead.

Nebraska trimmed Purdue's lead down to six with 5:55 left, 0'Connell and the offense ran the clock with a 12-play, 53-yard drive

O'Connell notched the fifth four-touchdown game of his career. The sixth-year thrower connected on 35 of his 54 passes for 391 yards. Receivers Jones and Sheffield both snagged a pair of touchdown passes and finished with 132 and 70 yards receiving, respectively.

The Purdue football team saw its four-game winning streak come to an end Saturday with a 35-24 loss at Wisconsin.

Running back Devin Mockobee topped the century mark rushing for the third time this season and the second straight week. The redshirt freshman carried the ball 23 times for 108 yards and one score.

Wide receiver Charlie Jones grabbed 10 passes for 105 yards. It was his fourth 10-catch game of the season, making him the fifth Purdue receiver to have four or more 10-reception games in a season since 2000.

The Boilermakers (5-3, 3-2) outgained Wisconsin (4-4, 2-3) 431-381 and finished with 111 yards on the ground and 320 through the air. Quarterback Aidan O'Connell threw for 320 yards, his 13th career 300-yard game, on 31-of-46 with one touchdown and three interceptions.

Down 25-in the third quarter, the Boilermakers outscored Wisconsin 21-14 in the second half. Purdue's punt team forced a fumble in the third that long snapper Nick Zecchino pounced on to set up an eight-yard touchdown pass from O'Connell to tight end Payne Durham.

Including Durham's score with 4:12 to play in the third, Purdue found the end zone on three of its final four drives including a pair of one-yard runs by Mockobee and O'Connell.

Wisconsin built a 21-3 lead through the first half, scoring on its first two offensive possessions and returning an interception for a touchdown on Purdue's first drive. Mitchell Fineran gave Purdue its lone points in the opening 30 minutes on a 36-yard field goal late in the second quarter.

On a blustery day in West Lafayette, the Purdue football team could not extend its winning streak against lowa to three games, falling 24-3 to the Hawkeyes on Saturday at Ross-Ade Stadium. Both sides had to battle gusting conditions that featured constant winds of 25 mph with gusts over 45 mph.

Wide receiver Charlie Jones caught 11 passes for 104 yards. He joined Rondale Moore as the second Boilermaker since 2000 to have at least five games with double-digit catches. Jones also became the sixth player in Purdue history to top the century mark six times in a single season.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell threw for 168 yards on 20-of-43 passing with two interceptions. Running back Devin Mockobee had 14 carries for 65 yards.

The Purdue defense recorded seven tackles-for-loss, one shy of the season high. Defensive lineman Jack Sullivan led the way, matching his career high with a pair of stops behind the line. Fellow lineman Lawrence Johnson recorded 1.5 sacks on lowa quarterback Spencer Petras for a new career high.

The two sides traded punts early on without much traction offensively in the first quarter. The Hawkeyes took advantage of a pair of Purdue interceptions to open a 17-0 lead midway through the second.

Mitchell Fineran converted a 34-yard field goal with 1:40 left in the first half for Purdue's only points of the game. The Hawkeyes scored the final points of the game 17 seconds into the third quarter on a 75-yard touchdown run by Keagan Johnson.

Petras connected on 13 of his 23 passes for 192 yards and two touchdowns, while Johnson rushed for 200 yards on 22 touches with one score.
