THE NOTES TO KNOW

- Purdue heads East for the second time in Big Ten play as it looks to win at a place where wins have been tough to come by, visiting Jersey Mike's Arena on Thursday for a contest with the talented Rutgers Scarlet Knights. Purdue enters on a three-game winning streak but will be tested in a facility that the Boilermakers have won just one of their last four meetings.
- In an incredible twist of scheduling fate, the Boilermakers will visit both coasts in a the span of a week, visiting the Jersey Shore and the Atlantic Ocean coast on Jan. 9, before heading to Seattle next week for a journey to the Pacific Ocean to face both Washington and Oregon.
- A win will give Purdue a four-game winning streak, matching its longest of the season (first four games of the year) and a 4-1 mark in Big Ten Conference play. Under Matt Painter, Purdue has started 4-1 or better just four times (2023, 2018, 2011, 2008). Ironically, Purdue has only won the Big Ten regular-season title once when starting 4-1 or better (2023).
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue owns an 18-2 record in the month of January.
- Purdue has just 22 turnovers over the last three games. Purdue averaged 12.3 turnovers per game in the first 12 games of the season. In the last two games, Purdue has 57 assists against 22 turnovers. It has also forced 35 turnovers in that span, a margin of plus-4.33 per game.
- In the last four years, Purdue has defeated teams ranked No. 1 (Arizona), No. 2 (Alabama), No. 4 (Marquette), No. 5 (Villanova), No. 6 (Wisconsin, Tennessee, Gonzaga), No. 7 (Tennessee), No. 8 (Duke) and No. 9 (Illinois). All but Alabama and Illinois came away from Mackey Arena.
- Purdue is now 103-23 since the start of the 2021-22 season, recording the second-most wins in the country (Houston - 106; Connecticut - 103) during that span. The senior class of **Caleb Furst** (only senior) became the seventh class in school history with 100 career victories.
- Purdue's trio of **Trey Kaufman-Renn**, **Fletcher Loyer** and **Braden Smith** have combined for 178 of Purdue's 243 points in the last three games. The trio has gone 68-of-131 (.519) from the field and 22-of-47 (.468) from 3-point range.
- The starting backcourt of **Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** are 74-15 since their arrival at Purdue, starting every game of their tenure. The duo has combined for 2,035 points, 617 rebounds and 763 assists during their careers, shooting 287-of-712 from deep (.403).
- Fletcher Loyer** needs four points for 1,000 in his career. Should he reach 1,000 career points, he would join his backcourt mate **Braden Smith** (1,039 points) to reach the 1,000-point club in the last week (Smith did so vs. Minnesota on Jan. 2).
- Braden Smith** was named Big Ten Player of the Week after averaging 25.3 points, 9.7 assists and 5.3 rebounds per game in three games during the voting week. He went 14-of-32 (.438) from 3-point range and has made at least five 3-pointers in four of the last six games, going 26-of-57 (.456) from deep in the last six games. He is the only player in America with 225 points, 125 assists and 50 rebounds.
- Trey Kaufman-Renn** is one of two players nationally (South Dakota State's **Oscar Cluff**) to average 17.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and shoot at least 57 percent from the field. He has scored in double-figures in all 15 games this season.
- Gicarri Harris** (Grayson HS) and Rutgers' **Ace Bailey** (McEachern HS) squared off in the Georgia Class 7A state basketball championship, with Harris' Grayson team winning the title, 51-41, last March. Harris had nine points in the title game, while Bailey had 18.
- A year ago, Purdue became the first Big Ten team since the Fab Five of Michigan to have two NBA Draft lottery picks from the same recruiting class (**Jaden Ivey** - No. 5; **Zach Edey** - No. 9). Rutgers is expected to have the same this coming draft with **Dylan Harper** and **Ace Bailey**.
- Purdue, Duke, Gonzaga and Houston are the only programs in America to have made at least a Sweet 16, Elite 8 and Final Four during their last five NCAA Tournament appearances. Purdue reached the Sweet 16 in 2022, the Elite 8 in 2019 and the Final Four in 2024.

- Purdue's has been ranked in 48 straight AP polls, 5th-longest nationally.
- D16 poll -> 1st time out of the top 15 since Nov. 21, 2022 (ranked 24th).

►►► SMITH NABS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONOR

- **Braden Smith** was named the Big Ten Player of the Week after a dominating two-week stretch that saw him average 25.0 points, 9.7 assists, 5.3 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game in three Purdue victories (Toledo, Minnesota, Northwestern).
- In the win over Toledo, Smith became the first player since Oklahoma's **Trae Young** to have at least 34 points and 12 assists in a regulation game.
- Then in the win over Minnesota, Smith became the first Big Ten player since **Draymond Green** in March 2012 to have at least 20 points, 10 assists and five rebounds with no turnovers in a game.
- Entering this season, Purdue had two performances all-time of at least 20 points and 10 assists. Smith has done it three times in the last six games, starting with the Maryland contest on Dec. 8.
- He has recorded 14 point-assist double-doubles in his last 53 games dating to last season, after having none as a freshman.
- Smith's award gives Purdue 19 Big Ten Player of the Week honors since the start of the 2021-22 season, by far the most in the Big Ten (Iowa - 10).
- In addition, Purdue becomes the first Big Ten program to win 100 Big Ten Player of the Week honors (now with 101, actually; forgot to mention this after **Trey Kaufman-Renn** won it Dec. 2.).

►►► DEFENSE COMING AROUND

- The Purdue defense is starting to turn it around during its three-game winning streak.
- Purdue held Northwestern to 38.3 percent shooting and its two leading scorers, **Brooks Barnhizer** and **Nick Martinelli**, who entered the game averaging 40.2 points per game between them, to 21 points on 6-of-23 shooting with 10 combined turnovers.
- Opponents are shooting just 42.0 percent from the field, while averaging 62.0 points per game in the last three games. Purdue has held consecutive Big Ten opponents under 62 points for the first time since Jan. 29 to Feb. 1, 2023 (Michigan State, Penn State).
- In addition, over the last three games, opponents are shooting just 23.2 (13-of-56) from 3-point range and Purdue is plus-13 in turnover margin (22 to 35 turnovers).

►►► TAKING CARE OF IT

- The Boilermakers have won 19 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent, and is 18-1 since the start of last season when having single-digit turnovers (lone loss: UConn in the National Championship game).
- Since the 2021-22 season, when Purdue has five or more turnovers than its opponent, Purdue is 20-15 (.571). In all other games, Purdue is 83-8 (.912).
- In Purdue's four losses this season, Purdue has recorded 67 turnovers (16.8 / game), resulting in 95 points off turnovers (23.8 / game).
- In Purdue's 15 losses since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue is plus-83 in turnover margin (+5.5 / game).
- Since the 2021-22 season, Purdue is 51-5 when forcing 10 or more turnovers in a game. When Purdue has single-digit turnovers, Purdue owns a 37-2 record in that span. Purdue has won 40 straight games when forcing between 10 and 15 turnovers in a game.

►►► JANUARY 9 (10-4)

- Purdue is 10-4 all-time in games played on January 9, and 2-3 under head coach **Matt Painter**.
- In 2018, the Boilermakers won a memorable game at Michigan as **Isaac Haas** made a free throw with four seconds left to lift Purdue to a 70-69 victory. The Boilermakers held Michigan scoreless for the last three minutes of the game.
- In 2020, **Trevion Williams** had 36 points and 20 rebounds in a loss at Michigan, the first 35-20 game at Purdue in 50 years.

►►► STARTING BIG TEN PLAY ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- With back-to-back wins over Minnesota and Northwestern, Purdue is off to a 3-1 start in Big Ten play for the fifth time in the last nine years (2017, 2018, 2023, 2024, 2025) and for the third straight season.
- A win over Rutgers would give Purdue a 4-1 start in Big Ten play for just the fifth time (2023, 2018, 2011, 2008) in the **Matt Painter** era, and just the third time in the last 14 years.
- Purdue's Big Ten titles under Painter have come in 2024 (3-2), 2023 (4-1), 2019 (3-2), 2017 (3-2) and 2010 (2-3). Only once in the five title years did Purdue start 4-1 in its first five Big Ten games.

▶▶▶ PLAYING THE BEST

- Purdue played one of its hardest non-conference schedules in school history, battling five ranked teams (2-3) so far this year.
- Including last year, nine of Purdue's 22 non-conference games came against nationally-ranked teams.

- Purdue is 186-13 under Painter when scoring at least 80 points, including 100-3 since the start of the 2017-18 season.
- Purdue is 73-6 since the start of the 2017-18 season when making 10, 3-pointers in a game.
- Purdue is 231-20 under Painter when shooting 48 percent or better from the field.

▶▶▶ THE BIG THREE

- The three returning starters of **Braden Smith**, **Fletcher Loyer** and **Trey Kaufman-Renn** all appear headed for big seasons.
- When the trio scores at least 41 points combined, the Boilermakers are 10-0. When held to 40 and below, Purdue is 1-4 (Marshall).

- With 16 NCAA Tournament berths, seven Sweet 16 appearances, five Big Ten regular-season championships, two Big Ten Tournament titles, two Elite Eight appearances, a trip to the Final Four, an appearance in a National Championship game and an international gold medal on his résumé, 20th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter was named the 2019 and 2024 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to nine straight NCAA Tournaments – the fourth-longest active streak in America. Included in that stretch are Sweet 16 appearances (and beyond) in five of the last seven tournaments.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
- Painter will enter the 2024-25 season second on the school's all-time wins list (447) behind legendary mentor **Gene Keady** and ahead of **Ward "Piggy" Lambert**, both of whom have been inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Has averaged over 23 wins a season in his 19 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 24.3 wins per year over the last 18 seasons.
- Has won at least 25 games in 12 of his 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Painter has averaged 11.9 wins per year in conference play, the third-best average in Big Ten Conference history.
- He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.
- Coach Painter's 16 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2024 – Painter is 53 years old).
- Purdue has finished first, second or third in Big Ten play in 11 of the last 17 years, including in eight of the last 10 years.
