• **Zach Edey** now has two seasons of at least 750 points and 425 rebounds. Since the 1947-48 season, only Edey, Houston's **Elvin Hayes** (3), Miami's **Rick Barry** (2) and Cincinnati's **Oscar Robertson** (2) have had multiple seasons of 750 points and 425 rebounds.

►►► THE FINAL NOTE OF DOMINANCE

• **Zach Edey** became the FIRST unanimous winner of consecutive National Player of the Year accolades since **Bill Walton** in 1972 and 1973. There are six entities that make up the selections (Naismith, AP, Wooden, Robertson, NABC, Sporting News). **Ralph Sampson** was considered a three-time winner of NPOY, but he was not unanimous in 1981 (**Danny Ainge**, **Mark Aguirre**) and 1983 (a guy named **Michael Jordan** won the Sporting News in 1983).

• Edey would win 12 NPOY awards during his career, the second most NPOY honors in NCAA history behind Sampson's 14.
