## BOILER NOTES

### TEAM

- Purdue captains - Hudson Card, Gus Hartwig, Sanoussi Kane and Nic Scourton
- Hartwig made his first appearance since last season's game against Northwestern on Nov. 19, 2022.
- Next up for the Boilermakers will be the Cannon Trophy Game against rivals Illinois at home in West Lafayette on Saturday, September 30 at 3:30 p.m. ET on Peacock.

### OFFENSE

- Purdue totaled a season-high 194 rushing yards, the most since the team had 232 yards on the ground in last year's win over Indiana State (Sept. 10, 2022).
- The ground attack was a team-effort, with four different Boilermakers recoring more than 30 yards.
- Tyrone Tracy Jr., the team's leading rusher with 84 yards and a touchdown on eight carries (good for 10.5 a carry), has scored a rushing touchdown in every game this season.
- The 84 yards with a long of 24 both represent career highs for Tracy.
- Tracy's 19-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter capped an eight-play, 75-yard drive that included 55 rushing yards (24 from Tracy, 31 from Devin Mockobee).
- Hudson Card produced a career-high 50 rushing yards with a touchdown on 13 attempts.
- Card completed 21 of 38 passes for 202 yards through the air.
- The Boilermakers scored touchdowns on both drives in the third quarter, racking up 150 yards of offense.
- Dylan Downing had a 25-yard carry in the first quarter to set up Purdue's first field goal of the game, the longest run by a Boilermaker this season.
- Deion Burks led the team in both receptions (6) and receiving yards (73).
- Abdur-Rahmaan Yasseen was not far behind with four catches and 62 yards of his own.
- TE Max Klare hauled in four receptions for 18 yards. The freshman has now had at least four catches in three straight games.

### DEFENSE

- After the Badgers scored three touchdowns on their first three drives, the Boilermakers held Wisconsin to one touchdown, three field goals, two punts and forced an interception on their remaining seven drives.
- Purdue's defense held Wisconsin on four of their last 10 third-down conversion attempts.
- Kydran Jenkins tied for the team lead with nine tackles (seven solo), the most of his career (Prev: 7, vs. Northwestern, 11/19/22).
- Botros Alisandro recorded his first career interception with a 19-yard return to set the offense up at midfield in the fourth quarter.
- The sophomore Alisandro also made his first career tackle-for-loss.
- The Boilermakers have recorded an interception in nine consecutive games.
- Sanoussi Kane led the team in tackles-for-loss with two (a career high) and co-lead the team in tackles with nine (five solo).
- Marquis Wilson made a career-high eight tackles (seven solo) on the night.
- Freshman Dillon Thieneman continues to impress, making seven tackles against the Badgers.
- Thieneman has 38 tackles through only four games and is only 33 shy of cracking the Top 10 in a single-season for a freshman in program history.
- OC Brothers recorded his second sack of the season and the third of his career in the third quarter.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

- Julio Macias converted his first collegiate field goal attempt, a 34-yarder to put Purdue on the board in the first quarter.
- Macias also went 2 for 2 on his extra point attempts on the night.
