- Give Purdue it's eighth of the season, winning eight regular season games in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1997-98.
- Be the Boilermakers' fourth Old Oaken Bucket victory in five matchups under Jeff Brohm.

- Biletnikoff Award semifinalist Charlie Jones is one of only Boilermakers to the Big Ten Championship in Indianapolis. two receivers to rank top 10 nationally in receptions (3rd-• The Boilermakers limited Northwestern to only 240 yards 93), touchdowns (3rd-11) and receiving yards (6th-1,056).
  - Purdue has the best passing offense in the B1G, averaging 274.9 yards through the air in league games.
- Purdue holds a 6-2 record over its past eight conference The Boilermakers have controlled time of possession in games away from home, including a 3-1 mark this season 10 straight games, and their time of possession (32:49) ranks 16th nationally.

Purdue has won seven games in back-toback seasons for the first time since the 2006 and 2007 seasons.



Aidan O'Connell has thrown 63 touchdown passes over his career, tied with Kyle Orton for fifth in Purdue history.



While Saturday's contest will be the 124th meeting between the Boilermakers and Hoosiers, it will be 97th battle for the Old Oaken Bucket. Purdue leads the Bucket series 61-32-3.

- Wide receiver Charlie Jones has made an immediate impact since transferring to Purdue from Iowa, ranking third nationally in receptions (93) and receiving touchdowns (11) as well as sixth in receiving yards (1,056). Jones is one of only two receivers to rank in the top 10 of all three categories.
- Jones has recorded six 100-yard games this season, including four in B1G play, to become the sixth Boilermaker to accomplish the feat in a single year.
- In B1G action, Jones has hauled in a conference-best 8.0 receptions per game to go along with 84.5 receiving yards per league contest.
- With a 32-yard touchdown in the win over No. 21 Illinois, Jones became the eighth Boilermaker in Purdue history to record 10 touchdowns and 1,000 receiving yards in a single season.
- It's safe to say Jones enjoys the Purdue offense. After making 21 catches for 323 yards and three touchdowns during the entire 2021 season, it only took him three games to surpass last year's totals with the Hawkeyes.
- With three multi-touchdown games, Jones is just the sixth Purdue receiver since 2000 to have three-or-more multi-touchdown games in a season.

### CATCHING RARE AIR

- Charlie Jones joined former Purdue wide receiver David Bell (2021) as the only Big Ten receivers since 2000 to haul in 85 or more passes through their first 10 games of a season.
- Since 2000, only five Big Ten receivers have tallied 1,000 yards and 10 touchdowns through the first 10 games of the season: Jones, Braylon Edwards (Michigan 2004), Charles Rodgers (Michigan State 2001, 2002), Austin Carr (Northwestern 2016) and Marvin McNutt (Iowa 2011).
- Jones is one of 10 B1G receivers since the turn of the 21st century to produce six 100-yard games in 10 games.
- This season, Jones is one of four wide receivers nationwide with at least 1,000 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns.

### THE RECONNECTION

- Playing youth football together, Aidan O'Connell and Charlie Jones were reunited at Purdue this offseason. Years passed since they were teammates, but you would not have known it in the season opener versus Penn State.
- O'Connell found Jones 12 times in his Purdue debut, and the duo connected for 153 yards through the air, both career highs.
- A week later, the pair connected nine times for 133 yards and three scores against Indiana State.
- Jones notched his third straight 100-yard receiving game with a career-high 188 yards and a score from 11 receptions at Syracuse.

- As one of the nation's leaders in multiple receiving categories,
   Purdue Football wide receiver Charlie Jones was named a
   Biletnikoff Award semifinalist.
- He was added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List midway through the year.
- The Boilermakers have a history with the Biletnikoff Award. Taylor Stubblefield won the honor in 2004, while David Bell was a finalist just one season ago.

### BRING ON THE PAYNE

- · A semifinalist for the Mackey Award (college football's most outstanding tight end), Payne Durham has been an important piece of the Purdue offense with 50 catches for 511 yards and seven touchdowns to rank second among Boilermakers in all three categories.
- The redshirt-senior ranks among the top tight ends nationwide, cracking the Top 10 in touchdowns (2nd-7), receptions (5th-50) and receiving yards (8th-511).
- Durham hauled in his 20th career touchdown reception in the win over Northwestern, tving DeAngelo Yancey (2013-16) for eighth on Purdue's all-time list. He ranks second among tight ends, trailing Dave Young (27, 1977-80), and is just one touchdown away from sitting alongside three of the best receivers in Purdue history: former teammate David Bell (2019-21), Dorien Bryant (2004-07) and Taylor Stubblefield (2001-04).
- In the win over Nebraska, Durham eclipsed 1,000 receiving yards for his career to become just the eighth Purdue tight end to accomplish the feat.
- Durham came through in the clutch against Maryland (Oct. 8), catching the go-ahead touchdown pass before rumbling 56 yards to set up another late Purdue touchdown. He made seven catches for 109 yards, both team highs, to record the third 100-yard game of his career.
- Durham's progression in college from backup to all-conference caliber is made more impressive when you consider he played one year of high school football after playing lacrosse all his life.

### CHAMPAYNE

- With the Cannon Trophy and BIG West implications on the line, Payne Durham came through in the clutch at No. 21 Illinois. The tight end hauled in a team-high seven catches for 70 yards and a pair of touchdowns to help the Boilermakers win 31-21 in Champaign.
- Durham's toe-tapping touchdown in the third quarter gave Purdue its first lead of the game before he put the Boilermakers ahead for good in the fourth with a 12-yard touchdown.
- The two-touchdown day was Durham's fourth multi-touchdown game of his career and the second of the season.

### ALL ABOARD THE MOCK TRAIN

- Don't underestimate redshirt-freshman Devin Mockobee. The walk-on running back leads the Purdue rushing attack with 750 yards and seven touchdowns, averaging 5.0 yards per carry.
- In regards to freshman running backs throughout Purdue history, Mockobee ranks third in yards and attempts as well as fourth in touchdowns.
- · Mockobee's 75.0 yards per game on the ground rank seventh nationally among freshman running backs, second in the B1G, and his seven touchdowns rank eighth.
- · Mockobee's numbers dropped after he was forced to leave early in the first quarter of the Northwestern game due to injury.
- He has produced four 100-yard games this season, the most ever by a Purdue freshman.

### FLOAT LIKE A BUTTERFLY, STING LIKE A 100-YARD MOCKOBEE

- All four of Devin Mockobee's 100-yard games this season have come in Big Ten games, increasing his output to 87.6 yards per game in conference action; his average ranks fifth in the conference, while leading all BIG freshman running backs.
- In the win over No. 21 Illinois, Mockobee outgained the nation's leading rusher Chase Brown. The Boilermaker ran for 106 yards and a touchdown, while the Purdue defense held Brown under 100 yards for the first time this season (98).
- Mockobee rumbled for 108 yards and a touchdown at Wisconsin.

68 - at Minnesota - 10/1/22

- The Boonville, Indiana, native had his best game as a Boilermaker in the win over Nebraska, recording 206 all-purpose yards (178 rushing, 28 receiving). His 178 yards on the ground set a new single-game record for rushing yards by a Purdue freshman, and Mockobee was rewarded Big Ten Freshman of the Week for his performance.
- Mockobee produced his first 100-yard game at No. 21 Minnesota, recording 112 yards rushing on only 11 carries to average 10.2 yards per rush. Late in the fourth quarter with Purdue ahead by three points, Mockobee broke free for a 68-yard run and motored into the end zone from two yards out on the following play to put the game on ice.
- The 68-yard rush at Minnesota is the longest run by a Boilermaker since Rondale Moore scampered 76 yards against Northwestern (Aug. 30, 2018).

## HEAD COACH JEFF BROHM

Jeff Brohm is in his sixth year at the helm of the Purdue Football. A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior to Brohm's arrival, Purdue matched that output in one season – a memorable 2021 campaign – as the Boilermakers continue to be on the rise under Brohm's leadership.

Brohm's three fundamental concepts – playing harder, tougher and smarter than the opposition – have been the benchmarks for his program. His calling cards of creative play-calling and an explosive, high-powered offense has led Purdue to average 419.8 yards per game and 27.6 points per game in his first five seasons.

Playing in Brohm's offense, Boilermakers have been recognized across the league and nationally. They have collected a variety of individual honors, including back-to-back Big Ten Freshman of the Year awards (Rondale Moore – 2018, David Bell – 2019), two Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year awards (Moore – 2018, Bell – 2021), the Big Ten Tight End of the Year award (Brycen Hopkins – 2019), and the 2018 Paul Hornung Award winner (Moore) as the nation's most versatile player.

Three Boilermakers have become All-Americans during Brohm's tenure in West Lafayette. Rondale Moore became first true freshman consensus First Team All-American in Big Ten history in 2018 before wide receiver David Bell and defensive end George Karlaftis earned All-American honors following the 2021 season. Bell was a consensus All-American, joining Moore as the second under Brohm and the 21st in Purdue history.

UAB (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks 2012) and Western Kentucky (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks 2013). He began his career as the head coach of the Louisville Fire in the af2 in 2002.

Brohm enjoyed an outstanding collegiate career at Louisville from 1989 to 1993. A three-year starter, he still ranks among the second under Brohm and the 21st in Purdue history.

Brohm and his staff continue to make moves on the recruiting trail, signing two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in school history 2019 and 2020. Purdue's 2019 class was ranked 25th nationally - the highest since Joe Tiller inked the No. 20 class in 2004.

The 2021 season featured a 9-4 record, the second-most wins in a single season in Purdue history. The Boilermakers tied for second in the Big Ten West, which included a pair of Top 5 victories over No. 2 lowa and No. 3 Michigan State. The season was capped off with a thrilling 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee at the TransPerfect Music City Bowl in Nashville.

Purdue exceeded all expectations in his first season in 2017 and made noise throughout college football. The Boilermakers won seven games, recaptured both of its rivalry trophies (the Cannon and the Old Oaken Bucket), and capped the season with Foster Farms Bowl victory over Arizona. They followed that up in 2018 with another Bowl appearance, and Top 25 victories over Boston College, Iowa, and a historic victory over No. 2 Ohio State.

Brohm was hired Dec. 5, 2016, as the 36th full-time head football coach in Purdue history. Widely regarded as one of the most innovative offensive masterminds in college football, he became the first former quarterback to engineer the Boilermakers since Bob DeMoss in 1970.

Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a remarkable 30-10 overall record from 2014 to 2016. The Hilltoppers were league champions in 2015 and 2016. They

won the 2014 Bahamas Bowl and the 2015 Miami Beach Bowl, as well as the 2016 Boca Raton Bowl.

Under Brohm, the Hilltoppers averaged 44.6 points, 356.6 passing yards and 526.2 yards of total offense per game over three seasons. Western Kentucky broke more than 75 school offensive records since 2013, when Brohm served as assistant head coach,

offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Western Kentucky ranked in the top 10 nationally in scoring offense, passing offense and total offense each of Brohm's three seasons as head coach.

Previously, Brohm served as an assistant coach at Louisville (quarterbacks 2003-06, assistant head coach/passing game 2007, assistant head coach/offensive coordinator 2008), Florida Atlantic (quarterbacks 2009), Illinois (quarterbacks 2010-11), UAB (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks 2012) and Western Kentucky (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks 2013). He began his career as the head coach of the Louisville Fire in the af2 in 2002.

Brohm enjoyed an outstanding collegiate career at Louisville from 1989 to 1993. A three-year starter, he still ranks among the Cardinals' career leaders in touchdown passes, total offense, completion percentage, passing yards, passing efficiency, passing attempts and completions through the 2020 season. Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player during both his junior and senior seasons, and his number 11 became part of the Louisville Ring of Honor in 2006.

Brohm played in the NFL six different franchises. In eight career games - all with the 49ers - he completed 37 of 58 passes (63.8%) for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception. His best game came Oct. 27, 1996, when he completed 19 of 30 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown to lead San Francisco to a 10-9 win over the Houston Oilers. In 2001, Brohm played in the XFL for the Orlando Rage and was named first-team All-XFL.

Brohm was a standout player at Trinity High School in Louisville, Kentucky. He won the Kentucky Mr. Football Award as a senior in 1988 while leading the Shamrocks to a state championship and undefeated season. Brohm was named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and was inducted into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 2014

A native of Louisville, Brohm (born April 24, 1971) earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1994. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Brady, and a daughter, Brooke. Jeff is one of four family members to be a football letterwinner at Louisville - father, Oscar (quarterback 1966-69), and brothers, Greg (wide receiver 1989-92) and Brian (quarterback 2004-07). The Brohm family, including mother, Donna, and sister, Kim, was inducted into the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

### BROHM AND THE BOILERMAKERS: YEAR 6

- Jeff Brohm is in his sixth year at the helm in West Lafayette.
- · Brohm boasts a career record of 65-43, a .602 winning percentage, with more than half of those wins coming at Purdue. • Purdue has won 25 conference games under Brohm's guidance after winning only 21 in the 10 seasons prior to Brohm taking over
- the program. A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior twice under head coach Jeff Brohm (2018, 2021). to Brohm's arrival, Purdue matched that output in one season - a
- memorable 2021 campaign. • The Boilermakers have made three bowl appearances in five years under Brohm, joining Joe Tiller and Jim Young as the only Purdue coaches to accomplish that feat.
- · Over Brohm's six seasons at the helm, the Purdue offense has averaged 309 yards per game and 27.6 points per game.
- · Purdue has had three All-Americans since Brohm's arrival; the Boilermakers only had three All-Americans from 2004-17.
- Boilermakers have won five individual Big Ten honors under 12). Brohm's guidance: Big Ten Freshman of the Year (Rondale Moore
- 2018, David Bell 2019), Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year Hopkins - 2019).

### OLD OAKEN BUCKET HISTORY

- · While Saturday's game will be the 124th meeting between the Boilermakers and Hoosiers, this year's matchup will be just the 97th edition of the Old Oaken Bucket Game.
- Since 1925, Purdue and Indiana have played annually for the O'CONNELL = BURLSWORTH TROPHY FINALIST Old Oaken Bucket. The Boilermakers lead the Bucket portion of the all-time series 61-32-3, including 16 wins in the last 24 showdowns.
- Purdue has won three of the four matchups under head coach Jeff Brohm (game was not played in 2020 due to COVID-19).
- · The Chicago alumni groups of both schools came up with the idea for a traveling trophy, and Russell Gray of Purdue and Clarence Jones of Indiana were given the task of finding an appropriate object. They recommended that "an old oaken bucket would be a most typical trophy from this state and should and Whiley J. Huddle of Indiana found the fabled bucket, in a bad state of repair, covered with moss and mold, on the Bruner farm between Kent and Hanover in southern Indiana.
- General John Hunt Morgan and his soldiers during their incursion into Indiana in 1863 during the Civil War.
- George Ade, distinguished humorist from Purdue, and Harry Kurrie, president of the Monon Railroad, representing Indiana, formally introduced the Old Oaken Bucket in 1925. The Boilermakers and Hoosiers subsequently battled to a 0-0 tie Nov. Boilermaker tight end since 1980 (Dave Young) to catch nine TDs 21 at Ross-Ade Stadium, resulting in an "I-P" link being attached
- Throughout its history, the bucket has been kidnapped by that it was given up as lost, only to turn up mysteriously just before or after the annual game.

### LAST TIME WE MET

- · The Old Oaken Bucket returned to its rightful home, as Purdue cruised to a 44-7 victory over Indiana in front of a sellout crowd MAINTAINING SUCCESS at Ross-Ade Stadium.
- The Boilermakers won for the third time in the past four rivalry matchups with the largest margin of victory in the series since a seasons for the first time since 2006-07. 62-10 win in 2008.

### B1G OUTLOOK

- · With one game remaining, the Boilermakers find themselves tied with Iowa atop the Big Ten West at 5-3.
- A victory over Indiana would secure a share of the divisional title for the first time in program history since the conference went to the divisional format in 2011.
- · The Boilermakers have finished second in the Big Ten West
- An Iowa loss and a Purdue win would make the Boilermakers outright B1G West champions, sending them to the conference championship game for the first time ever.

### **BIG WINS AWAY FROM HOME**

- Playing on the road in Big Ten play hasn't fazed Purdue lately. The Boilermakers have won six of their past eight conference games away from home, including the three this season against No. 21 Minnesota (Oct. 1), Maryland (Oct. 8) and No. 21 Illinois (Nov.
- Three of those victories were over ranked teams. Purdue beat No. 2 Iowa 24-7 last season (Oct. 16, 2021), knocked off No. 21 (Moore - 2018, Bell - 2021), Big Ten Tight End of the Year (Brycen Minnesota this October and took down No. 21 Illinois two weeks

### **BOWLING ON THE HORIZON**

- With the victory over No. 21 Illinois, Purdue became bowl eligible for the fourth time in six seasons under head coach Jeff Brohm.
- Taking the Boilermakers to another bowl game, Brohm joins Joe Tiller as the only coaches in Purdue history to make four bowl (76%). appearances in their first six years guiding the program.
- The last time Purdue went to four bowls over a six-year span, Tiller led the Boilermakers for four appearances in five years (2003-2007). In 12 seasons under Tiller, Purdue reached 10 bowls, including a Rose Bowl trip during the 2000 campaign.

### PILOT SACKS

- · Senior defensive end Jack Sullivan leads the Boilermakers with five sacks this season, ranking seventh in the conference.
- Four of his five sacks have come in league games, the fourth-
- Sullivan had a crucial strip sack in the win over Northwestern, forcing a turnover late in the fourth quarter to preserve the (Nov. 5). victory
- Graduating with a degree in Professional Flight Technology and FOURTH QUARTER DEFENSE Aviation Management, Sullivan plans to become a commercial pilot following his playing career.

## STRENGTH ON THE LINE

- Purdue's veteran offensive line has been a major factor for strong. success on that side of the ball.
- The Boilermakers allow only 3.73 tackles-for-loss per game, leading the Big Ten and ranking sixth in the nation.
- The trio of Gus Hartwig, Spencer Holstege, and Eric Miller have started the past 26 games alongside one another. Holstege leads the way with 29 straight starts, followed by Hartwig (27) and • The 15 rushing TDs surpass the total from the previous two
- Facing the nation's best defense in No. 21 Illinois (232.2 yards in a season since Purdue rushed for 20 touchdowns in 2018. per game), the Purdue line did not allow a sack and helped the offense rack up 379 yards for the most allowed by the Fighting Illini this season.
- In the win over Nebraska, the line paved the way for 217 rushing yards, the most by a Purdue offense in four years.

- · Beginning his career as a walk-on and eighth on the quarterback depth chart, Aidan O'Connell worked his way up to the starting role and didn't stop there. The sixth-year QB has etched his name in the school record books, and he continued to rise up the career charts this season.
- O'Connell already ranks in the program's Top 10 in several career categories: completion percentage (1st - 66.8%), 500-yard games (T1st - 2), 400-yard games (2nd - 5), 300-yard games (2nd - 13), touchdown passes (5th - 63), passing completions (5th -776) and passing yards (6th - 8,563).
- Aidan O'Connell paces the Big Ten in passing yards and total offense. Completing 27 passes per game, he sits fifth in the country. His 283.4 passing yards per game rank 14th nationally.
- O'Connell has kept up his game against conference opponents, throwing for an average of 274.9 yards in B1G games to lead the league.
- In his 13 300-yard games over his career, O'Connell has eclipsed 350 yards in 12 of them.
- O'Connell torched the Syracuse defense with a season-high 424 passing yards and three touchdowns. He has five career 400yard passing games; only Drew Brees has more (7).

- Thirty-two of those 42 red zone scores have been touchdowns
- · In conference play, Purdue only trails Ohio State as the highest scoring team in the red area. The Boilermakers are 30-of-32 in conference action with 20 touchdowns and 10 field goals.

### ROSS-ADF BRIGADE

- · With a win over Northwestern in the home finale, Purdue finished 4-2 at Ross-Ade Stadium for the second straight season.
- Purdue fans, including the Ross-Ade Brigade student section, packed the stadium nearly to capacity (57,282) all season long; an average of 57,129 came to Ross-Ade Stadium throughout the fall, the highest average home attendance since 2007 (59,326).
- Purdue sold out games against Nebraska (Oct. 15) and Iowa

- · The Boilermaker defense welcomed back one of their leaders, Jalen Graham, in the 31-29 win over Maryland.
- · Graham, who missed the previous four games due to injury, returned to record a team-high nine tackles to go along with one tackle-for-loss and one pass breakup.
- The senior followed up his return performance with six tackles, including two tackles-for-loss, one sack and a forced fumble in the win over Nebraska.
- Despite playing in just seven games this season, Graham ranks and a pair of TDs. second on the team in total tackles (40); his 5.7 tackles per game pace Purdue.
- · Graham picked off the third pass of his career against Northwestern, returning it to the end zone before the touchdown got called back due to some early celebrating by the Boilermaker. his fourth 100-yard game of the season.

### **BROHM KNOWS OFFENSE**

- Jeff Brohm has produced more 600-vard games than any coach. in Purdue history, owning four of the 10 highest offensive outputs
- · With 608 yards in the win over Nebraska, Purdue recorded the eighth-most yards of offense in a single game and pushed Brohm past legendary head coach Joe Tiller.
- The top two offenses in a game belong under Tiller's watch but four of the next six have been by Brohm's Boilermakers.

### **SPOILERMAKERS**

- · Purdue has become known as the Spoilermakers under Jeff Brohm, collecting seven wins over ranked teams during the head coach's tenure following the 31-24 win at No. 21 Illinois.
- · Five of the seven wins have been by double digits, the biggest being a 29-point victory over No. 2 Ohio State in 2018.
- · Four of the victories have been on the road, including a pair this season at Minnesota and Illinois; both teams were ranked No. 21 heading into their game against Purdue.
- Three of those wins were against Top 3 teams, while Purdue handed five of those ranked teams their first loss of the season.
- · Last season, Purdue knocked off previously unbeaten No. 2 Iowa (Oct. 16) and No. 3 Michigan State (Nov. 6), giving the Boilermakers two wins over Top 5 teams for the first time since 1960.
- The Boilermakers beat three ranked teams during the 2018 campaign, Brohm's second season, for the most victories over ranked teams in a single-season since 2003.
- Prior to Brohm's arrival in West Lafayette in 2017, Purdue only won two out of 27 games against AP-ranked teams over the

### **KEEPING THE CANNON**

- Purdue kept the Cannon Trophy for the third year in a row and increased its chances of winning the Big Ten West with a 31-21 victory at No. 21 Illinois, becoming bowl eligible along the way.
- The Boilermakers improved to 3-1 on the B1G road this season, while beatiing a ranked team for the seventh time under Jeff
- Aidan O'Connell went 25-40 for 237 yards with three touchdown passes, finding tight end Payne Durham seven times for 70 yards
- T.J. Sheffield made six catches for a team-high 72 yards, while Charlie Jones added 66 yards and a touchdown to go over 1,000 receiving yards for the year.
- Devin Mockobee rushed for 106 yards on 28 carries and a score,
- · Linebacker Kieren Douglas made a late fourth-quarter interception with the help of a tip from Lawrence Johnson.
- Purdue won in Memorial Stadium for the sixth straight time.

## SUCCESS VS. NATION'S BEST

- Illinois came into the Cannon Trophy game with the nation's No. 1 scoring (10.4) and total defense (232.2 ypg). The Purdue offense put up 31 points on 379 total yards to earn the win; both marks were the most surrendered by the Fighting Illini all season long.
- On the other side of the ball, the Purdue defense limited Chase Brown to 98 yards on the ground. Brown entered the game as the nation's leading rusher, going over the 100-yard mark in every contest and averaging 149 yards per game.

### WALK-ONS RUNNING

- With starting running back King Doerue missing seven games due to injury, a pair of walk-ons took over the backfield.
- Dylan Downing and Devin Mockobee have rushed for 1,126 yards this season, including 646 yards over the seven weeks with Doerue out of the lineup.
- Downing ran for a career-high 113 yards in the win over FAU, the first 100-yard game of his career.
- One week later, Mockobee led the way with 112 yards on the ground that included a pair of rushes for 70 yards that resulted in a touchdown and clinched Purdue's victory over No. 21 Minnesota.
- Downing and Mockobee's performances gave the Boilermakers different 100-yard rushers in consecutive games for the first time since 2017 when Markell Jones recorded 217 yards in a win over Indiana and D.J. Knox added 101 yards in a Foster Farms Bowl victory (vs. Arizona).

### **HURRY HURRY**

- · The Boilermaker defense has made habit of living in the offensive backfield with 54 tackles-for-loss and 25 sacks.
- · Kydran Jenkins leads the team with 7.5 stops behind the line, while Khordae Sydnor and Jack Sullivan add 6.5 TFL apiece. Twenty-one different players have helped tally a tackle-for-loss this year.
- Sullivan paces the Boilermakers in sacks with 5.0, while Sydnor is right behind his fellow defensive end at 4.5.
- Junior safety Sanoussi Kane leads the team with a pair of forced fumbles. Six other Boilermakers have also forced fumbles this
- Purdue's defense has recovered 4-of-8 fumbles it has forced this year.

### FOUR IN-A-ROW

- Purdue put together a four-game winning streak prior to the loss at Wisconsin for the first time the 2018 season.
- · The Boilermakers won four straight games in 2018, which included the memorable 49-20 victory over No. 2 Ohio State.
- The 2018 and 2022 seasons are the only ones over the past 15 years that have featured four-game winning streaks. The 2006 and 2007 Boilermakers won their first four games of each season under loe Tiller.

### **AUSSIE RULES PUNTING**

- After Purdue ranked last in the Big Ten a season ago in punting, sophomore Jack Ansell has completely turned around the Boilermakers' punt game and earned a spot on the mid-season Ray Guy Watch List.
- Ansell averaged 38.3 yards per punt as a freshman, but the Aussie has increased his output to 42.8 yards per punt this year.
- · Against FAU, Ansell booted a career-long 67-vard punt that was downed at the 4-yard line; the punt was the longest by a Boilermaker since 2019.
- The Australian boomer followed up that performance with a trio on five balls of 50-yard punts at No. 21 Minnesota.
- Dealing with difficult, windy days, he added a pair of 59-yard punts in games against lowa and Illinois.
- Ansell has forced 10 fair catches, dropped nine balls inside the 20-yard line, launched eight 50-yard boots and a trio of muffs.
- Ansell worked with ProKick Australia to prepare to play collegiate football in the United States, following a high school career as a Victoria state champion triple jumper in Australia.

### ATTACK FROM THE AIR

- Over the Jeff Brohm era, the Boilermakers have averaged 307.3 yards passing per game at a 65.1% completion clip with 152 touchdowns.
- · Purdue's passing attack trails only Ohio State and ranks in the top 20 nationally over the last five years, also considering the program played just six games in 2020.

### POPPING CORN

- In the 43-37 win over Nebraska, the Boilermakers popped the Cornhuskers for 608 yards of total offense for the eighth-most yardage in school history.
- The Boilermakers racked up 391 yards through the air and 217 on the ground, just the second time in the past 25 years that they surpassed 350 passing yards and 200 rushing yards (Oct. 13, 2018 at Illinois). Both instances have occurred under Jeff Brohm.
- · Purdue rushed for 217 yards, the most on the ground in a B1G game since the 2018 game at Illinois.
- The offense ran 101 plays while tying a school record with 38 first downs.
- Individually, Devin Mockobee set a Purdue freshman rushing record with 178 yards. Aidan O'Connell added 391 yards and four touchdowns through the air, his favorite target being Charlie Jones. The wideout made 12 catches for 132 yards and two touchdowns for his fourth 100-yard game of the season.

### **BURTON OFF THE BENCH**

- With All-B1G quarterback Aidan O'Connell unavailable due to injury, fellow sixth-year senior Austin Burton heard his name called to start as Purdue's quarterback versus FAU.
- The start was Burton's first since Oct. 5, 2019 when he was UCLA's starting quarterback against Oregon State.
- The Newton, Massachusetts, native completed 72.4 percent of his passes (21-of-29) for 166 yards and three touchdowns.
- Two of Burton's three touchdown passes were to his roommate, Charlie Jones.
- Burton didn't seem to have much rust, marching the Boilermakers down the field on the opening drive by completing all six of his passes that resulted in a touchdown toss to Jones.

### **BROHM AIR RAID**

- · Head coach Jeff Brohm's offensive air-raid style has produced dividends over his coaching career at Purdue and Western Kentucky.
- Over his two coaching stops, Brohm's offenses have accounted for 16 400-yard passing games (8 at Purdue, 8 at WKU).
- Since Brohm got his head coaching start in 2014, only two coaches have had more 500-yard passing games than him - Mike Leach (14) and Kliff Kingsbury (11).

### SYCAMORE SHUTOUT

- Purdue's 56-0 win over Indiana State was the largest margin of victory since beating Southeast Missouri 59-0 in 2011.
- The victory was the second shutout of the Jeff Brohm era, joining the 49-0 win over UConn last season.
- Purdue allowed only 145 yards of total offense, the lowest output by an opponent since Oregon mustered just 143 yards in 1979.

## 300-YARDERS

- Aidan O'Connell started his 2022 campaign with 365 yards passing against Penn State for his ninth career 300-yard game, before adding his 10th with a 424-yard performance at Syracuse.
- · With five this season, O'Connell is up to 13 in his career for the second most in program history.
- Last year, he joined Drew Brees as the only Purdue quarterbacks to record multiple 500-yard games over a career, while becoming the only one to reach the 500-yard mark twice in a single season.
- O'Connell threw for a career-high 536 yards in an upset victory over No. 3 Michigan State before ending the year with 534 passing yards to help Purdue beat Tennessee in the Music City Bowl.
- The gunslinger produced six 300-yard games in 2021, the thirdmost in a single season and the first Purdue quarterback to accomplish the feat since Curtis Painter in 2007.
- Drew Brees owns the record with 16.
- · All but one of O'Connell's 13 300-yard passing games have been for 350 yards or more.

- So far this season, Purdue has 19 plays of 30 yards or more, and both interceptions returned for a touchdown.

- · Devin Mockobee's 68-yard rush was Purdue's longest since Rondale Moore carried 76 yards in his record breaking of Fame in 2014. He was a consensus All-American as a senior, performance against Northwestern in 2018.
- The Boilermaker offense tallied 29 plays of 30 yards or more in 2020, as well as 11 of 50 yards or more.
- O'Connell has 40 career throws over 30 yards or more and 12 over 50 yards.
- Purdue's three longest plays from 2021 all came in that exhilarating TransPerfect Music City Bowl with O'Connell finding Broc Thompson for touchdowns of 75 and 70 yards and Durham for a 62-yard catch-and-score.

### 99th SEASON AT ROSS-ADE STADIUM

 The Boilermakers call Ross-Ade Stadium home for the 99th SECOND SEASON WITH ENGLISH/HAGEN season in 2022.

- A roughly two-year construction process for \$237,500 (\$3.76 million) with funds raised by Purdue alumni David E. Ross and defensive coordinator Brad Lambert who left for Wake Forest George Ade helped replace Stuart Field, which had hosted Purdue Football since its inception.

· Ross-Ade Stadium had the perfect dedication and opening, a 26-7 drubbing of Indiana for homecoming on Nov. 22, 1924.

- Originally seating 13,500 with an additional 5,000 standing spots, Ross-Ade Stadium now can hold up to 61,320, including non-ticketed personnel.

### IN MEMORY OF DAVE BUTZ

- Dave Butz, a legend of Purdue Football who was inducted in including seven passes from Aidan O'Connell to Charlie Jones the College Football Hall of Fame, passed away Friday (Nov. 4) at the age of 72.
  - Butz (1970 to 1972) was elected into the College Football Hall the recipient of the Zipp Award as college football's outstanding player and a finalist for the Lombardi Award (presented to the best lineman or linebacker).
  - Butz earned the reputation as the NFL's iron man, missing merely four games over the course of his career that included 216 contests. He was named NFL Defensive Player of the Year and was selected to the Pro Bowl after recording a career-high 11 sacks in 1983. Butz played in three Super Bowls with Washington: XVII (a 27-17 win over the Miami Dolphins), XVIII (a 38-9 loss to the Oakland Raiders) and XXII (a 42-10 win over the Denver Broncos).

- · Purdue is in its second season with co-defensive coordinators Ron English and Mark Hagen. The duo, along with fellow coduring the offseason, provided some much-needed stability to the defensive side of the ball.
- With Hagen's focus on the defensive line and English handling the defensive backs, Purdue trimmed opponents' passing yards per game down to 208.7 yards in 2021, which ranked fifth nationally and second in the Big Ten.
- The Boilermakers also posted their first shutout since 2011 with a 49-0 drubbing of UConn before recording another shutout this season, a 56-0 over Indiana State

## CRADLE OF QUARTERBACKS

Many schools boast of tradition. But none can match Purdue's tradition of turning out top-flight quarterbacks.

The Cradle of Quarterbacks has evolved over the last half century as a defining feature of Purdue football. Boilermakers have set numerous NCAA and Big Ten Conference records, many have been chosen as All-Americans and national awards winners or finalists.

In the early 1970s, Purdue Athletics commissioned a university artist named Keith Butz to create a poster featuring outstanding Boilermaker quarterbacks of the previous 30 years. That poster featured Bob DeMoss, Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bernie Allen, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and



## ROSS-ADE RENOVATION

- The future for the home of Boilermaker Football has come into an exciting level of focus as Purdue Athletics will soon unveil renderings, plans and construction timelines for the upcoming Phase 1 of Ross-Ade Stadium renovations.
- Originally announced on April 8, the \$45.4 million initial phase of renovations will strategically enhance several areas of the student-athlete and fan experience within the Ross-Ade footprint, creating a game day environment that is second to none for future generations of Boilermakers.
- The approval granted for Ross-Ade's phase one includes plans for renovations including the construction of a new team entrance/tunnel from the Kozuch Football Performance Complex to Rohrman Field, the conversion of the existing team store into a student-athlete nutrition/dining facility and the construction of a stadium addition adjoining seating in the south end zone.

## SOUTH END ZONE

• The long-awaited addition to Ross-Ade Stadium will connect the east and west sides of the facility in its 100th anniversary season, closing in the south end zone to create a complete howl.

A late Penn State touchdown with 57 seconds remaining sent the Purdue football team to a 35-31 loss in the 2022 season opener at Ross-Ade Stadium.

The Boilermakers (0-1) held a 31-28 advantage after Chris Jefferson intercepted Penn State (1-0) quarterback Sean Clifford and returned it 72 yards for a touchdown with 8:29 to play. Purdue held Penn State to just seven plays and 14 yards on its next two possessions, taking the ball back on offense with 4:28 on the clock. Penn State's defense forced Purdue to punt with 2:22 remaining.

The Nittany Lions then took eight plays to cover 80 yards in 1:25 with Clifford hitting Keyvone Lee for 10 yards and the gamewinning score.

Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell finished the night going 30-59 passing for 365 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions. The sixth-year thrower crossed the 300-yard mark for the ninth time in his career, moving him into sole control of fifth in program history. Running back King Doerue found the end zone twice for his second career multi-score game.

Clifford threw for 282 yards on 20-of-37 passing with four touchdowns and an interception.

Both sides had one giveaway that led to points. Purdue's fumble with 30 seconds remaining in the second saw Penn State score with two seconds left in the first half, while Jefferson's interception return for a touchdown swung the momentum in the fourth.

O'Connell connected with former youth football teammate Charlie Jones in his Purdue debut 12 times. Jones posted a career night receiving with 12 receptions for 153 yards and a touchdown.

## SEPT. 10, 2022 ROSS-ADE STADIUM - WEST LAFAYETTE, IND.

Purdue's defense forced a fumble on the opening play of the game to set the tone in a 56-0 rout of Indiana State on Saturday at Ross-Ade Stadium. The 56-point margin of victory was the largest for Purdue since a 59-point shutout win over Southeast Missouri in 2011.

The Boilermakers (1-1) tallied 521 yards of total offense with a balanced 232 on the ground and 289 through the air. Purdue's defense held the Sycamores (1-1) to 145 yards of total offense.

The defense posted its second shutout of the Jeff Brohm era. Purdue racked up seven tackles-for-loss, three sacks, two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Sanoussi Kane delivered a punishing hit to Indiana State Tee Hodge on the opening play of the game to pop the ball up in the air into safety Cam Allen's arms.

In the third quarter, Allen picked off an Indiana State pass and took it to pay dirt for a 65-yard touchdown. It marked the first time Purdue has interception returns for a touchdown in back-to-back weeks since Ricardo Allen achieved the feat in 2010.

Offensively, Purdue scored a touchdown on seven of its first nine drives. The only two drives the Boilermakers failed to score on started inside their own two-yard line.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell was efficient in his one half of action with four touchdowns and 211 yards on 17-of-19 passing. Charlie Jones added to his early haul as a Boilermaker with his second straight 100-yard receiving game. The Deerfield, Ill., native snagged nine passes for 133 yards and three touchdowns.

Redshirt freshman Devin Mockobee led the rushing attack with 78 yards on 13 touches with one score. Dylan Downing added 55 yards from 11 rushes. Purdue topped 200 yards rushing for the first time since Oct. 13, 2018, in a win over Illinois.

# WEEK 3 32 SYRACUSE 29 PURDUE

SEPT. 17, 2022 JMA WIRELESS DOME • SYRACUSE, N.Y.

A Syracuse touchdown with seven seconds left to play handed Purdue a 32-29 loss in its road opener on Saturday in the JMA Wireless Dome.

The Boilermakers (1-2, 0-1 B10) held a 9-3 lead over the Orange (3-0, 1-0 ACC) at the end of the first half thanks to a Devin Mockobee 15-yard touchdown run and a Mitchell Fineran 41-yard field goal in what looked to be a defensive dogfight. Purdue's defense held quarterback Garrett Shrader and the Syracuse offense to just 134 total yards and a field goal in the first half of play.

The script would flip in the second half however, as both offenses exploded for a combined 49 points, 42 of which came in the fourth quarter. Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell posted season highs in completions and yards as he finished 39-of-55 for 424 yards, three touchdowns and one interception.

A back and forth second half saw the lead change hands on five different occasions. The teams traded touchdowns until O'Connell's first career pick-six gave the Orange a 25-15 lead with 8:08 left in the game. The Boilermakers would battle right back, as O'Connell found Charlie Jones for a 55-yard bomb to cut the deficit to three before tight end Payne Durham caught his second touchdown of the day to give Purdue a 29-25 lead with just 51 seconds remaining.

Penalties against Purdue aided Syracuse on their final possession as they took five plays to go fifty yards capped off by Shrader finding wide receiver Oronde Gadsden II for a 25-yard touchdown to win the game for the Orange.

O'Connell's connection with Charlie Jones continues to drive the Boilermaker offense. Jones racked up a career-high 188 yards and added a touchdown to become just the fifth power five player to have 100 yards receiving and a touchdown in his team's first three games. Two 50-plus yard strikes from O'Connell to Jones sparked Purdue's fourth quarter comeback bid that ultimately fell short.

Behind a balanced offensive attack, the Purdue football team capped the 100th Homecoming celebration with a 28-26 win over FAU on Saturday night at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers used a trio of defensive stops in the fourth quarter along with a four-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Austin Burton to TJ Sheffield to hold on for the two-point win.

Twice in the fourth quarter, Purdue's defense stepped in front of passes from FAU (2-3) quarterback Nkosi Perry to keep the Boilermakers (2-2) in the lead. Midway through the period, Chris Jefferson intercepted a pass at the Purdue 10-yard line and returned to the FAU 35-yard line. Jefferson's second pick of the season led to a four-yard touchdown catch by TJ Sheffield to extend the lead to 28-20.

Following FAU's touchdown with 5:21 to play that cut the Boilermaker lead to two, Cam Allen dove in front of a double-pass on the Owl's ensuing two-point conversion in the endzone to keep Purdue ahead.

The defense stopped FAU's final drive cold on fourth down with 46 seconds remaining. As Perry reached over a pile on fourth-and-one, linebacker Jacob Wahlberg punched the ball free, and Sanoussi Kane pounced on the loose ball to seal the win.

Purdue quarterback Austin Burton, starting in place of the injured Aidan O'Connell, threw for a career-high three touchdowns on 21-for-29 passing and 166 yards. The sixth-year passer worked around an interception in the third quarter to lead Purdue to a scoring drive in each quarter.

The Boilermakers finished with more rushing yards than passing for the first time since 2018 against Eastern Michigan, ending with 188 yards on the ground and 166 through the air. Running back Dylan Downing crossed the century mark for the first time in his career to end the night with 133 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown.

Downing was the first Boilermaker to rush for over 100 yards since Zander Horvath ran for 101 yards against Rutgers in 2020.

Purdue's defense intercepted three passes, while the offense rushed for 160 yards and two scores to pull off a 20-10 win over No. 21 Minnesota on Saturday afternoon at Huntington Bank Stadium. The Boilermakers moved to 3-2 on the year and 1-1 in Big Ten play with their first win in Minneapolis since 2007.

Purdue's defense stymied Minnesota (4-1, 1-1) all afternoon long with a trio of interceptions, seven tackles-for-loss, two sacks and six pass breakups. Safety Cam Allen delivered a pair of momentum swings with an end zone interception in the second quarter, before the game-sealing pick late in the final frame.

Facing an offense that averaged 294.5 yards rushing over its first four games, the Boilermakers were stout defensively, limiting the Golden Gophers to just 47 yards rushing. It was the first time Purdue held a team to 50 or fewer rushing yards since 2017 when Nebraska recorded 40 yards on the ground.

Linebacker Semisi Fakasiieiki led the way defensively with eight stops, including a pair behind the line. Seven different Boilermakers contributed to a tackle-for-loss. Purdue's defense allowed just three points off three giveaways on Saturday.

The Boilermakers jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the first quarter. Running back Dylan Downing pounded his way into the end zone for a two-yard touchdown to start the scoring. Mitchell Fineran later added a season-long 43-yard field goal. The defense meanwhile stood tall on Minnesota's opening four drives, forcing a three-and-out, interception by Jacob Wahlberg,

Purdue's offense found its rhythm in the fourth. Fineran put the Boilermakers back in front with a 25-yard field goal with 4:57 to play. The Boilermakers made it a 10-point gap when redshirt Devin Mockobee found the end zone with 3:13 left on a two-yard rush, following a career-long 68-yard carry.

Back-to-back fourth quarter touchdown drives for Purdue sandwiched in between two straight stops on point after attempts gave Purdue a 31-29 victory over Maryland on Saturday at SECU Stadium.

The defense for Purdue came up big for the second straight week against a potent offense. The Boilermakers produced three sacks to go with six tackles for loss and four break ups.

Purdue jumped out to an early 10-0 lead early in the first after a two-vard touchdown toss from quarterback Aidan O'Connell to TJ Sheffield and a 37-yard field goal by Mitchell Fineran. The Cornhuskers (3-4, 2-2) responded with 10 straight points to even the score midway through the second.

O'Connell started a 17-point run before the half by the Boilermakers with a 31-yard pitch-and-catch to Charlie Jones. Fineran nailed another 37-yard kick before running back Mockobee found pay dirt from one yard out.

After Nebraska rolled off 13 unanswered points to cut the gap to four late in the third quarter, Sheffield danced around the Cornhusker defense for a 28-yard touchdown. Fineran, who went 3-for-4 on the night, tacked on a 34-yard kick in the fourth, before Jones added his second touchdown catch from two yards out with 6:55 to play to open a 43-30 lead.

Nebraska trimmed Purdue's lead down to six with 5:55 left, O'Connell and the offense ran the clock with a 12-play, 53-yard

O'Connell notched the fifth four-touchdown game of his career. The sixth-year thrower connected on 35 of his 54 passes for 391 yards. Receivers Jones and Sheffield both snagged a pair of touchdown passes and finished with 132 and 70 yards receiving, respectively.

The Purdue football team saw its four-game winning streak come to an end Saturday with a 35-24 loss at Wisconsin.

Running back Devin Mockobee topped the century mark rushing for the third time this season and the second straight week. The redshirt freshman carried the ball 23 times for 108 vards and one score.

Wide receiver Charlie Jones grabbed 10 passes for 105 yards. It was his fourth 10-catch game of the season, making him the fifth Purdue receiver to have four or more 10-reception games in a season since 2000.

The Boilermakers (5-3, 3-2) outgained Wisconsin (4-4, 2-3) 431-381 and finished with 111 yards on the ground and 320 through the air. Quarterback Aidan O'Connell threw for 320 yards, his 13th career 300-yard game, on 31-of-46 with one touchdown and three interceptions.

Down 25-in the third quarter, the Boilermakers outscored Wisconsin 21-14 in the second half. Purdue's punt team forced a fumble in the third that long snapper Nick Zecchino pounced on to set up an eight-yard touchdown pass from O'Connell to tight end Payne Durham.

Including Durham's score with 4:12 to play in the third, Purdue found the end zone on three of its final four drives including a pair of one-yard runs by Mockobee and O'Connell.

Wisconsin built a 21-3 lead through the first half, scoring on its first two offensive possessions and returning an interception for a touchdown on Purdue's first drive. Mitchell Fineran gave Purdue its lone points in the opening 30 minutes on a 36-yard field goal late in the second quarter.

NOV. 5, 2022 ROSS-ADE STADIUM • WEST LAFAYETTE, IND.

On a blustery day in West Lafayette, the Purdue football team could not extend its winning streak against lowa to three games, falling 24-3 to the Hawkeyes on Saturday at Ross-Ade Stadium. Both sides had to battle gusting conditions that featured constant winds of 25 mph with gusts over 45 mph.

Wide receiver Charlie Jones caught 11 passes for 104 yards. He joined Rondale Moore as the second Boilermaker since 2000 to have at least five games with double-digit catches. Jones also became the sixth player in Purdue history to top the century mark six times in a single season.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell threw for 168 yards on 20-of-43 passing with two interceptions. Running back Devin Mockobee had 14 carries for 65 yards.

The Purdue defense recorded seven tackles-for-loss, one shy of the season high. Defensive lineman Jack Sullivan led the way, matching his career high with a pair of stops behind the line. Fellow lineman Lawrence Johnson recorded 1.5 sacks on Iowa quarterback Spencer Petras for a new career high.

The two sides traded punts early on without much traction offensively in the first quarter. The Hawkeyes took advantage of a pair of Purdue interceptions to open a 17-0 lead midway through the second.

When Purdue (6-4, 4-3) needed it most, the defense stepped up. The Boilermakers held Illinois (7-3, 4-3) off the board on three of the final four drives in the fourth quarter, including a key interception by Kieren Douglas with 3:37 to play and Purdue up seven.

Sanoussi Kane topped all tacklers with nine on the afternoon with eight solos, one for loss and a forced fumble. The Boilermakers tallied five tackles-for-loss and a pair of sacks.

Illinois came into the game averaging 192.6 yards on the ground, led by running back Chase Brown's 149.3 yards per game. On Saturday, the Boilermakers limited those numbers to 102 and 98, respectively. It was Brown's first game under 100 yards rushing all season.

Purdue tight end Payne Durham had a career day with a pair of touchdown receptions, finishing the day with a team-high seven catches for 70 yards. Quarterback Aidan O'Connell threw for 237 yards on 25-of-40 passing with three touchdowns.

Running back Devin Mockobee notched his fourth 100-yard game of the season, going for 106 yards on 28 carries and a touchdown. Purdue posted 142 yards on the ground to outgain 379-303 overall for the game.

Purdue held a Big Ten opponent to nine or fewer points for the fourth time in the last two seasons.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell threw for 159 yards and two scores on 16-of-25 passing. Charlie Jones snagged six passes for 46 yards and touchdown, while PayneDurham scored once on two receptions for 30 yards.

Purdue totaled 299 yards of offense in a balanced attack of 140 yards on the ground and 159 through the air. Running back Dylan Downing carried the bulk of the load with 17 rushes for 49 yards, and Kobe Lewis added 42 yards on 11 carries.
