A WIN WOULD

- Mark Purdue's second straight win over the Huskies and their first in Seattle since 1961, when the Boilermakers edged Washington 13-6.
- Make it back-to-back wins in the series, 23 years apart.

THE OPENING KICK

- Purdue Football makes its final road trip of the 2025 season, traveling 2,192 miles to face Washington in the first Big Ten matchup between the two teams. Kickoff from Husky Stadium is set for 7 p.m. ET (4 p.m. PT) on FS1.
- The Boilermakers are making their sixth trip to Washington, the first since 198. That includes the first matchup in the series, a 13-6 victory in 1961.
- The last two matchups were in bowl games. Purdue defeated Washington 34-24 in the 2002 Sun Bowl. The two teams also met in the 2001 Rose Bowl after the Boilermakers captured the 2000 Big Ten title.
- The contest features the Boilermakers going up against their former head coach, Ryan Walters, who serves as the Huskies' defensive coordinator. Purdue head coach Barry Odom's brother, Brian, coaches Washington's inside linebackers.
- Purdue's November features opponents with a combined record of 32-5. That includes hosting the top two teams in the country and coming off back-to-back weeks against the last two national champions.
- On this date in 1958, Jack Mollenkopf's No. 8 Boilermakers went on the road to beat No. 13 Northwestern 23-6 in a Top 15 matchup.
- Last week, Purdue became the first team this season to hold a lead over No. 1 Ohio State at the end of the first quarter (3-0). The Boilermakers also became the second team to hold the Buckeyes scoreless in two quarters this season.
- Purdue ranks third in the Big Ten and 21st nationally in red zone defense.
- After forcing only one turnover through the first five games of the season, the Boilermakers have forced seven turnovers in the last five games, at least one in each contest during that stretch.
- The Top 3 tackle leaders in the Big Ten are Boilermakers. Mani Powell (94) leads the way, while Tahj Ra-EI (91) is second and Charles Correa (88) ranks third.
- All three crack the nation's Top 30 in tackles per game. Powell (9.4) ranks 17th, Ra-EI (9.1) ranks 22nd and Correa (8.8) ranks 28th.
- CJ Nunnally IV is one of three players in the country with at least seven tackles-for-loss, five sacks, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception (Xavier Adkinson - Auburn and Byrun Parham - UConn). Nunnally has recorded at least five sacks in all three seasons at the FBS level.
- Spencer Porath is 12-for-13 on field goals this season, ranking third in the Big Ten and 10th nationally in field goal percentage (92.3%). Porath hit a career-long 50-yard field goal at Michigan to kick off the month of November.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten and ranks 18th nationally in net punting with a 42.2 average.
- Jack McCallister ranks second in the Big Ten in punt average (44.8) and leads the conference with 16 punts pinned inside the 20-yard line.
- The Boilermakers also rank 21st nationally in punt return defense, allowing only 3.9 yards per return.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

ABOUT THE SERIES

- Purdue will face Washington for the first time since the 2002 Sun Bowl, and for the first time as Big Ten conference mates.
- The Huskies hold a 7-2-1 advantage in the series.
- Purdue won the 2002 Sun Bowl 34-24, overcoming a 17-0 deficit.
- The Boilers battled the Huskies in Purdue's most recent Rose Bowl appearance in 2001. Washington won that day, 34-24.
- Purdue has won the first and last meeting in the series, the first of which on Sept. 23, 1961, in Seattle (13-6)

OUR LAST MEETING

PURDUE 34, WASHINGTON 24 DEC. 31, 2002 - SUN BOWL - EL PASO, TEXAS

- Purdue erased a 17-point deficit to defeat Washington 34-24 in the Sun Bowl, finishing the season 7-6.
- Quarterback Kyle Orton threw for 283 yards and two touchdowns to lead the comeback, guiding the Boilermakers to their first bowl win in four years.
- Wide receiver John Standeford caught 10 passes for 105 yards and a touchdown, while Taylor Stubblefield added seven receptions for 92 yards.
- Running back Joey Harris powered the ground game with 93 yards on 23 carries, including a 10-yard touchdown that gave Purdue the lead in the third quarter.
- A fumble recovery in the end zone by Ray Williams just before halftime cut Washington's early lead to 17-14, sparking Purdue's rally.
- Kicker Berin Lacey tied the game with a 22-yard field goal before Harris' score put the Boilermakers ahead for good.

BOILER NOTES

THE ODOM ERA BEGINS

- Guiding one of the greatest resurgences in college football over the past two seasons, Barry Odom was named the new head football coach of the Purdue Boilermakers on December 8, 2024.
- Odom, 48, became the 38th head coach in the history of Purdue Football, coming to West Lafayette following what could be considered the most impressive gridiron campaign in UNLV's school history. The Rebels reached double-digit wins for only the third time in program history (1974, 1984), with both previous seasons predating the program's move up to Division I competition and the Mountain West Conference, respectively.
- Prior to arriving at Purdue, Odom possessed a 44-33 overall record in six seasons as a head coach, four at Missouri (2016-19) and two at UNLV (2023-24). His 19-8 mark with the Rebels bears significance in that the five seasons prior to his arrival (2017-22), UNLV won just 20 games.
- Odom has a defensive background. A linebacker during his playing days at Missouri (1996-99), he has racked up seven seasons as a defensive coordinator over three stops: Memphis (2012-14), Missouri (2015) and Arkansas (2020-22).

CROSS-COUNTRY CONNECTIONS

- Despite being more than 2,000 miles apart, there are several connections between the Purdue Boilermakers and the Washington Huskies.
- Purdue starting punter Jack McCallister spent four seasons at Washington, including the past three as the Huskies' starting punter.
- Head coach Barry Odom's brother, Brad, is the inside linebackers coach at Washington.
- Washington defensive coordinator Ryan Walters served as Purdue's head coach during the 2023 and 2024 campaigns.
- Washington special teams coordinator Chris Petrilli served on Walters' Purdue staff in the same position.

FAR, FAR AWAY

- When Purdue makes the 2,192-mile trip to Seattle this weekend, it will be the 21st time in history that the Boilermakers have traveled more than 2,000 miles to play a football game.
- With Washington being one of the newest members of the Big Ten, Saturday's game will be the longest road trip for a conference game in Purdue Football history.
- The Boilermakers have made five trips to Seattle to face Washington, their most-common opponent from the West Coast, having met 10 times throughout history.
- Six of those 2,000-mile road trips have been to the Los Angeles area for matchups against UCLA and USC, as well as a pair of Rose Bowl appearances (1967, 2001).

MISSING MOCKOBBE

- For the rest of the season, Purdue is without one of the best running backs in program history.
- Devin Mockobee suffered an injury in the fourth quarter against Rutgers (Oct. 24), which required season-ending surgery.
- Mockobee missed the matchup at No. 21 Michigan (Nov. 1) due to injury, snapping a streak of 37 straight games played by the starting running back going all the way back to the 2022 season opener.
- Mockobee appeared in five games before earning the starting position midway through the 2022 campaign and never looking back.
- The Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year semifinalist ranks in the program's Top 10 in several career categories: 100-yard rushing games (4th - 9), rushing yards (4th - 2,987), all-purpose yards (7th - 3,864) and rushing touchdowns (9th - 23).
- This season, Mockobee leads the team in rushing yards (521) and rushing touchdowns (4). He has also thrown a touchdown and caught a touchdown this year.

LAST WEEK VS. OHIO STATE

- Purdue held a 3-0 advantage at the conclusion of the first quarter, becoming the first team to lead Ohio State at the end of the first quarter this season.
- The Purdue offensive line did not allow a sack on 22 pass attempts. It marked the third time this season that the o-line played a complete game without giving up a sack.
- Purdue became the second team this season to hold Ohio State scoreless in two quarters, the first coming being Texas in the season opener.
- Mani Powell had 13 tackles, one sack, and 1.5 tackles-for-loss. It was Powell's fourth game this season with double digit tackles.
- CJ Nunnally IV became the first Boilermaker defensive lineman with an interception since George Karlaftis on Sept. 14, 2019 vs. TCU.

CJ STUFFS THE STAT SHEET

- Joining Purdue after two years as a First Team All-MAC defensive lineman at Akron, CJ Nunnally IV has proven to be a major transfer pickup for Barry Odom's Boilermakers.
- The Douglasville, Georgia, native leads Purdue in sacks (5.0), forced fumbles (2) and QB hurries (8), while ranking second in tackles-for-loss (7.5). He also has an interception and a fumble recovery to his credit.
- Nunnally is one of three players in the FBS this season with at least seven tackles-for-loss, five sacks, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception (Xavier Adkinson, Auburn and Byrun Parham, UConn).
- He recorded the first interception of his career last game against No. 1 Ohio State, picking off Heisman Trophy favorite Julian Sayin in the end zone. His interception was the first by a Boilermaker defensive lineman since George Karlaftis against TCU in 2019.
- Nunnally has picked up the pace lately, forcing two fumbles and intercepting a pass over the last three games.
- He has at least five sacks in all three of his seasons at the FBS level.

SWARM THE BALL

- Mani Powell (94), Tahj Ra-El (91) and Charles Correa (88) have combined for 273 tackles this season, more than any other trio of teammates in the country.
- The Top 3 tacklers in the Big Ten are Boilermakers. Powell leads the way, Ra-El ranks second, and Correa is tied for third. Those numbers are even better in conference play. Powell's 11.1 tackles per conference contest lead the Big Ten, while Ra-El (9.7) and Correa (9.3) round out the Top 3.
- The three Boilermakers crack the nation's Top 30 in tackle average. Powell ranks 18th (9.4), Ra-El (9.1) ranks 22nd and Correa (8.8) ranks 28th.
- With Ra-El's career-high 15-tackle performance against Rutgers, Purdue became the second team nationwide to record at least three individual 15-tackle games this season (Buffalo).
- Correa and Powell led the attack against No. 22 Illinois, recording 15 and 14 tackles, respectively. They became the first pair of Purdue teammates to have at least 14 tackles in the same game since the Boilermakers' 2021 Music City Bowl win over Tennessee (Chris Jefferson, Jaylan Alexander and Kieren Douglas).



**BOILER NOTES****SPECIAL SPENCER**

- Spencer Porath has been a major factor in Purdue's special teams play this season, going 12-of-13 on field goals.
- The sophomore went 7-for-11 as a freshman. He eclipsed his make total in game four this season.
- Against Michigan this season, Porath connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal. It was Purdue's first kick of 50 or more yards since J.D. Dellinger made a 53-yard boot against TCU in 2019.
- Porath is one of 14 kickers this season to have made 10 or more field goals at a 90% clip with a long of 50 yards or better. He and USC's Ryon Sayeri are the lone representatives from the Big Ten.
- Porath's perfection through the his first nine kicks of the season matched the best start by a Purdue kicker since Mitchell Fineran in 2021.
- In just 18 career games, Porath has moved into 14th on the Purdue career charts with 19 made kicks.
- His 79.1% career field goal clip is currently second in Purdue history.
- He made a career-high three field goals at No. 21 Notre Dame. That included a career-long 48-yard field goal in the second quarter.
- Against Southern Illinois, he scored 10 points thanks to a pair of field goals and splitting the uprights on four PATs. For his performance, Porath became Purdue's first Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week since Dellinger six seasons ago (Nov. 11, 2019).

FROM GEORGIA TO PURDUE

- In the offseason, the Purdue wide receiver room welcomed a pair of Georgia transfers who have become an important part of the Boilermaker offense.
- After making the move north, Michael Jackson III and Nitro Tuggle have combined for 79 catches for 834 yards and five touchdowns this season.
- Jackson leads the Boilermakers in receptions (53) and receiving yards (471), while Tuggle ranks second in both categories, 26 and 363, respectively, and his four receiving touchdowns are a team best.
- Jackson hauled in a career-high 14 receptions against No. 22 Illinois, the only Big Ten player to reach that mark this season. It was also the most catches by a Boilermaker since Rondale Moore (Minnesota Vikings) caught 15 passes against Minnesota (Nov. 20, 2020).
- Scoring a touchdown against Notre Dame, Tuggle became the first Purdue wide receiver to find the end zone in three straight games since Charlie Jones (Cincinnati Bengals) accomplished the feat during his 2022 All-American season.

MANI'S THE MAN

- A leader on the field and in the locker room as a team captain, Mani Powell is the Big Ten's leading tackler through the first 10 games of the season.
- Powell leads the conference in total tackles (94) and ranks 17th nationally with 9.4 tackles per game. He has been even better in conference play, as his 11.1 tackles per game in BIG games lead the league.
- He also paces Purdue with 10.0 tackles-for-loss and ranks second on the team with 4.0 sacks.
- Against Northwestern, the Columbus, Ohio, native produced one of the best performances this century by a Purdue defender. He made a career-high 20 tackles, the most by a Big Ten player in a conference game since 2018.
- Powell's game marked the first time a Boilermaker recorded 20 tackles in a game since Willie Fells accomplished the feat against Iowa 28 years ago (Nov. 1, 1997).

JASON WITTEN MAN OF THE YEAR SEMIFINALIST

- Due to his positive impact both on and off the field, Devin Mockobee was named a semifinalist for the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year. Mockobee was selected as one of 20 semifinalists who have all demonstrated a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.
- Mockobee is no stranger to being recognized for his contributions on and off the field, having also earned spots on the Wuerffel Trophy and AFCA Good Works Team Watch Lists.
- Off the field, Mockobee has showcased his leadership by giving back to the community. A native of Boonville, Indiana, Mockobee returned to his hometown this summer to make a \$10,000 donation to Pioneer Junior Football and Cheer. It was with Pioneer that Mockobee fell in love with the game of football, leading to him being only 648 yards away from becoming Purdue's career leading rusher.
- Also making an impact in the Greater Lafayette community, Mockobee has made several visits to the Boys and Girls Club of Lafayette as well as Food Finders Food Bank.

TACKLING MACHINE

- Making the move with head coach Barry Odom from Las Vegas to West Lafayette, sophomore linebacker Charles Correa has made an immediate impact for the Boilermaker defense.
- Correa has made 88 tackles on the season, leading the Big Ten and averaging 8.8 tackles per game to rank 28th nationally.
- He was the first Boilermaker underclassmen with at least 49 tackles through five games since Ja'Whaun Bentley in 2015.
- Correa was the first Boilermaker since at least 1995 to record 10 or more tackles in four of the first five games and just the 14th Big Ten player to do so in that span.
- He is one of three underclassmen with 10 or more tackles in at least five games this season.
- With four double-digit tackle games, Correa is tied for seventh-most in a season at Purdue since 1995.

SUPPRESSING THE PASSING GAME

- Purdue held its opponent below 50 percent in pass completions for two consecutive weeks, containing Minnesota to 46.7 percent (Oct. 11) and Northwestern to 42.3 percent (Oct. 18).
- It marked the first time Purdue held Big Ten opponents to under 50 percent in back-to-back games since 2014 (Minnesota - 50.0, Nebraska - 38.1).
- Purdue joined Oregon and UCLA as the only three Big Ten teams to hold a Big Ten opponent under 50 percent in multiple games this season.
- During the two games, the Boilers totaled 20 passes defended and picked off their first two passes of the season. Purdue's 12 passes defended at Minnesota are tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in the FBS this year.

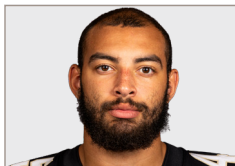

BOILER NOTES

OFFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

- With offensive coordinator Josh Henson calling the plays, Purdue has moved the ball up and down the field this year.
- The Boilermakers have averaged 356.4 yards of total offense, close to an improvement of 100-plus yards from the 2024 season.
- After racking up 453 yards against No. 22 Illinois, the Purdue offense recorded a season-high 456 yards at Minnesota. It marked the first time that the Boilermakers reached 450 yards of total offense in back-to-back Big Ten games since November 2021 (481 at Ohio State, 473 versus Northwestern).
- Purdue has scored at least 24 points in five games this year. The 2024 Boilermakers reached the 24-point plateau just twice throughout the entire season, averaging 15.8 points per game.

THAT'S A FACT JACK - FOR THE BRAND

- A starting punter for the past three seasons at Washington, senior Jack McCallister had no problem bringing his talents from the Pacific Northwest to West Lafayette.
- A weapon for the Boilermakers, McCallister's punts forced opponents to a starting field position of their own 22.4-yard line; that number was the 10.8-yard line over the opening three games of the season.
- Purdue ranks 18th nationally and leads the Big Ten in net punting at 42.2 yards.
- McCallister has punted 38 times on the year for an average of 44.8 yards per boot. He has dropped 16 balls inside the 20-yard line and launched 12 punts of 50 yards or more with a long of 68.
- His punts have been returned just 15 times for an average of 3.9 yards per return.
- McCallister ran a fake punt for 10 yards and a first down through contact at Notre Dame, the first Purdue punter to run for a first down since Joe Schopper at Rutgers in 2017.
- Against USC, McCallister was called upon three times for an average of 54.3 yards per game, including a 68-yard boot.
- The 68-yard punt was the longest by a Boilermaker since Brooks Cormier's 69-yard punt against Minnesota in 2019.
- He is one of three Purdue punters to average 50+ yards on a minimum of three punts twice in a season since at least 1995, joining Jared Armstrong (2006) and Travis Dorsch (2000, 2001).
- In his Purdue debut, McCallister landed all three of his punts inside the 20-yard line for an average of 50.3 yards.
- He was named to the Ray Guy Award Ray's 8 after Week 1 and Week 3 of the season.

IN THE BIG HOUSE

- In a hard fought battle, Purdue fell to No. 21 Michigan 21-16 at Michigan Stadium to kick off the month of November. The Wolverines entered the contest winning all four of their previous home games by at least 14 points.
- The Boilermaker defense forced a pair of red zone turnovers, an interception by Hudaori Hines and a forced fumble by CJ Nunnally at the goal line that went out of the back of the end zone.
- Purdue produced a 16-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that nine minutes and thirty seconds off the clock, the team's longest drive in terms of time duration this season. It was the longest drive in plays for the Boilermakers since 2022 when they scored a touchdown on a 19-play drive against Illinois.
- Tahj Ra-El finished with double-digit tackles for the third straight game, leading the team with 13 stops on the night.
- Spencer Porath connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal early in the third quarter, the longest by a Boilermaker kicker since JD Dellinger hit a 53-yarder against TCU in 2019.
- Winston Berglund got his hand on a punt in the third quarter, the first blocked punt by the Boilermakers since the season opener in 2024 by Leland Smith.

NOTABLES ON RUTGERS

- Four Boilermakers recorded at least 10 tackles on against Rutgers, making Purdue the first Big Ten team to achieve that this year.
- Purdue ran 28 times for 217 yards. An average of 7.8 yards per carry tied the Boilermakers 10th highest mark since 1995.
- The Boilermakers committed no penalties for just the fourth time in the last 20 years.
- Purdue recorded a season-high five sacks.
- The Boilermakers' 92-yard drive in the first quarter was their longest scoring drive of the season.
- Three Boilermakers (Devin Mockobee, Malachi Thomas, and Antonio Harris) had a rush of 30-or-more yards for the first time since 2018 vs. Eastern Michigan (D.J. Knox, Markell Jones, and Rondale Moore).
- Thomas became the first Boilermaker with a rush of 40-or-more yards and a reception of 40-or-more yards in a game since Akeem Hunt in 2012 (vs. Eastern Michigan).

RUNNING WILD IN MINNESOTA

- Against Minnesota, the Boilers set a season high with 253 yards on the ground, their most since 263 yards at Oregon State last season.
- Devin Mockobee led the rushing attack with 98 yards, two yards shy of his third 100-yard game against the Golden Gophers.
- Ryan Browne added 61 yards on the ground on eight carries, and Malachi Singleton tacked on a career-high 73 yards on five rushes. Both quarterbacks had rushing touchdowns. The 134 yards on the ground were the most by Purdue quarterbacks since Rob Henry rushed for 132 yards at Northwestern in 2010.
- Browne and Singleton also became the first quarterback duo at Purdue to both rush for 50 yards in a game since at least 1995.
- Browne, Singleton and Mockobee were the first trio with 60+ yards on the ground since Raheem Mostert, Akeem Hunt and Austin Appleby did it against Minnesota in 2014.

ALL SMILES

- Sophomore Smiley Bradford has become one of Purdue's best defenders in the passing game.
- The defensive back is tied for second on the team in pass breakups (5) and has one interception, recording his first career INT against Northwestern.
- Also against Northwestern, he earned a 90.1 coverage grade to sit atop the Big Ten and rank second nationally (min. 15 coverage snaps).

STOPPING THE GOPHER GROUND GAME

- While Purdue ran for 253 yards at Minnesota, the defense limited the Golden Gophers to only 30 yards on the ground.
- It marked the sixth game since 2000 that Purdue allowed 30 yards or fewer on the ground and just the third against Big Ten competition.

**BOILER NOTES****HERE COMES THE MOCKTRAIN**

- From walk-on to phenom, Devin Mockobee will finish his career as one of the best running backs in Purdue history.
- Mockobee has led the rushing attack this season with 521 yards and four touchdowns on 125 rushing attempts.
- He has amassed 2,987 yards on 630 carries with 23 touchdowns throughout his career with nine games over 100 yards rushing.
- Mockobee is fourth on the career rushing chart and 14th on Purdue's all-time touchdown list with 26 scores.
- He carried the ball 32 times for 126 yards and his first career multi-touchdown game against Southern Illinois.
- The senior was named to the Doak Walker Award, Wuerffel Trophy and AFCA Good Works Team Watch Lists, as well as the Senior Bowl Top 300 list.
- Mockobee did not entertain entering the transfer portal after last season, instead focusing on completing his mechanical engineering technology degree. His close connection to running backs coach Lamar Conard (2000 Purdue graduate), who was retained by Barry Odom, also was a major factor in staying at Purdue.
- He is one of 13 Big Ten running backs to rush for 650 yards in the last 10 years, a list that includes Saquon Barkley, Jonathan Taylor and Nicholas Singleton.
- Mockobee's impact can be felt beyond the field after donating \$10,000 to youth football in his hometown during the offseason.

WHAT CAN BROWNE DO FOR YOU

- Quarterback Ryan Browne has thrown for 1,689 yards on 163-266 passing with nine touchdowns.
- The junior was one of three Purdue quarterbacks to post three 300-yard passing games in the opening five games of a season (Drew Brees - 1999, 2000 | Kyle Orton - 2004 | Curtis Painter - 2007) since 1995.
- Browne (15.0) joined Kyle Orton as the only two Purdue quarterbacks since 1995 to average 15.0 yards per completion through the first two games of the year (Kyle Orton 15.8 in 2004 and 15.0 in 2002).
- Browne was named the starting quarterback by head coach Barry Odom in the last week of fall camp after a competition with Malachi Singleton, Bennett Meredith and Evans Chuba and Garyt Odom.
- Browne served as a backup for the Boilermakers last year, making one start, before spending the spring semester under Bill Belichick at North Carolina. He transferred back to Purdue during the spring portal window.

BY LAND, AIR AND RE(SEA)TING

- Ryan Browne has accounted for 13 touchdowns this year.
- Not only has he thrown for eight touchdowns while adding a four on the ground, the Purdue quarterback also has caught a touchdown pass.
- Using a little trickery against Notre Dame, Devin Mockobee took the handoff from Browne before tossing the ball back to the quarterback in the flat. Wide open on the swing pass, Browne caught the first pass of his career and strolled into the end zone for a 14-yard touchdown.
- Browne became just the second player in the country to have at least one passing, rushing and receiving touchdown (Kiael Kelly - Ball State) this season. Browne was the first Big Ten quarterback to accomplish the feat since Iowa's Spencer Petras in 2020. Illinois' Luke Altmyer joined Browne after catching a touchdown pass against USC.
- Since 2001, Browne is one of two Purdue QBs to record a receiving touchdown (David Blough - 2018). He joined Blough, Brandon Hance (2001) and Drew Brees (1999, 2000) as the only Boilermaker quarterbacks since 1995 to catch a touchdown pass.

MOCKING MOVING UP THE CHARTS

- Mockobee has already climbed into the top 10 at Purdue in several career categories: fourth in career rushing attempts (630), fourth in career yards (2,987), ninth in rushing touchdowns (23), fourth in 100-yard rushing games (9) and seventh in all-purpose yards 3,864.
- With a 59-yard day against Ball State, he became just the eighth Boilermaker in history to rack up 2,500 career rushing yards, moving up to seventh on the all-time charts in the process.
- His 126-yard outing against Southern Illinois saw him vault two spots up the rushing yards charts into the top five.
- The MockTrain is the ninth running back to lead Purdue in rushing for three straight seasons since 1946.
- He started his career by setting a new Purdue freshman record with 968 rushing yards while also adding nine touchdowns in 2022. After being put on scholarship, he led the team in rushing once again with 807 yards and six touchdowns in 2023. He posted 687 yards and four scores in 2024.

DEALING WITH DELAYS

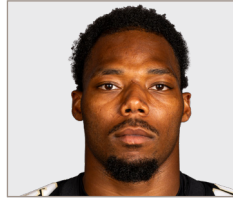
- Mother Nature has brought lightning to Purdue gamedays to lead to delays totaling nearly five hours over two games this season.
- The start of the Boilermakers' game against USC (Sept. 13), the first Big Ten contest of the Barry Odom era, was delayed three hours and five minutes.
- One week later, Purdue forced a fumble and was driving in Notre Dame territory before the game was called due to lightning in the area. That delay lasted one hour and 54 minutes before resuming the second quarter and transitioning right into the second half.
- Two years ago (Sept. 9, 2023), Purdue and Virginia Tech were part of the longest weather delay in college football history (five hours, 27 minutes). After resuming play, the Boilermakers emerged with a 24-17 road victory.

THE MOCKCAT OFFENSE

- In his first four years as a Boilermaker, Devin Mockobee never took a snap from the quarterback position. However, under new offensive coordinator Josh Henson, the Wildcat formation has become the Mockcat.
- All four of Mockobee's rushing touchdowns this season have come from the Purdue running back taking the snap before rumbling into the end zone.
- Scoring a pair of touchdowns in the win over Southern Illinois, Mockobee recorded his first game with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- When Mockobee missed the Michigan game, Antonio Harris pounded the ball into the end zone from two yards out of the wildcat.

SEASON-OPENING SHUTOUT

- For the second straight season, Purdue began the year with a shutout victory. Jack Mollenkopf's Boilermakers in 1964 and 1965 were the last to record a season-opening shutout in consecutive seasons.
- The Boilermakers were one of 10 programs nationwide to start the season with a shutout, including one of only two Big Ten teams (Wisconsin).
- Purdue kept an FBS opponent off the scoreboard for the first time since a 49-0 victory over UConn in 2021.
- The Boilers limited Ball State to only 203 yards of total offense, which included just 87 passing yards. The defense also racked up seven tackles-for-loss and four sacks.
- Purdue was one of 21 teams over Week 0 and Week 1 to allow just one trip or less to the red zone.

FAST START

- Purdue got off to fast starts in its first two games of the season. The Boilermakers scored touchdowns on their first two drives in both games, totaling 28 points. Purdue scored only 13 first quarter points Purdue throughout all of last season.
- Arhmad Branch scored Purdue's first touchdown in both games. The wide receiver has gotten off to fast starts of his own, recording five catches for 129 yards and two touchdowns in first quarters this year.
- It took the Boilermakers two plays and only 36 seconds to score for their first points of the season. After a 13-yard run by Devin Mockobee, Ryan Browne found Branch down the middle of the field. The sophomore wideout broke multiple tackles and added a smooth spin move before finding the end zone for the 49-yard touchdown.
- The last time Purdue scored within the first minute of the season was at the start of the 1981 campaign.

A BACK-TO-BACK START

- With the win over Southern Illinois, Barry Odom became the first Purdue head coach to start his tenure in West Lafayette 2-0 in more than a century.
- The last coach to start his tenure 2-0 was Cleo O'Donnell in 1916 when he beat Monon Bell rivals Wabash and DePauw.
- The best start to a Purdue career was by Knowlton Ames, who went a perfect 12-0 over two seasons (4-0 in 1891, 8-0 in 1892) to win back-to-back Indiana Intercollegiate Athletic Association Championships.

IN-STATE OPPOSITION

- A schedule rarity, Purdue has three opponents from the state of Indiana this season.
- Purdue downed Ball State 31-0 to start the year, before falling at No. 21 Notre Dame.
- Purdue will close the regular season with the 100th Old Oaken Bucket Game against Indiana on Black Friday (Nov. 28)
- It marks the second straight season the Boilermakers will face three in-state foes and just the fifth time in the last 25 years.

6-FOR-6

- A season ago, Arhmad Branch's lone touch was a 3-yard touchdown on an end-around. Impressing the new coaching staff in the spring and throughout fall camp, it was evident that the sophomore was going to get more than one look in the season opener.
- Quarterback Ryan Browne targeted Branch early, posting three catches for 101 yards in the first quarter.
- Not only did Branch produce a 100-yard quarter, he became the first Purdue wide receiver to record a 100-yard game since Abdur-Rahmaan Yassen (Sept. 16, 2023 vs. Syracuse).
- Branch's first career catch was a 49-yard touchdown on the second play of the game for Purdue's first score of the season. On the second drive, he started off with a 17-yard snag before hauling in an impressive one-handed grab for 35 yards.
- Branch was one of only two wide receivers in the country to eclipse 100 yards on three-or-fewer receptions on the opening weekend, the first Boilermaker to accomplish the feat since 2008.

NO PUNTS, NO PROBLEM

- In the 34-17 victory over Southern Illinois, the Purdue offense was so efficient that the Boilermakers did not have to punt during the game.
- It marked the first time Purdue played an entire game without punting since 2016, a 24-14 win over Nevada.
- The Boilermakers have had four games without a punt over the past 21 years, all games resulting in victories.
- Punting only six times this season, Purdue leads the nation in net punting with a 52.5 average. That includes ranking sixth in punt return defense, producing negative yardage (-0.5 average).

SLINGING IT AROUND IN THE SEASON OPENER

- Ryan Browne notched his first career win against Ball State behind a career-high 311 yards on 18-of-26 passing with a pair of touchdowns. He added another score on the ground.
- Browne was one of eight quarterbacks to throw for 300 yards against FBS opposition on the opening weekend of the season and was one of two to throw for 300 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while scoring another on the ground (Maverick McIvor - Western Kentucky) against an FBS team.
- He joined Drew Brees (2000), Elijah Sindelar (2019), Jack Plummer (2021) and Aidan O'Connell (2022) as the only Purdue quarterbacks to register a 300-yard passing game in the season opener since 1995.
- He was the lone Big Ten quarterback to throw for 300 yards in Week 1 and led the league in total offense.

HARD, SMART, TOUGH

- The three core principles of a Barry Odom-coached program are: hard, smart and tough. Playing football that way helped Odom's UNLV teams succeed in all three phases of the game each of the past two seasons.
- Odom's defenses have made 17 interceptions in both the 2023 season and the 2024 campaign. The 34 INTs were the second most recorded by a team over the past two years. The defenses also forced 49 turnovers during the two-year span, ranking fifth nationally.
- Odom's teams have put up points over the past two seasons, averaging 34.4 points per game in 2023 (22nd nationally) and 36.2 ppg in 2024 (14th nationally). The 953 total points throughout both 2023 and 2024 ranked sixth in the country.
- Odom emphasizes special teams, realizing it brings a winning edge to a program. In 2023, Odom's Rebels made 26-of-29 field goals for an 89.7 percent clip. Last season, his special teams unit blocked five punts to lead the nation.

ADDING THROUGH THE PORTAL

- It's a brand new era under head coach Barry Odom. With a coaching change, there always comes roster turnover. Odom welcomed at least 50 transfers in each of his two seasons at UNLV, attacking the portal to produce two of the best seasons in UNLV history.
- Heading into the 2025 campaign, Purdue has welcomed 54 transfers, which leads the nation. Add in high school signees and walk-ons, 82 Boilermakers are new to the program.
- Forty-six players practiced for the first day on the opening day of fall camp as post-spring practice additions.

HEAD COACH BARRY ODOM

Guiding one of the greatest resurgences in college football over the past two seasons, Barry Odom was named the new head football coach of the Purdue Boilermakers on December 8, 2024.

Odom, 48, became the 38th head coach in the history of Purdue Football, coming to West Lafayette following what could be considered the most impressive gridiron campaign in UNLV's school history. The Rebels reached double-digit wins for only the third time in program history (1974, 1984), with both previous seasons predating the program's move up to Division I competition and the Mountain West Conference, respectively. National recognition has followed, as the Rebels have achieved a program-best No. 19 ranking in both the AP and Coaches polls, as well as their first-ever CFP ranking.

Fresh off steering UNLV Football to its winningest season in 40 years, Odom has compiled an impressive list of accomplishments throughout his coaching career, which includes stints as a head coach in both the Southeastern Conference with Missouri (2016-19) and the Mountain West Conference with the Rebels (2023-24). UNLV has totaled 19 wins during Odom's time guiding the Rebels, making it the winningest two-year stretch in the school's history as a Division I program. As a head coach, he has secured four postseason appearances in six seasons, including two (2017 Texas Bowl, 2018 Liberty Bowl) bowl bids at Missouri.

His 19-8 mark with the Rebels bears significance in that the five seasons prior to his arrival (2017-22), UNLV won just 20 games. Impressively, his UNLV teams posted a 10-2 mark in true road games after the program only won eight total road games in the previous six seasons (8-25).

In just two seasons, Odom dramatically changed expectations in Las Vegas, with UNLV twice advancing to the MWC Championship Game after the program had not made a single appearance in the event prior to his arrival. Following Odom's first campaign in Las Vegas (9-5, 6-2 MWC), he was named the 2023 Mountain West Coach of the Year. He also earned distinction as the program's first-ever Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award finalist. The 2023 season culminated in an appearance in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl in Phoenix, Arizona.

Odom's adept tutelage saw three Rebels earn All-America status, and the program christened its first-ever First Team Academic All-American after the 2023 season. Back-to-back seasons of six First Team All-MWC honorees for the Rebels have occurred, including a school-record 12 combined recognitions between the conference's first and second teams in 2024. Incoming Rebels have seen a boost in notoriety, as well, with Odom's 2025 signees ranking as the top class in the Mountain West.

Odom has also spent impactful tenures as a highly regarded defensive coordinator at Memphis (2012-14), Missouri (2015) and Arkansas (2020-22). For the Razorbacks, Odom served as associate head coach, defensive coordinator and safeties coach. His 2021 defense turned heads, as it allowed just 22.9 points per game – 12 points fewer per game than in 2020 and the fewest for an Arkansas defense since 2014. Focusing on the run defense, the unit evolved to allow just 153.9 yards per game, the fewest for Arkansas since 2015. Under Odom's watch, Arkansas' 18 takeaways during the 2020 campaign ranked 25th nationally. The Razorbacks' 13 interceptions were second most in the SEC and 13th most in the FBS.

During his first defensive coordinator job at Memphis in 2012, he transformed the Tigers into a defensive power. In 2014, his defense ranked fifth nationally in scoring defense (17.1 points per game) and 22nd nationally in total defense (343.3 yards per game) to help the Tigers go 10-3. That marked an incredible turnaround for a Memphis team that ranked 117th in total defense prior to his arrival. The program improved defensively each year under Odom, rising from 50th nationally in total defense in 2012 to 39th in 2013 to 22nd in his final year.

Before moving to Fayetteville, Odom spent four seasons as Missouri's head coach, taking two of his teams to bowl games and finishing at .500 or better three times en route to building an overall record of 25-25 from 2016-19. His 2018 Missouri squad finished the regular season ranked 23rd in the College Football Playoff poll.

Regarded among the coaching fraternity for his steadfast pathway to the top, Odom was promoted to the head coaching role at Missouri following the retirement of Gary Pinkel, whom he worked for in numerous capacities while on staff at Missouri in two separate stints. From 2003-2011, Odom served as graduate assistant, director of recruiting, director of football operations and safeties coach for the Tigers. Upon returning from his three seasons at Memphis, Odom served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2015 before his promotion ahead of the 2016 season.

Odom was born in Lawton, Oklahoma, and raised in Maysville, Oklahoma. He was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker for Missouri from 1996-99, helping the school make two bowl trips and serving as team captain during his senior season. He ended his MU career ranked in the program's all-time top 10 with 362 tackles.

Odom graduated from Missouri in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in education and earned his master's in education from the school in 2004. He and his wife, Tia, have two sons, JT and Garyt, and a daughter, Anna.

ROSS-ADE STADIUM HISTORY

• Ross-Ade Stadium was dedicated Nov. 22, 1924, ahead of its first game when Purdue hosted Indiana. The Boilermakers demolished their in-state foes in a 26-7 rout.

• The two men for whom the stadium is named after, David E. Ross and George Ade, were instrumental in building a stadium that has served as the backdrop to Purdue lore over the last 101 seasons. Ross conceived of the idea for a new stadium to replace Stuart Field, a 5,000-seat stadium that hosted Purdue Football from 1892 to 1924 and was located where the Elliott Hall of Music stands today.

• The original capacity for Ross-Ade Stadium in 1924 was 18,500, including standing room tickets. Over the years and several renovations, the capacity grew to its largest at 69,200 in 1970.

• The largest crowd ever to see a game at Ross-Ade is 71,629 against Indiana on Nov. 22, 1980, when Purdue outlasted the Hoosiers, 24-23, on the shoulders of consensus All-Americans quarterback (and current John Purdue Club Director of Leadership and Alumni Engagement) Mark Herrmann and tight end Dave Young.

• Additional upgrades to the stadium included a new press box, luxury boxes and premium club areas in 2003 as a part of a \$70 million project. Permanent lighting was installed in 2017 and a new sound system in 2018.

• The Tyler Trent (T²) Student Gate was dedicated during the 2019 season in memory of Purdue superfan Tyler Trent who passed away at the age of 20 from osteosarcoma. The T² Gate was relocated to the south side of the stadium after the 2023 student section renovations were completed.

PHASE 1

The 2023 season saw the completion of the Phase I of a multi-phased renovation project at a cost of more \$45 million, fully funded by gifts to the John Purdue Club.

The three main enhancements to the stadium were the Tiller Tunnel, the south end zone student section and the team dining facility, which opened in July of 2024, on the north side of the stadium, bringing the total capacity up to 61,441.

SOUTH END ZONE PROJECT

The Purdue student section and the All-American Marching Band have a new home in the south end zone of Ross-Ade Stadium. As a part of the Phase I project, the dedicated student section enhancements included the addition of a new Tyler Trent student entrance area, safe standing seats, patio and deck areas, rail seating, and enhanced concessions.

The completion of the bowl, in addition to the investment in the size of the concourse, allows for a more accessible fan experience as fans will now be able to traverse the entire stadium at the concourse level.

TILLER TUNNEL

The Boilermakers run onto Rohrman Field at Ross-Ade Stadium via the Tiller Tunnel. Completed in 2023, the tunnel provides direct access to the team back to the Kozuch Football Performance Center.

The tunnel is named in honor of the Purdue Hall of Fame inductee Joe Tiller, the winningest coach in the history of Purdue Football. Tiller left an incredible legacy on the program and Boilermakers everywhere. The result was 10 bowl games, including the 2001 Rose Bowl, and a Big Ten Conference championship in 2000.

THE MEMORIAL TUNNEL

Purdue was slated to face in-state foe Indiana in 1903 at a neutral site for the first time at Washington Park in Indianapolis.

Purdue reserved two special charter trains in order to carry the football team and over 1,500 supporters to the state capital.

Around 10 a.m. on Oct. 31, 1903, the lead special charter train carrying the team, members of the band and other university administrators collided with a northbound coal train. Seventeen people were killed, including 14 members of the football team.

Purdue dedicated the southeast tunnel of Ross-Ade Stadium to the victims of the tragedy in 2003 to mark the centennial of the wreck. Memorial Gymnasium, now Felix Haas Hall housing the Department of Computer Science, was dedicated to the victims in 1909. It has 17 steps at the entrance, one for each victim.

DEN OF DEFENSIVE ENDS

Throughout its history, Purdue has produced many outstanding defensive ends, creating an institution unlike any other in college football - The Den of Defensive Ends.

The tradition of The Den of Defensive Ends dates to the days of Leo Sugar and Lamar Lundy from the late 1940s to the mid-1950s and Keena Turner in the late 1970s, but it has flourished more recently. While Purdue's high-powered offense has made headlines under head coaches like Joe Tiller and Jeff Brohm, the Boilermakers' defense made a name for itself principally for the play of its ends.

CRADLE OF QUARTERBACKS

The Cradle of Quarterbacks has evolved over the last 70 years as a defining feature of Purdue Football. Boilermakers have set numerous NCAA and Big Ten Conference records, many have been chosen as All-Americans and national awards winners or finalists.

Fifteen former Purdue signal-callers have gone on to play in the National Football League. Drew Brees, Len Dawson and Bob Griese combined to win four Super Bowls. Purdue is one of just two universities that can claim three Super Bowl champs at the position. (Alabama)

The reference to Cradle of Quarterbacks was added in the late 1970s when the poster was updated to include Mark Herrmann.

Purdue opened the season with a resounding 31-0 win over Ball State.

Ryan Browne completed 69.2% of his passes with no turnovers. He finished 18-of-26 passing for a career-high 311 yards and two touchdowns, connecting with seven receivers.

Devin Mockobee paced the offense with 104 all-purpose yards (59 rushing, 45 receiving) and a touchdown. He moved from ninth to seventh place on Purdue's all-time rushing list (2,521 career rushing yards) and is now 73 yards away from tying Markell Jones for the No. 6 spot.

Mockobee became the 10th Boilermaker to score 20 rushing touchdowns.

Arhmad Branch led the aerial attack with a touchdown and 101 receiving yards, the most by a Purdue wide receiver since Abdur-Rahmaan Yaseen had 114 against Syracuse on Sept. 16, 2023. He scored on just the second play from scrimmage on a 49-yard dime from Browne, setting the tone early.

Michael Jackson III had a game-high six catches, matching his career best in his Purdue debut. He caught a 14-yard pass from Browne to score his first touchdown as a Boiler in the third quarter.

The defense held the Cardinals to 203 total yards and just 87 yards through the air. BSU averaged just 3.9 yards per play.

Tahj Ra-El led the team with seven tackles (all solos), including one for a loss. The Boilers made life difficult for the Cardinals all day, stuffing them behind the line for seven tackles for loss, including four sacks.

Jack McCallister had three punts for 151 yards, an average of 50.3 per punt, all landing within the Ball State 20-yard line.

Purdue improved to 2-0 with a 34-17 victory over SIU, giving head coach Barry Odom the program's best start in a Purdue coach's first year since 1916.

Ryan Browne directed a balanced attack, completing 14-of-23 passes for 170 yards and two touchdowns. The sophomore also added 50 yards rushing, helping Purdue score on six of its eight drives without a punt.

Devin Mockobee carried the load on the ground with 32 attempts for 126 yards and two touchdowns, his first career game with multiple rushing scores. The senior climbed to fifth on Purdue's all-time rushing list (2,651 yards) while notching his ninth career 100-yard game.

Tight end George Burhenn paced the receiving corps with three catches for 48 yards. Arhmad Branch opened Purdue's scoring on a 13-yard touchdown grab, while Georgia transfer Nitro Tuggle hauled in his first career touchdown on a 29-yard strike from Browne late in the first quarter.

The Boilermaker defense rebounded after allowing two early touchdowns, limiting the Salukis to just three points over the final three quarters. Purdue held SIU to 81 rushing yards on 26 carries, an average of 3.1 yards per attempt.

CJ Nunnally IV made back-to-back sacks in the 4Q, his first multi-sack game in a Purdue uniform. Charles Correa made a big play in the first half, tallying his first career sack on third down to force the Salukis' initial punt.

Tahj Ra-El led the team again with seven solo tackles. The Boilers finished with three sacks and seven tackles for loss on the night.

Kicker Spencer Porath remained perfect on the season, drilling field goals from 28 and 43 yards. He's now 3-for-3.

After a three-hour weather delay, Purdue dropped its BIG opener 33-17 to USC.

Ryan Browne continued to shine, throwing for 305 yards and two touchdowns. He opened the second half with a highlight-reel play, scooping up a tipped backward pass on a trick play and racing 26 yards for a score. Later in the third quarter, he found Nitro Tuggle for a nine-yard touchdown, marking the Georgia transfer's second consecutive game with a touchdown.

Tuggle and EJ Horton Jr. led Purdue receivers with 70 yards each, while senior running back Devin Mockobee added 45 yards on the ground.

Despite producing 365 yards of total offense, the Boilermakers were undone by three interceptions in USC territory. The Trojans countered with 460 yards, led by quarterback Jayden Maiava, who threw for 282 yards and added a rushing touchdown.

On defense, Myles Slusher posted a career-high 12 tackles, while Charles Correa set his own mark with 11. Demeco Kennedy chipped in his first career sack, bringing down Maiava for a nine-yard loss in the second quarter.

Special teams provided bright spots once again. Kicker Spencer Porath stayed perfect on the season, drilling a 39-yard field goal in the second quarter. Jack McCallister closed the night with a career-long 68-yard punt, averaging 54.3 yards on three attempts. He became the first Purdue punter since 2006 to average at least 50 yards per punt in multiple games during a season.

The Boilermakers fell to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in Big Ten play, while USC improved to 3-0 and 1-0 in the league.

In a second straight game with a weather delay, the Boilers totaled 23 points in the first half, their most against an FBS opponent since 2023, but it was not enough to keep up with #21 Notre Dame. A Myles Slusher strip-sack set up a Spencer Porath field goal, and Nitro Tuggle capped the half with a 24-yard touchdown reception. A 1:54 lightning delay doubled as halftime, and the Fighting Irish clamped down after the break.

Quarterback Ryan Browne went 21-of-34 passing for 250 yards and a touchdown. He also caught his first career pass for a touchdown on a trick play from Devin Mockobee. Tuggle paced the receivers with 66 yards and scored for the third straight game, the first Purdue wideout to do so since Charlie Jones in 2022.

Devin Mockobee added a career-high seven catches for 56 yards and threw his first career pass to Browne for a TD, becoming the first Boilermaker running back to throw for a TD since 2001. Malachi Singleton earned his first extended action in the fourth quarter, throwing his first career touchdown to Jesse Watson. It also marked Watson's first career score.

Slusher led the defense with 10 tackles, including eight solos, while forcing Purdue's first takeaway of the season. CJ Nunnally IV pounced on the fumble at the Notre Dame 19-yard line, setting up points before the half.

Porath remained perfect on the year by hitting all three field goals, highlighted by a career-long 48-yarder in the second quarter. He improved to 7-for-7 this season, the best start by a Purdue kicker since 2021.

Punter Jack McCallister averaged 45.2 yards on five punts, one of which landed inside the 20. He also converted a fake punt with a 10-yard run on 4th-and-5, the longest run by a Purdue punter since 2017 and the fourth-longest since 1995.

Purdue totaled 453 yards of offense but couldn't keep pace with No. 22 Illinois in a 43-27 loss Saturday afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers (2-3, 0-2 BIG) struck first with a 10-play, 62-yard drive capped by a one-yard touchdown from quarterback Ryan Browne, but the Fighting Illini (5-1, 2-1) answered with 24 straight points to take control and retain the Cannon Trophy.

Browne led the way offensively with 302 yards through the air on 30-of-50 passing, adding a rushing touchdown on six carries. He connected with sophomore wideout Corey Smith for a 60-yard strike late in the first half, marking Smith's first touchdown as a Boilermaker. The offense also found success on the ground, rushing for 151 yards behind an explosive day from Antonio Harris, who recorded his first career touchdown on a 41-yard run and led the team with 69 yards on just four carries.

Devin Mockobee added a one-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, his 23rd career score, while averaging 5.3 yards per carry. Michael Jackson III continued his breakout campaign, catching 14 passes for 94 yards to lead all receivers and surpass his most productive collegiate season just five games into his first year at Purdue. It was the most receptions by a Boilermaker since Rondale Moore had 15 at Minnesota on Nov. 20, 2020.

On defense, Charles Correa (15 tackles) and Mani Powell (14) anchored the effort with career days. Correa became the first Boilermaker since at least 1995 to record 10 or more tackles in four of the first five games, totaling 49 stops on the season to rank among the Big Ten's most productive defenders. Purdue registered two sacks, including one from CJ Nunnally IV and another shared between Demeco Kennedy and Ryan Turner.

Purdue Football dropped a hard-fought 27-20 battle at Minnesota despite outgaining the Golden Gophers 456-262. Three interceptions ultimately proved costly for the Boilermakers, including one returned for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter.

Trailing by seven with 7:40 left, quarterback Ryan Browne led a 15-play, 68-yard drive that reached the Minnesota 7-yard line, but the Gophers stood tall on fourth-and-goal. After a defensive stop gave Purdue one last possession, a hook-and-lateral attempt came up short as time expired.

Devin Mockobee carried the load with 98 yards on 21 rushes, moving up to fourth on Purdue's all-time rushing list with 2,868 yards. Browne (61 yards, one TD) and Malachi Singleton (73 yards, one TD) added balance on the ground, combining for the most rushing yards by Purdue quarterbacks in a game since at least 1995. The trio became the first Boilermakers to each top 60 rushing yards in a contest since 2014. Singleton's 40-yard touchdown run on fourth-and-2 in the opening quarter was the longest by a Purdue quarterback since 2015.

Browne went 21-of-40 passing for 203 yards, spreading completions to nine different receivers. Corey Smith led the group with a career-high six catches for 57 yards.

The Purdue defense turned in one of its best efforts of the season, holding Minnesota to just 30 rushing yards on 18 carries (1.7 avg) and limiting quarterback Drake Lindsey to a career-low 47% passing. The Boilers' 12 pass breakups marked their most in more than 15 years. Alex Sanford Jr., Mani Powell and Tahj Ra-El shared the team lead with seven tackles apiece, while CJ Nunnally IV and Ian Jeffries each recorded sacks.

Myles Slusher recorded Purdue's first interception of the season.

The Wildcats controlled the game thanks to their time of possession, holding the ball for nearly 38 minutes compared to 22 for the Boilermakers. While Northwestern held a 364-305 advantage in total offense, the home team ran 20 more plays than Purdue.

Mani Powell produced a career-high 20 tackles, the most by a Boilermaker in the last 20 years. His 20-tackle performance is the first by a Big Ten player since 2018 and is one of 13 by a Big Ten player since 2005.

Powell added a forced fumble, the first of his career, and 1.5 tackles-for-loss.

Tahj Ra-El (11) and Alex Sanford Jr. (10) both produced double-digit tackles. Sanford's total is a career high, and Ra-El tied his career high with three passes defended.

Malachi Singleton went 11-of-19 for 187 yards and added 20 rushing yards in relief of Ryan Browne, who was injured on the first play of the second half.

The Boilermakers forced their third turnover of the season during the fourth quarter when Hershey McLaurin knocked the ball out at the Purdue 18-yard line and Sanford Jr. recovered and returned the ball to the Purdue 28-yard line.

The forced fumble was McLaurin's second of his career and the recovery was Sanford's first.

Smiley Bradford followed later in the fourth quarter with Purdue's second interception of the season and the first of his career. He finished the game with three passes defended.

Purdue dropped a 27-24 heartbreaker to Rutgers in Ross-Ade Stadium.

Purdue led 17-7 after Devin Mockobee recorded his first receiving touchdown of the season and third of his career. Malachi Singleton found him wide open for a three-yard score in the third quarter.

But the Scarlet Knights stormed back to score two unanswered touchdowns, taking a 21-17 lead with 7:45 left. Michael Jackson III then shifted the momentum back to Purdue's side with a 56-yard kick return.

Ryan Browne and the offense capitalized with a seven-play, 41-yard drive and a 14-yard TD pass to Nitro Tuggle, giving Purdue a 24-21 edge.

Rutgers took the ball back and went 73 yards to kick a game-tying field goal with just over a minute to go. The Boilers had a chance to go down and win the game, but a pass from Browne deflected off a defender and back into the his hands. He tried to make a move on the busted play, but the Knights forced and recovered a fumble in Purdue territory.

Rutgers' Jai Patel then kicked a walk-off 30-yard field goal to spoil Purdue's Homecoming game.

Tahj Ra-El paced the defense with a career-high 15 tackles, followed by Charles Correa (13), Hershey McLaurin (12) and Mani Powell (11). The defense totaled a season-high five sacks with one apiece for McLaurin, CJ Nunnally IV, Trey Smith and Jamarrion Harkless, as well as a shared sack by Correa and Powell. McLaurin and Nunnally also each forced a fumble.

Purdue dropped its Saturday night clash at No. 21 Michigan, 21-16, in a hard-fought effort against its third ranked opponent of the season.

Michigan struck first late in the first quarter, and Purdue responded with a 16-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. Antonio Harris scored by taking a direct snap out of the wildcat and rushing two yards up the middle. The drive was Purdue's most plays in a scoring sequence since a 19-play drive against Illinois in 2022.

In the second quarter, Hudaury Hines undercut a throw by Michigan QB Bryce Underwood in the red zone in the final two minutes of the half. The INT was Hines' first of his career..

Out of the half, the Boilermakers cut into the Michigan lead courtesy of a career-long 50-yard field goal from Spencer Portath at the nine-minute mark of the third quarter. The field goal was Porath's third conversion of at least 40 yards this season.

Purdue Football fell in its penultimate home game of the 2025 season, 34-10, to No. 1 Ohio State.

Purdue took the lead first when Spencer Porath converted a 40-yard field goal with under five minutes to play in the first quarter. During the scoring drive, Ryan Browne connected with Rico Walker on a 30-yard play that nearly doubled Walker's previous game high of 16 yards with the one reception. Purdue held a 3-0 lead after the first to hand Ohio State its first deficit after one quarter this season.

After the Buckeyes took a 24-3 lead into halftime, they put together a 15-play drive that lasted 8:34 out of the half before CJ Nunnally IV intercepted the first pass of his career in the end zone. His interception was the first by a Boilermaker defensive lineman since George Karlaftis against TCU in 2019.

The interception helped Purdue hold Ohio State scoreless in the third quarter. It was only the second time the Buckeyes were held scoreless in multiple quarters this season, the other in the season opener against Texas.

Ohio State scored the first 10 points in the fourth quarter before Jesse Watson found the end zone on a seven-yard reception in the final two minutes to make the final score 34-10. The touchdown was Watson's second of his career, both thrown by Malachi Singleton.

Browne finished the game 10-for-19 with 76 yards and Singleton went 3-for-3 with 18 yards and a touchdown. Antonio Harris led the rushing attack with 13 carries for 45 yards.

Mani Powell (13) and Tahj Ra-El (10) both finished with double digit tackles for the fourth time each this season. It was Powell's third time lead Purdue in tackles this season, all in the last five games.
