## BOILER NOTES

### TEAM

- Captains: Michael Jackson III, Jalen St. John, Tony Grimes, An'Darius Coffey
- Purdue lost the toss. Indiana deferred. Purdue elected to receive in the north end zone.
- The temperature was 24 degrees at kickoff, marking the coldest game in Ross-Ade Stadium history.
- It was the third coldest game in Purdue history, behind 19 degrees at Minnesota in 1966 and 21 degrees at Minnesota in 2018.

### OFFENSE

- Ryan Browne went 25-for-47 with 238 yards and an interception. He added four rushes for three yards.
- Nitro Tuggle tied his career high with five receptions for a career-high 80 yards. It marks the fourth time Tuggle led Purdue in receiving yards this season.
- Tuggle's 80 receiving yards are the most by a Boilermaker since Michael Jackson III went for 94 yards on Oct. 4 vs. Illinois. His 80 yards were the fourth-highest by a Boilermaker this season.
- Jackson led Purdue with six receptions for 66 yards. He topped 60 receiving yards for the fifth time this season.
- Luca Puccinelli recorded the first three receptions of his career for 24 yards.
- Jaron Thomas had the first touches of his career out of the backfield and rushed twice for 15 yards.
- Antonio Harris led Purdue with 15 rushes for 31 yards.
- Purdue was 1-for-1 on red zone attempts.

### DEFENSE

- Tahj Ra-El finished with a game-high 12 tackles for his fifth double-digit performance of the season. He led Purdue for the third time this season.
- With his performance, Ra-El finishes tied with Mani Powell for the team lead in tackles with 110 on the season.
- Powell added a tackle-for-loss on Friday and finishes the season as Purdue's leader with 12.0. He finished with at least 0.5 tackles-for-loss in 11-of-12 games this season.
- Charles Correa totaled five tackles to finish his first season in West Lafayette with 96.
- Hudaury Hines defended one pass to concluded the season with a team-high eight.

### SPECIAL TEAMS

- Spencer Porath converted on a 22-yard field goal in the first quarter. It was his 22nd career made kick, moving him into a tie with Tim Clark (1981-83), Joe O'Leary (1991-92) and Brad Bobich (1992-95) for 11th all-time with 22 made kicks in his career.
- Porath finished the year 15-of-17 on field goals. His 88.2% field goal clip is the best single-season mark in Purdue history.
