THE OPENING TIP

- After having a week off between games for finals, the Purdue women's basketball team will close out the non-conference campaign with a noon tip on Sunday against Jackson State.
- The Boilermakers are coming off a 37-point win over Dayton last Sunday, 80-43. Four of Purdue's starters finished in double figures, led by Hila Karsh's 17 points. The win marked Purdue's third victory of 35 points or more this season, its most since 2010-11.
- Purdue is 7-0 at Mackey Arena this season, outscoring opponents by 28.1 points per game. The Boilermakers have shot 50% from the floor and connected just shy of nine 3-pointers per game at a 40% clip, while dishing out 19 assists per night.
- Defensively, Purdue has held four opponents to 50 points or fewer over the opening 11 games of the year, the most by a Boilermaker squad since the 2017-18 team recorded seven.
- The Boilermakers held back-to-back opponents under 50 points for the first time since 2016.
- Hila Karsh found her scoring touch with back-to-back games in double figures with 10 and 17 points, respectively, while shooting 59% from the floor and 50% from distance. Karsh sits third on the team in scoring at 10.4 points per game and ranks fourth among Big Ten rookies.
- Purdue is 13th nationally and second in the Big Ten with a defensive rebound percentage of 76.3%.

Purdue set the tone on the defensive end, holding the Flyers (5-5) to just 43 points, the fewest given up by the Boilermakers in the Katie Gearlds era and tied for the 13th fewest in Purdue history.

The Boilermakers held Dayton to 25.5% from the field and 6-of-23 from behind the arc. Purdue flipped 26 Dayton turnovers into 30 points, while recording a season-high 14 steals.

- The Boilermakers hold a 49-8 record when scoring 70 or more points, while also posting a 59-20 mark when holding opponents below that mark.
- Purdue is 24-1 under Katie Gearlds when dishing out 20 or more assists.
- The Boilermakers have won by 40 points or more three times under Gearlds, with two coming this season.

BOILER NOTES

THIS IS PURDUE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

- Purdue Women's Basketball is in its 51st season in 2023-24.
- Purdue was the 40th program in NCAA Division I history to hit 900 wins.
- The Boilermakers are the only team from the Big Ten to win a national championship, hoisting the title in 1999.
- The program has reached the NCAA Tournament 27 times with 12 Sweet 16s, eight Elite 8s, three final fours and a trio of national championship game appearances.
- In addition to its NCAA success, Purdue owns the Big Ten record for most tournament titles with nine.

MONEY MAD\$

- In her final campaign for the Boilermakers after a year off, Madison Layden-Zay has the chance to go down as one of the all-time sharpshooters in Purdue history.
- Layden-Zay is averaging 8.5 points, 3.8 rebounds, 2.7 assists, 1.5 steals per game.
- She leads the team with 22 made triples and her 43.1% clip from distance ranks sixth the Big Ten.
- Against Miami (OH), Layden-Zay dropped a career-high 21 points on a career-high six made 3-pointers, going 6-of-8 from distance.
- The fifth-year senior is 16 3-pointers away from the record of 244 career made triples by Karissa McLaughlin (2018-21), who was a teammate of Layden-Zay's in 2020-21.
- Layden-Zay has averaged 9.1 points, 3.8 rebounds and 2.7 assists over her career while shooting 37% from the floor and 35% from behind the arc.
- Layden-Zay is one of five players in Purdue history to score 1,000 points and knock down 200 3-pointers, including Katie Gearlds.
- Over her first four years of college, Layden-Zay was one of 17 players nationally to drain 30 or more 3-pointers and dish out 50 assists in a season four times from 2021-24.

- Already one of the best all-around performers in Purdue history, Layden-Zay is on the verge of becoming the seventh player in Big Ten history with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 300 assists, 200 3-pointers, and 50 blocks. She is 34 rebounds away from the mark.
- If the fifth year hits the rebounds mark and adds 25 steals for 200 in her career, she will join Caitlin Clark as the only players in Big Ten history to achieve the six-stat milestone.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

- The Boilermakers are 7-3 in non-conference action with a 7-0 mark at Mackey Arena.
- Purdue has scored 73.6 points per game to start the year, which is the fourth most by a Purdue squad in non-conference action in the last 25 years. Three of the top five spots have come in the last five seasons.
- Purdue has held four opponents under 50 points for the first time since 2017-18.
- Holding Lipscomb to 45 points then setting a new Gearlds era record keeping Dayton to 43 points, the Boilermakers held back-to-back teams under 50 points for the first time since 2016.
- Defensively, Purdue also kept three non-conference opponents under 30% shooting for the first time since 2019-20.
- The Boilermakers picked up three 35-point victories, the program's most since the 2010-11 campaign.

KIKI CAN SHOOT IT

- Kiki Smith can flat out shoot the ball. The junior was a key get for Gearlds and the coaching staff, when they wanted to set up a roster full of high-percentage shooters.
- She leads the team with 11.5 points per game and second with 18 made 3-pointers.
- In her first game for the Boilermakers, she tallied 19 points off the bench on 7-of-13 shooting with a trio of 3-pointers. It was the most points off then bench in a season opener for Purdue since 2017.
- Smith has scored in double figures seven times this season and 20 times in her career.
- Smith crossed the 1,000-point mark for her career against Eastern Illinois, when factoring in her Hutchinson stats.
- In her lone season at Arkansas in 2024-25, Smith averaged 10.2 points and was second in the SEC with a 40.6% 3-point clip.
- She spent her freshman season at Hutchinson Community College, where she was named the NJCAA Player of the Year and a First Team All-American. She guided Hutchinson to the NJCAA National Championship behind a 37-0 record, while averaging 17.6 points per game and shooting 44.4% from deep on 82 made triples.
- She is a proud member of the Comanche Nation.

HOLY HILA

- Hila Karsh is averaging 10.4 points, 2.7 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game, while shooting 46.2% from the field and 42.2% from distance.
- She has reached double figures in five games with a season-high 24 points against Eastern Illinois.
- Karsh earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors after the opening week of the season, alongside USC's Jazzy Davidson.
- Karsh became the 16th Purdue freshman to start a season opener since 1982-83 and was the ninth freshman in the last 25 years to have more than 10 points (12), five rebounds, one assist (2), one block and one steal against FDU.

- The Boilermakers have played some of their best ball at Mackey Arena this season, posting 7-0 record and an efficient offense.
- The best start under Katie Gearlds at home was 8-0 during the 2023-24 season.
- The Boilermakers have held four teams to fewer than 50 points and kept three teams to less than 30% shooting from the field.
- The defense has forced 20 or more turnovers twice and registered 10 or more steals three times.
- Purdue has connected on 10 or more 3-pointers in four games at home this season.

STRAIGHT SPEED BY T

- One of the skills the staff looked for in the transfer portal was intense on-ball defense, Tara Daye's athleticism and tenacity more than checked the box.
- Daye leads Purdue in rebounding at 7.2 boards per game and leads in scoring with 11.6 points per game.
- She leads the team and ranks third in the Big Ten with four double-doubles on the year.
- Daye played in the post during her time at DePaul and St. John's, before Gearlds moved her to the point to start her career at Purdue.
- The redshirt junior recorded her first career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds at No. 20/20 Kentucky.
- She set career highs with a 15-point, 13-rebound double-double against Howard on Nov. 26.
- Part of the experienced corps with more than 60 games over her two stints at DePaul and St. John's, Daye quickly became one of the leaders in the locker room.
- Prior to missing most of last season at St. John's, she started 23 times over two campaigns for the Red Storm.
- Daye began her career at DePaul where she was a teammate of LSU All-American Aneesah Morrow in 2022-23.
- A two-time New Jersey state champion in basketball, Daye also excelled in track, twice winning the 400m sectionals.
- Daye's handle on social media is 973Cookie for her hometown area code and the nickname she was given as a child, due to having the same energy as Cookie Monster.

SHOOT IT BEFORE YOU TURN IT OVER

- Shoot before you turn it over - the goal for Purdue's offense.
- Purdue has made seven or more triples 72 times since over the last five seasons under Gearlds.
- Purdue has made 10 or more 3-pointers in 20 games in the Katie Gearlds era. Prior to her return, the Boilermakers tallied just 28 double-digit triple games from 2003 until 2021.
- The Boilermakers set a program high in the Gearlds era with a 72.7% clip (8-11) against Miami in 2024-25, good for the fourth highest clip in a game in program history.
- The Boilermakers have not been shy about shooting the three during Katie Gearlds' time on the sideline, setting the Purdue season record for 3-pointers made and attempted in 2021-22.
- Purdue made 200 or more 3-pointers in each of Gearlds' first three seasons.

LADYEN-ZAY - NEW NAME, SAME GAME

- "I'm Back." Madison Layden-Zay posted those two words on Instagram on March 26 announcing her return to Purdue, a post that has received over 11,000 likes.
- Layden-Zay graduated from Purdue with a degree in selling and sales management in May of 2024 and married Rees Zay, a former practice player with the program and Purdue graduate, in September of that year.
- While working a full-time job, Madison attended most of Purdue's home games during the 2024-25 season to watch her younger sister McKenna.
- During Alumnae Day in January, Madison set up a meeting with Katie Gearlds after the morning shootaround and surprised the head coach by asking if she could play again.
- After checking with compliance and going through a few workouts, Madison signed for the Boilermakers in late March with the caveat that she would play under her married name - Madison Layden-Zay.

LANA LEVELING UP

- Lana McCarthy picked up her first double-double of the year setting career highs with 19 points and 15 rebounds against Howard, the first by a Boilermaker off the bench since 2019-20.
- The sophomore is averaging 8.2 points and 5.3 rebounds per game this season, while shooting 60.9% overall.
- McCarthy came off the bench for three games, starting against Miami, before rejoining the lineup against Evansville. She averaged 9.6 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting 71.4% from the floor over the next five games.
- After a freshman campaign that saw her stand toe-to-toe with Lauren Betts, Alexis Markowski and other top-tier post players in the country, McCarthy took the offseason to elevate all areas of her game.
- The only healthy returner after the season, McCarthy had daily one-on-one skill work with Katie Gearlds, focusing on her post presence, footwork and long-range shooting.
- She averaged 6.4 points on a 47.1% shooting clip as a rookie last year, while grabbing 4.8 rebounds per game.
- Against Purdue Fort Wayne in the season opener last year, McCarthy became the 15th freshman to start a season opener since 1982-83 and the second to post a double-double on a debut (Sue Fackler - 23 points, 21 rebounds, 1977-78).
- Her two double-doubles Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton for more double-doubles by a freshman since 2004-05.
- McCarthy capped an impressive prep career as New Hampshire Miss Basketball following her second state title as a senior.
- She finished her Bedford High School basketball career with a 71-8 record. She also went 80-0 in volleyball with four state titles.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

- Only a freshman, guard Hila Karsh entered Purdue with a wealth of experience in the international and professional ranks.
- The 21-year old has represented her native Israel in five European Championships at the U20 and U18 levels.
- Karsh has several senior national team caps, making her debut in the EuroBasket qualifiers in 2023, before appearing in the 2025 qualifiers.
- Karsh played five seasons on the roster for Rishon LeZion in the Israeli National League, averaging 7.6 points.
- She guided her hometown team to the playoffs in all five campaigns, winning the regular season championship in 2022 and 2024. She was named to the EuroBasket.com All-Israeli League Honorable Mention in 2024 and 2025.
- Karsh is the first player in Purdue history to wear No. 8. She picked that number to honor her father, Idit, who played professionally in Israel. Her father, and all three siblings all wear No. 8.

INDIANA MISS BASKETBALL

- The long history of Purdue welcoming the state's top player extended back to 2003, when Katie Gearlds became the fifth honoree to pick West Lafayette.
- Madison Layden-Zay (2020) finished runner-up as a senior.

BOILER NOTES

DEFENSE FOR THE WIN

- Purdue is 36-5 when keeping a team to 60 points under head coach Katie Gearlds with a 4-1 mark this season.
- Opponents average under 66 points, while shooting under 40% from the field and under 30% from distance when Purdue wins over the last five seasons.
- The Boilermakers are 45-22 when forcing 15 or more turnovers since 2021-22 and 4-2 this year.
- Purdue has recorded 10 or more steals 30 times in the last five years and the four times this season.
- In the season opener, Purdue held FDU to 48 points and a 27.4% clip shooting, before resetting the record with 43 points allowed on a 25.5% shooting clip against Dayton.

6-7...

- Purdue has not been able to escape the 6-7 trend.
- The Boilermakers scored 67 points against FDU and Purdue Fort Wayne, while holding opponents to 67 points against Eastern Illinois.
- Adding to the fact, Purdue has the tallest player in program history on the roster in 6-foot-7 Avery Gordon.
- Against Lipscomb, Gearlds subbed Gordon into the game and called a play for the 6-foot-7 forward to score Purdue's 67th point of the game on Education Day. The kids were excited.
- For the record, the author of these notes still has no clue what the trend means.

NON-CONFERENCE ACTION

- Purdue has an 37-14 non-conference mark under Gearlds, including 21 straight wins against non-power conference opponents at home.
- In Gearlds' second season, the Boilermakers went 9-1 for the third-best clip in team history and the best since 2003-04.
- Purdue went 9-2 in regular season non-conference action during Gearlds' first campaign, which tied for the second best mark by a first-year head coach at Purdue.
- The Boilermakers capped the non-conference campaign with their 18th straight home win against non-conference opposition (including postseason), setting a new program record and later added to it with a win over Duquesne in the WNIT to set the record at 19 games.

BLACK BELT BALLER

- Kendall Puryear has turned up her intensity and physicality another notch in her sophomore season, after providing a physical punch off the bench as a freshman last year.
- The sophomore is sitting at 4.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per game this season.
- She finished third on the team with 3.7 rebounds per Big Ten game in 2024-25 and was third on the team in scoring with 8.8 points at a 58% clip in Big Ten play. Nine of her 11 double-figure performances came in conference action.
- Puryear was a finalist for Miss Show-Me Basketball following a 1,249 points and a school record 897 rebounds, including 317 on the offensive end, for her career.
- Puryear also finished second at the Missouri high school state track meet in the shot put.
- Her older brother was a four-year starter at Mizzou under Purdue alumnus Cuonzo Martin.
- Puryear is also a Black Belt in Taekwondo.

BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Hila Karsh was named the co-Big Ten Freshman of the Week after the opening week of the season, alongside USC guard Jazzy Davidson.
- The Rishon LeZion, Israel, native was the only freshman in the nation to average 18.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.5 3-pointers per game.
- Against FDU, she was the ninth freshman to tally 10 points (12), five rebounds, one assist, one block and one steal.
- Against Eastern Illinois, she was the only freshman in the nation that week and the first Purdue freshman since Courtney Moses in 2011 to post a 20-point (24), five-3-point, five-rebound (7) night.
- Karsh is the fourth Boilermaker to earn a Big Ten Freshman of the Week under Katie Gearlds, joining Lana McCarthy, Mary Ashley Stevenson and Rashunda Jones.

BIG BIGS IN THE BIG

- Purdue's front court has some serious height this season with the four listed forwards standing an average 6-foot, 3.75-inches, ranking second in the Big Ten behind UCLA.
- Purdue returns its two tallest players from last year in 6-4 Lana McCarthy and 6-3 Kendall Puryear.
- Freshman Avery Gordon stands at 6-7, the tallest player in Purdue history and tied for tallest player in the Big Ten this season alongside UCLA's Lauren Betts and Lety Vasconcelos from Illinois.

RUNNING WITH THE BISON

- The Boilermakers used a hue run over the first and second quarters to pull away to a 92-62 win over Howard.
- The Boilermakers went on a 31-4 run in the first half that featured 22 straight points.
- The Boilermakers were 12-of-16 from the field in the run.
- Purdue forced Howard into 13 straight missed field goals and kept the Bison off the scoreboard for 8:12 of game time.
- The 22 unanswered points were the most by a Purdue squad since going off for 27 points in a 74-48 win over Northwestern on Feb. 14, 2024.
- The 30-point win was Purdue's biggest since downing Wisconsin by 39 (89-50) on Dec. 30, 2023.

NYA MAKING NOISE

- A transfer who took huge leaps during her first offseason with the program was Nya Smith, impressing the staff with her three-level scoring and top speed on the team.
- The sophomore set a career high with five assists on the road at Central Michigan.
- Smith arrived in West Lafayette after a historic season at UNC Greensboro, earning the SoCon Freshman and Sixth Woman of the Year.
- Smith tallied 10.9 points and 3.9 rebounds in 2024-25.
- She was one of eight freshmen nationally last year to average better than 10.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 1.0 assists, while knocking down 50 or more triples.
- Coming from an athletic family, Smith's father, Rachaud, played football at UCF from 1997-00, and her mother, Kristina, played tennis for Miami.
- A hidden non-basketball skill Smith has picked up over the last few years is crocheting gifts for her teammates, friends and family.

PACER PLANNING

- Purdue's coaching staff looked to revamp its offensive playbook during the offseason and turned to the professional ranks.
- The staff held several talks with Indiana Pacers assistant coach Jenny Boucek, who is coming off an Eastern Conference title.
- Purdue wanted to put an emphasis on playing quick and dove into how the Pacers run their offense in transition, creating numerous shot options for all five players on the court.

BOILER NOTES**STAHL DOES THE LITTLE THINGS**

- Purdue continued its tradition of keeping the best talent in the state when it signed Saige Stahl from Indiana State.
- Stahl is third on the team in rebounding and posted a career high with six steals against Lipscomb.
- Despite just two points in the season opener against FDU, Stahl led the way on the glass with nine rebounds.
- Stahl impressed the coaching staff during the offseason with her hustle and effort on non-stat plays - screens, loose balls, close outs.
- Stahl has posted nine double-doubles in her career.
- An Indiana All-Star as a junior and senior, she averaged 7.4 points and 7.2 rebounds per game with the Sycamores in 2024-25, and even recorded a 16-point, 13-rebound double-double against the Boilermakers in Mackey Arena.

KENNA CONNECTION

- After showing improvement over her first two years, McKenna Layden aims to take another step during her junior year.
- In limited action this year, Layden has made four 3-pointers.
- She scored 5.6 points per game in Big Ten play, and led the team in rebounding with 5.4 per game last year.
- She earned her first career start at Oregon last year and stated nine games in league play.
- Layden posted a career-high 10 rebounds at Indiana in 2024-25.
- In her career, Layden has connected on 38 3-pointers at a 33% clip.

RANKED MATCHUPS

- Head coach Katie Gearlds has guided Purdue to three ranked wins during her time in West Lafayette. Purdue had lost its last 25 games to ranked opponents before the Gearlds era started.
- Purdue recorded back-to-back ranked wins for the first time since 2018 during the 2022-23 campaign.
- With a 73-65 win over No. 2 Ohio State in Columbus, the Boilermakers tallied their first ever top-five win on the road.
- Purdue snapped the program's 19-game skid to ranked teams with a 66-61 win over No. 17 Florida State last season.
- Gearlds was 23-22 against ranked teams during her playing days in West Lafayette.
- Purdue has 19 wins in program history against AP Top-5 teams.

FAMILIAR FRESHMEN

- After playing AAU together growing up for Indiana Elite, freshmen Avery Gordon and Carley Barrett will continue their run as freshmen at Purdue in 2025-26.
- Gordon was the No. 56 recruit in the nation by ESPN and the No. 1 post player by Prospects Nation.
- An Indiana All-Star, Gordon scored over 1,500 points and grabbed over 800 rebounds in her high school career. She averaged a double-double with 20.3 points and 10.3 rebounds per game as a senior.
- Gearlds has said that she has all the tools to be an All-American and have her number hanging in the rafters of Mackey Arena.
- Along with teammate Nya Smith, Gordon is an avid crocheter.
- Barrett was named the Lafayette Journal & Courier Readers Choice Female Athlete of the Year and co-Small Schools Girls Basketball Player of the Year.
- A hometown product from Lafayette Central Catholic, Barrett comes from a Purdue family. Her brother, Carson, is a graduate assistant with the men's team and helped the Boilermakers reach the Final Four as a player in 2024. Her father, Dave, played basketball for Purdue from 1988-91 as a teammate of Matt Painter.

YEAR 5 OF THE KG ERA

- Head coach Katie Gearlds is in her fifth season back at her alma mater after guiding the Boilermakers to the postseason in each of her first three seasons back home.
- Prior to the 2024-25 season, Gearlds inked an extension that will keep her on the sidelines in West Lafayette through the 2028-29 season.
- Before coming back to Purdue, the Boilermakers had endured a three-year postseason drought. After reaching the WNIT in her first campaign, the Boilermakers went back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017 with their 2023 bid.
- Gearlds guided Purdue to the WNIT Great 8 in 2024, the program's deepest run in the postseason in 15 years.
- Gearlds took over the program 47 days before her first campaign in 2021-22 when Purdue was coming off a seven-win season and guided Purdue to a 17-15 mark.
- She became the fourth Purdue head coach to reach the postseason in each of her first three seasons, joining Lin Dunn, Kristy Curry and Sharon Versyp.
- Gearlds joined Boilermaker legends Carolyn Peck and Lin Dunn as the only Purdue head coaches to post win improvements in each of their first two seasons.
- Gearlds has racked up three ranked wins, including the program's first true road AP top-5 victory against No. 2 Ohio State in 2022-23.

PACKING MACKEY

- Head coach Katie Gearlds continues to bring the magic back to Mackey Arena, as more fans come through the turnstiles.
- Purdue has topped 5,000 fans in 19 home games over the last four years and ranked in the top 30 nationally.
- Mackey Arena's capacity is 14,876.
- Purdue set a new attendance record in 2022-23 with a capacity crowd when it hosted Indiana for its first sellout since 2000.
- Purdue has sold out Mackey Arena four times in program history and twice under head coach Katie Gearlds - against Iowa in 2023-24 and Indiana in 2022-23.

TAYLOR HENDERSON

- Taylor Henderson is an athletic guard who can play inside and has a knack for rebounding.
- In two seasons at UNC Wilmington, Henderson averaged 13.2 points and 6.0 rebounds per game, scoring in double figures 22 times during the 2024-25 season.
- She garnered All-Colonial Athletic Association Freshman team honors after notching 14.2 points per game in 2023-24.
- Henderson hails from an athletic family with her father (Dontae - Savannah State) and three brothers (Deontae, Jacobie, Dontrae) playing football collegiately. Jacobie and Dontrae are both on current rosters for Rutgers and Indiana, respectively.
- She suffered an injury on the first day of official practice that will keep her out for significant time

STARTING STRONG

- The Boilermakers improved to 4-1 in season openers under head coach Katie Gearlds with a 67-48 win over FDU on Nov. 3.
- Four Boilermakers finished in double figures, led by Kiki Smith's 19 points, the most by a Boilermaker off the bench in a season opener since Tiara Murphy had 19 against Central Michigan to start the 2017-18 season.
- Defensively, the Boilermakers held FDU to 48 points and a 27.4% shooting clip, both lows in the Katie Gearlds era.
- Hila Karsh became the 16th freshman to start a season opener for the Boilermakers since 1982-83.

- They were the first sister pairing to play on the floor together in program history, playing 6:29 together in the 2023-24 season opener at UCLA.
- And yes, McKenna served as Madison's Maid of Honor.
- In high school, they played for their mother, Kathie, at Northwestern High School. Together, they reached the 2020 4A ISHAA State Championship Game after winning sectionals and regionals that year.
- Kathie retired in 2023 after 23 seasons as a high school head coach in Indiana, winning five state championships, the most by a non-private school head coach, and a record of 385-165.

PROBOILERS

- Since Katie Gearlds' return to Mackey Arena, Purdue has started to help more of its student-athletes make the jump to ProBoilers.
- Abbey Ellis is in her second season with the Townsville Fire of the WNBL after earning Breakout Player of the Year honors and reaching the WNBL Finals as a rookie. She also helped Australia win its first ever Asia Cup over the summer, qualifying the Opals for the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup in Germany.
- Ae'Rianna Harris plays for the Caledonia Gladiators out of East Kilbride, Scotland, in the British Super League Basketball, winning the SLB Cup last season.

THE BIG TEN'S ONLY NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- Led by National Coach of the Year Carolyn Peck, the Boilermakers finished the year with a program-best 34-1 record, a perfect 16-0 mark in Big Ten play, a Big Ten Tournament title and a 62-45 win in the National Championship Game over Duke.
- The 1998-99 season opened when Purdue knocked off three-time defending national champion and No. 1-ranked Tennessee at Mackey Arena 78-68.
- Stephanie White was named an All-American, the Honda Award winner and the Wade Trophy honoree, as well as the Big Ten Player and Athlete of the Year. Ukari Figgs earned an honorable mention All-America nod and was named the 1999 Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Tournament.
- The victory was bittersweet as guard Tiffany Young tragically died when she was killed by a drunk driver just over four months after winning the national championship. The 1998-99 team have continued to bring back their memories and love for Young over the last 25 years to ensure her impact on their lives will never be forgotten.

HALL OF FAMER

- Katie Gearlds became the 13th member of the Purdue women's basketball team to be enshrined in the Leroy Keyes Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame, when she was inducted in the Class of 2024.
- The fourth highest scorer in program history, Gearlds guided Purdue to two Big Ten Tournament titles, four NCAA Tournament appearances, two Sweet 16s and an Elite Eight.
- Gearlds was a four-time All-Big Ten honoree and was tabbed Third Team All-America as a senior.
- She was selected seventh overall in the 2007 WNBA Draft by the Seattle Storm, the highest pick in Purdue history.
- Gearlds was enshrined alongside Devynne Charlton (Track), Annie Drews (Volleyball) Chukwuebuka Enekwechi (Track & Field), Bob Ford (Men's Basketball), Laura Gonzalez-Escalion (Women's Golf), Kevin Plawecki (Baseball) and Tim Stratton (Football).

THE VOICE OF THE BOILERMAKERS

- In his 36th season calling Purdue women's basketball, play-by-play man Tim Newton has called over 1,000 games with Purdue women's basketball.
- He joined the 1,000-game club against Indiana State on Dec. 20, 2023.
- Newton has provided the call for all seven Big Ten regular season titles, all nine Big Ten Tournament Championships, three Final Fours and 25 of 27 NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Perhaps Newton's best call came in the final seconds of the 1999 National Championship as Purdue became the only Big Ten team to capture the national title. "Ladies and gentlemen, the national champion team resides in West Lafayette, Indiana, as Katie Douglas throws the ball skyward. It's over. Purdue wins 62-45, capturing the national championship."
- His first game was on WBAA (920 AM) on Jan. 3, 1991 when No. 3 Purdue downed Ohio State at Mackey Arena 105-45.

INDIANA HALL OF FAMER

- Boilermaker Mary Jo Noon was named to the 2026 Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame class in early December, become the 18th Boilermaker to be enshrined in the state's hall.
- Noon reached four NCAA Tournaments and averaged 8.9 points and 4.3 rebounds over 113 games for the Boilermakers. She was twice All-Big Ten honorable mention.
- Noon was on the roster but missed the 1998-99 national championship campaign due to injury.
- A standout at Jeffersonville, she averaged 25.2 points, 13.3 rebounds and 2.7 blocks, while shooting 64.2% from the field as a senior to win sectional and regional titles.
- Noon was a 1998 Nike All-American and AP First Team All-Indiana.

EXHIBITION NOTES

- Playing their first public game with 10 newcomers, the Boilermakers rolled to a 118-42 win over Purdue Northwest.
- Seven different players finished in double figures, led by Lana McCarthy's game-high 16 points.
- Purdue shot 63.9% from the field and dished out 31 assists on 46 made field goals.
- The 118 points were the third most by a Purdue squad in an exhibition in program history.
- The Boilermakers are 5-0 in preseason tuneups under Gearlds, averaging 102 points per contest.
- Purdue has won all five contests by at least 25 points.

KATIE GEARLDS BIO

Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Katie Gearlds enters her fifth season as the head coach of the Purdue women's basketball team. Returning to her alma mater, the 2007 All-American was elevated to the head job on Sept. 17, 2021, becoming the ninth coach in program history.

Reaching the postseason in three of her first four campaigns, she inked a contract extension in the summer of 2024 that will keep her home in West Lafayette through the 2028-29 season. Establishing a new culture, revamping recruiting and reconnecting with the alumnae and fan bases, Gearlds has the Boilermakers headed in the right direction.

Gearlds was inducted into the Leroy Keyes Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame in the fall of 2024.

PURDUE POSTSEASON BOUND

The Boilermakers reached the postseason in each of Katie Gearlds' first three seasons back in West Lafayette. Purdue returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017 and the 27th time in program history during the 2022-23 campaign. Gearlds took the Boilermakers back to the postseason for the first time since 2018 in her first year, reaching the second round of the WNIT. The Boilermakers added their second WNIT appearance under Gearlds in 2023-24, as Purdue reached the Great 8 for its deepest postseason run in more than a decade.

ON THE RECRUITING TRAIL

Gearlds' first true signing class in November of 2022 was ranked No. 21 by ESPNW.

PRIOR TO PURDUE

Gearlds spent eight seasons taking Marian University to unparalleled success as its head coach, winning back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2016 and 2017. She is the winningest coach in Marian history with a 228-50 record, an 82% clip.

A three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year, Gearlds guided the Knights to six straight Crossroads League regular-season titles, four league tournament championships and seven appearances in the NAIA Tournament.

With only five All-Americans in program history before her arrival, Gearlds mentored 12 All-America honorees, including 2021 WBCA NAIA National Player of the Year Imani Guy, as well as 28 All-Crossroads League selections.

Her teams averaged more than 70 points per game in all eight campaigns at Marian and over 75 points in four seasons. Defensively, the Knights kept opponents to 60 points per game or less in six of her eight years.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Prior to her jump into coaching, Gearlds spent three seasons in the WNBA with the Seattle Storm. She was taken with the seventh overall pick in the 2007 WNBA Draft, the highest selection ever from Purdue and the 10th top-10 pick in Big Ten history.

Over three campaigns with the Storm, Gearlds shot just under 40% from the field and 37.9% from distance. She also spent time playing professionally in Spain, Greece, Portugal and Slovakia. Two of her closest teammates and friends over the years are WNBA legend Sue Bird and fellow WNBA great and New Orleans Pelicans Vice President of Basketball Operations Swin Cash.

ALL-AMERICA AND HALL OF FAME COLLEGE CAREER

One of the most prolific players at Purdue, Gearlds was a three-year starter for the Boilermakers during her career from 2004-07, appearing in 133 games with 100 starts. She ranks fourth in program history with 1,974 points and was the ninth fastest to join the 1,000-point club, reaching the plateau in just 80 games. For her efforts, Gearlds was named a Legend of Mackey Arena during its 50th anniversary season. She was inducted into the Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame in 2024.

The Boilermakers won two Big Ten Tournament titles and never missed the NCAA Tournament with Gearlds in the squad, reaching three Sweet 16s and one Elite Eight. Her senior class ranks seventh with 103 wins, eighth in winning percentage at 77.4% and seventh in Big Ten winning percentage at 78.1%.

Gearlds' senior season awards haul featured Third Team All-America by the Associated Press, All-America Honorable Mention by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and a spot NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team. She was a four-time All-Big Ten selection, a three-time All-Big Ten Tournament Team honoree and was the 2004 Big Ten Freshman of the Year.

Gearlds earned a bachelor's degree in sociology with minors in psychology and communications from Purdue in 2007.

AN IN-STATE TALENT

A native of Beech Grove, Indiana, Gearlds was named the Indiana Miss Basketball in 2003. She amassed 2,521 career points, good for sixth in IHSAA history. She averaged 30.1 points, 9.4 rebounds, 5.4 assists and 5.1 steals per game to lead Beech Grove High School to the 2003 Class 3A State Championship. Her high school accolades included Nike/WBCA All-America, First Team All-State and the Gatorade Indiana Player of the Year.
