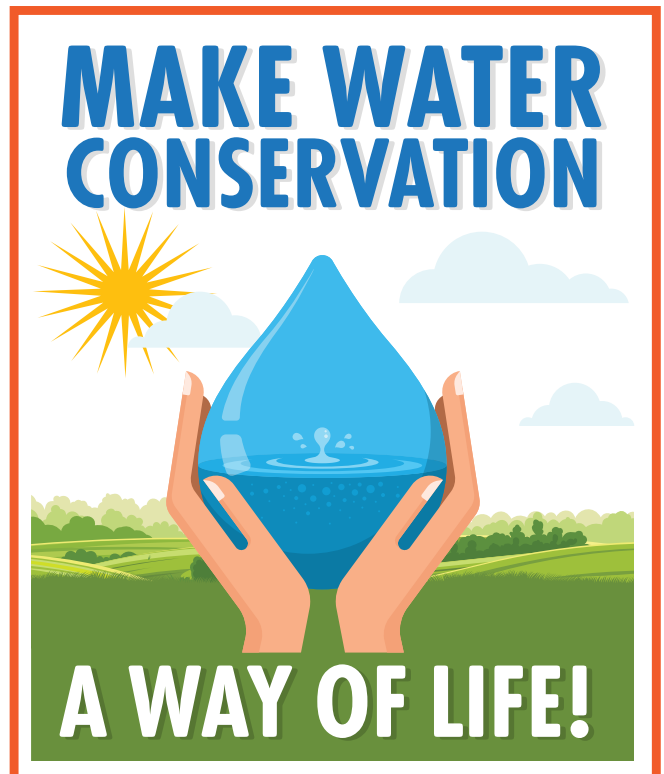
As we celebrate the end of the drought, let us also celebrate our collective achievements. We have demonstrated our ability to come together as a community to address a significant challenge and have

Summer Tips for Outdoor Irrigation

- ✓ Check your irrigation and landscaping frequently – if you have a landscaper or gardener, survey the property with them to check for leaks and develop an irrigation schedule that works best for your landscape.
- ✓ Make sure your sprinklers are watering the lawn and garden, not the driveway and sidewalks.
- ✓ Replace broken, cracked, or sunken heads and clogged nozzles.
- ✓ Install irrigation controllers to operate automatic irrigation.
- ✓ Know where your valves are for your irrigation system.
- ✓ Set your irrigation schedules to after 8 pm and before 10 am for most efficient water use.
