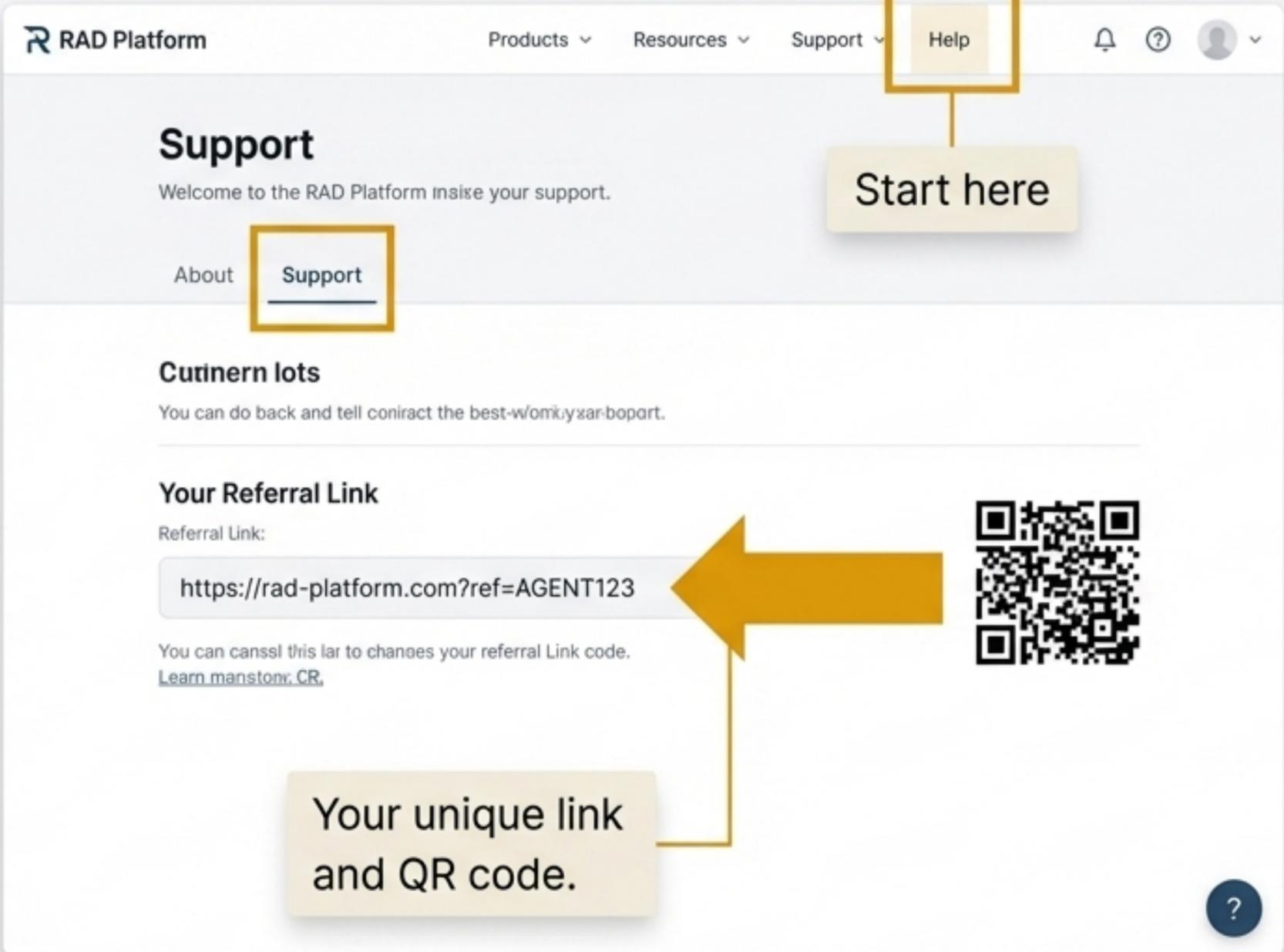
Step 1: Secure and Share Your Unique Referral Link

Your Referral Link is the tool that connects new users to your Agent account. Every user who signs up through this link becomes your "Referred User."

How to find it:

1. Navigate to the Help page in the top navigation.
2. Select the Support tab.

Note: This feature is only visible if the administrator has enabled it for your account.

The Foundation of Your Earnings: Understanding Commission

Your earnings are a percentage of the revenue generated by your referred users. This percentage is your **Agent Revenue Share**, which is configured by the platform administrator.

This share is applied to **True Revenue** — the actual amount spent by your users from credits they have purchased.

The next slide breaks down exactly what counts as ‘True Revenue.’ Understanding this distinction is the key to accurately tracking your earnings.

The Rule of Revenue: Calculating Your Commission

$$[\text{Purchased Credits Spent by Your User}] \times [\text{Your Agent Share \%}] = \text{Your Commission}$$



Included in Commission

True Revenue: Defined as the cost of deployments paid for using **Purchased Credits**. These are credits bought with real money via Stripe.



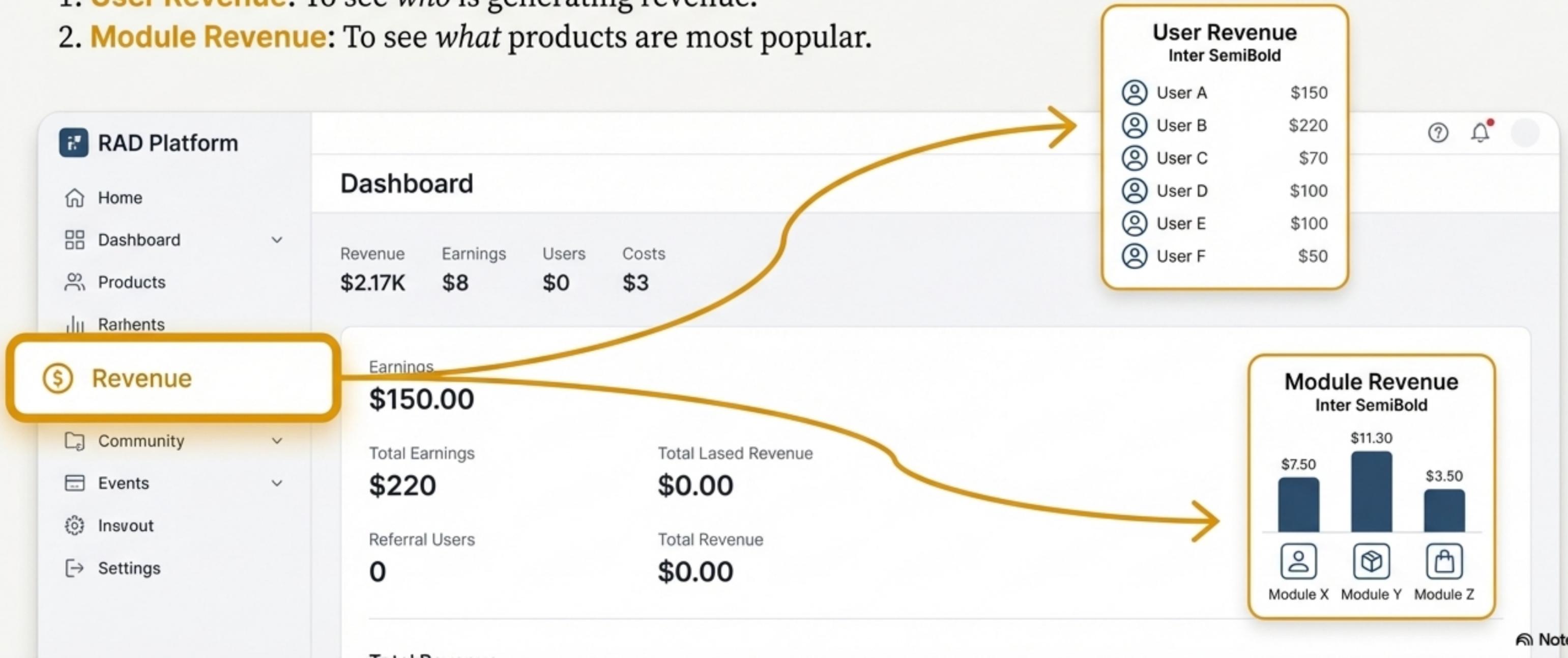
Excluded from Commission

Awarded Credits: Costs covered by free credits, such as sign-up bonuses or referral awards, do NOT generate a commission.

Your Command Center: Mastering the Revenue Dashboard

All your performance data is centralized on the **Revenue** page. This is your primary workspace for monitoring earnings and understanding referral activity. We will now tour the two key tabs designed specifically for you:

1. **User Revenue:** To see *who* is generating revenue.
2. **Module Revenue:** To see *what* products are most popular.



Dashboard Tour: Track *Who* is Generating Your Revenue

The User Revenue Tab

Key Question: “Which of my referred users are the most active?”

This report provides a detailed, transaction-level view of the spending activity for each user you have referred.



Filter by User: Select one or more specific referred users from a dropdown list to isolate their data.



Filter by Date Range: Analyze performance over specific time periods (e.g., last week, last month).



Export to CSV: Download the raw data for your own analysis or record-keeping.

- 5. Export Button:** Download this data for offline analysis.

Dashboard Tour: Track *What is Generating Your Revenue*

The Module Revenue Tab

Key Question: "Which products are most popular with my audience?"

This report aggregates revenue data by module, giving you a high-level view of product performance across all your referrals.



- **Filter by Module:** Isolate data for a specific module to see how it's performing.



- **Filter by Date Range:** Track module popularity over time.



- **Strategic Insight:** Use this data to focus your marketing efforts on the modules that resonate most with your referred users.

For Admins & Finance: The Central Oversight View

The **Agent Revenue Tab** (Located on the **Billing** page)

Purpose

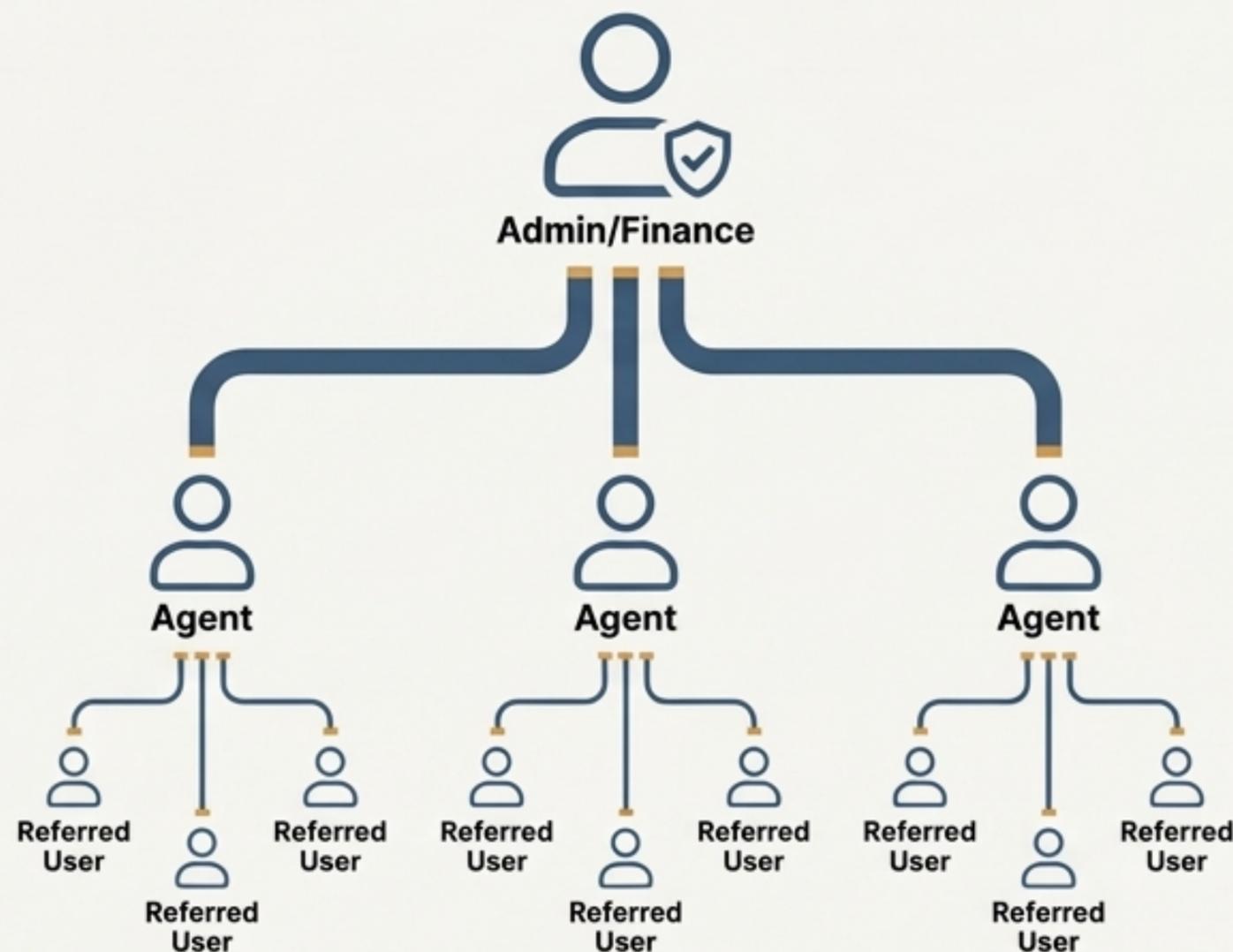
This tab is designed for a high-level view of performance across multiple agents.

Key Differentiators for Admins/Finance

-  **Filter by Agent:** Unlike the agent view, you can select one, multiple, or all agents from a dropdown list to compare performance.
-  **Consolidated Data:** The view provides a detailed transaction log across all selected agents and their referred users.
-  **Primary Use Case:** Ideal for calculating total payouts, auditing performance, and managing the agent program as a whole.

For Agents

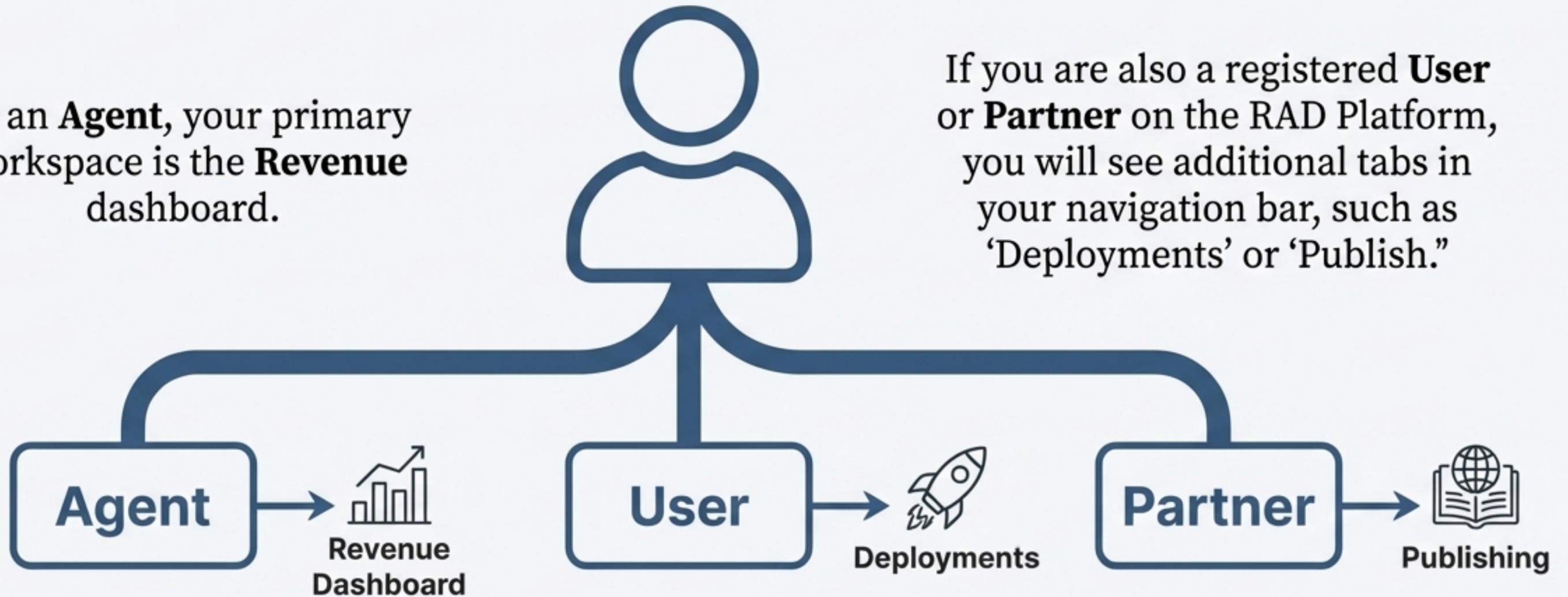
You can also view this tab, but your name will be pre-selected in the filter. It provides a similar detailed transaction list as your User Revenue tab.



Your Role on the Platform

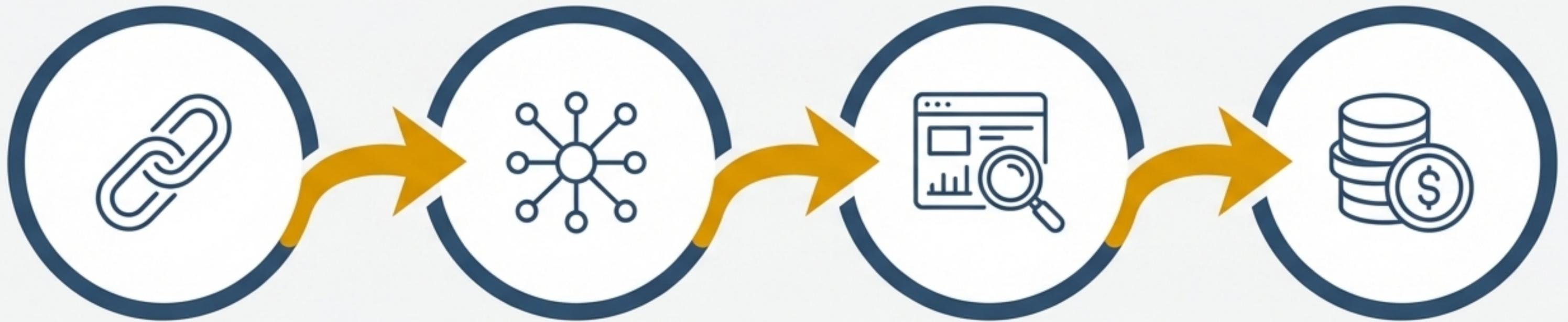
As an **Agent**, your primary workspace is the **Revenue** dashboard.

If you are also a registered **User** or **Partner** on the RAD Platform, you will see additional tabs in your navigation bar, such as 'Deployments' or 'Publish.'



These roles and tools exist alongside your agent functionality. Your Revenue dashboard is always available to track your referral performance.

The Agent Workflow: Your Path from Action to Earnings



1. GET LINK

Find your unique link in Help > Support.

2. SHARE

Distribute your link to invite new users to the platform.

3. TRACK & ANALYZE

Use the User Revenue (Who?) and Module Revenue (What?) tabs to monitor performance.

4. EARN

Receive commissions based on the True Revenue your referrals generate.
