STARTING FIVE

1. Georgia Tech makes its first appearance of the 2018-19 season on Sunday hosting Coastal Georgia in an exhibition game at McCamish Pavilion. The game can be viewed on ACC Network Extra.
2. The Yellow Jackets and Mariners have never met in program history.
3. Georgia Tech returns seven letterwinners from last season's squad that went 20-14 overall and reached the third round of the WNIT. The Yellow Jackets defeated Bethune Cookman and UAB at home before falling to Alabama by a possession in Tuscaloosa.
4. Amongst Tech's seven returning letterwinners is last season's leading scorer and 2016-17 ACC Freshman of the Year, Francesca Pan. The junior led the Jackets in scoring last season, averaging 14.3 points per game, while also leading the team in three-point shooting, connecting on 79 treys. Also returning for her sophomore campaign on The Flats is Kierra Fletcher who put together an impressive freshman campaign last season. Fletcher returns as the team's leading rebounder after pulling down 5.2 rebounds per game last season.
5. Head coach MaChelle Joseph is in her 16th season on The Flats and carries an all-time career record of 294-191. Joseph is the all-time winningest coach in program history and holds the highest winning percentage in Yellow Jacket history at 60.9 percent.

LAST TIME THEY MET

This afternoon's meeting marks the first between Coastal Georgia and Georgia Tech.

LAST TIME OUT

Georgia Tech wrapped up the 2017-18 season with its 11th postseason appearance in 12 seasons with a return trip to the WNIT. The Jackets reached the third round of the WNIT after defeating Bethune Cookman and UAB at home before falling at Alabama by a possession. Tech finished last season with a 20-14 overall record, tying for ninth in the ACC with a 6-10 conference ledger.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS IN 2018

With an at-large bid to the WNIT last season, the Yellow Jackets made their 11th postseason appearance in 12 seasons and third-straight WNIT appearance. Tech went undefeated when hosting WNIT opponents inside McCamish Pavilion last season, defeating Bethune Cookman in the first round, 85-32, followed by a 91-47 rout over UAB before hitting the road. The Jackets met Alabama in Tuscaloosa in the third round and led the majority of the game, but fell by a possession to the Crimson Tide.

SCORING TO THE FUTURE

Tech returns 48% of its scoring from last season including the team's leading scorer, Francesca Pan who averaged 14.3 points per game as a sophomore. Pan shot 35.1 percent (156-445) from the field last season and went 79-for-242 from three-point range for a 32.6 percent efficiency. The Italian native also led the Jackets from the charity stripe, connecting on a team-best 79 free throws.

WHAT RETURNS

Georgia Tech returns seven letterwinners from last season's squad and welcomes six newcomers. The Jackets return 48% of its scoring from last season and 42% of its rebounding.

APPROACHING A MILESTONE

The team's leading returning scorer from last season, junior Francesca Pan has poured in 900 career points in 70 career games, needing just 100 points to become the 31st player in program history to cross the 1,000-career point plateau. As a freshman, Pan poured in 414 points in 36 games and finished second on the team in scoring to be tabbed the ACC Freshman of the Year. She followed her inaugural season scoring 486 points as a sophomore in 34 games.

CLOSING IN ON VICTORY CLUB

Georgia Tech's women's basketball head coach MaChelle Joseph has 294 career wins in 15 seasons, needing just six wins to reach 300 career wins at Georgia Tech. Joseph is the program's all-time winningest coach in program history and has led the Jackets to 11 postseason appearances since taking over at the helm of the program, including seven NCAA appearances. Additionally, she has helped lead the Yellow Jackets to 10 20-plus win seasons.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT

Three Yellow Jackets were named to Preseason Watch Lists prior to the official tipoff of the season. Junior Francesca Pan was one of 20 candidates tabbed to the 2019 Cheryl Miller Award watch list by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and the WBCA. The award recognizes the top small forwards in women's NCAA Division I college basketball.

Tech also placed two freshmen on the ACC preseason Newcomer Watch List. Elizabeth Balogun earned a spot on both the Blue Ribbon Panel's watch list as well as the league's head coaches'. She was joined on the head coaches watch list by teammate Elizabeth Dixon. A pair of McDonald's All-Americans, Balogun and Dixon were two members of Tech's 7th-ranked recruiting class. The pair also competed in the Jordan Brand Classic game in Brooklyn, N.Y. in April. Balogun, the USA Today Tennessee Player of the Year, garnered second team Naismith Trophy National High School All-American Team accolades, while Dixon was tabbed honorable mention.

TECH IN EXHIBITIONS

Tech opens its second-straight season hosting an exhibition on Sunday. Under MaChelle Joseph, the Jackets have taken the last four exhibition contests dating back to 2013.

COMPETITION AWAITS

The Yellow Jackets have a competitive 2018-19 schedule ahead of them as they are set to face 16 teams that reached postseason play last season, 10 from the ACC. Twelve teams reached the NCAA Tournament last season including Georgia, George Washington, Maryland and Dayton in non-conference action, and Duke, Florida State, Louisville, Miami, NC State, Notre Dame, Syracuse and Virginia in league play. Three teams competed in the WNIT: Houston, Seton Hall and Virginia Tech.

ACC PREDICTIONS

In the ACC Preseason polls, Georgia Tech was picked to finish ninth by the league's head coaches and 10th by the Blue Ribbon Panel. Notre Dame was the preseason favorite in both polls. Freshmen Elizabeth Balogun and Elizabeth Dixon were named to the Preseason Newcomer Watch List.

HOME SWEET HOME

All time, the Yellow Jackets are 355-209 (.620) when playing at home. Under Joseph's direction, Georgia Tech has gone 174-61 (.735) playing on The Flats.

CONNECTING FROM DOWNTOWN

In Georgia Tech's win over Appalachian State on Dec. 11, 2016, the Yellow Jackets set a program record, hitting 14 three-pointers in the win. Tech was 14-of-27 from three-point range, fueled by five treys from both Antonia Peresson and Cha'Ron Sweeney. In total, five different Yellow Jackets hit a three-pointer to help set the record. The previous record was 13, hit twice in previous years.

JOSEPH VS. THE RANKED

Since MaChelle Joseph took the reigns of the Yellow Jacket program prior to the 2003-04 season, Tech has beaten 14 ranked opponents. All-time, Georgia Tech has 35 wins against AP ranked teams with eight of those coming on the road.

LAST WIN VS. RANKED OPPONENT

Tech's last win against a ranked opponent came vs. #24 Syracuse, 75-66, in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 15, 2017. The win marked the first-ever against Syracuse in program history. The last victory over a ranked opponent was on Feb. 26, 2015 over #16/17 Duke, also at home.

ALL OVER THE WORLD

Georgia Tech's roster boasts players from seven different states and four different countries. Junior Francesca Pan (Bassano del Grappa, Italy), sophomores Anne Francoise Diouf (Dakar, Senegal), Lorela Cubaj (Terni, Italy), and freshmen Elizabeth Balogun (Lagos, Nigeria) and Lotta-Maj Lahtinen (Helsinki, Finland) are Georgia Tech's five international student-athletes.

This past summer, Tech had two student-athletes representing their home countries on their National Teams. Junior Francesca Pan and sophomore Lorela Cubaj both competed for the Italian National Team. Pan competed with the Senior National Team for the first time, while Cubaj saw action in the FIBA U20 Women's European Championship.

Two summers ago, Pan represented Italy in the 2016 U20 European Championships, helping her country to a second-place finish.

HEAD COACH MACHELLE JOSEPH

16th Season • Purdue '92 • Auburn, Ind.

Georgia Tech signed head women's basketball coach Machel Joseph to a two-year contract extension through the 2019-20 season, as announced on Oct. 21, 2014. Georgia Tech has had unprecedented success at the helm of the Yellow Jackets during the past 14 seasons. Joseph is just the second head coach in Yellow Jacket history to hit 200 career wins and is the all-time winningest coach at GT. Her 61 percent career winning percentage is the highest in Georgia Tech history. Currently, Joseph has nine 20-win seasons and seven NCAA tournament appearances, including six-straight from 2007 through 2012. Under Joseph's direction, 19 Yellow Jackets have garnered All-ACC accolades and four Jackets have been named All-ACC First Team members since Joseph became the head coach in 2003. Seven freshmen have been named to the All-ACC Freshman Team, including one a year from 2011 to 2014. Tyaunna Marshall was named an AP honorable mention All-American in both 2013 and 2014. Joseph has coached six Jackets that were selected in the WNBA Draft. Both Alex Montgomery and Sasha Goodlett were chosen in the first round of the WNBA Draft in 2011 and 2012, respectively. Aaliyah Whiteside was tabbed an honorable mention WBCA All-American last season, becoming just the sixth All-American Yellow Jacket in program history.

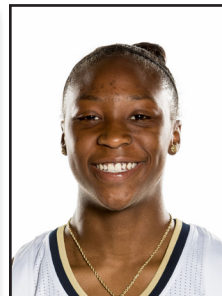

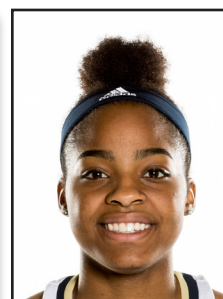

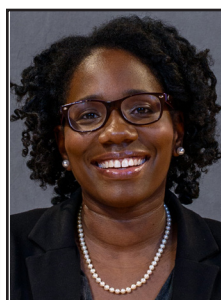
