GEORGIA TECH (5-6, 1-1 ACC) vs. Hawai'i (8-4, 0-0 Big West)

GAME 12 • December 25, 2019 • 6:30 p.m. ET • Stan Sheriff Center • Honolulu, Hawai'i

About Wednesday's Game

For the first time since 1994, Georgia Tech's basketball team is in Honolulu, Hawai'i to compete in the Diamond Head Classic, and the Yellow Jackets face the host team, Hawai'i, in the third-place game at 6:30 p.m. Eastern time on Christmas Day at the Stan Sheriff Center.

Tech (5-6, 1-1 ACC), in its fourth season under head coach Josh Pastner, opened the tournament with a 74-60, come-from-behind victory over Boise State before dropping its semifinal game, 70-59, to Houston. The Yellow Jackets, 2-3 away from home this season, have on a stretch of five straight games away from home with its appearance in the Diamond Head Classic.

Hawai'i (8-4, 0-0 Big West), playing under acting head coach Chris Gerlufsen, defeated UTEP, 67-63, in the opening round of the Diamond Head Classic before falling, 72-61, to No. 21 Washington in the semifinals. The Rainbow Warriors had won five of six games before the loss to the Huskies, but are 0-3 against power conference teams (Illinois, Oregon and Washington).

Wednesday's game will be televised live on ESPN2. Live streaming is available through the ESPN app. Radio coverage of Tech's games is provided through Learfield IMG College, airing in Atlanta on 680 AM and 93.7 FM the Fan and through the Tuneln app. The Tech broadcast is also available on satellite radio (XM ch. 371, internet ch. 971).

The Tipoff

• **Tournament titles** - Georgia Tech last won a regular-season tournament event in 2003, the Preseason NIT, defeating No. 1 Connecticut and No. 25 Texas Tech in Madison Square Garden to capture the title. Since then, the Yellow Jackets have reached the finals of three events - the 2006 Maui Invitational, the 2010 Legends Classic and the 2015 NIT Season Tipoff. Tech has won 18 regular-season tournaments over the years.

• **Long time away** - Following Georgia Tech's trip to Hawai'i, the Yellow Jackets play their next two games on the road, Dec. 31 at Florida State and Jan. 4 at North Carolina. Tech does not play at home again until Jan. 8 against Duke.

• **Jolly good cheer** - Tech is playing on Christmas Day for only the second time in program history. Tech opened the 1926-27 season by playing eight consecutive road games from Dec. 20-28, including a Dec. 25 contest against the Loraine Lions Club.

• **Missing piece** - Jose Alvarado returned to the court for the first time since Nov. 20 when he played 30 minutes against Boise State, scoring 14 points and keying a strong second-half defensive effort by the Jackets. The junior point guard added seven points and four assists in 35 minutes in Tech's semifinal game against Houston.

• **Ushering in** - Jordan Usher made his debut for the Yellow Jackets Dec. 18 against Ball State after sitting out the required two semesters after he transferred from Southern California last January. After a subpar first game against the Cardinals in his Tech debut, the 6-7 junior guard/forward from Canton, Ga., has averaged 14 points and 5.5 rebounds in two games at the Diamond Head Classic, hitting 10 of 22 shots from the floor.

• **Sophomore guard Michael Devoe** ranks fifth in the ACC in scoring (17.8 ppg), and ninth in field goal percentage (.458). He also is No. 2 in minutes played (35.8).

• **Tech** has the ACC's leading shot-blocker in senior center **James Banks III** (3.2 per game, No. 8 in NCAA).

• **Junior forward Moses Wright** ranks No. 2 in the ACC in field goal percentage (.565) and No. 8 in rebound average (8.3 per game).

• **No ducking** - Georgia Tech's schedule is the ninth-strongest among power conference teams according to KenPom.com. Tech's schedule included six power conference teams in its first 10 games, including road games at NC State, Georgia and Kentucky, and home games against Arkansas, Nebraska and Syracuse. The Jackets' non-conference schedule rates 13th-toughest among power conference teams.

• **Beefing up** - With a more veteran team in 2019-20, Georgia Tech made an effort to strengthen its non-conference schedule, beginning a two-game series with Kentucky and finishing another two-game set with Arkansas, while accepting an invitation to play in the Diamond Head Classic, in which the Jackets faced a 2019 NCAA Tournament teams in Houston. Tech has also played its annual meeting against Georgia and the Big Ten/ACC matchup against Nebraska.

Tech and the Diamond Head Classic

Georgia Tech basketball is making its sixth trip to the state of Hawai'i in program history this weekend with the 2019 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu.

Tech has an 11-6 record all time in four previous tournament events in Hawai'i, including a 6-3 mark in three appearances in the old Rainbow Classic (1984 champions, 1988, 1994) which also were held at the University of Hawai'i. The Yellow Jackets also played in the 1998 Big Island Classic in Hilo, and the 2006 Maui Invitational, finishing as the runner-up in both.

when the Yellow Jackets were an independent in basketball. The Rainbows won both games.

Hawai'i has made two visits to Atlanta to play the Yellow Jackets, who won both games on Jan. 25, 1969 and Jan. 6, 1973. The teams never met in the Rainbow Classic.

Tech So Far in the DHC

Georgia Tech 74, Boise State 60 - Jordan Usher and Moses Wright scored 18 points each to lead four players in double figures as Georgia Tech overcame an eight-point second-half deficit to defeat Boise State, 74-60, Sunday in the opening round. The Yellow Jackets, who trailed by five at intermission and by eight early in the second half, snapped a three-game losing streak after going on a 20-2 run midway through the second half, turning a 41-38 deficit into a 58-43 advantage. Wright started the run with an old-fashioned three-point play, scoring at the basket while drawing a foul and making the free throw to tie the game at 41-all with 14:44 to play. Usher gave the Jackets the lead for good on a three-point basket two minutes later.

Wright did not miss a shot in the game, going 7-for-7 from the floor, including a three-point basket on his first shot attempt, and 3-for-3 from the charity stripe. He scored nine of his points during the run, while Usher scored seven. Usher finished the game 6-of-10 from the floor and 5-of-6 from the line.

Jose Alvarado made his first appearance for the Jackets since Nov. 20, having missed seven of the last eight games with an ankle injury. The junior point guard started and played 30 minutes, scoring 14 points and playing tough defense in the second half. He re-entered the game with 5:32 to go and scored Tech's next 10 points on a pair of three-point shots and four free throws to keep the Broncos (6-5) at bay.

Houston 70, Georgia Tech 59 - Moses Wright posted a double-double and led three Georgia Tech players in double figures, but the Yellow Jackets couldn't rally from an 11-point halftime deficit and dropped a 70-59 decision Monday in a semifinal game. Houston guard Quentin Grimes led the Cougars with 26 points, scoring 23 of them in the first half, including nine straight over the final three minutes to help his team expand a 30-26 lead to 43-32 at intermission. Houston shot 54.3 percent in the first half to help gain separation, and dominated the boards to the tune of 42-25 to keep the Yellow Jackets from coming back.

Tech steadied itself defensively after the break, limiting Houston to 30.4 percent from the floor and just one three-point basket while forcing 11 turnovers. But the Yellow Jackets hit only 30.8 percent themselves and could come no closer than six points.

Wright finished the game with 19 points and 10 rebounds, his third double this month, while Michael Devoe scored 17 points, including a pair of three-point baskets, and Jordan Usher added 10 for the Yellow Jackets. Jose Alvarado scored seven points with four assists and no turnovers in nearly 36 minutes in his second game back from an ankle injury.

What's Trending

- Georgia Tech ranks No. 36 in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com (90.8 points per 100 possessions), No. 23 nationally in effective defensive field goal percentage (43.9) and 19th in two-point field goal defense (42.3).
- Since the beginning of last season, Tech has held 24 opponents, including nine ACC opponents, under 40 percent from the floor. Six Tech opponents this season have shot under 40 percent.
- The Jackets have limited 20 opponents, nine in the ACC, to 30 percent or less from three-point range in the same time frame.
- Tech ranks No. 10 nationally in blocked shots with 59 in eight games (6.0 per game). James Banks III is No. 8 in the nation individually with 3.2 per game.

• Georgia Tech's adjusted tempo is 71.5 possessions per game according to KenPom (85th in the nation), well ahead of the 66.1 possessions per game last season and 66.8 in 2016-17. Game-by-game, Tech has played less than 70 possessions just four times and has exceeded 100 points/100 possessions three times.

• Tech has reached 70 possessions per game over the course of a full season only four times since 1997, the first year KenPom kept 1997-98 (72.3), 2000-01 (72.1), 2001-02 (70.5) and 2008-09 (70.5).

• Two fouls in the first half? No problem. Georgia Tech ranks No. 2 in the nation, according to KenPom.com, in 2-foul participation, a measure of percentage of available minutes played by players with two fouls (72.5 pct. for Tech). The Jackets led the nation in this category in 2018-19, was fourth in 2017-18 and 35th in 2016-17.

• Tech is 2-3 on the road this season, 3-3 at home.

• Tech has trailed at halftime in nine of 11 games this season, but has won three of those eight games. The Jackets are 13-46 under Josh Pastner when trailing at the half.

• Tech hit 16-of-22 shots from the free throw line against Houston and has connected on 31-of-42 (73.8 pct.) in two games in the Diamond Head Classic. Tech had not hit the 70-percent mark since making 72.7 percent in the season opener at NC State and has done so in both games of the tournament.

• Tech committed a season-low nine turnovers against Houston, its first game under 10 since the end of the 2018-19 season.

• Tech, fifth in the nation in blocked shots coming into the Houston game, blocked only two against the Cougars and has 18 in its last five games, dropping its average to 6.0 per game this season (now 8th in the nation).

• Tech has connected on just 34-of-138 three-point field goals in its last six games (24.6 percent, 3-of-15 vs. Houston) after hitting 21-of-63 (33.3 percent) in the first three games of the season. The Jackets are hitting 27.8 percent for the season.

Personnel Trends

• After missing seven of Tech's eight games before the Diamond Head Classic because of an ankle injury, Jose Alvarado has played 65:20 in the Yellow Jackets two games in the tournament, scoring 21 points (6-18 FG, 3-10 3pt, 6-6 FT).

• Jordan Usher has reached double digits in both games of the Diamond Head Classic. The 6-7 junior has hit 7-of-22 shots from the floor and 7-of-8 from the foul line, and has grabbed 11 rebounds.

• Moses Wright has three double-doubles in the month of December after scoring 19 points with 10 boards against Houston. The 6-9 junior had 12 points and 12 rebounds against Bethune-Cookman on Dec. 1 and 13 points with 10 boards at Kentucky on Dec. 14. He and James Banks III each have three double-doubles this season.

• Wright is averaging 18.5 points and 9.5 rebounds in the Diamond Head Classic, having hit 14-of-22 shots from the floor and 8-of-9 from the foul line. He has hit 56.6 percent of his shots from the floor this season, which ranks No. 2 in the ACC.

• Michael Devoe, the ACC's fifth-leading scorer, has hit double figures in each of Tech's last three games after scoring just 12 total in the two games prior. He scored 17 on 5-of-9 shooting against Houston, also hitting two of his three three-point attempts and 5-of-6 free throws. The 6-5 sophomore was 2-of-19 from distance in Tech's previous four games.

• James Banks III played a season-low 21:03 and had five points with seven rebounds against Boise State. The 6-10 senior grabbed two key offensive rebounds for the Jackets in the final 1:41.

• Banks blocked one shot against Houston, and has 35 in 11 games this season for an average of 3.18, dropping to No. 2 in the ACC after leading the conference the entire season.

Pastner's Key Metrics

• **Assists to made field goals:** Tech has assisted on 135 of 270 field goals (50 percent) this season. The Jackets had only seven assists on 20 made field goals against Houston, falling below their nightly goal of 60 percent, which Tech has made four times this season.

• **Free throws made to opponents' attempts:** Tech went 16-of-22 from the free throw line against Houston, while the Cougars were 14-of-19, falling short of accomplishing its nightly mission of making more free throws than the opponent attempts. The Jackets are 41-19 under Josh Pastner when attempting more free throws than the opponent. Tech has connected on just 59.7 percent of its free throws this season and has averaged just 11.1 points per game from the charity stripe.

• **Turnovers:** Tech committed a season-low nine turnovers to 15 for Houston. The Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over more than their opponent in nine of 11 games. The Jackets have averaged 18.3 turnovers in eight games, forcing 15.3. Target each night is to commit 11 or fewer, which Tech met only three times last season (all in the last four games) and once this season. More telling for Tech under Josh Pastner is that when Tech has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent, it is 23-16. When it has committed more, it is 27-34.

• **Guard rebounding:** Tech's players outside of Banks, Cole and Wright collected six of the Jackets' 18 defensive rebounds against Houston. For the season, they have 133 of the Jackets' 307 defensive rebounds (43.3 percent).

Pre-Season Storylines

• **Rise above** - The Yellow Jackets finished last season 10th in the ACC after being projected to finish no higher than 13th in the preseason. It was Tech's highest finish since tying for ninth in 2013. Tech also outperformed projections in 2016-17, finishing 11th after being picked to finish 14th in Josh Pastner's first season. The Jackets have been projected to finish 12th this season in the official preseason poll of ACC media.

• **Core group returns** - Georgia Tech returns all five players who started its final two games of the season, and eight players who started a total of 123 games.

• **Firepower returning** - Tech returns its top three scorers from the 2018-19 season - Jose Alvarado, James Banks III and Michael Devoe - who accounted for 48.4 percent of its points, 41.6 percent of its rebounds and 47.2 percent of its minutes. Altogether, Tech returns eight of its top 11 players, who combined for 73.2 percent of its points, 66.4 percent of its points and 73.7 percent of its minutes. Those eight players combined to start 123 games.

• **Get old and stay old** - Tech's core eight returning players include two seniors, three juniors and three sophomores.

• **Reinforcements** - Tech has added two high-level transfers in 6-7 forward Jordan Usher from Southern California and 5-11 guard Bubba Parham from VMI, both of whom hail from the Atlanta area and were successful with their former schools. Usher, a former 4-star high school prospect, averaged more than eight points a game last year at USC, while Parham, an All-Southern Conference selection, led the SoCon in scoring at 21.4 points per game. Parham was granted immediate eligibility by the NCAA. Usher, who enrolled at Tech last January, becomes eligible for the Jackets' Dec. 18 game against Ball State. The Jackets also signed an all-state high school guard from South Carolina in 6-5 Asanti Price.

• **First time** - Georgia Tech's roster is composed entirely of student-athletes recruited by head coach Josh Pastner and his staff for the first time in Pastner's tenure.

• **Peachy** - All four of the transfers on Georgia Tech's roster are from the Atlanta metropolitan area and went to high school here - James Banks III (Decatur/Mount Vernon Presbyterian School), Bubba Parham (Snellville/Brookwood HS), Shembari Phillips (Atlanta/Wheeler HS) and Jordan Usher (Canton/Wheeler HS).

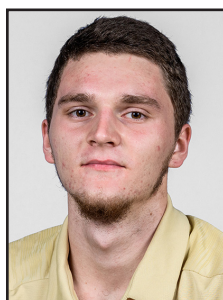
