About Saturday's Game

Now into the last two weeks of the Atlantic Coast Conference regular season, Georgia Tech continues a three-game homestand Saturday night, hosting Miami for an 8 p.m. tip at McCamish Pavilion. It is the only scheduled meeting between the two teams this season.

Georgia Tech update (14-14, 8-9 ACC) - With three games left in the regular season, Tech is tied for seventh place in the ACC standings, tied with NC State and Clemson. The Yellow Jackets are 5-3 over their last eight conference games, a stretch that includes four straight home victories over NC State (64-58), Virginia Tech (76-57), Louisville (64-58) and Clemson (68-59) and a road win at Wake Forest (86-79). Miami is the middle game of this three-game homestand that began with a Tuesday night win over Clemson.

Miami update (14-13, 6-11 ACC) - Miami is tied for 11th place in the ACC standings with Virginia Tech. The Hurricanes, 2-7 on the road, dropped an 87-71 decision at Notre Dame Sunday night, snapping a three-game winning streak that included victories over Boston College (85-58), Wake Forest (71-54) and Virginia Tech (102-95, 3ot).

The Tipoff

• **Nine tonight** - A win over Miami would give Tech nine ACC wins for the first time since the Yellow Jackets went 9-7 in its Final Four season of 2003-04. Since its last regular-season ACC title in 1995-96, Tech has won as many as eight ACC games just seven times (including this season), and has finished the regular season .500 in conference games just four times, last in 2007.

• **Never on Tuesday** - If the regular season ended today, Tech would receive a first-round bye in the ACC Tournament for the first time since the conference expanded to 15 teams. The Yellow Jackets (8-9) are tied for seventh place in the ACC standings with NC State and Clemson, teams the Jackets are 3-0 against this season. Tech is one game behind Notre Dame and Clemson, teams the Jackets are 0-4 against this season. Immediately behind the Jackets are Boston College (7-11) and Virginia Tech (6-11), each of whom Tech defeated in their only meeting of the season.

• **Home stretch** - Georgia Tech has won its last five home games (four ACC) after starting the season 3-6 within the confines of McCamish Pavilion. Tech has won as many as five straight ACC home games only four times since 1995-96 (8-0 at home) - in 2001, 2003, 2007 and 2010.

• **More snacks** - Tech is 4-5 on the road this season in the ACC, having defeated NC State, North Carolina, Boston College and Wake Forest. It is the first time since the 2007-08 season (4-4 record) that the Yellow Jackets have won four ACC road games. The last time Tech won five conference road games was 1995-96 (5-3), when the Jackets finished 13-3 overall and won the ACC regular season title. It is the only time Tech has won as many as five ACC road games.

• **Never easy** - Georgia Tech's seven ACC losses in January and February have come by an average of 6.5 points. Its seven wins have come by an average of nine points.

• **A make-or-miss game** - After ranking near the bottom of the ACC in shooting over the first three years under Josh Pastner, Georgia Tech now ranks No. 2 in the ACC in field goal percentage (46.5) against the conference, No. 6 in three-point percentage (33.9) and No. 10 in scoring. *See chart on page 4.*

• **More balance** - Tech ranks 10th in the ACC in scoring average in conference games (70.35) and ninth in scoring defense (71.06). The Jackets have typically ranked near the top in defense (average ranking 4.3) and near the bottom in offense (14.3) the last three seasons. Tech ranks right in the middle (8th) in both offensive and defensive efficiency against the league, according to KenPom.com.

• **Clamping down** - Tech has won its last four ACC games at home (NC State, Virginia Tech, Louisville, Clemson), holding all four to less than 60 points (58.0 ppg) and limiting them to 31.2 percent shooting from the floor, 15.3 percent from three-point range. *See chart on page 6.*

• **Twelve** - The number of games missed due to injury for Tech players this season. Tech has had its full roster available for only 14 games. Leading scorer Michael Devoe was sidelined for three games with an injured left foot. Reserve forward Evan Cole missed two games with an ankle sprain. Jordan Usher did not play in the season's first seven games, sitting out as a transfer.

• **Six** - The number of different starting lineups Tech has used this season. The most frequent has been Jose Alvarado, Michael Devoe, Jordan Usher, Moses Wright and James Banks III, used 15 times in the last 18 games, interrupted only by Devoe's injury that forced him to miss three games. Moses Wright is the only Jacket to start every game this season.

• **Guard's game** - Tech has four starters averaging in double figures this season in ACC game, but starting guards Michael Devoe and Jose Alvarado, Tech's two leading scorers, have accounted for 39.2 percent of the Yellow Jackets' points in ACC games, and 40.8 percent of the scoring in games in which they have both played.

• **All-for-ado** - Georgia Tech has averaged 70.3 points

and shot 46.5 percent from the floor in the 19 games since Jose Alvarado returned to the court from injury Dec. 22. The Yellow Jackets have shot 50 percent or better in six of those games.

- **Wright stuff** - Moses Wright has hit double figures in Tech's last seven ACC games, averaging 15 points and 6.7 rebounds over that stretch, and hitting 52.4 percent of his shots from the floor. The 6-9 junior has scored 10 or more in all but five games this season. Until his 33 points at Syracuse, Wright had scored 20 or more in a game only once this season (22 at North Carolina on Jan. 4).

- **Big miss** - Jose Alvarado has averaged 14.8 points (45.5 FG pct., 36.1 3pt pct.), 4.2 assists and 2.2 steals in 19 games since his return from an ankle injury on Dec. 22. He has scored 20 or more points six times.

- **Crack that whip** - Michael Devoe's line for last seven games is 17.1 points per game, 5.1 assists per game, 50.1 percent (38-of-75) from the floor, 43.8 percent (14-for-32) from three-point range, 86.2 percent (25-of-29) from the free throw line. He has hit 43.1 percent of his threes in ACC games.

- **Ushering in** - Jordan Usher has started every game since he became eligible on Dec. 18. the 6-7 junior has averaged 9.6 ppg (36-of-6 FG), 4.6 rpg, 2.5 apg in the 10 games Tech has won since he became eligible.

- **No ducking** - Georgia Tech's schedule is the 23rd-strongest in the nation according to the NCAA NET rankings. Tech has played nine games against quad 1 teams (two wins) and 10 against quad 2 teams (four wins), five of those against non-conference teams. The Jackets have one remaining game against a quad 1 or 2 team (at Clemson). The Jackets' non-conference schedule rates 78th in the NET.

Series vs. Miami

- After winning the first two meetings against the Hurricanes after they became members of the ACC, Georgia Tech has lost three of the last four meetings with Miami and have dropped 13 of the last 18.

- The Hurricanes won the only regular-season meeting between the two teams in 2018-19, an 80-65 win in Coral Gables.

- Miami has an 14-9 lead in the all-time series which dates back to 1953, and is 13-7 against the Yellow Jackets since joining the ACC.

- Tech has won two of its last four games against Miami in Coral Gables, including a 71-69 victory over 6th-ranked Miami on March 6, 2013. It was Tech's first win at the Watsco Center since Feb. 26, 2005. The Jackets also captured a 70-50 win against No. 23 Miami on Jan. 28, 2015.

- Miami had won five straight meetings in Atlanta and was 3-0 at McCamish Pavilion before Tech's 2018 win (64-54). Miami also won the only regular-season meeting between the two teams in 2011-12, as well as their ACC Tournament meeting, both games at Philips Arena.

- Miami was the opponent for Tech in its last game at Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game the Yellow Jackets won 66-57 to close out the 2010-11 regular season. Tech won four of six games against the Hurricanes in the building.

- Fourteen of the 23 meetings have been decided by 10 points or less.

- Tech is 3-7 against Miami teams coached by Jim Larranaga, and 4-7 against Larranaga, including a 70-62 win over his George Mason team on Nov. 20, 2009 in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

- Tech coach Josh Pastner is 3-2 against Miami (1-2 while at Tech), including a pair of victories during his term as head coach at Memphis.

- The last meeting between the two schools prior to Miami's joining the ACC occurred in December of 1997 as part of the Orange Bowl Classic doubleheader at Miami Arena, the Hurricanes' home court until the team moved into the on-campus Convocation Center. The Yellow Jackets, led that year by senior forward Matt Harpring, won that game, 69-61, over a

Miami 80, Georgia Tech 65

Jose Alvarado scored 20 points, and Moses Wright matched his career high with 19, but Miami had a hot shooting hand early in the game and cruised to an 80-65 victory at the Watsco Center.

The Hurricanes (12-14, 4-10 ACC) made 12 of their first 19 shots from the floor in opening a 30-13 lead by the 8:09 mark of the first half. The Yellow Jackets (12-16, 4-11 ACC) limited the Hurricanes to one field goal the rest of the half, and opened the second stanza by making 10 of their first 12 shots from the floor, but 11 points (51-40 with 14:01 left in the game) was as close as they could get.

Tech shot 51.6 percent in the second half to Miami's 43.6, and hit 5-of-10 shots from three-point range in outscoring the Hurricanes, 42-41, after intermission. Miami finished the game with nine threes and shot 46.6 percent overall.

Miami center Ebuka Izundu was Tech's primary offensive force in the first half and finished the game with 18 points on 8-of-9 shooting from the floor. D.J. Vasiljevic hit four of his five threes and scored 16 of his game-high 21 points in the second half for the Hurricanes to keep the Jackets at bay. Anthony Lawrence scored 16 points, and Chris Lykes added 11 for Miami.

Alvarado played all 40 minutes and hit 6-of-14 shots from the floor, including 6-of-9 from the foul line and a pair of threes. He also had seven rebounds and four assists. Wright, whose previous career high in an ACC game was nine points, hit 9-of-13 shots and grabbed nine rebounds. Michael Devoe added 13 points for the Jackets.

• Tech played Miami twice under former head coach Whack Hyder, losing the first-ever meeting in the series by 22 points in 1953, then taking a six-point homecourt victory in 1967. That was the only pre-ACC visit by the Hurricanes to Alexander Memorial Coliseum, and the 90-84 Tech win has been the highest scoring game in the short series.

Last Time Out: Jackets Down Clemson

Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe combined to score 33 of Georgia Tech's 68 points and the Yellow Jackets pulled away for their fifth straight home win, a 68-59 triumph over visiting Clemson on Tuesday evening at McCamish Pavilion.

Alvarado overcame an elbow injury that forced him to momentarily leave the court midway through the first half to score 19 points on 8-of-14 shooting (3-of-5 from 3-point range). Devoe scored 14 points to go along with six rebounds and a game- and career-high eight assists. Moses Wright also reached double figures for the Yellow Jackets with 10 points.

Georgia Tech, which led wire-to-wire in its previous three home wins over Morehouse (Jan. 28), Virginia Tech (Feb. 4) and fifth-ranked Louisville (Feb. 12), was behind for only 10:25 of Tuesday's 40 minutes. The Jackets closed the first half with a 9-2 run to take a 34-29 halftime lead and never trailed after the break.

Tech limited Clemson, who had averaged 77 points and hit 34-of-68 threes in winning its last three games, to just 59 points and 2-of-20 from three-point range.

What's Trending

• Among ACC teams (according to KenPom.com), Tech ranks No. 4 in effective field goal percentage (51.5) against the league, the Yellow Jackets' highest ranking in that category since they were No. 2 in 2010 (49.0). They also are No. 8 in offensive efficiency (100.1).

• The Jackets rank No. 2 in percentage of points scored on two-point field goals (57.9), and have been the No. 1 team in the ACC in that category all four years under Josh Pastner. Tech ranks No. 8 nationally in all games (59.0 pct.).

• Tech has exceeded 100 points per 100 possessions 10 times, seven of those games coming since Jan. 4 at North Carolina, which was the Jackets' highest efficiency rating of the season (132.2). In its last six games, Tech exceeded 100 against Notre Dame, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest.

• Tech ranks No. 29 nationally in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com (92.3 points per 100 possessions), No. 22 nationally in effective defensive field goal percentage (45.4) and No. 9 in three-point field goal defense (28.8).

• Tech has held 12 opponents this season under 40 percent from the floor (five ACC opponents), and 10 under 30 percent from three-point range (five ACC opponents - Louisville hit 3-of-24, Clemson was 2-for-20).

• Tech has held five opponents to their lowest offensive efficiency of the season, including two of its foes in Hawai'i - Elon, Arkansas, Nebraska, Boise State and Hawai'i. Four other teams, including Boston College, NC State, Virginia Tech and Louisville, posted one of their five lowest offensive efficiency ratings against the Yellow Jackets.

• Tech's adjusted tempo is 69.7 possessions per game according to KenPom.com (No. 95 in the nation), its best rate and ranking in Josh Pastner's four years at Tech. The Yellow Jackets' tempo in league play (69.7) is the fourth-highest, hitting 70 or more in each of the last four games (Louisville, Wake Forest, Syracuse, Clemson), and 16 times overall this season.

• Tech has reached 70 possessions per game over the course of a full season only four times since 1997, the first year KenPom kept track - 1997-98 (72.3), 2000-01 (72.1), 2001-02 (70.5) and 2008-09 (70.5).

• Two fouls in the first half? No problem. Georgia Tech ranks No. 1 in the nation, according to KenPom.com, in 2-foul participation, a measure of percentage of available minutes played by players with two fouls (68.7 percent for Tech). The

Jackets led the nation in this category in 2018-19, was fourth in 2017-18 and 35th in 2016-17.

• Tech has scored more than 80 points in three of its four ACC road wins this season, and has averaged 73.9 points in its nine ACC road games. Tech's 86 points against Wake Forest was its second highest point total this season behind the 96 it scored at North Carolina on Jan. 4. In all games, Tech has averaged 72.2 points on the road, 66.1 at home.

• Tech entered the Clemson game having not trailed in its last 122 minutes and 41 seconds of basketball at McCamish Pavilion. Tech never trailed in its prior three home games (Morehouse, Virginia Tech, Louisville) and for the final 2:41 of its Jan. 25 game against NC State. Clemson broke that streak by scoring the first basket of the game, but the Jackets did not trail for the final 21:58 against the Tigers, being tied once in the second half.

• Tech is 9-2 this season when leading at the half.

• Tech has won the rebounding battle eight times and held even twice in 13 games since the beginning of January. The Jackets are plus-28 on the boards in ACC games for the season, averaging 1.6 per game more than their opponents.

• Tech has hit 36-of-93 (38.7 percent) of its three-point attempts in its last six games. The Jackets went 7-for-16 against Clemson.

• Over its last eight ACC games (5-3 record), Tech has averaged 70.8 points, has shot 46.4 percent from the floor, and 34.6 percent from three-point range. The Jackets also have a plus-2.9 scoring margin and a plus-3.5 rebound margin, have scored 14.8 points per game from the foul line and reduced its turnover rate to 14.4. Opponents have shot 41.7 percent from the floor, 23.9 percent from three-point range.

• Tech has managed as many as the 68 points it scored Tuesday night only six times in 20 meetings against Tiger teams coached by Brad Brownell.

• Tech played one of its better defensive games of the season and did not have a player foul out for the first time since Feb. 4 against Virginia Tech. The Jackets were whistled for just 16 fouls, its fewest in an ACC game since Jan. 25 against NC State. Twenty-two Georgia Tech players have fouled out this season, the most for the Yellow Jackets since the 1989-90 season (28 in 38 games). In conference play, 15 Jackets have fouled out, the most ever for the Jackets in an ACC season.

Personnel Trends

• Jose Alvarado (team-high 19 points, 3-of-5 3pt FG against Clemson) has made a three-point basket in 15 straight games. That is the longest streak for a Tech player since Adam Smith knocked down a three in 24 straight games during the 2015-16 season.

• Alvarado has hit 32-of-80 shots (40 pct.) from three-point range in his last 15 games (3-of-5 vs. Clemson) and is 77-of-159 overall (48.4 pct.) during that stretch. He has hit 37.1 percent from distance in ACC games.

• Michael Devoe (14 points, 2-of-4 3pt FG) has made a three in seven straight games. His longest streak is 13 games, last year as a freshman.

• Devoe established a career high for assists with eight against Clemson, breaking his previous personal best of seven accomplished three times earlier this season.

• Last seven games for Devoe - 17.1 points per game,

5.1 assists per game, 50.1 percent (38-of-75) from the floor, 43.8 percent (14-for-32) from three-point range, 86.2 percent (25-of-29) from the free throw line. He has hit 43.1 percent of his threes in ACC games.

- Alvarado and Devoe have combined to score 39.4 percent of Tech's points and sink 39.6 percent of their three-point attempts in ACC games, 45.8 percent overall from the floor. Against Clemson they combined for 33 of the Jackets' 68 points, hit 5-of-9 from three-point range and 14-of-27 overall. They also combined for 11 assists against three turnovers and had nine rebounds and four steals.

- Moses Wright has hit double figures in Tech's last seven ACC games, averaging 16 points and 6.9 rebounds over that stretch, and hitting 54.1 percent of his shots from the floor. Counting the Morehouse game, he has an eight-game streak of double digit games. The 6-9 junior has scored 10 or more in all but five games this season.

- Jordan Usher has averaged 7.0 rebounds over his last three games.

- James Banks III did not foul out (just two fouls) for the first time in five games. He played 31:30 and had seven points, eight rebounds and a career-best four steals.

Pastner's Key Metrics

- **Assists to made field goals:** Tech has assisted on 54.0 percent of its field goals this season, well above the national average of 51.6. The Jackets had 16 assists on 26 made field goals against Clemson (61.5 percent). Its nightly goal is to assist on 60 percent, which the Jackets have met 15 times this season. Tech has assisted on 58.5 percent of its field goals vs. ACC teams this season, fifth-best rate in the conference, and 55.4 percent over its last eight ACC games.

- **Free throws made to opponents' attempts:** Tech went 9-of-13 from the free throw line against Clemson, while the Tigers were 9-of-14. Tech's goal each night is to make more free throws than the opponent attempts. Against ACC foes, the Jackets have hit 67.6 percent and scored 12.9 points per game from the line, and rank sixth in the conference in ratio of free throw attempts to field goal attempts (34.1 percent).

- **Turnovers:** Tech committed 17 to Clemson's 16. The Yellow Jackets have turned the ball over more than their opponent in 20 of 28 games this season. The Jackets have averaged 15.9 on the season, forcing 13.7. Target each night is to commit 11 or fewer, which Tech has met three times this season. More telling for Tech under Josh Pastner is that when Tech has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent, it is 27-17. When it has committed more, it is 31-41.

- **Guard rebounding:** Tech's players outside of Banks, Cole and Wright collected 18 of the Jackets' 27 defensive rebounds against Clemson, 151 of 269 (56.1 pct.) in Tech's last seven games. For the season, they have 395 of the Jackets' 737 defensive rebounds (53.6 percent).

Due to its ability to play both zone and man-to-man and keep opponents off-balance, Georgia Tech has been able to rely on its mixture of defenses to win games over Josh Pastner's first three seasons at Georgia Tech.

According to KenPom.com, Georgia Tech ranks No. 29 nationally in defensive efficiency (92.3 points/100 possessions), its best ranking since 2016-17 (No. 6).

Broken down, Tech ranks No. 22 in effective defensive field goal percentage (45.4), No. 74 in two-point field goal defense (46.5) and No. 9 in three-point defense (28.8).

Tech has held five opponents to their lowest offensive efficiency of the season, including two of its foes in Hawai'i - Elon, Arkansas, Nebraska, Boise State and Hawai'i. Seven other foes, including NC State (both meetings), Kentucky, Duke and Boston College, has posted one of their six lowest ratings against the Jackets.

Balancing Act

Georgia Tech has lived and succeeded by playing excellent defense during its four years under Josh Pastner, but

since the Yellow Jackets have had their entire roster available this season, they have demonstrated efficient and sometimes powerful offense as well.

Without relying a great deal on three-point shooting, Tech has increased its tempo this season to a four-year high under Pastner, 69.7 possessions per game according to KenPom.com (No. 95 in the nation). Tech has hit 70 or more in its last four ACC games, and the Yellow Jackets' tempo in league play (69.7) is the fourth-highest.

Against ACC teams (according to KenPom.com), Tech ranks No. 4 in effective field goal percentage (51.5), the Yellow Jackets' highest ranking in that category since they were No. 2 in 2010 (49.0). They also are eighth in offensive efficiency (100.1) against the conference.

Though the Jackets rely heavily on their starting guards Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe for scoring, they do the majority of it inside the three-point line along with post players James Banks III and Moses Wright, Tech ranks No. 2 in conference games in percentage of points scored on two-point field goals (57.9), and have been the No. 1 team in the ACC in that category each of the three previous seasons under Josh Pastner. Tech ranks eighth nationally in all games (59.0 percent).

Tech has exceeded 100 points per 100 possessions 10 times, seven of those games coming since Jan. 4 at North Carolina, which was the Jackets' highest efficiency rating of the season (132.2). Tech exceeded 100 in three of its last six games (Notre Dame, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest).

Assisted Living

Georgia Tech coach Josh Pastner preached and prodded his Yellow Jackets on ball and player movement and hard cutting from the first time he got his team on the practice court. His primary measuring stick on how well the Jackets perform offensively is their ratio of assists to made field goals.

Tech has been one of the nation's better teams in assists to made field goals (currently No. 147 nationally at 53.1 pct.). In ACC games, Tech has assisted on 58.5 percent, the third-best figure in the conference.

Pastner's nightly goal is 60 percent. The national average is 51.6 percent.

Tech finished last season No. 49 in 2018-19 at 57.6 percent (56.4 pct. in ACC games), well above the national average (52.1 pct.) in that category. In Pastner's first season, the Yellow Jackets ranked 13th nationally at 62.6 percent, the team's highest rate since the 2000-01 season. Tech's number was 63.2 percent in ACC games.

Getting it Wright

The best player development story in Georgia Tech's program is that of sophomore forward Moses Wright, who played only one year of high school basketball and was not rated at all coming out of high school.

He may be the most improved player in the ACC. Remarkably consistent, he has failed to reach double figures in scoring only five times, and never in back-to-back games. He has doubled his scoring and rebounding averages over his sophomore season, and ranks third among ACC players in scoring average increase.

The 6-9 Raleigh, N.C., native has continued where he left off at the end of the 2018-19 season, starting every game this season and sitting No. 3 on Tech's scoring (13.5 ppg) chart and No. 2 in rebounding (7.1 rpg), while connecting on 54.3 percent of his shots from the floor. He ranks No. 2 in the ACC in field goal percentage, and No. 13 in rebound average.

In ACC games, he is Tech's No. 3 scorer at 14.6 points per game and No. 2 with 7.0 rebounds per game and a 52.0-percent shooting rate from the floor.

Wright has seven double-doubles this season, four of them in ACC games against Florida State, Duke, Boston College and Syracuse (33 points, 10 rebounds on Feb. 22). He also posted double-doubles against Houston and Kentucky.

He made the all-tournament team at the Diamond Head Classic, averaging 17.7 points and 7.3 rebounds while connecting on 63.6 percent of his field goal tries, earning him ACC Player of the Week honors.

Wright started the Yellow Jackets' last seven games of 2018-19 and blossomed in the last four, averaging 15.6 points and 6.2 rebounds while connecting on 36-of-58 field goals. He finished off the season with a career-high 25 points (12-of-18 FG) in the ACC Tournament against Notre Dame.

Wright's Has Historic Game at Syracuse

Moses Wright posted a historic performance for a Georgia Tech player in a close defeat Saturday at Syracuse, scoring 33 points with 10 rebounds in the Yellow Jackets' 79-72 loss to the Orange. The 33 points tied the third-most ever recorded by a Tech player in an ACC road game, and were the most for a Jacket in an ACC road game in nearly 20 years. He beat his previous career best by eight points, having scored as many as 20 points only twice in his career previously.

The 6-9 junior made 14 of 17 field goal attempts in the game, with the 14 field goals the third-most ever by a Tech player against an ACC team.

Wright posted his seventh double-double this season, but this one was the first by a Tech player to involve 30 or more points since Josh Okogie's 35-point, 14-rebound game against Florida State on Jan. 22, 2017.

Sophomore Surge

Sophomore guard Michael Devoe, the highest-rated high school prospect Georgia Tech has recruited under Josh Pastner, steadily improved over the course of his freshman season and has made a quantum leap for the Yellow Jackets this season.

The Orlando, Fla., sophomore led the ACC in scoring through the month of November, and is currently No. 7 at 16.0 points per game and No. 4 in field goal percentage (47.0).

Devoe has scored 20 or more points in nine games this season, including a career-best 34 in a loss to Georgia that earned him ACC Player of the Week honors, and has reached double figures in all but five games.

He topped the NCAA rankings in three-point shooting early in the season, and has made 42.0 percent for the season, 43.1 percent in ACC games. He came out of a shooting slump in Hawaii, and has hit 26-of-60 shots from three-point range in his last 14 games after going 2-for-19 in the four games prior.

As a freshman, the Orlando, Fla., native began the season

Media Guidelines

Georgia Tech's practices are closed to the public and the media, but coaches and student-athletes are made available prior to each game before one of the team's practices. Notices will be distributed weekly to confirm the schedule.

TV stations will be allowed to shoot B-roll of practice on occasion.

Media are asked to notify Mike Stamus *the day before* of their need to attend and to make specific student-athlete requests.

Interview requests with student-athletes that need to be conducted at other times must be arranged through the Georgia Tech communications office at least 24 hours in advance. These interviews will be conducted at a time and place convenient to the student-athletes' availability and class schedule.

Media are asked not to contact student-athletes directly either by phone, e-mail, text or social media. They are instructed not to respond. Every effort will be made to make them available.

Interviewing Coach Pastner

Media wishing to speak with Coach Pastner at times other than scheduled media availabilities must notify Mike Stamus in the communications office in advance to make or confirm arrangements. He also is available each Monday on the ACC Teleconference (10:50 a.m.) beginning January 6.

Post-Game Protocol

Each head coach will hold a post-game press conference in the designated interview room (Shah Media Room at McCamish Pavilion).

Student-athletes requested by the media will be brought to the interview room following the coaches press conferences, when the team is at home, outside the team's locker room when the team is on the road.

Josh Pastner Radio Show

Head coach Josh Pastner's weekly radio show airs each Monday from 7-8 p.m. on "680 the Fan" and 93.7 FM, beginning in December.

ACC Coaches Weekly Teleconference

The 15 ACC head basketball coaches will be featured on nine Monday teleconferences during the 2019-20 season, beginning on January 6, and continuing through March 2. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an instant replay of each teleconference on the Conference's internet site TheACC.com each Monday afternoon.

Coach Josh Pastner's regular time will be 10:50 a.m. Coaches whose teams play on Monday in January and February are not required to participate in that day's call. Coaches who do not have a Monday game - Georgia Tech is one - will be on every Monday at the same time. The teleconference schedule for each Monday will differ for the other head coaches, depending on what teams play that Monday night.

slowly after missing significant practice time with a toe injury, but steadily played more minutes and improved his production. He connected on 43.8 percent of his three-point tries in ACC games and averaged 35.4 minutes (10th-most). He hit 32-of-68 (47.1 pct.) three-point tries in his last 15 games.

Jose Can You See

Point guard Jose Alvarado, recruited to Georgia Tech primarily for his winning attitude and determination, was given the green light by head coach Josh Pastner to handle the position as a freshman, sink or swim.

The Brooklyn native, the first Tech player from the New York area in nearly 20 years, has made a huge difference for the Yellow Jackets since his return to the court in Hawai'i, playing an average of 34.1 minutes per game and 14.8 points.

He is Tech's leading scorer in ACC games at 15.8 points per game (8th in the ACC) while converting on 46.8 percent of his shots from the floor (7th ACC) and 37.1 percent from three-point range. He ranks No. 4 in the ACC in steals (2.06) and seventh in assists (4.63) in conference games.

The 6-foot junior has exceeded 20 points six times over his last 14 games, including 26 in a win over NC State and 25 each against North Carolina and Notre Dame (Feb. 1), 22 at Wake Forest on Feb. 19.

Since returning from Hawai'i, the Jackets have exceeded 100 points per 100 possessions seven times in 16 games.

The 6-foot junior had missed seven full games and most of an eighth before that trip with a right ankle sprain suffered before the Jackets' played their second game of the season against Elon. Since his return, Tech has averaged 70.3 points per game and shot 46.5 percent from the floor.

In his last seven games, he has shot 48.8 percent (41-of-84) from the floor, 42.1 percent (16-of-38) from three-point range.

As a sophomore, he developed into the Yellow Jackets' engine on the floor, leading the Jackets in scoring (12.5 ppg), assists (3.6 apg), steals (1.8 pg) and free throw percentage (76.9 pct.) in ACC games.

Alvarado has posted 48 double-figure scoring games in his career, 16 times scoring 20 or more. And the playmaker has averaged more than 34 minutes per game, with 15 complete 40-minute games.

Said Pittsburgh coach Jeff Capel last season:
"[Jose] Alvarado is a big-time competitor. We told our guys coming into this game, I know that kid and I know his spirit. With his team struggling, I knew that he would try to take it upon himself to be aggressive and have a great game. He was sensational."

Banking Hours

The most significant development in the direction of last year's Georgia Tech team may have occurred Nov. 13, when the NCAA granted James Banks III immediate eligibility after his transfer from Texas.

Tech received that news while conducting its shootaround for its second game of the season, at Tennessee. Arrangements were made to get Banks to Knoxville (transfers do not travel with the team), where he contributed five points and seven rebounds in a 66-53 loss.

The personable 6-9 post player progressed rapidly after that modest start. He logged seven double-doubles, finished the season as Tech's No. 2 scorer and top rebounder, and finished 11th in the nation in blocked shots anchoring Tech's defense.

This season, he has added five more double-doubles, ranks No. 24 in the nation in blocked shots and No. 2 in the ACC at a rate of 2.39 per game, and ranks 11th in the ACC in rebound average (7.2). In ACC games, he has averaged 9.9 points, 7.1 rebounds while hitting 56.3 percent of his shots from the floor.

Banks on 3x3U Watch List

James Banks III is one of 10 ACC seniors under consideration to represent the conference in the 2020 Dos Equis 3X3U National Championship which will take place at Atlantic Station during the NCAA Final Four weekend.

The event will feature 128 graduating Division I college basketball seniors competing for \$150,000. The 3x3 event will take place April 3-5 at Atlantic Station in Midtown Atlanta, close to the Tech campus, and will feature musical acts, food trucks, interactive experiences and more for fans in attendance.

The event is free and open to the public, giving fans the chance to see some of the best college basketball players in the nation during the sport's ultimate weekend in Atlanta.

Banks was one of 320 seniors across all 32 Division I conferences named to a mid-season watch list that was revealed Feb. 4.

Pre-Season Storylines

Rise above - The Yellow Jackets finished last season 10th in the ACC after being projected to finish no higher than 13th in the preseason. It was Tech's highest finish since tying for ninth in 2013. Tech also outperformed projections in 2016-17, finishing 11th after being picked to finish 14th in Josh Pastner's first season. The Jackets were projected to finish 12th this season in the official preseason poll of ACC media.

Core group returns - Georgia Tech returned all five players who started its final two games of the season, and eight players who started a total of 123 games.

Firepower returning - Tech returned its top three scorers from the 2018-19 season - Jose Alvarado, James Banks III and Michael Devoe - who accounted for 48.4 percent of its points, 41.6 percent of its rebounds and 47.2 percent of its minutes. Altogether, Tech returned eight of its top 11 players, who combined for 73.2 percent of its points, 66.4 percent of its points and 73.7 percent of its minutes. Those eight players combined to start 123 games.

Get old and stay old - Tech's core eight returning players include two seniors, three juniors and three sophomores.

Reinforcements - Tech added two high-level transfers in 6-7 forward Jordan Usher from Southern California and 5-11 guard Bubba Parham from VMI, both of whom hail from the Atlanta area and were successful with their former schools. Usher, a former 4-star high school prospect, averaged more than eight points a game last year at USC, while Parham, an All-Southern Conference selection, led the SoCon in scoring at 21.4 points per game. Parham was granted immediate eligibility by the NCAA. Usher, who enrolled at Tech last January, becomes eligible for the Jackets' Dec. 18 game against Ball State. The Jackets also signed an all-state high school guard from South Carolina in 6-5 Asanti Price.

Beefing up - With a more veteran team in 2019-20, Tech made an effort to strengthen its non-conference schedule, beginning a two-game series with Kentucky and finishing another two-game set with Arkansas, while accepting an invitation to play in the Diamond Head Classic, in which the Jackets faced a 2019 NCAA Tournament team in Houston. Tech also played its annual meeting against Georgia and the Big Ten/ACC matchup against Nebraska.

Building Depth

The upward progress of Georgia Tech's program is evident in the development of its last two classes, each of whom has played significant minutes and made significant contributions on the ACC level. Though not highly-rated in terms of rankings, the players have a wide range of skills and are developing into consistent conference-level performers for the next couple of years.

a. The 2017-18 class of Jose Alvarado, Evan Cole and Moses Wright combined to start 54 games last season, contributing 20.7 points, 8.7 rebounds and 57.5 minutes per game.

b. The 2018-19 class of Michael Devoe, Khalid Moore and Kristian Sjolund combined to start 37 games last season, contributing 15.7 points, 5.4 rebounds and 54.4 minutes.

c. James Banks III, who transferred from Texas, took just 23 games to eclipse his two-year totals at Texas, averaging 10.5 points and 7.7 rebounds and leading the ACC in blocked shots (2.52 per game).

Five-Star Player Development

Notable player development successes over the past three seasons include Josh Okogie, Ben Lammers, Tadic Jackson, Abdoulaye Gueye, James Banks III and Moses Wright, who maximized their skill sets and their production under the current coaching staff.

Okogie went from being ranked 11th in the state as a HS senior to a first-round NBA draft pick. In the last two seasons, Gueye, a 6-9 forward, developed from a project player into an ACC-level contributor. Banks, a 6-9 center, exceeded his two-year totals at Texas in just 23 games and led the ACC in blocked shots. Graduate transfer Brandon Alston had similar statistical numbers at the ACC level as he compiled in two seasons at Lehigh. Wright blossomed at the end of the 2018-19 season and averaged more than 15 points and six rebounds, tripling his season scoring average and doubling his rebound norm.

Jackets' Newcomer Class

• **David Didenko**, a 6-9, 232-pound forward originally from Yakutsk, Russia, attended Boca Raton Community High School before enrolling at Palm Beach State, a junior college in Boca Raton, for the 2018-19 academic year. A full academic qualifier in high school, Didenko enrolled at Tech in the summer and has three years of eligibility with the Yellow Jackets. Didenko moved to the United States in 2010, at the age of 11. Prior to his enrollment at Boca Raton, Didenko attended Northeast High School as a junior, and Montverde Academy for his ninth- and 10th-grade years.

• **Bubba Parham**, a 5-10 transfer from VMI, received NCAA approval waiving his required year of residency on Sept. 11 and has two seasons of eligibility at Georgia Tech. A native of Snellville, Ga., Parham attended Brookwood High School, transferred to Tech in June after two standout seasons at VMI in Lexington, Va., where he earned second-team All-South Conference honors in 2018-19 and was named the conference's Freshman of the Year in 2017-18. Last season,

Parham led the Southern Conference with 21.4 points per game, scoring 30 points or more nine times.

• **Asanti Price**, a 6-5, 177-pound guard from Columbia, S.C., and W.J. Keenan High School, signed with Tech in the spring. Rated a three-star prospect and ranked No. 74 among shooting guards nationally in the 247Sports composite rankings, Price led W.J. Keenan High school with 17.9 points per game and was considered one of the top shooters in the area during the 2018-19 season.

• **Jordan Usher**, a 6-7, 225-pound forward, transferred from Southern California and enrolled at Tech last January after playing a season and a half for the Trojans. A former 4-star prospect from Canton, Ga., Usher played in all 36 games with two starts for the Trojans as a freshman in 2017-18, averaging 4.8 points and 2.0 rebounds per game while connecting on 40.9 percent of his three-point field goal attempts. In 2018-19, Usher played in 12 games and made two starts, averaging 8.6 points and 3.7 rebounds.

Wire-to-Wire

Though he has expanded his bench to reflect the growing level of talent within the program, head coach Josh Pastner remains committed to a tight playing rotation, reminiscent of the way Bobby Cremins coached the Yellow Jackets over his 19 seasons.

This season, Tech's reserves have played 26.5 percent of the minutes (No. 275 in the nation), up from the 23.6 percent they played during ACC games last season.

Jose Alvarado and Michael Devoe rank No. 9 and 11, respectively, in the ACC in minutes in conference games. Last season, Alvarado and Devoe both ranked among the ACC's top 10 and combined for eight 40-minute games. Alvarado has posted 15 40-minute games in his career.

Tech 4-0 in Summer Tour of Spain

Georgia Tech went 4-0 in its seven-day August tour of Spain, winning two games each in Barcelona and Madrid against a collection of players from Spanish professional leagues.

The tour took place from August 8-16, coinciding with the break between summer and fall academic terms. The Yellow Jackets spent the first three days in Barcelona, took a high-speed train to Madrid, where they stayed three more days.

The Yellow Jackets won their four games by an average of 19.8 points, the closest game being an 87-83 win in the final contest, and averaged 93 points per game while working to play an up-tempo style.

Tech shot 55.8 percent from the floor overall, 34.5 percent from three-point range while hitting an average of 10.5 three-pointers per game.

The Jackets' top three-point shooters in the tour were Jose Alvarado (8-of-16), Shembari Phillips (6-of-12) and Michael Devoe (8-of-19).

Along with the basketball competition, the Yellow Jackets visited the professional soccer facilities of FC Barcelona and Real Madrid, and the La Sagrada Familia basilica in Barcelona among other activities.

Tech has made summer international tours twice previously, most recently to The Bahamas in 2015. The Jackets traveled to France in August of 1991.

Winning Starts at Home

Georgia Tech and head coach Josh Pastner have made a priority of making McCamish Pavilion a real homecourt advantage for the program, and the Yellow Jackets made a good start on that by setting a program record for wins at home (17) in 2017-18, which included a 7-2 ACC record and two NIT victories.

Tech is 20-15 against ACC teams at home under Pastner, and that includes a 6-8 mark against ranked opponents.

Tech is 48-20 at McCamish Pavilion under Pastner, 91-50 since the building opened for the 2012-13 season.

Jackets Sign Three in Early Period

Georgia Tech filled all three of its available scholarships during the early signing period, signing four-star 7-1 center **Saba Gigiberia**, three-star 6-2 guard **Tristan Maxwell** and four-star 6-9 forward **Jordan Meka**.

Gigiberia, originally from Tbilisi in the Republic of Georgia, attended Prolific Preparatory School in Napa, Calif., after a year at Findlay Prep in Las Vegas, Nev. He has represented Georgia in the FIBA U16 and U18 European Championships.

Meka, originally from Yaounde, Cameroon, has attended Mt. Bethel Christian Academy in Marietta, Ga., since ninth grade, and has made all-state teams the last three years and is the school's all-time leading scorer, rebounder and shot-blocker.

Maxwell, the son of 13-year NBA veteran Vernon Maxwell, led class 4A in three-point shooting last season at North Mecklenburg High School in Huntersville, N.C. He is the school's all-time leading three-point shooter and is nearing the school's all-time scoring record.

Three Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters

Since 1982, Georgia Tech has produced 19 first-round NBA draft picks and 46 draft picks overall. A total of 38 Georgia Tech alumni have played in the NBA.

Four former Georgia Tech basketball stars are currently on NBA rosters, including guard **Josh Okogie**, who was drafted 20th overall by the Minnesota Timberwolves in 2018 and is in his second season with the team.

Thaddeus Young, a 12-year NBA veteran, finished three full seasons with the Indiana Pacers in 2019 after playing seven seasons in Philadelphia, one in Minnesota and two in Brooklyn. He signed with the Chicago Bulls during the off-season.

Derrick Favors emerged as a key figure in his nine seasons with the Utah Jazz, but became a free agent after the 2018-19 season and signed with the New Orleans Pelicans.

Iman Shumpert, an eight-year NBA veteran who went in the first round of the NBA draft to New York in 2011, signed with his fifth team, the Brooklyn Nets, last month, but was released on Dec. 11.

Arts and Letters

Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer of 2011, every four-year senior in the Georgia Tech program has graduated, with the exception of the Yellow Jackets' 2018 two seniors, who are both expected to return and complete their degrees this summer after a year of pro ball overseas.

Graduate student Brandon Alston (economics), fifth-year senior Abdoulaye Gueye (business administration) and fourth-year junior Sylvester Ogbonda (business administration) all will complete their course work this semester and receive their degrees in May.

Georges-Hunt and Jackson made the Academic All-ACC team twice, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball team has recorded the highest Academic Progress Report scores the last five years since the NCAA began tracking academic performance in 2004-05. The Jackets scored a perfect team single year APR score of 1000 three straight years from 2011-13.

Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech is playing its seventh season in McCamish Pavilion, which was essentially brand new when it opened for the 2012-13 season. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most impressive features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which concentrates light on the court while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

20-Game ACC Schedule Rotation

Beginning this season, the Atlantic Coast Conference has implemented a 20-game schedule for all its teams and announced a rotation that will carry the league through the next three seasons (through the 2021-22 season).

Each team plays its two primary rivals every season both home and away (four games - Clemson and Notre Dame remain Georgia Tech's primary home-and-away opponents) and four rotating opponents both home and away (eight games). The remaining eight opponents will be single games, four at home and four on the road. The full cycle of repeat opponents will be complete following the third year.

Under the former 18-game schedule, each team played four opponents both home and away each season, four at home and four away.

In 2019-20, Georgia Tech is playing Louisville, NC State, Pittsburgh and Syracuse both home and away in addition to Clemson and Notre Dame, with Duke, Miami, Virginia and Virginia Tech visiting McCamish Pavilion.

In 2020-21, Tech's home-and-away opponents will be Clemson, Notre Dame, Duke, Florida State, Virginia and Wake Forest, with home games against Boston, North Carolina, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.

In 2021-22, the Yellow Jackets play Clemson, Notre Dame, Boston College, Miami, North Carolina and Virginia Tech both home and on the road, and will host Florida State, Louisville, NC State and Wake Forest.

Tech's NCAA Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in the NCAA Tournament 16 times in its history. Fifteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present, 10 under head coach Bobby Cremins and five under Paul Hewitt.

Tech has a record of 23-16 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were Tech's' first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-93.

Georgia Tech has won at least one game in 11 of its 16 NCAA Tournament appearances.

Tech's ACC Tournament History

Georgia Tech has played in 40 ACC Tournaments, and has a 26-37 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won three championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte) and 1993 (Charlotte).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro. Tech also made the finals in 2005 at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including all three titles), 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010), 2-5 under Brian Gregory, and 0-3 under Josh Pastner.

BIO UPDATES

Head Coach Josh Pastner • 4th season

After guiding Memphis to five post-season berths in seven seasons as the Tigers' head coach, Josh Pastner became Georgia Tech's 14th head basketball coach on April 8, 2016.

Implementing a high-energy style of play and creative offensive and defensive schemes, and building the Jackets' talent base for the future, Pastner has tirelessly promoted the program on campus and throughout the city of Atlanta in an effort to re-create the major homecourt atmosphere that surrounded the Yellow Jackets throughout the 1980s, 1990s and into the middle of the 2000s. The result has been numerous wins, high excitement and 12 sellouts in three seasons at McCamish Pavilion.

Two of his players - guard Josh Okogie and Ben Lammers - have earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors before moving on to the professional ranks. Okogie, in particular, developed from an under-the-radar high school prospect into a highly-regarded NBA rookie, having been selected 20th in the 2018 NBA Draft.

In his first season at the helm, his Yellow Jacket team defied all pre-season expectations by reaching the post-season and advancing to the finals of the National Invitation Tournament. Tech earned victories over No. 9 North Carolina, No. 6 Florida State and No. 14 Notre Dame (later vacated by the NCAA Committee on Infractions), who all finished among the top four in the ACC regular season. He was named Coach of the Year in the ACC and in NABC District 2.

Two of his players earned all-Atlantic Coast Conference honors; junior center Ben Lammers was named second-team All-ACC and ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman guard Josh Okogie was named to the ACC All-Freshman team.

Though hampered by several significant injuries and other issues in 2017-18, Tech still was able to knock off a pair of top-25 teams while Lammers and Okogie again earned conference honors, and Okogie developed into an NBA first-round draft choice. In 2018-19, the Yellow jackets picked up three significant road wins - at Arkansas, Syracuse and NC State, each of whom made post-season play - and center James Banks III was named to the ACC's All-Defensive team.

Pastner, 43, compiled a 167-73 record over seven seasons as the head coach at Memphis, where the Tigers earned bids to the NCAA Tournament four times. He tied for the 10th most wins for a head coach in his first seven seasons in Division I basketball history, and was the second winningest active coach under the age of 40 in NCAA Division I at the time.

Despite his young age, Pastner has been involved in basketball at the Division I level for 21 years, as a player and an assistant coach at Arizona, and as an assistant coach and the head coach at Memphis. He has been a part of teams that have won 524 games, played in 17 NCAA Tournaments and 19 total post-season events. Teams he has been involved with have won 12 conference tournament or regular-season championships, advanced to seven Sweet Sixteens, five Elite Eights, two Final Fours and two NCAA championship games.

As an NCAA head or assistant coach and an AAU head coach, he has coached nearly 25 NBA draft selections.

Pastner's Memphis teams averaged 23.9 wins per season and compiled a conference regular-season record of 82-36, including a conference winning streak of 28 games. The Tigers went 11-4 in Conference USA and American Athletic Conference tournaments, including three championships.

He guided Memphis to five post-season berths, the NIT in 2010 and the NCAA Tournament in 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014. Pastner twice won Conference USA Coach of the Year honors (2010, 2013) by various organizations and news media.

Pastner was born in Glen Dale, W.Va., and grew up in Kingwood, Texas. He earned his bachelor's degree in family studies in December of 1998, in just two and a half years, from Arizona and his master's degree in teaching and teacher education from Arizona in December of 1999, all while lettering four years in basketball under head coach Lute Olson.

He married the former Kerri Lamas of Sierra Vista, Ariz., in 2009. He has a stepson (Ethan) and three daughters, Payten, Kamryn and Harper.

ERIC REVENO

Associate Head Coach • 4th year at Tech

Eric Reveno, who served 10 years as the head coach at the University of Portland, joined Josh Pastner's men's basketball staff in May, 2016. He was promoted to associate head coach on Nov. 1, 2019.

The former post player oversaw one of the Yellow Jackets' great successes in 2016-17 in the development of 6-10 center Ben Lammers, who became a second-team All-ACC performer and the conference's Defensive Player of the Year. He also helped develop another former reserve forward, Abdoulaye Gueye, into a significant contributor for the Yellow Jackets in his final two seasons, and helped transfer James Banks III develop into one of the ACC's top defensive players in 2018-19, making the ACC's All-Defensive team.

Reveno's penchant for analytics has led to partnering the Jackets with advance technology systems to help the team's performance, such as the Noah shot-tracking system which was installed in both the Zelnak Practice Facility and the main floor at McCamish Pavilion. In addition to recruiting and on-court coaching, Reveno also handles budget management and game scheduling for the program.

Reveno and his wife, Amanda, have two children: Katie (16) and Andrew (13).

JULIAN SWARTZ

Assistant Coach • 4th year at Tech

A 16-year coaching veteran, including 10 years on the NCAA Division I level, Julian Swartz was named an assistant coach on Josh Pastner's staff in August of 2018.

Swartz, 39, is responsible for on-court development of Tech players and focuses his efforts on the Yellow Jackets' defensive schemes as well as handle recruiting responsibilities. He helped guide Tech's defense to a national ranking of No. 37 in efficiency in 2018-19, according to KenPom.com, and the Yellow Jackets also ranked among the top 15 in effective field goal percentage and three-point defense.

One of two members of head coach Pastner's staff at Memphis to follow him to Georgia Tech, Swartz came to The Flats in May, 2016, after four years with Pastner at Memphis, where he served stints as assistant director of operations, director of player development and interim assistant coach. He served his first two years at Tech as director of recruiting and compliance, which included serving as the staff liaison with compliance, coordinating on-campus recruiting operations and summer camps.

ANTHONY WILKINS

Assistant Coach • 2nd year at Tech

Anthony Wilkins, an Atlanta native who spent the past five seasons on the coaching staff at Tulane University, joined Georgia Tech's basketball staff in June of 2018.

Wilkins, 39, served as an assistant coach for four seasons at Tulane under two head coaches -- Ed Conroy and Mike Dunleavy - after serving as director of basketball operations during his first year with the Green Wave. At Tulane, Wilkins handled game strategy and scout prep responsibilities along with player development and recruiting duties. He also had six years of professional playing experience prior to entering the coaching world.

Focusing his on-court efforts with Tech's offense, the Yellow Jackets made significant strides toward the end of his first season on The Flats, and he is credited with the development of sophomore forward Moses Wright, who averaged more than 15 points and shot 62 percent from the floor over his last five games.

Born in Atlanta, Wilkins lived in the city for much of his childhood and attended Therrell High School for two years before finishing his high school studies at Glenville High School in Cleveland, Ohio.
