RJC PRODUCES FOUR STANDOUTS

During 1981 the RJC football team produced four juco All-Americans. Dan Sharp of Boerne, made his two years of football worthwhile, for he was named All-American for the second time. The 221 lb. sophomore recorded 47 receptions for 892 yards and eleven touchdowns.

Mike Surovik from Port Lavaca, was named honorable mention All-American. His five interceptions as a defensive back combined for 153 yds. in returns.

Anchoring the offensive line from Rochester, Tex. was Bobby Easterling, a 6' 3", 270 lb. tackle, who has given the offensive backfield steady protection for the past two seasons.

Melvin Ray was elected honorable mention for his superior play and quickness. As a punt return specialist, his statistics include 14 punt returns for 401 yds. and 9 kickoff returns for 222 yds. His season was also highlighted by a 101 yd. kickoff return against the University of Nueva Leon, Mexico.

These four All-Americans helped the Rangers to compile a 7-2-1 season.

HOOP IT UP FOR WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

RJC's RangeAnns, through trial and tribulation, have been ranked third in conference with a 5-4 record.

Beginning the first half of Conference play, the team got off to a good start with victories for the first two games against TSTI and SWCC. Three defeats in a row against Cisco, Weatherford and Cooke didn't get the ladies down. The RangeAnns turned around and beat number two ranked MCC. The fourth loss came from Grayson.

Second half action started out with two wins chalked up. RangeAnns are prepared for the tough competition that lies ahead and plan to "turn the tables" on the upcoming games that started out as defeats.

"Our main objective," states Coach Ron Butler, "is to finish the conference ranked in one of the top three positions; this will set the team in a good seed for the Regional Tournament."

WOMEN'S TRACK

"This is the year for the women's track team," says Coach Dan Smalley.

Twenty-one women are actively conditioning and preparing for the spring track season.

The opening meet will be the Rambelle Relays at Angelo State University March 4.

TRACKSTERS GEARING UP

Coach Johnny Gann is looking forward to another rewarding track season.

In the previous season, as head track coach, Gann sent 23 athletes to the national meet. The tracksters were also Texas Jr. College champs last year.

Coach Gann is waiting for his first chance to see his team compete at the Porder Olympics March 5-6, where they are defending champs.

ROUNDBALLERS ANTICIPATE SEASON FINALE

The first half of the basketball season is history, with Ranger 6-2 and one game behind the conference leader McKennon Community College.

Thomas Holman is the leading scorer for Ranger with a 16 point average from the field. Holman is also shooting 85% from the free-throw line. Other top percentages from the line are Kevin Phillips with 89% and Maurice Dorsey with 82%.

Mike Bell is the leading rebounder in conference with 11 a game. Mike Loerch follows in the rebounding category. Phillips is a top conference rebounder too.

Ranger ended the first round with a 6-2 record with victories over TSTI, 60-58; Cisco, 85-76; Weatherford, 81-72; Cooke, 49-47; Northwood, 62-57; and Grayson, 68-52. The two defeats came from SWCC, 72-81; and MCC, 65-70.

The second half started with a victory over TSTI. Maurice Dorsey took scoring honors with 22. Mike Bell maintained his season average of 11 rebounds.

Ranger's football team is in full swing with their off season weight and conditioning program.

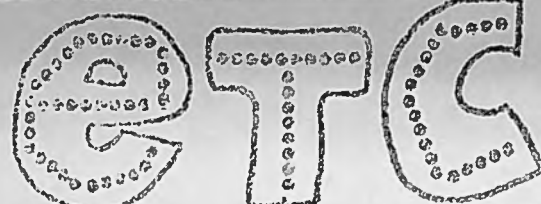
