The Ranger football team started the season with a 24-0 shut-out against Henderson County last Sat., Sept. 11.

Bryan Rosenblum completed a 45 yd. pass to Lamar Landrum for the first score of the game.

Tommy Thornton ran for the next score from 5 yds. out. This score was set up by a 45 yd. pass from Rosenblum to Dirk Davis.

Al Blackman scored the last touchdown with a 50 yd. interception return.

David May accounted for the last score with a 37 yd. field goal.

Vince Oldag converted all extra points.

Standouts on defense were Blackman, James Krebbs, and Tim Moriarity.

RANGERS TROMP TSU

RJC football team scrimmaged TSU Wed., Sept. 1, coming out on top 14-0.

The Rangers began their offensive moves with a 17 yd. run by Jeff Crumedy with Brad Galbraith kicking the extra point. Ranger was on top 7-0.

Defensive moves included an interception from Jack Landers in the 3rd quarter. "The entire defense looked impressive. Many newcomers played well," reported Coach Gann.

The final scoring came from a 64 yd. run drive in the 3rd quarter by Kirk Ingram. The extra point was made by Rudy Lopez, making the final score Ranger 14, Tarleton 0.
