# A Black Fact...



*Jessie Jackson* was the first black man to make a serious bid for the presidency of the United States.

*Ralph Bunche* was the first black man to win the Nobel Peace Prize.

*Huey P. Newton* and *Bobby G. Seale* founded the militant Black Panthers party which guarded ghetto areas with guns and law books to protect Negroes from police harassment.

*James Derham* was the first black doctor.

*Madame C.J. Walker* created the first straightening comb.

*George Washington Carver* produced 300 products from the peanut ranging from instant coffee to soap and ink. He also developed 118 products from the sweet potato (flour, shoe polish, and candy) and 75 products from the pecan.

*Constance Baker* was the first black woman federal judge in New York (1966).

*Luclius Anderson* was the first black sheriff since the Reconstruction.

*Shirley Chisholm* was the first black woman in the U.S. House of Representatives.

*Thurgood Marshall* was the first black justice on the Supreme Court.

**FOOTBALL:** William H. Lewis was the first black All American in 1892.

**BASKETBALL:** The basketball color line was broken in 1951 with the signing of Chuck Cooper by the Boston Celtics. Bill Russel was the first black basketball coach.

**TRACK:** In the year 1963 and following, Bob Hayes was known as the "World's Fastest Human". He set a world record in the 100 yard dash in 9.1 seconds.

**BASEBALL:** On April 10, 1947, Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier in major league baseball. He later was named Rookie of the Year.
