TL;DR, You can use Rasa X CE to build AI assistants for commercial or non-commercial purposes and host it for your own project. More details below.

What is the new Rasa X Community Edition (CE) License?

With Rasa X Community Edition, Rasa is launching a new tool to deploy and improve Rasa-powered assistants by learning from real conversations. Unlike Rasa (previously Rasa NLU and Rasa Core or Rasa Stack) Rasa X CE is not open source but is available at no charge.

Is Rasa X CE Open Source?

Our framework is open source licensed under Apache 2.0 Rasa X CE is not open source but free of charge.



What can and can't I do with Rasa X CE under this license?

You can:

- Use Rasa X to build AI assistants for commercial or non-commercial purposes
- Host it for your own project.

You can't:

- Host it for other parties (like SaaS).
- Decompile it.
- Change the code.

How does that affect Rasa's open source libraries?

It doesn't. Rasa remains open source under the Apache 2.0 license.

How does Rasa (the company) make money?

We wrote about this <u>here</u>.

What is a permitted commercial purpose?

Permitted use for Rasa X CE is in connection with a Rasa-based AI assistant that is built for commercial purposes. For example, you have an assistant for online shopping with which you make money. To improve the bot, you use Rasa X CE.

What is not permitted is if you would make money only with Rasa X CE, for example, if you would host it for other parties and charge them for it.
