Mesa Prieta is covered in petroglyphs, most of which are believed to have been etched of a 300-year period by the Native Americans that settled the area around 1300 A.D., though, 1,000's of images are believed to go back approximately 5,000 years to the Western Archaic People. Also found, are Clovis Points showing activity around 10,000 years ago.

There have been over 60,000 surveyed and recorded and the estimate is that there will be upwards of 100,000 once cataloging is complete.

Recording and surveying at Mesa Prieta started in 2002 and has been well documented.

Additional contiguous acreage might be available.

Metal Projectile Point


One of 35 Historic Period artifacts found

Tests indicated the iron was probably made in Mexico and traded.


Iron may have originally been used in water or storage barrel stays.
