PROPERTY OVERVIEW




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PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

Bridge Street, located just across the Grand River from downtown GR's Medical Mile, is the gateway to the city's West Side neighborhood. An influx of investment in the past decade or so has transformed once abandoned and neglected buildings into some of the city's trendiest restaurants and nightspots- and given rise to the Bridge Street Entertainment District. Yet residents also value their history, and some of the businesses have been operating for generations.

Bridge Street is a 10-minute walk from downtown's Devos Place Convention Center and it's stop on the city's FREE Downtown Area Shuttle (DASH) route. Street parking is limited but there are four city parking lots and a number of private lots just steps away.




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
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
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
