

Proposed Site Plan - Approved by Orange Beach (2022) for 167 RV Pads









ALABAMA'S TOP METROS FOR WAGE GROWTH (2012-2022)










POPULATION GROWTH (2010-2022)



BALDWIN COUNTY ANNUAL NET DOMESTIC IN-MIGRATION











PRIME-AGE LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE







BALDWIN COUNTY TOTAL EMPLOYMENT




TOP INDUSTRIES FOR WAGE GROWTH IN BALDWIN COUNTY









PROJECTED TOTAL POPULATION GROWTH BY ALABAMA COUNTY (2020-2030)




PROJECTED POPULATION GROWTH BY ALABAMA METRO AREA (2020-2030)


