

Editor's note—Ord. No. 681, § 1, adopted Apr. 8, 1981, was included as superseding the former provisions of the chapter, derived from Ord. Nos. 462, 546, 632, an 679. Subsequently, Ord. No. 850, adopted Apr. 24, 1991, repealed Ord. No. 681 and added new §§ 18-1—18-4, 18-15—18-24.

ARTICLE I. - IN GENERAL

Sec. 18-1. - Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter, certain terms and words as used herein are defined as follows:

Streets, avenues, roads, or any similar designation all mean the same for the general purpose of this chapter.

Subdivision means the division of a tract, or parcel of land into two (2) or more lots, plots, parcels, or building sites, any one of which has an area of less than three (3) acres; for the purpose of sale or building development, either immediate or future.

Sec. 18-2. - Submittal of plat of survey prerequisite to dedication of streets of a subdivision.

It shall be necessary for any person, firm, corporation or association of persons who desires to dedicate the streets of a subdivision outside the corporate limits of any incorporated city, town or municipality to first present a plat of survey or map showing the outline of streets, roads, public alleys or thoroughfares contemplated in said subdivision so that the police jury may study said plat or outline of streets, roads, public alleys and thoroughfares before the same are dedicated to public use and accepted as public servitudes by this police jury.

Sec. 18-3. - Reserved.

Editor's note— Ord. No. 2252, adopted Sept. 10, 2014, repealed former § 18-3 in its entirety which pertained to an exemption for roads which do not form part of a subdivision and derived from Ord. No. 850, adopted April 24, 1991.

Sec. 18-4. - Inspection.

When the person, firm, corporation or association of persons described in <u>section 18-2</u> of this chapter has complied with the provisions of sections <u>18-2</u>, <u>18-15</u> and <u>18-16</u> of this chapter, the parish police jury shall appoint a committee to inspect said subdivision and make a report to the jury at their next meeting so that the jury may accept said subdivision for recordation in the clerk of court and ex officio recorder for the parish's office.
