WHAT THE FX747 DOES

The FX747 Supersonic Stereo Flanger is DOD's newest answer to an old argument: "To flange or not to flange?" The FX747 speed or MACH control has an extended range allowing it to flange slower than any other flanger made. This allows you to play "into" the effect, rather than "with" the effect. Give your quitar or bass a full on, jet-like sound, or just take a spacev trip into the ozone.

CONNECTING THE FX747

Connect your guitar to the input of the FX747. Connect the OUTPUT of the FX747 to your amp (or to the input of another effects device). Connect the STEREO OUT to a stereo amp, or connect it to a stereo effects device. To eliminate the need for a 9volt battery, attach the DOD PS200R to the AC adapter jack. The PS200R is a regulated supply that will not allow hum into the pedal.

CONTROLS

PAYLOAD: PAYLOAD controls the amount of flance level when the effect is on. Turn it down for a very subtle effect. Turn it up for a deeper and more defined sound.

MACH: MACH determines how fast the flance is moving. If you like things drastically slow, turn it down. If you want to fly supersonic, turn it up.

ALTITUDE: ALTITUDE controls how far and how wide the flange changes. Turn it down for a little change, turn it up and you will hear just how extreme wide your quitar will sound. CAUTION: WHEN RUNNING IN STEREO. THE FX747 HAS BEEN KNOWN TO DRIVE PEOPLE INTO THEIR LOCAL AIR RAID OR BOMB SHELTER. PLEASE HANDLE WITH CARE.

THRUST: THRUST controls the amount of regeneration in the flange sound. If you want your guitar to take on a more bizarre or "jet" sound, turn it up. Turn it down, and the signal sounds like it's under water.

FOOTSWITCH: Switches the flange effect in or out of the signal path.

LED INDICATOR: Lights when the flange is enabled, and is not lit when the flange is bypassed

JACKS: Input, Output, Stereo Out, AC Adapter (use the DOD PS200R power supply only to eliminate the need for a 9 volt battery).

OPERATION OF THE FX747

The FX747 can be operated in front of an amplifier or in an effects loop. Since the order of the effects is very important, they should be ordered as follows: 1) compression effects (DOD FX84), 2) Wah/volume and envelope filters (DOD FX17, FX25), 3) Distortion effects or preamps (DOD FX51, FX69), 4) EQ's (DOD FX40), 5) chorus, flanging, phasing, vibrato (DOD FX64, FX75, FX20, FX747), 6) Delay and reverb effects (DOD DFX94).


To set up your own sound with the FX747, set all controls at 12 o'clock. Then adjust the MACH and ALTITUDE controls for the desired speed and width Next adjust the PAYLOAD control for the desired amount of effect. Finally, dial in the flange regeneration by adjusting the THRUST control.

With the FX747 you will not have one of those laid back flange sounds, tell the neighbors that everything is OK, and let yourself fall victim of the mesmerizing sounds you can produce. Try keeping a warning sign outside your door stating: "Do not enter-Classified Air Force experimentation area." At gigs hand out plenty of earplugs at the door and break the sonic barrier.

On the following pages, some examples of different types of sounds are described, along with graphic representations of how to set the knobs. Since good (or bad) quitar sounds are a subjective matter, use these examples as starting points to create your own sounds that meet your specific tastes, or lack there-




Use this setting when you need a good, slow flange. Turn the PAYLOAD up, the MACH down, the ALTI-TUDE up and the THRUST down. When used after distortion it sounds like there's an air raid coming to shutdown the gig. Also, for another twist of madness, use this setting on the board and run the drums through it. (Thanks Joe).




SPACEY U.F.F. (UNIDENTIFIED FLYING FLANGE)

If the need for aliens to land in your bedroom arises follow these simple instructions: Turn the PAYLOAD, MACH and THRUST controls up, set the ALTITUDE to 12 o'clock. Take your sound to the outer limits. Add plenty of springy reverb and you've got yourself the sound for a 60's surf/space song.



FLANGE BEFORE THE AMP

Do you like the sound of a flange before a overdriven tube head? If so set the controls as follows: PAYLOAD and MACH to 12 o'clock. ALTITUDE up and THRUST to 3 o'clock. This setting colors the quitar's sound. Adjusting the MACH control will regulate the frequency of the "tone changes."



OUT OF CONTROL FLANGE FOR THE PLAYING IMPAIRED

This setting is used as a special effect for solos. vocals, etc. If you suffer from motion sickness, don't try this. To do this, turn all controls up. That's it, plain and simple, just let it go completely insane.
