

We are able to provide assistance in completing restraining order documents, explain the process and answer questions, assist with the filing of appropriate documents, and accompany you to court on the day of your hearing. Staff are NOT attorneys or paralegals and will not give legal advice. Failure to complete our internal questionnaire thoroughly may cause a delay in the processing of paperwork.

GLOSSARY of TERMS

Civil Harassment Restraining Order (CH RO): A civil harassment restraining order is a court order that helps protect people from violence, stalking, serious harassment, or threats of violence from a person other than a relative, former, or current significant other.

Family Law Domestic Violence Restraining Order (DV RO): A domestic violence restraining order is a court order that helps protect people from abuse or threats of abuse from someone they have a close relationship with (i.e. married or registered domestic partners, divorced or separated, dating or used to date, living together or used to live together, parents together of a child, or closely related).

Intimate Partner Violence: Intimate Partner Violence is threatened, attempted, or completed physical or sexual violence or emotional abuse by a current or former intimate partner. A pattern of behavior that is designed to exert power and control over an intimate partner.

Intimate Partner: An intimate partner can be a current or ex-spouse, a current or former boyfriend or girlfriend, or dating partner, a person who shares a child in common, or a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.

RISE Advocate: A RISE staff or volunteer acting as a certified crisis counselor (in compliance with California Evidence Code 1035.2 et, seq.) available to provide emotional support to survivors of sexual assault, sexual abuse, and intimate partner violence.

Sexual Assault/Abuse: The sexual exploitation, forcible penetration, or any type of sexual contact on the body of another person, male or female, without his or her freely given explicit consent.

Sexual Harassment: Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature that creates hostile or offensive work, professional, or social situation.
