


Using Glose for Education with Microsoft Teams





✔ **Step 1** of 7 :

Log in to your Microsoft account and click on the Classroom you wish to add Glose for Education to. Click the '+' to find the application in the Teams Marketplace.



✔ **Step 2** of 7 :

A popup will appear asking you to sign in to Glose for Education using your Microsoft login credentials. If you do not already have a Glose for Education account, you can create one using your Microsoft login credentials.




✔ **Step 3** of 7 :

Once a classroom is linked, you will receive a message saying your classroom is ready. Click 'Save' to confirm the configuration.


✔ Step 4 of 7 :

From the Glose Education tab, you will see Activity, Dictionary, Books, and Statistics. To begin reading ebooks with your classroom, click 'Books'. From here you will be able to add a book to your classroom or schedule a reading session with your students.




✔ Step 5 of 7 :

To add a book in your classroom, click on 'Go to Glose Education'. This will redirect you to Glose.education where you can search for books, upload files, and import pages from the internet. Use the search field to find a book by author, or book title.



✔ Step 6 of 7 :

Add a book from 4,000 classic (free) titles or from the bookstore containing over 1 million books. Once a book is selected, you will see the option to read it with your Microsoft Teams classroom.




Choose who you're going to read with
