
# Spartan Coaching Staff



San Jose State head coach Oscar Crespo begins his second season as head coach at his alma mater. A 1990 graduate, Crespo was named head coach in March of 2007 as the program's sixth head coach.

In his first season, Crespo led the 2007 Spartans to a 14-15 overall record. The team upset Utah State at the Western Athletic Conference Tournament and advanced to the semifinals for the second consecutive season and the sixth time in school history. Crespo recorded his first collegiate win with a 3-0 sweep of Grambling State on August 24.

The Spartans recorded tournament wins during Crespo's first season. The team won the ASU/Bancorp South Classic and the UVU/La Quinta Inn & Suites Invitational. San Jose State defeated Pacific-10 foe Arizona State, 3-1. The team also got a jolt in its final non-conference match of the year as a 5.6 earthquake shook Spartan Gym in game two against Pacific on October 30, forcing the cancellation of the match.



His first Spartan team also collected awards throughout the season. Colleen Burke was a first team All-WAC selection, while Keri Anglin, Niki Clement, and Jennifer Senftleben were second team All-WAC honorees. Emily Burke was named to the WAC All-Freshman team. Five players also received WAC All-Academic recognition – Anglin, Kelly Crow, Nia Freeman, Thao Pham and Kristal Tsukano.

Rooted in fundamentals, Crespo believes in the well-rounded student-athlete. He wants each member of his team to be a successful student in the classroom and a solid athlete on the court.

Prior to accepting the Spartan position, Crespo spent seven years as a member of the University of Nevada volleyball coaching staff. From 2000-01, he was the Wolf Pack's assistant head coach before being promoted to associate head coach prior to the start of the 2002 season.

His primary areas of focus at Nevada were athlete training and development; opponent scouting and evaluation; recruiting; setter development; drill development and individual and team skill evaluation; development of defensive and offensive systems, and statistical analysis of individual and team play.

His recruiting expertise helped the Pack sign the 23rd-ranked volleyball recruiting class for 2006 according to PrepVolleyball.com. Crespo was instrumental in Nevada's recent success of participating in four of the last five NCAA Tournaments.


A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, USA Volleyball, and the Northern California Volleyball Association, Crespo is an accomplished coach with international experience. He spent the spring of 2002 coaching a USA College All-Star team in France, Holland and Belgium.

In the spring of 2007, Crespo was an assistant coach for the USA Volleyball Federation/Bring It Promotions (Senior) Select Team.

The USA/BIP team, which included former Spartans Jennifer Senftleben and Jessie Shull, traveled to Argentina to play the Argentinean National team as well as a few of the top club teams around Buenos Aires.

Crespo's vast coaching experience also includes stints at the University of California (1995-98), Saint Mary's College (1993-94) and De Anza College.

Crespo received a bachelor's degree in art history from San Jose State and was a member of the men's club volleyball team. Crespo and his wife, Lisa Ice-Crespo, a three-time All-American volleyball player at San Jose State, reside in Los Gatos with their three children: Ryan, Rachel and Karly Nicole.





# Spartan Coaching Staff



Former San Jose State player Jeanine Haldi begins her third season on the Spartans' staff as an assistant coach for the 2007 season. She was promoted to the top assistant this past spring after serving as the volunteer coach last year.

Haldi played for San Jose State from 1999 to 2002 and finished her four-year career with 982 digs, ranking sixth all-time. Considered the first libero in Spartan history as the position was instituted her senior year, Haldi led the 2002 team with 370 digs. She played in two NCAA Tournaments (2000 and 2001) including the 2001 upset of Santa Clara when she had eight block assists in the win.

During the 2005-06 school year, Haldi worked in the San Jose State Athletics Department as a compliance assistant while completing her master's degree at the University of San Francisco. In 2005, she worked in the University of California Athletics Department as a sponsorship intern.

Haldi is involved in the club volleyball system where she is the president, trainer and coach of Club Levile in Tracy, Calif. The club is certified by the Northern California Volleyball Association.

A three-time Scholar-Athlete, Haldi graduated from San Jose State in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and sport management. She received her master's degree from the University of San Francisco in May 2006.



Annie Feller returns to collegiate coaching this season as she joins the San Jose State volleyball staff as an assistant coach. She brings a wealth of volleyball knowledge to the Spartans.

Feller was the head coach at Santa Clara from 1993-98, where she had four winning seasons and made three NCAA tournament appearances. She recorded 20-win seasons in 1993 (22) and 1998 (20). Her team won the 1993 West Coast Conference title.


After serving as an assistant coach for three seasons (1990-92), Feller took over the head coaching duties for the 1993 seasons. Her first team posted a then-school record regular season teams and won its second straight WCC title with a 12-2 mark. That team earned a spot in AVCA/Tachikara Top 25 poll for the first time in school history, finishing the season ranked 22nd.

Prior to her stint at Santa Clara, Feller was an assistant coach at the University of Hawaii as a member of Dave Shoji's coaching staff. While coaching the Wahine, she helped Hawaii to a national runner-up finish at the 1988 NCAA Tournament. Prior to her stint in Hawaii, Feller was a graduate assistant at Syracuse for the 1987 season.

An All-American at UC Riverside, Feller led her team to the 1986 NCAA Division II National Championship and was honored as Reebok's Division II Player of the Year. A three-time CCAA first team pick, she was a 1986 Broderick Award nominee and named UC Riverside's Female Athlete of the Year in 1985 and 1986. Feller was inducted into the UC Riverside Hall of Fame in 1993.

Feller graduated from UC Riverside in 1987 with a bachelor of arts degree in psychology. She received a master of arts degree in education administration from Santa Clara in 1994. After college, Feller played professionally for Major League Volleyball's Los Angeles Starlites for the 1987 season when they won the MVL championship.

Feller resides in Saratoga with her husband Steve and their children Kevin and Adam.

# Western Athletic Conference

In its 47th year, the Western Athletic Conference continues to evolve and features some of the nation's best intercollegiate competition. One thing that remains unchanged is the persistent nature of the nine schools in the WAC to advance their programs to contend at the top levels of the NCAA.

The WAC provides its student-athletes the chance to travel to scenic destinations and gain exposure in some of the nation's most diverse markets. In addition, the WAC's student-athletes work to achieve

the highest levels of success with the academic support of their institutions.

## CONTINUED SUCCESS

The WAC has experienced tremendous success. Over the past six years, it has won 54.5 percent of its bowl games, the third best winning percentage of any conference in the nation. The WAC has sent a total of 22 teams to bowl games (12-10) in that period. Boise State has won 76 games since joining the conference, the most in the nation during that time span (2001-07). For the second year in a row, the WAC sent a team to a BCS bowl game as Hawai'i earned a Sugar Bowl bid this past season following Boise State's unforgettable victory in the 2007 Fiesta Bowl. In men's basketball, the WAC has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in 23 of the past 25 seasons. In baseball, the WAC has boasted two national champions in the past five years including Fresno State's College World Series victory in 2008. In women's sports, Fresno State softball has competed in every NCAA Tournament held, while Louisiana Tech basketball has played in all but two.

Current WAC alums have made their presence felt as well. David Carr (Fresno State) was the first player selected in the 2002 NFL Draft. Cheryl Ford (Louisiana Tech) was named the WNBA Rookie of the Year and helped the Detroit Shock win the league's championship in 2003. In 2001, the WAC partnered with ESPN for coverage of football and basketball giving the conference national exposure from one of the most respected broadcast entities in the country. The WAC officially added WAC.tv in 2006 to give fans streaming internet access to many of its postseason championships including volleyball, soccer, swimming and diving, basketball, gymnastics, softball and baseball.

## HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

The WAC is the sixth oldest among the nation's 11 Division I-A conferences. Its history traces back to July 27, 1962, when the original six-team league of Arizona, Arizona State, Brigham Young, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming began competition.

The first championship was held in November 1962, when Arizona won the men's cross country title and New Mexico followed with the first WAC football title. Arizona finished second in the NCAA College World Series and, less than three years later, Arizona State claimed the league's first NCAA title when the Sun Devils won the College World Series trophy. Fresno State was the last WAC school to earn an NCAA team title when it won the College World Series in 2008.

Since the WAC's inception, several changes have occurred. UTEP and Colorado State became members in September 1967, while Arizona and Arizona State withdrew on June 30, 1978. The WAC then added San Diego State (1978), Hawai'i (1979) and Air Force (1980). Before 1990, the WAC sponsored championships only in men's sports. However, a merger with the High Country Athletic Conference formed a single conference under one administrative structure, and the 1990-91 athletic year was the first in which both men and women competed under the WAC name. Fresno State was added in 1992, and then in 1996, the women's programs from Air Force and Hawai'i along with six new schools, including San Jose State, came into the WAC. Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State, UNLV, New Mexico, San Diego State, Utah and Wyoming withdrew on June 30, 1999. Nevada (2000), Boise State (2001) and Louisiana Tech (2001) were added following the 2000-01 season. The current membership was established on July 1, 2005, when Idaho, New Mexico State and Utah State joined the WAC after four schools withdrew.

## WAC CHAMPIONS

Presently, the WAC crowns team and individual champions in 19 sports – eight men's and 11 women's. For the men, there are championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field.

Championships for women are held in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and volleyball.



## 1999 San Jose State Sports Hall of Fame Lisa Ice-Crespo, 1983-87 One of 13 Inaugural Inductees

Lisa was one of 13 inducted into the San José State University Sports Hall of Fame on November 5, 1999. She was a 1986 First Team All-American and 1985 Second Team All-American. In 1987, she was honored with the NCAA Top Six Award. Lisa was a member of the 1983 U.S. Olympic Festival Gold Medal Team. She is the San José State career leader in hitting percentage at .317. She previously held the match record for most digs at 38.

# San Jose State University



Located at the core of Silicon Valley, San José State University is an exceptional place for hands-on learning, professional development and personal growth. From an award-winning faculty and high-achieving students to cutting-edge programs and growing collaborations with the community and the corporate world, SJSU is on the move as it meets the challenges of the 21st century.

Known for the high quality of its academic programs, its excellent faculty (87 percent hold doctorates or the highest degrees in their academic disciplines), and its diverse and committed student body, San José State successfully educates students to compete in today's complex, high tech and global economy.

For the past six years, San José State has been ranked among the top ten masters-level public universities in the West by U.S. News & World Report's survey of "America's Best Colleges." In the 2006 survey, the College of Engineering is ranked 14th among the

nation's Best Undergraduate Engineering Programs (in addition, electrical engineering ranks 11th; civil engineering, 16th; mechanical engineering, 16th).

San José State is the number one supplier of education, engineering, computer science and business graduates to Silicon Valley, the world's high tech capital. The oldest and one of the largest universities in the 23-campus California State University (CSU) sys-



tem, SJSU attracts students from throughout California, the United States and 100 countries of the world.

Located in the nation's 10th and California's third largest city, San José State had a fall 2005 enrollment of 29,975 students. Approximately 75 percent of the students were undergraduates; 25 percent were graduate students. Almost 59 percent of the student population had an ethnic affiliation. More than 100 different languages are spoken on campus.

Founded in 1857, SJSU is the oldest public institution of higher education on the West Coast. From its beginnings as a normal school to train teachers, the campus has matured into a comprehensive university offering 134 bachelors' and masters' degrees.

San José State is one of the largest public-sector employers in Silicon Valley, with about 2,500 full-time employees and an annual budget of \$472 million (2005-06).

Some 7,862 bachelors' and masters' degrees were awarded in 2005-06 — continuing to support the region by supplying Silicon Valley with more graduates at the baccalaureate and masters' levels than any other school in the nation.



## Jon Whitmore President

Dr. Jon S. Whitmore was named President of San Jose State University in April 2008 with a start date in August 2008.

Dr. Whitmore, whose Ph.D. is from the University of California, Santa Barbara in theatre history, returns to California after five years (2003-2008) as the Texas Tech

University president and a professor of theatre.

His distinguished professional history in academia began in 1967 at Washington State University. Positions at Highline Community College in Seattle and the University of California preceded an 11-year tenure (1974-1985) at West Virginia University where he gained full professorship and was Interim Dean of the College of Creative Arts. Dr. Whitmore spent five years (1985-1990) at the University of Iowa as the Dean, Faculty of Arts and Letters and a professor of theatre.

He was the Dean of the College of Fine Arts, the Effie Marie Cain Regents Chair and a professor of theatre at the University of Texas (1990-1996) and the Provost and a professor of theatre at the University of Iowa (1996-2003).

The native of Seattle, Wash., earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in speech from Washington State University. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Ian, enrolled at the University of Iowa, and daughter, Amy, enrolled at Vanderbilt University.

### Martin Luther King, Jr., Library

The new Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library, located on the main campus of San Jose State University, opened on August 16, 2003. A first-of-its-kind collaboration between a city and a university, the \$177-million, 475,000 square-foot library provides a center for life-long learning. Students, faculty and the community have access to the information they will need for educational and personal growth throughout their lives.

Among the features of the 10-acre, 10-floor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library on the northwest corner of the main campus are:

- 3,623 seats
- 4 computer instruction laboratories
- 1,800 seats wired for internet connections
- 37 group-project rooms
- 400 public computers
- 112 workstations available in the computer instruction labs
- 8 built-in projector screens
- 135 databases of information
- 4 pianos

The collaborative design of the new Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library provides many opportunities for academic, cultural and community programs. Multilingual and special collections for San Jose’s diverse ethnic groups are available. A special adaptive technology area in the library assures all people have ability to access the information and databases available.





# Thomas Bowen, Athletics Director



Tom Bowen was named San Jose State University's director of intercollegiate athletics on December 20, 2004. Under his leadership and with his vision for the department, San Jose State has established itself as a viable Division I-A intercollegiate athletics program with proven athletic, academic and financial successes to his credit.

## CULTURE OF CHAMPIONS

At the core of Bowen's mission for San Jose State University athletics

is building a "Culture of Champions" academically, athletically and in the community. To that end, the Notre Dame alum has overhauled the department's infrastructure; invested resources both in external and internal operations; initiated an enhanced website presence; and expanded marketing, promotions and advertising opportunities locally, regionally and nationally with the creation of Spartan Sports Properties.

With his fund raising acumen, Bowen has led the Spartan Foundation - the department's fund-raising component - to unprecedented development heights with \$3.0- million during the last two annual fund drives.

As an integral member of the University's presidential staff, he has created new short and long-term revenue streams for intercollegiate athletics and many other campus extra-curricular activities. His initiatives and leadership have created new energy department-wide and throughout the university. The university has benefitted from Athletics' increasing visibility, receiving record donations particularly in 2006-07.

Since taking over, San Jose State has more football wins in a three-year period than any similar span since 1990-92. The 2006 and 2007 Spartans are the first two Spartan teams to post back-to-back .500 or better records in the Western Athletic Conference football standings.

In 2007-08, the Spartans sent their women's gymnastics team to NCAA post-season action and had individuals from the women's swimming and women's golf teams compete in NCAA Championships. Women's water polo, with two All-American team members, was ranked seventh in the final national coaches poll. Men's basketball had its best win total since the 2001 season and beat two teams that played in the 2008 NCAA Tournament. San Jose State capped the school year with a budget surplus for an unprecedented third year in a row and was cited as one of 12 Division I universities cited for Overall Excellence in Diversity in a national study by Texas A&M on behalf of the NCAA.

In 2006-07, football capped its finest season in nearly two decades, posting a 9-4 overall record and capturing the New Mexico Bowl championship. Women's cross country and women's water polo, ranked sixth nationally in the final coaches' poll, turned in their best record in years. There were All-American performances in football and women's water polo. Men's basketball, football, women's swimming, women's volleyball and women's water polo players competed in national team or individual national competitions. The 2007 season marked the second year in a row a Spartan won the Western Athletic Conference women's golf individual title.

He has appointed new head coaches in football, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's golf, women's golf, women's swimming and diving, softball, women's softball, women's cross country and women's volleyball. In 2005-06, San Jose State won

the Western Athletic Conference women's golf championship, recorded its highest finish ever at a NCAA regional championship in women's gymnastics, produced seven teams out of 16 with its best conference finish in years, and had WAC "Coaches of the Year" in women's golf and softball.

Bowen's vision for student-athlete success and excellence led to the creation of a Student Success Services component. Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores as measured by the NCAA have risen steadily under his watch.

## EXPERIENCED PROFESSIONAL

Bowen came to San Jose State after serving three years as the Director of Community Affairs for the San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League. He directed all of the team's fund-raising activities and was responsible for alumni and current player participation in the community. Also serving as the executive director of the 49ers Foundation, San Francisco was the first NFL franchise to implement an annual giving program.

His Division I experience at the collegiate level includes athletics administration positions at the University of California and Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif. As an assistant and associate director of athletics at the University of California from July 2000 through September 2002, he was responsible for athletic fund-raising.

At Saint Mary's College, he was the Director of Foundations and Corporate Relations from May 1995 to January 1997 before being appointed to an associate director of athletics position. His grant proposal acumen helped raise \$6.1-million in academic funding for the institution. From January 1997 through April 2000, he managed the athletics department's budget, directed a corporate sponsorship program and interacted with the academic senate, faculty and university personnel on student-athlete issues.

## EDUCATION & COMMUNITY

He is a Level 2 certified member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA), the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and the National Society of Fund Raising Executives.

The 1983 graduate of the University of Notre Dame played high school football at Moreau High in Hayward, Calif. He majored in theology / sociology and spent six years studying for the priesthood with the Holy Cross Fathers. Bowen went on to earn a master's degree in administration/education from the University of San Francisco in 1990.

An active member of the Bay Area community, he was named to the 2008 San Jose Mercury News' Top-25 Most Powerful Sports Figures in the Bay Area. He serves on the board of the San Jose Sports Authority. He is an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco School of Sports Management and at San Jose State University's Department of Kinesiology where he teaches sports management classes. As a senior faculty member of the Capital Campaign Institute based in Minneapolis, Minn., from 1996 through 2002, he is a frequent guest lecturer at several Bay Area university campuses. Bowen continues to speak before major corporations headquartered locally on the topics of leadership, management and motivation.

The Denver, Colo., native and his wife, Mia, are the parents of three children: sons, Andrew and Peter, and, daughter, McKenna.

Please be aware that you could become part of the action in Spartan Gym because of the narrow sideline and endline areas. It is recommended that photographers shoot on the sideline opposite of the team benches.


