Jeff Leightman
Head Coach
Second Season

Jeff Leightman is in his second season as head coach of the San Jose State University women's soccer team, and continues the rebuilding process of the program.

In his first year, Leightman had seven true freshmen and one redshirt freshman start at least 11 games each, improving San Jose State's overall winning percentage from .238 to .350 while qualifying for a fourth straight WAC Tournament. A program-high 10 Spartans earned Academic All-WAC distinction.

Leightman arrived from his alma mater, Binghamton (N.Y.) University, where he compiled a record of 102-66-1 from 1998-07. He led the Bearcats to the 2004 America East Conference regular-season and tournament titles and an NCAA Championship berth, earning AEC Coach of the Year honors.

Leightman has worked at the collegiate level for 16 years, having coached a nationally-ranked NCAA Division III program, a regionally-ranked Division I program at Villanova and a Division I national champion at North Carolina prior to leading Binghamton.

In 1998, Leightman's first year at Binghamton, the Bearcats were ranked nationally and finished with a 14-3-1 record and an Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) crown. Over seven years at Division I, he directed his squad to regional top-10 rankings by both the National Soccer Coaches Association of America

(NSCAA) and *Soccer Buzz*.

In addition to the 2004 title, Leightman led Binghamton to the America East semifinals in 2005 and 2007, and the quarterfinals in 2006. The Bearcats were ECAC runners-up in 1999 and semifinalists in 2001 and 2003. Leightman has served as the America East Women's Soccer Coaches' Chair from 2005-07, the National Chairman for the NSCAA rankings and the East Region Chairman for the NSCAA Scholar-Athlete All-America Committee.



Leightman has been involved with the Olympic Development Program since 2002. He was a United States Youth Soccer Region I staff coach at the U13 and U14 levels, as well as the head coach of the New York State West ODP U16 and U17 teams.

As an assistant coach at Villanova in 1997, Leightman helped guide the Wildcats to an 8-8-2 record, the Big East Tournament semifinals and an ECAC Tournament appearance. At North Carolina in 1996, he assisted in a national championship as the Tar Heels finished with a 25-1 record and the Atlantic Coast Conference title.

Leightman's coaching career began at Binghamton as an assistant coach from 1993-96. He earned a degree in biological sciences from Binghamton in 1995, and holds an NSCAA Premier diploma.

Craig Winans is in his fourth season as the assistant coach for the San Jose State women's soccer program.

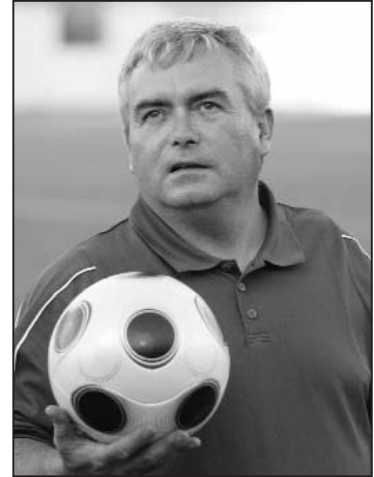
Prior to joining the Spartan staff in 2006, Winans had been the director of coaching of the Xtreme Soccer Club, based in Pacifica, Calif., where he was responsible for building the recently-formed club program. In addition, he was the girl's head coach at Sacred Heart Cathedral Prep in San Francisco, Calif., during the 2004 season.

Winans has also been a state staff coach and instructor since 1997 and district Olympic Development Program (ODP) head coach since 1995 for the

California Youth Soccer Association (CYSA), based in Pleasanton, Calif.

The 1981 San Francisco State University graduate majored in business with an emphasis in accounting. Winans also attended the United States Air Force Academy, where he played college soccer, and Cal State Hayward.

The San Francisco native holds an NSCAA Premier diploma and a United States Soccer Federation National "B" coaching license. He and



his wife, Vickie, have four children, Bridget, Brendan, Kevin and Theresa, and reside in San Francisco, Calif.

SPARTAN NOTES: In her second season with the Spartans...enrolled in school and participated in training during the 2008 spring semester...voted by teammates as San Jose State's MVP and Offensive MVP in 2008...2008 Academic All-WAC honoree.



2008: Led the Spartans in virtually all statistical categories, including goals (8), points (17), game-winning goals (3), shots (39) and shots on goal (21)...was the lone Spartan to start all 20 matches...notched the game-winning goal in three of San Jose State's five victories, at home versus Sacramento State (9/14) in overtime, at Air Force (9/26) and at Nevada (10/12) ...scored three equalizers, versus California (8/24), at Hawai'i (10/19) and against Boise State (11/6) in the WAC Tournament...also reached the back of the

net against WAC foes Louisiana Tech (10/24) and at Boise State (11/2)...collected her lone assist on the opening goal of a 3-2 home loss against Utah State (10/26)...nine points and four goals in WAC matches tied for the league lead... tied for second on the WAC goal-scoring chart in all matches, and sixth in points... played a season-high 104 minutes at home against Seattle (8/31) and Fresno State (10/10)...all four shots against Cal were on goal...matched that single-game season high with four shots against Miami (Ohio) (9/21) and at Saint Mary's (10/3).

CABRILLO COLLEGE: Played two years at Cabrillo College (Coach Paolo Carbone) in Aptos, Calif., scoring 56 goals...was chosen the MVP of the Coast Conference in 2007 and was the Forward of the Year in her freshman year in 2006...two-time all-conference pick.

APTOS HIGH SCHOOL: Played four years of varsity basketball and participated in varsity track and field for three years, graduating in 2005...was a two-time first-team all-league selection in basketball, and part of the school-record-setting 4x100 relay as a track athlete.

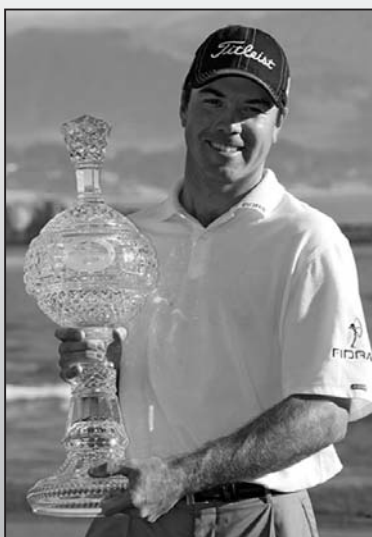

Spartan Stadium, which seats 30,456, is the home for San Jose State women’s soccer, men’s soccer and football.

The multi-purpose facility is the site of the school’s annual commencement ceremony. Concerts, professional and collegiate soccer, band competitions and high school football games also take place at Spartan Stadium.

The stadium was the site of the FIFA Women’s World Cup in 1999 and the NCAA Women’s College Cup in 1999 and 2000 (at top), attracting record-setting crowds. It has also been the home of Major League Soccer’s San Jose Clash (1996-99) and San Jose Earthquakes (2000-05), and the Women’s United Soccer Association’s San Jose CyberRays (2001-03).

Most recently in 2007, Spartan Stadium played host to warm-up matches for both the U.S. men’s (at right) and women’s national teams against China and Japan on June 2 and July 27, respectively, attracting over 32,000 spectators for the two matches.

For the first time in 2009, Spartan Stadium will feature FieldTurf as its playing surface.
