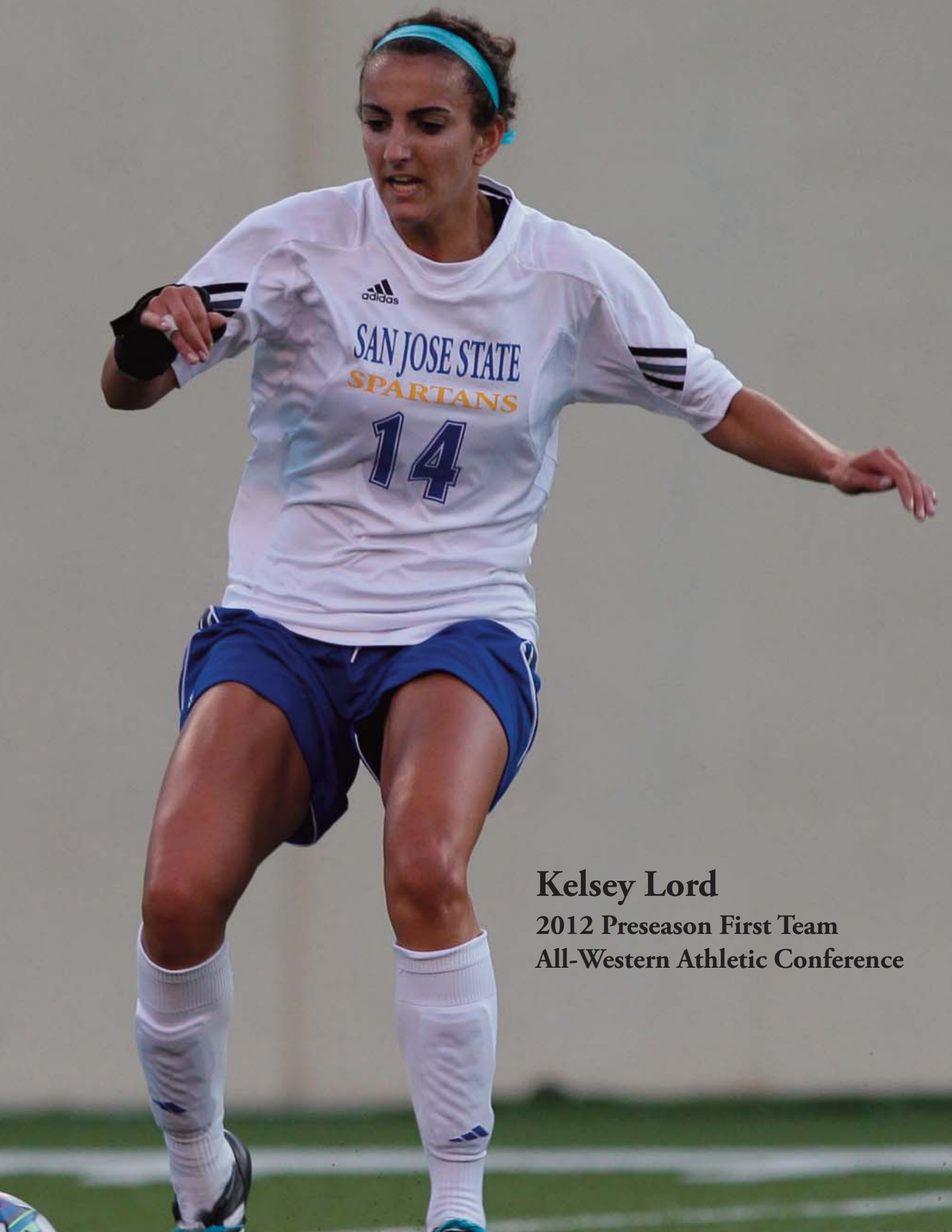

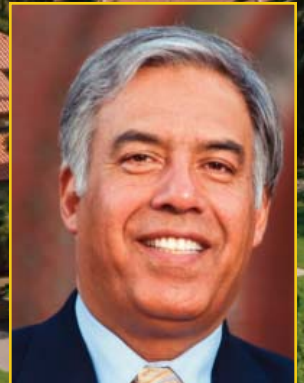
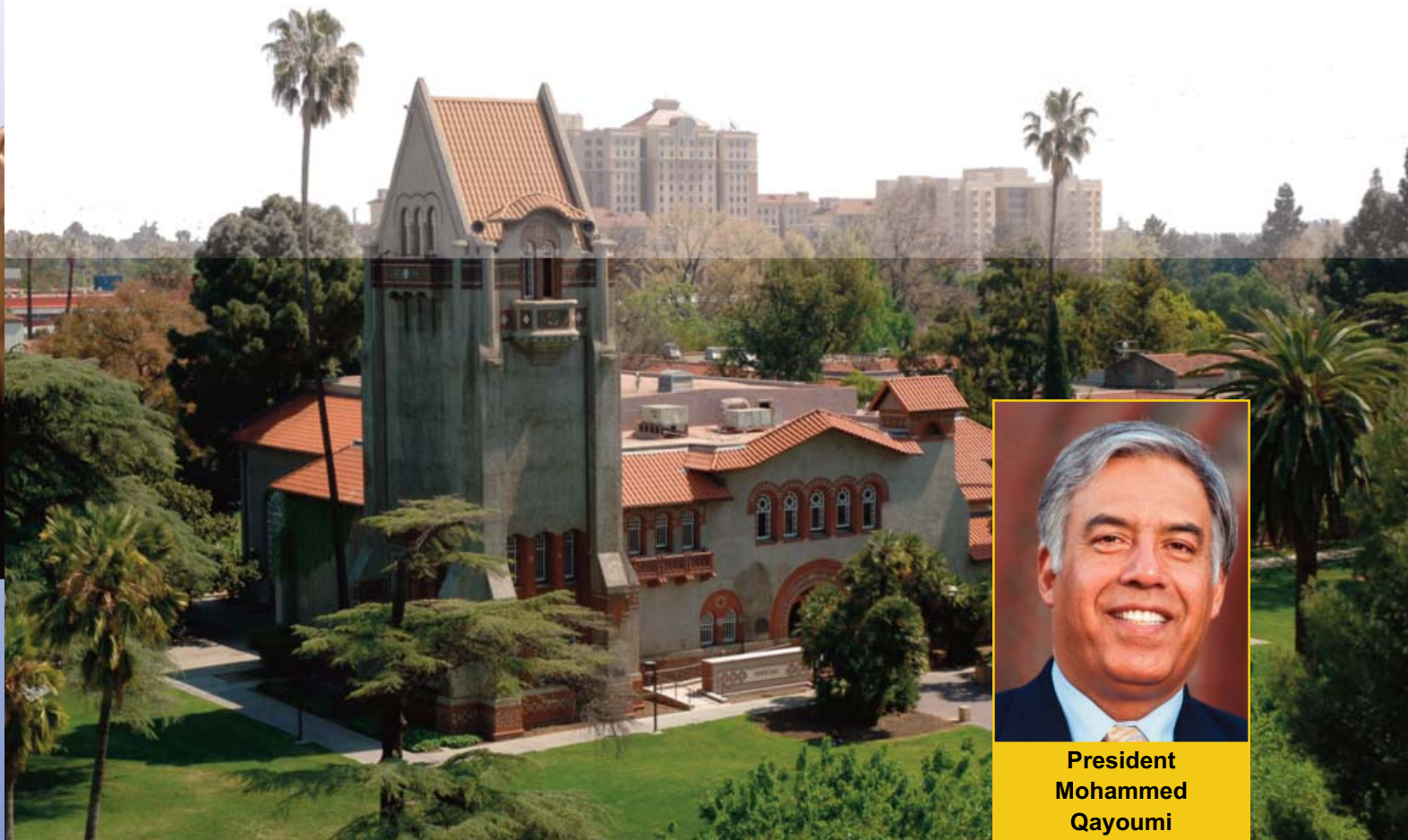

JEFF LEIGHTMAN HEAD COACH 5TH SEASON

State women's soccer coach to be

Leightman's success on the pitch the Spartans parallels the team's success. In 2009, 2010, and 2011, the National Association of Collegiate Women's Soccer (NACWS) National Team Awards for achieving a team GPA on a 4.00 scale. In 2009, San Jose State was named Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient.

A Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, Jeff Leightman was named San Jose State University women's soccer head coach in February 2008.

A COAST-TO-COAST PROGRAM

Coaching at his alma mater, Leightman coached at Binghamton University's women's soccer program.

In the program's 17-year history, Leightman is the only coach to lead his team to back-to-back regular season conference titles. His four-year record is 34-36-10, and his 2009 squad was the first since 1999 to post a winning record. In each of his four years, he has led the Spartans to a WAC Tournament bid.

In his 2010 campaign, Leightman led the team to its second-straight winning season. San Jose State broke a team mark for most single-season WAC wins with six. With a shutout victory at home on senior night, San Jose State clinched a share of the 2010 WAC regular season title. The program received numerous honors from the 2010 All-WAC women's soccer awards with the Freshman of the Year distinction and three players earning All-WAC honors. Three additional players were named to the WAC All-Tournament Team.

The Spartans set a single-season school record with a 14-match unbeaten streak, ignited by five-consecutive shutout victories. Four Spartans were first-team All-WAC selections and one earned second-team conference honors. In addition, Leightman became the second San Jose State coach to be named WAC Coach of the Year.

ightman seamlessly transitioned s soccer program from a mediocre Division III team to a regionally-ranked Division I force in the east. Leightman left Binghamton for San Jose State as its winningest women's soccer coach, compiling an overall record of 102-66-1 from 1998 through 2007.

In 2004, Binghamton won the America East Conference title and earned an NCAA Championship Tournament berth in just four seasons competing at the Division I level. The Bearcats' success resulted in Leightman receiving America East Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Through seven years of Division I competition, Leightman directed his squad to top-10 Northeast Region rankings by both the NSCAA and Soccer Buzz magazine. In 2001, Soccer Buzz ranked

Binghamton as the top first-year Division I program in the nation. Respected by his coaching colleagues, Leightman served as the America East Women's Soccer Coaches' Chair from 2005-07, the National Chairman for the NSCAA/Adidas rankings and the East Region Chairman for the NSCAA Scholar-Athlete All-America Committee.

A NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP COACH & ODP EXPERIENCE

Leightman's coaching career began with a three-season tenure in 1993 as an assistant at Binghamton. The Bearcats went 39-13-8 overall during that span, earned a conference championship, was ranked second nationally in 1995 and played in the 1995 NCAA Division III Championship. He moved to the University of North Carolina for the 1996 season and was an assistant coach on the Tar Heels' NCAA Division I championship team. After a year as a Villanova University assistant coach, he returned to Binghamton as the women's team head coach.

Since 1999, Leightman has worked for the Olympic Development Program. He is currently the head coach of the De Anza Force U18 team in Cupertino, Calif. The Force competes in the Elite Club National League (ECNL), an elite program in girls' youth soccer. He was a United States Youth Soccer Region I staff coach and was the Director of Coaching for the BC United Fusion, a premier girls' youth soccer program, from 2004-07. In 1999-2000, he was the girls' head coach of the New York State West ODP U16 and U17 teams.

Leightman earned a bachelor's degree in biological sciences from Binghamton in 1995. He holds an NSCAA Premier diploma.



VALERIE HENDERSON ASSISTANT COACH 1ST SEASON

Valerie Henderson begins her first season as an assistant coach with the San Jose State women's soccer team in 2012.

Henderson was a team captain and four-year starting goalkeeper (2004-07) at UCLA. Named a 2007 NSCAA Scholar All-American, she helped lead the Bruins to four-straight NCAA Women's College Cups, including two championship game appearances. Henderson currently holds records at UCLA for career shutouts (38) and career wins (76). While at UCLA, Henderson competed for the United States at the 2006 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Russia and was named "Woman of the Match" after a shutout victory versus France. She also helped the USA capture the 2008 Nordic Cup Championship U-23 Team by recording four clean sheets over the course of the tournament.



Following her collegiate career, Henderson was chosen in the third round of the 2009 Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) draft by the Los Angeles Sol, where she played from March 2009 to March 2010. She then played for the Philadelphia Independence, also of the WPS, from March 2010 to August 2011. Henderson most recently played professionally for the KIF Örebro women's professional soccer team, based in Örebro, Sweden.

Henderson spent the 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons as an assistant coach for the Lamorinda Soccer Club in Lafayette, Calif. She was a 2012 member of the Women's Premier Soccer League's Bay Area Breeze, based in Berkeley, Calif.

A native of Concord, Calif., she earned a bachelor's degree in English from UCLA in 2007. Henderson was a contributing writer to ESPNW.com.



DAVE LOVERCHECK ASSISTANT COACH 4TH SEASON

Dave Lovercheck enters his fourth season as an assistant coach with the San Jose State Women's soccer team. He joined the staff in 2009 as a volunteer assistant and was promoted to assistant coach in 2010.

In 2010, Lovercheck mentored Meghan Maiwald to a season in which she set a program record for shutouts and led the WAC in total saves and saves-per-game, in addition to garnering WAC All-Tournament Team recognition.

Alongside his work at San Jose State, he coaches the U14 girls Pride Black and Blue teams of the MVLA Soccer Club (Mountain View/Los Altos). He has worked with the Olympic Development Program as well as several other area youth clubs, and served as Head Coach and Director of Soccer at Gunn High School in Palo Alto, Calif. Lovercheck served as the Head Equipment Manager of FC Gold Pride in its inaugural season in the Women's Professional Soccer League.

Lovercheck played collegiately for Hunter College in New York, N.Y., where he was a four-year captain and two-time all-league selection. He also played seven years with the Central Park Rangers FC. He earned a bachelor's degree in Organizational Behavior and Leadership from the University of San Francisco in 2010.
