Spartans feature another strong team



The 2007 Spartans have their sights set on a WAC Championship and another top-notch showing in NCAA Championship action.

2006 NCAA Regional Championships, averaged 9.613 while Shina averaged 9.621 in the vault. Jay's best in the event is a 9.750 at the 2005 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Championships.

Leah Bigelow, the team's top performer in the balance beam, returns for her senior season. **Alise Blackwell**, whose 9.623 was the top average for the Spartans in the floor exercise, also is back for San Jose State.

Seven promising newcomers figure prominently in Wright's plans this season. Four of them participated in the 2006 USA Junior National Championships.



Michelle Minotti was the Spartans' top all-around performer in 2006.

Coming off of one of its best seasons in school history, the San Jose State University women's gymnastics team has set lofty goals for the 2007 season. With a strong and capable nucleus of returning gymnasts and a talented group of newcomers, the Spartans are primed to vault their way back into conference and national prominence.

Head coach **Wayne Wright**, now in his sixth season leading the Spartans, has 10 returning letterwinners. The vast majority of them have competed in NCAA Regional Championship action either individually or as part of the San Jose State team that finished with a

school-record best fourth place at the 2006 NCAA Regional hosted by Stanford.

All-WAC selections **Renae Moneymaker** and **Veronica Porte** are entering their second season as Spartans. **Michelle Minotti** and **Greta Leach**, a pair of juniors who are two-time NCAA Regional Championship competitors, give San Jose State strength in the all-around. Leach hopes to return to top-notch form after a redshirt season in 2006.

Raylyn and **Shina Cardeno** and **Casey Jay** are three experienced vaulters capable of posting high scores for the Spartans in dual meet and championship action. Raylyn, who scored a 9.800 at the

TEAM SCORING

Each team can field up to six competitors on each event, but only the top five scores will count toward the team score. Collegiate competition requires at least two judges evaluate each athlete's performance. The average of the two scores is the final mark. A perfect team score would be 200, and the top college teams score in the 194-197 range.

SCORING

With the exception of vault (which has a predetermined start value for each vault), routines are judged on a 9.5 point scale, with an additional .5 bonus available for meeting special requirements. Judges use the following criteria:

Value parts (difficulty*)	2.2 points
Special requirements	1.2
Execution, combination and artistry (bb/fx)	6.1
Additional value	0.5
Total	10.0

* Skills are classified by difficulty (A, B, C, D, E) with E being the most difficult.

SCORING DEDUCTIONS

Fall from apparatus or on floor	0.5
Heavy brush of feet or hand touch on floor	0.3
Intermediate swing on bars	0.3
Presentation to judges omitted before or after	1.0
Stepping out of bounds on floor	0.1

Other deductions up to 0.3 are taken for form breaks such as bent arms and legs or leg separations. There is also a team deduction of 0.3 for competing out of order in the lineup.

VAULT

The vault in gymnastics could best be compared to the dive in aquatics. Scores are awarded on the basis of difficulty and execution. A vault consists of two principle elements - pre-flight (the approach to the horse) and post-flight. The faster the approach and the higher the vault, the better the score.

UNEVEN BARS

A routine requires at least 10 moves including the dismount. The key to a good score on bars is continuous movement; breaks or pauses in the routine result in point deductions. The gymnast must move from one bar to the other with a series of swings, twists, somersaults and handstands. The dismount is the most dramatic movement.

BALANCE BEAM

Despite the 4-foot height and 4-inch width of the beam, the gymnast is expected to do what amounts to a floor-exercise routine. The key word is balance, as the judges deduct points for stumbles and falls. The routine includes dance movements (leaps, turns and jumps), acrobatic and tumbling movements and maximum use of the entire beam. The routine lasts 90 seconds.

FLOOR EXERCISE

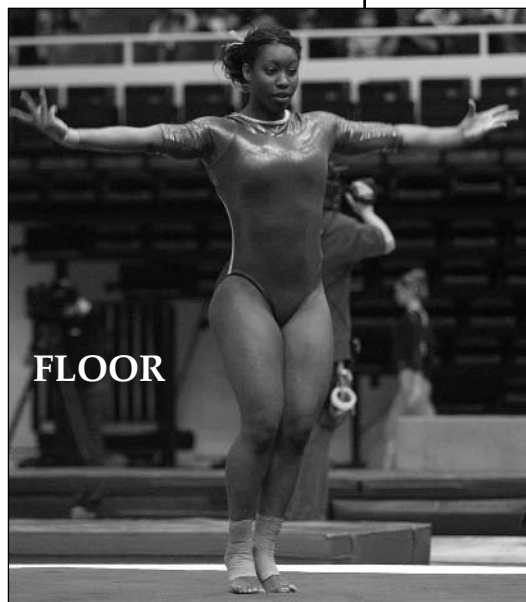
The favorite of most gymnasts and fans, the floor exercise lends itself to personal expression. The only music-accompanied event, the floor exercise routine contains tumbling movements, dance movements and a maximum use of the floor area. There must be at least three tumbling passes in the routine (passes from one spot of the floor to the other). The routine lasts a minimum of 70 seconds and a maximum of 90 seconds.

Wayne Wright Head Coach Academy of Health Sciences, 1984 6th Season

Wayne Wright is in his sixth season as the head coach of the San Jose State women's gymnastics team. The Spartan program

has made significant strides during Wright's tenure, breaking school records, winning conference championships and receiving team invitations to the NCAA West Regional.

Wright helped lead the 2006 Spartan team to its second team appearance at the NCAA West Regional. San Jose State finished fourth, the best in program history. The Spartans broke the school vault team and individual records during the year. Wright also helped the Spartans transition to competing in the Western Athletic Conference. Three gymnasts received All-WAC honors - Renae Moneymaker, Veronica Porte and Kelsey Spellacy.

The 2005 team had a 17-5 overall record and placed second at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Championships. Three gymnasts - Jennifer Greene, Greta Leach and Michelle Minotti, qualified for the NCAA West Regionals in the all-around.

The 2004 season was a successful year as the Spartans recorded a 16-9 record and won the MPSF Championship held at Spartan Gym. Three individuals won MPSF titles - Shirla Choy, bars; Amberly Klein, beam; and Jennifer Greene, floor. The first 10.0 score was posted by a Spartan gymnast as Greene was perfect on the floor at the MPSF meet.

For the 2003 season, Wright posted an overall record of 12-9. The team broke every event record in Spartan history under his instruction. For the first time in school history, the Spartans qual-

ified as a team for the NCAA West Regional competition. The team placed second at the MPSF Championships, and Wright was named the MPSF "Coach of the Year."

In 2002, the Spartans were 12-9-0. Wright coached four individuals at the NCAA West Regional meet, the most in school history. The team broke the school floor record and placed third at the MPSF Championships.

Wright believes firmly in the importance of academics and athletics in a college education. Five teams, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005, had the

highest grade point average among San Jose State's 16 intercollegiate athletic teams. Six gymnasts were named 2005 Scholastic All-Americans by the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches, and five were named to the Academic All-WAC team. In the past four years, 23 gymnasts have received "Scholastic All-America" honors.

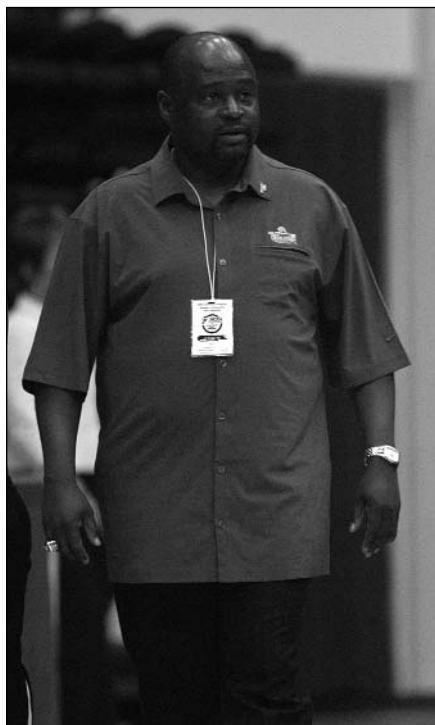
As an assistant coach, Wright was at Stanford from 1996-2001 and at San Jose State from 1987-1996.

While at Stanford, Wright helped coach the team to its first Pac-10 title in 1998 and an NCAA West Regional championship. During his first stint at San Jose State he coached Tara Law, the 1996 Big West floor champion, to the NCAA West Regional.

Before he began collegiate coaching, Wright served as program director and head coach of the Kokokahi Gymnastics Center in Kailua, Hawaii, developing Class I National Junior Olympics gymnasts. He also worked with U.S.A. Gymnastics at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and was on the floor when the team won the gold medal.

Wright has an extensive background in nursing and physical education. He graduated from the Academy of Health Sciences in Texas with a degree in nursing. He also studied physical education and recreation at the University of Hawai'i.

Wright served three years in the U.S. Army as a nurse attached to Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. He is a certified phlebotomy technician and a candidate for a California Nurse's License.

Amber Giorgianni begins her first season as an assistant coach on the San Jose State women's gymnastics staff. She brings experience at the collegiate and club levels to the Spartan program. Giorgianni is primarily responsible for the bars, vault and floor teams.

Giorgianni was a four-year letterwinner at Arizona State from 2001-04. She competed on the vault, bars and beam during her collegiate career. A team co-captain her senior year, Giorgianni was a beam specialist, tying her career best that season with a 9.950 against Eastern Michigan. At the 2004 NCAA Championships, she scored a 9.725 on beam during the preliminary session. Her sophomore season, she scored a career best 9.925 on the beam at Utah State and spent her junior season competing primarily on the bars and beam. Giorgianni scored a 9.775 on the beam at the 2003 NCAA Championships preliminary session. She scored a career-high 9.875 on the bars against Kentucky and competed on the vault in one meet.

Her freshman season was cut short after suffering a knee injury in warm-ups before a meet against Auburn. That season, Giorgianni competed on the vault and beam.

A native of San Jose, Giorgianni graduated from Santa Teresa High School and competed and coached at Airborne Gymnastics.

Giorgianni received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in sociology in 2005 from Arizona State. Her father, Peter, was a member of the Spartan men's swimming team, while her mother, Patty, did modern dance at San Jose State.



Shella Martinez is in her fourth season as a member of the San Jose State women's gymnastics coaching staff. She brings over 11 years of coaching experience to the Spartans. Martinez is the beam coach and handles all choreography for the Spartans.

Prior to coming to San Jose State, Martinez spent five seasons as the Developmental Program Director and head coach for Pegasus Gymnastics Academy in Milpitas, Calif. During Martinez's career as a head coach she trained a Level 10 national competitor, Level 10 regional qualifiers, and Level 5, 6 and 7 state championship teams.

From 1995 to 1998, Martinez worked at Funtastics Gymnastics, in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho where she developed and implemented programs to aid in the teaching of fundamental gymnastics.

Martinez competed for the Gold Cup Gymnastics Academy in Albuquerque, N.M. Her personal achievements as a gymnast include competing at Nationals as a Level 10 gymnast and at Regionals as a Level 9 and 10 gymnast. In 1989, Martinez won the Level 8 New Mexico state championships.

Currently, Martinez attends San Jose State University and is working toward a bachelor's degree in biology.

Whether you are a graduate or a friend of the university, there are many reasons you can be proud of San José State. From an award-winning faculty and high-achieving students to cutting-edge programs and growing collaborations with the community and the corporate world, SJSU is on the move as it meets the challenges of the 21st century.

Known for the high quality of its academic programs, its excellent faculty (87 percent hold doctorates or the highest degrees in their academic disciplines), and its diverse and committed student body, San José State successfully educates students to compete in today's complex, high tech and global economy.

For the past six years, San José State has been ranked among the top ten masters-level public universities in the West by U.S. News & World Report's survey of "America's Best Colleges." In the 2006 survey, the College of Engineering is ranked 14th among the nation's Best Undergraduate Engineering Programs (in addition, electrical engineering ranks 11th; civil engineering, 16th; mechanical engineering, 16th).

San José State is the number one supplier of education, engineering, computer science and business graduates to Silicon Valley, the world's high tech capital. The oldest and one of the largest universities in the 23-campus California State University (CSU) system, SJSU attracts students from throughout California, the United States and 100 countries of the world.

Located in the nation's 10th and California's third largest city, San José State had a fall 2005 enrollment of 29,975 students. Approximately 75 percent of the students were undergraduates; 25 percent were graduate students. Almost 59 percent of the student population had an ethnic affiliation. More than 100 different languages are spoken on campus.

Founded in 1857, SJSU is the oldest public institution of higher education on the West Coast. From its beginnings as a normal school to train teachers, the campus has matured into a comprehensive university offering 134 bachelors' and masters' degrees.



San José State is one of the largest public-sector employers in Silicon Valley, with about 2,500 full-time employees and an annual budget of \$472 million (2005-06).

Some 7,862 bachelors' and masters' degrees were awarded in 2005-06 — continuing to support the region by supplying Silicon Valley with more graduates at the baccalaureate and masters' levels than any other school in the nation.





Don W. Kassing President

Don W. Kassing was appointed president of San José State University, the oldest and one of the largest universities in the 23-campus California State University system, in May 2005.

Kassing has moved the university forward in several key areas. Under his leadership, the campus is engaged in university-wide strategic

planning, with the goal of making San José State University a university of choice by 2010. In February 2006, he accepted the largest single private donation to the university in its history, a \$10 million gift from alumni Donald and Sally Lucas, to create a new graduate school of business.

As president and in his former role as vice president for administration and finance, Kassing led the development, construction and successful opening of two major campus facilities: the award-winning Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Library, based on a first-of-its-kind and highly successful partnership with the city of San José; and Campus Village, a state-of-the-art residence complex for students, faculty and staff, the largest such project in the California State University system, and the focus of a renewed sense of community on campus.

Before his appointment to the presidency, Kassing had served for more than a decade as vice president for administration and finance and as chief financial officer. As CFO, he had responsibility for all business and financial affairs of the university.

His previous 18 years of experience in higher education includes service as:

* Vice President for University Relations and Administrative Services - Murray State University (Kentucky)

* Vice President for Development and Public Affairs - Western State College of Colorado

From 1975 to 1986 he served at Belleville Area College, in Belleville, Illinois, where he taught management and marketing, served as department chair, and for two years was president of the Granite City Campus. Before that he worked for 11 years in private industry, including eight years in corporate finance and operations management for Brown Group Inc. and three years with General Motors Corporation.

Martin Luther King, Jr., Library



The new Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library, located on the main campus of San Jose State University, opened on August 16, 2003. A first-of-its-kind collaboration between a city and a university, the \$177-million, 475,000 square-foot library provides a center for life-long learning. Students, faculty and the community have access to the information they will need for educational and personal growth throughout their lives.

Among the features of the 10-acre, 10-floor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library on the northwest corner of the main campus are:

- 3,623 seats
- 4 computer instruction laboratories
- 1,800 seats wired for internet connections
- 37 group-project rooms
- 400 public computers
- 112 workstations available in the computer instruction labs
- 8 built-in projector screens
- 135 databases of information
- 4 pianos

The collaborative design of the new Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library provides many opportunities for academic, cultural and community programs.

Multilingual and special collections for San José's diverse ethnic groups are available. A special adaptive technology area in the library assures all people have ability to access the information and databases available.

Campus Village

In the fall of 2005, San José State University opened the doors of Campus Village to more than 2,279 students, faculty and staff.

Positioned on Tenth Street between San Carlos and San Salvador on the southeast corner of the main campus, the Campus Village is a gateway to incredible academic resources and campus activities, the excitement of downtown San José, the opportunities of Silicon Valley, and some of the greatest recreational areas in the world.



The Campus Village includes three buildings featuring apartment and suite-style living accommodations and a typical college dormitory experience. Campus Village includes recreational and study areas, a full-service

computer lab, wireless internet access, an interactive gaming center, laundry facilities, meeting rooms, retail stores and underground parking for 700 vehicles. Fully equipped nearby recreational facilities offer residents space to work out, swim, play basketball, volleyball, ping-pong or pool.

Hassle-free access to the main campus is another asset to the Campus Village. Walking to the Student Union or the main entrance to The Event Center is five minutes or less. Residents can walk or bicycle to the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Library without crossing any streets.





Tom Bowen was named San Jose State University's director of intercollegiate athletics on December 20, 2004. Under his leadership, the Spartans have made significant and meaningful strides forward as a viable Division I-A intercollegiate athletics program.

As the director, Bowen has overhauled the department's infrastructure; invested resources both in external and internal operations; initiated an enhanced website presence; and expanded marketing, promotions and advertising opportunities locally, regionally and nationally with the creation of Spartan Sports Properties. The Spartan Foundation, the department's fund-raising component, has enjoyed its most successful two-year period generating just over \$2.0-million in personal and corporate contributions.

As an integral member of the University's presidential staff, he has created new short and long-term revenue streams for intercollegiate athletics and many other campus extra-curricular activities. His initiatives and leadership have created new energy department-wide and throughout the university.

His vision for student-athlete success and excellence led to the creation of a Student Success Services component. Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores as measured by the NCAA have risen dramatically under his watch. Above all, his goal for San Jose State University athletics is building a "Culture of Champions" academically, athletically and in the community.

He has appointed new head coaches in football, men's basketball, men's golf, women's golf and women's swimming and diving. In 2005-06, San Jose State won the Western Athletic Conference women's golf championship, recorded its highest finish ever at a NCAA regional championship in women's gymnastics, produced seven teams out of 16 with its best conference finish in years, and had WAC "Coaches of the Year" in women's golf and softball.

Bowen came to San Jose State after serving three years as the director of community affairs and the executive director of the 49ers Foundation for the San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League. He directed all of the team's fund-raising activities and was responsible for alumni and current player participation in the community. San Francisco was the first NFL franchise to implement an annual giving program.

His Division I experience at the college level includes athletic administration positions at the University of California and Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif.

As an assistant and associate director of athletics at the University of California from July 2000 through September 2002, he was responsible for all athletic fundraising. Bowen was credited with developing the first comprehensive planned giving program for the Golden Bears.

At Saint Mary's College, he was the Director of Foundations and Corporate Relations from May 1995 to January 1997 before being appointed to an associate director of athletics position by the president of the college. His grant proposal acumen helped raise \$6.1-million in academic funding for the institution. From January 1997 through April 2000, he managed the athletics department's budget, directed a corporate sponsorship program and interacted with the academic senate, faculty and university personnel on student-athlete issues.

The 1983 graduate of the University of Notre Dame played high school football at Moreau High in Hayward, Calif. He majored in theology/sociology and spent six years studying for the priesthood with the Holy Cross Fathers. Bowen went on to earn a master's degree in administration/education from the University of San Francisco in 1990.

His first professional leadership appointment in athletics was at De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. From 1987 through 1995, he held the positions of assistant football coach and athletics director.

He is a Level 2 certified member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA), the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), the National Society of Fund Raising Executives and an associate member of the Indiana University School of Philanthropy.



Bowen currently is an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco School of Sports Management. A senior faculty member of the Capital Campaign Institute based in Minneapolis, Minn., from 1996 through 2002, he has been a guest lecturer at several Bay Area university campuses. Bowen continues to speak before major corporations headquartered locally on the topics of leadership, management and motivation.

The Denver, Colo., native was born on May 27, 1961. He and his wife, Mia, are the parents of three children. In 2007, Andrew will be nine-years-old; Peter, five; and, daughter, McKenna, four.



Spartan Gym is the home of the San Jose State women's volleyball and women's gymnastics teams. Seating capacity of the gym varies from 1,000-1,500 people depending on the gym setup. The gym is located on the corner of Fourth and Paseo de San Carlos Streets. Also housed in the Spartan Gym complex are two training rooms, locker rooms and an uneven bar training room for gymnastics.

During the summer of 2005, Spartan Gym underwent extensive renovations to update the facility. New paint, new ceiling, new windows and new scoreboards highlight the many changes to the facility. The locker rooms also were redone.

Koret Athletic Training Center



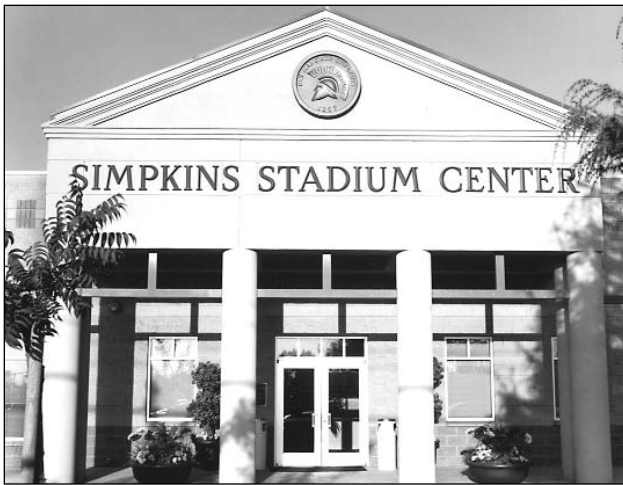
The Koret Athletic Training Center, open since November 2001, is a state-of-the-art facility that encompasses over 10,000 square-feet of training space and is located adjacent to Spartan Stadium.

The Koret Athletic Training Center also contains a 1,000-square foot rehabilitation and training room that services physical therapy and sport-specific rehabilitation.



The facility enables the sports medicine staff of athletic trainers, doctors, and physical therapists to provide the best possible care to help prevent and rehabilitate injuries.

Spartan Athletic Facilities



The football offices, team meeting rooms, Student Success Services personnel and Scott Gadway Academic Center are in the Simpkins Stadium Center, which is located between Spartan Stadium and the Koret Athletic Training Center.



Spartan Stadium is the home of the San Jose State University football team. It also serves as the home for the Spartan men's and women's soccer teams. The stadium has been the site of the NCAA Women's College Cup and Women's World Cup soccer.



The Event Center is home to the men's and women's basketball teams and hosts many concerts each year.



Muni Stadium (above) and Blethen Field are the two homes of the San Jose State baseball team. The facilities are across the street from one another and a short walk from Spartan Stadium.



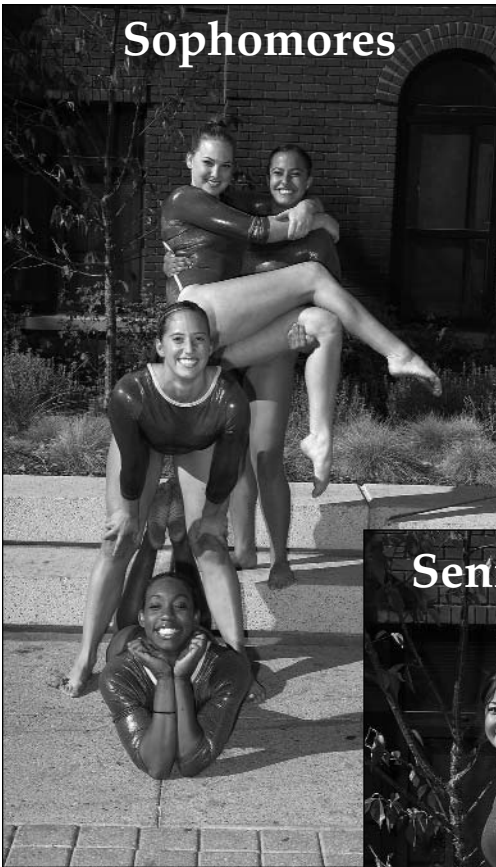
The Aquatics Center, across the street from The Event Center, is the home of the women's swimming and diving and water polo teams. There is plenty of pool area for recreational swimming.

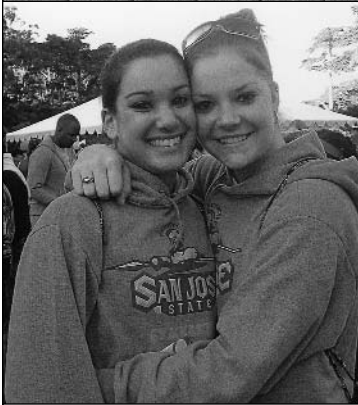
