## PETER TURNER

HEAD COACH

THIRD YEAR

SACRAMENTO STATE - 1989

Peter Turner begins his third season as head softball coach at San Jose State University after compiling a 49-63 record his first two seasons with the Spartans.

Turner came to San Jose State after spending four seasons, 2003-06, as the head women's softball coach at San Joaquin Delta College in Stockton, Calif., where he compiled a 99-30 coaching record and his 2005 team won the Big 8 Conference Championship and finished fourth in the state tournament. In 2006 the Mustangs took fifth place in the state.

Turner has been an accomplished coach and player for the USA Softball Men's National Team. In 2006, he coached the USA Softball Men's National Team to a fourth place finish at the VII Pan American Men's Softball Qualifier and a birth in the 2009 ISF Men's World Championships. He coached the 2003 team to a silver medal at

the Pan Am Games and the 2002 team to a gold medal at the Pan Am qualifier in Guatemala.

A 10-time ASA All-American as a player, Turner played in 14 ASA National Championships, five U.S. Olympic Festivals and was part of the 1995 silver medalist team at the Pan American Games. In 2007 he was inducted into the ASA National Softball Hall of Fame and led the USA Men's National Team to a runner-up finish in the ISF World Cup in Prague, Czech Republic. He played baseball at Pacific and was inducted into the Stockton Sports Hall of Fame and Stockton Softball Hall of Fame.

Turner earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in social science from Sacramento State in 1989 and received a Master of Science degree in business administration from Hamilton University in 1999.

# VICKY GALINDO

Assistant coach Vicky Galindo begins her third season at San Jose State. She brings a wealth of playing knowledge to the position. Her experience spans from a successful collegiate career at Cal to the National Pro Fast Pitch League, to the USA National Softball team and the Olympic Games.

As a member of the USA National Team, Galindo represented the United States during the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China where she won a silver medal. She was also a member of the national team for the 2007 World Cup and Pan American Games.

Galindo helped guide the national team to a gold medal at the 2006 World Championships that were held in Beijing. In 2005, she earned a gold medal at the Pan Am qualifier and helped the team to a silver medal in the inaugural World Cup.

Also in 2005, Galindo led the Cal Golden Bears to the Women's College World Series. She was a first team All-America, a first team Easton All-America, a Pac-10 Conference honoree and a Player of the

Year candidate.

In 2004, Galindo and the Bears were WCWS runner-ups. The third baseman earned WCWS All-Tournament honors as well as first team All-America honors, first team Easton All-America honors, first team All-Region honors and second team All-Pac-10 honors. She also joined the USA Schutt Elite Team in 2004, guiding the team to championships in the Canada Cup and the Champions Cup. That same year she was on the national team that won a silver medal at the Japan Cup.

Since finishing her eligibility at Cal in 2005, she has played for the National Pro Fast Pitch team, the Chicago Bandits. With the Bandits she was named to the NPF All-Star team from 2005-07.

Prior to playing for Cal, Galindo played a year at West Valley College in San Jose, Calif. She led the team to the 2002 State Championship title. For her efforts, Galindo earned All-American honors and was a first team All-League selection.

## THAD BROWN

Thad Brown is in his third year as an assistant coach on the San Jose State staff.

He has worked hand in hand with head coach Peter Turner for more than six years. Their partnership began at San Joaquin Delta College and has continued through the USA Men's National Softball team and now at San Jose State.

Brown's playing career began in baseball in 1958 and spanned four decades. A veteran of 10 years of fast-pitch softball before an injury ended his playing career,

he found a new passion coaching young athletes.

He worked with several Major League Baseball scouts defining and polishing the mechanics for offense and defense and then adjusting them for softball.

At SJSU Brown has focused on working with hitters and defense. Under his tutelage the team batting average has increased from .249 to .274, slugging percentage has increased by 36 points to .362. In addition, hits, runs and RBI have all increased under Brown.



## STAN MCFADDEN

VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH  
THIRD SEASON

Assistant Coach Stan McFadden enters his third year on the San Jose State softball coaching staff.

McFadden has worked closely with Coach Turner and Coach Brown for the past six years. His teaching methods are based on his years of baseball experience and those that Turner and Brown have developed.

A decorated baseball player at Fremont High School in Sunnyvale, Calif., he was an All-De Anza Athletic League honoree and a member of the World Youth Baseball Classic championship team in 1989. He attended and played baseball at De Anza College, in Cupertino, Calif., under head coach Ritchie Price. McFadden began coaching in 1993. As a club team

head coach, McFadden led squads to ASA Junior Olympic National births in 2004 and 2007. As a head coach, McFadden has guided his team to championship wins in the ASA, NSA, and USSSA fastpitch governing bodies. His 2007 team finished ranked 9th in the nation. In 2008, he was the head coach of the ASA Junior Olympic Winter Nationals Championship Team. In 2007, he was Commissioner of Softball for six club teams in Tracy, Calif. and the United States Specialty Sports Association Regional Fast Pitch Director.

At San Jose State, McFadden is primarily responsible for working with the Spartan outfielders. In addition, his game day responsibilities include bullpen coach as well as first base coach.

# SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY





**S**an Jose State University, Silicon Valley's metropolitan university, is pre-eminent in broadly educating leaders and professionals for an increasingly complex and global society.

Located in the heart of the Silicon Valley, this university has aided the development of the computer industry and the resulting technological advances in our nation by providing the largest source of engineering, science and business graduates to Silicon Valley companies.

Graduating about 7,000 students annually, San Jose State University also provides the professional infrastructure for

the region - from teachers, to social workers, to artists, to law enforcement officers, to nurses. The terms, "leaders and professionals," describe not just the types of graduates who earn their degrees at San Jose State, but also the roles they assume in their communities and in their fields of endeavor.

San Jose State University's place in history is well-established. Founded in 1857, it was the first public institution of higher education on the West Coast. From its humble beginnings as a normal school to train teachers for the developing frontier, it has matured into a master's university offering 191 bachelor's and master's degrees.

The University's 30,000 students study in eight fully-accredited colleges: Applied Sciences and the Arts, Business, Education, Engineering, Humanities and the Arts, Science, Social Sciences and Social Work. One strength of the academic program is the broad general education curriculum that brings common elements -- critical thinking, writing and communication skills, and cultural pluralism -- to diverse studies. Academic strength also is seen in the University's nationally-recognized programs. Examples include the School of Music, the School of Art and Design, the School of Journalism and Mass Communications, the School of Nursing and the School of Library and Information Science.

In each discipline, quality teaching remains a priority. Tenured faculty teach introductory as well as advanced courses with an emphasis on small classes. Learning facilities include computer-equipped classrooms, the Western world's only under-

graduate nuclear science facility and North America's largest Beethoven Center. Focusing on applied research, faculty receive a growing number of contracts and grants each year. From Moss Landing Marine Research Laboratory to the NASA Ames Research Center, faculty are exploring everything from the depths of the ocean to the surface of Mars.

San Jose State University also finds strength in its diversity. For many first-generation students, it is a gateway to economic independence and social mobility. It is also an incubator of cultural and intellectual development, and an opportunity for lifelong learning. Students range in age from first-time freshmen, to college transfers, to professionals seeking additional education. Student demographics - with ethnic pluralism - provide the benefits of multiple cultures and diverse student interests and activities. From residence life, to athletic teams, to social clubs, to co-op jobs - student activities meet the needs of this diverse student body.

## Campus Village

In the fall of 2005, San Jose State University opened the doors of Campus Village to more than 2,279 students, faculty and staff. Positioned on Tenth Street between San Carlos and San Salvador, on the southeast corner of the main campus, Campus Village is a gateway to incredible academic resources and campus activities, the excitement of downtown San Jose, the opportunities of Silicon Valley, and some of the world's greatest recreational areas.

Campus Village includes three buildings featuring apartment and suite-style living accommodations and a typical college dormitory experience. Campus Village includes recreational and study areas, a full-service computer lab, wireless internet access, an interactive gaming center, laundry facilities, meeting rooms, retail stores and underground parking for 700 vehicles. Fully-equipped nearby recreational facilities offer residents space to work out, swim, play basketball, volleyball, ping-pong or pool.

Hassle-free access to the main campus is another asset to Campus Village. Walking to the Student Union or to The Event Center, home for the San Jose State University men's and women's basketball teams, will take five minutes or less. Residents also can walk or bicycle to the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library without crossing any streets.

## The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library

The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library, located on the main campus of San Jose State University, opened in August, 2003.

A first-of-its-kind collaboration between a city and a university, the \$177-million, 475,000 square-foot library provides a center for life-long learning. Students, faculty and the community have access to the information they will need for educational and personal growth throughout their lives.

The 10-floor library features:

- 3,623 seats
- 1,800 seats wired for the internet
- 400 public computers
- 135 databases of information
- Four computer instruction laboratories
- 112 workstations available in the computer instruction labs
- 37 group-project rooms

The collaborative design provides many opportunities for academic, cultural and community programs. Multilingual and special collections for San Jose's diverse ethnic groups are available. An adaptive technology area assures all people have the ability to access the information and databases available.

## **Jon Whitmore** **University President**

Dr. Jon S. Whitmore was named President of San Jose State University in April 2008 with a start date in August 2008.

Dr. Whitmore, whose Ph.D. is from the University of California, Santa Barbara in theatre history, returns to

California after five years (2003-2008) as the Texas Tech University president and a professor of theatre.

His distinguished professional history in academia began in 1967 at Washington State University. Positions at Highline

Community College in Seattle and the University of California preceded an 11-year tenure (1974-1985) at West Virginia University where he gained full professorship and was Interim Dean of the College of Creative Arts. Dr. Whitmore spent five years (1985-1990) at the University of Iowa as the Dean, Faculty of Arts and Letters and a professor of theatre.

He was the Dean of the College of Fine Arts, the Effie Marie Cain Regents Chair and a professor of theatre at the University of Texas (1990-1996) and the Provost and a professor of theatre at the University of Iowa (1996-2003).

The native of Seattle, Wash., earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in speech from Washington State University. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Ian, enrolled at the University of Iowa, and daughter, Amy, enrolled at Vanderbilt University.



## **Tom Bowen** **Director of Athletics**

Tom Bowen was named San Jose State University's director of intercollegiate athletics on December 20, 2004.

Under his leadership and with his vision for the department, San Jose State has established itself as a viable Division I-A intercollegiate athletics program with proven athletic, academic and financial

successes to its credit.

At the core of Bowen's mission for San Jose State University athletics is building a "Culture of Champions" academically, athletically and in the community. To that end, the Notre Dame alum has overhauled the department's infrastructure; invested resources both in external and internal operations; initiated an enhanced website presence; and expanded marketing, promotions and advertising opportunities locally, regionally and nationally with the creation of Spartan Sports Properties.

As an integral member of the University's presidential staff, he has created new short and long-term revenue streams for intercollegiate athletics and many other campus extra-curricular activities. His initiatives and leadership have created new energy department-wide and throughout the university. The university has benefitted from Athletics' increasing visibility, receiving record donations, particularly in 2006-07.

In 2007-08, the Spartans sent their women's gymnastics team to NCAA post-season action and had individuals from the women's swimming and women's golf teams compete in NCAA Championships. Women's water polo was ranked seventh in the final national coaches poll. Men's basketball had its best win total since the 2001 season. San Jose State capped the school year with a budget surplus for an unprecedented third year in a row and was cited as one of 12 Division I universities cited for Overall Excellence in Diversity in a national study by Texas A&M University on behalf of the NCAA.

In 2006-07, football capped its finest season in nearly two decades, posting a 9-4 overall record and capturing the New Mexico Bowl championship. Women's cross country and women's water polo, ranked sixth nationally in the final coaches' poll, turned in their best record in years. The 2007 season marked the second year in a row a Spartan won the Western Athletic Conference women's golf individual title.

In 2005-06, San Jose State won the Western Athletic Conference women's golf championship, recorded its highest finish ever at a NCAA regional championship in women's gymnastics, produced seven teams out of 16 with its best conference

finish in years, and had WAC "Coaches of the Year" in women's golf and softball.

Bowen's vision for student-athlete success and excellence led to the creation of a Student Success Services component. Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores as measured by the NCAA have risen steadily under his watch.

Bowen came to San Jose State after serving three years as the Director of Community Affairs for the San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League. Also serving as the executive director of the 49ers Foundation, San Francisco was the first NFL franchise to implement an annual giving program.

His Division I experience at the collegiate level includes athletics administration positions at the University of California and Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif. At the University of California, Bowen was credited with developing the first comprehensive planned giving program for the Golden Bears.

At Saint Mary's College, he was the Director of Foundations and Corporate Relations before being appointed to an associate director of athletics position by the president of the college. His grant proposal acumen helped raise \$6.1-million in academic funding for the institution. For three years he managed the athletics department's budget, directed a corporate sponsorship program and interacted with the campus community on student-athlete issues.

His first professional leadership appointment in athletics was at De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. From 1987 through 1995, he held the positions of assistant football coach and athletics director.

He is a Level 2 certified member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA), the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and the National Society of Fund Raising Executives.

The 1983 graduate of the University of Notre Dame played high school football at Moreau High in Hayward, Calif. He majored in theology/sociology and spent six years studying for the priesthood with the Holy Cross Fathers. Bowen went on to earn a master's degree in administration/education from the University of San Francisco in 1990.

He was named to the 2008 San Jose Mercury News' Top-25 Most Powerful Sports Figures in the Bay Area. Bowen is an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco School of Sports Management and at San Jose State University's Department of Kinesiology where he teaches sports management classes.

The Denver, Colo., native and his wife, Mia, are the parents of three children: sons, Andrew and Peter, and, daughter, McKenna.



The Koret Athletic Training Center, opened in November 2001, is a state-of-the-art facility that encompasses over 10,000 square-feet of training space and is located adjacent to Spartan Stadium, the athletic locker rooms and the football practice field.

The Koret Athletic Training Center also contains a 1,000 square-foot rehabilitation and training room that services physical therapy and sports specific rehabilitation. The facility enables the sports medicine staff of athletic trainers, doctors, and physical therapists to provide the best possible care to help prevent and rehabilitate injuries.



## Our Philosophy

- We teach a hands-on approach where the student-athlete is expected to develop a comprehensive understanding of not only the “how’s”, but the “why’s” of our program.
- We teach correct movement patterns to optimize efficiency and performance.
- Our program design is centered on ground-based, free weight, multi-joint movements that will transfer to the playing field and keep our student-athletes out of our sports medicine facility.
- Our primary concern is the development of speed in all our sports.
- We develop speed and flexibility through strength.
- Our speed program consists of functional and straight-line speed training. Functional means acceleration, deceleration and change-of-direction work.
- We train through an entire range-of-motion in all lifts to enhance active flexibility, develop strength to prevent injury, and unlock joints with mobility issues.
- Olympic-based movements are utilized for speed of movement, active flexibility and dynamic stability.
- Squats and deadlifts have a permanent home in our program for developing hip strength and back stability. Single-leg variations are used to fix strength imbalance and lateral deficits.

Garcia was a quarterback on the 1991, 1992 and 1993 San Jose State teams. As a sophomore, he was third nationally in passing efficiency. He led San Jose State to its first win in school history over a Big Ten Conference team, the University of

Minnesota, and went on to receive honorable mention All-America recognition in 1992. The school record holder for total offense with 7,274 yards was named the "Outstanding Offensive Player" at the 1994 East-West Shrine All-Star Game in Palo Alto, Calif.

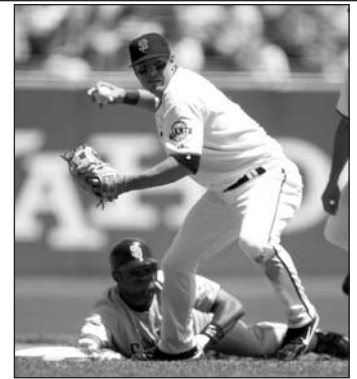

Professionally, he played five seasons (1994 through 1998) for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League, was a four-time all-star and led the team to the 1998 Grey Cup championship. Garcia joined the San Francisco 49ers in 1999 and took the team to playoff appearances in 2001 and 2002. He was a Cleveland Brown in 2004, a Detroit Lion in 2005 and led the Philadelphia Eagle to the playoffs in 2006. In 2007 he joined the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and guided them to an NFC South Championship and playoff berth. Garcia earned his degree in business administration through the National Football League's Continuing Education Program.

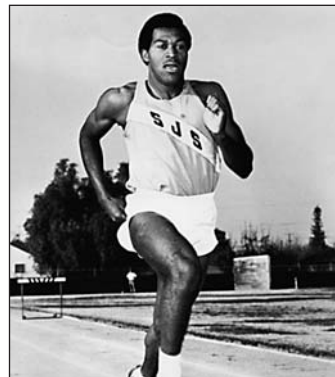

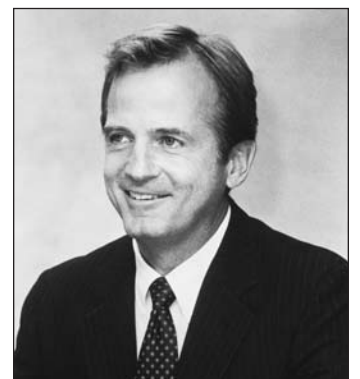

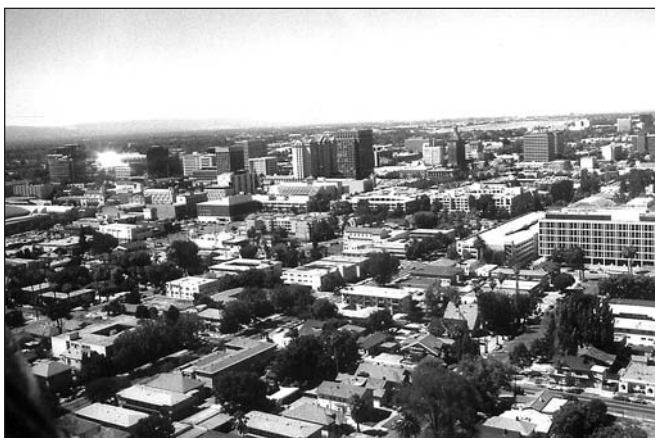
