



Wayne Wright
Head Coach

Wayne Wright is in his ninth season as the head coach of the San Jose State women's gymnastics team. The Spartan program has made significant strides during Wright's tenure, breaking school records, winning conference championships and receiving team invitations to the NCAA West Regional.

The 2009 season provided many highlights for the Spartans as the team advanced to the NCAA West Regional for the fourth time in school history. Two gymnasts, Veronica Porte and Thomasina Wallace, advanced to the NCAA Championships in the all-around, just the second time in school history any Spartan has competed at the championships. Wallace won the NCAA West Regional Bar title, the first in school history, and was named the 2009 Western Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year. Six gymnasts received first or second team All-WAC honors.

Wright and the 2008 Spartans advanced to the NCAA West Regional for just the third time in the program's history. The Spartans finished second at the WAC Championships by just .200. Two gymnasts were first team All-WAC honorees,

Veronica Porte and Emily Stebbins, while Shanice Howard, Renae Moneymaker and Porte all received second team All-WAC recognition.

In 2007, two Spartan gymnasts, Porte and Alise Blackwell, competed in the allaround at the NCAA West Regional.

Porte received All-Western Athletic

Conference honors in the all-around and on the yault and floor.

Wright helped lead the 2006 Spartan team to its second team appearance at the NCAA West Regional. San Jose State finished fourth, the best in program history The Spartans broke the school vault team and individual records during the year. Wright also helped the Spartans transition to competing in the Western Athletic Conference. Three gymnasts received All-WAC honors - Renae Moneymaker, Veronica Porte and Kelsey Spellacy.

The 2005 team had a 17-5 overall record and placed second at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Championships. Three gymnasts - Jennifer Greene, Greta Leach and Michelle Minotti, qualified for the NCAA West Regionals in the allaround.

The 2004 season was a successful year as the Spartans recorded a 16-9 record and won the MPSF Championship held at Spartan Gym. Three individuals won MPSF titles - Shirla Choy, bars; Amberly Klein, beam; and Jennifer Greene, floor. The first 10.0 score was posted by a Spartan gymnast as Greene

was perfect on the floor at the MPSF Championships.

For the 2003 season, Wright posted an overall record of 12-9. The team broke every event record in Spartan history under his instruction. For the first time in school history, the Spartans qualified as a team for the NCAA West Regional competition. The team placed second at the MPSF Championships, and Wright was named the MPSF "Coach of the Year."

In 2002, the Spartans were 12-9-0. Wright coached four individuals at the NCAA West Regional meet, the most in school history. The team broke the school floor record and placed third at the MPSF Championships.

Wright believes firmly in the importance of academics and athletics in a college education. Five teams, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2005, had the highest grade point average among San Jose State's 16 intercollegiate athletic teams. Three gymnasts were named 2007 Scholastic All-Americans by the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches, and 41 have been named to the Academic All-WAC team. Since 2000, 43 gymnasts have received "Scholastic All-America" honors.

As an assistant coach, Wright was at Stanford from 1996- 2001 and at San Jose State from 1987-1996. While at Stanford, Wright helped coach the team to its first Pac-10 title in 1998 and an NCAA West Regional championship. During his first

stint at San Jose State he coached Tara Law, the 1996 Big West floor champion, to the NCAA West Regional.

Before he began collegiate coaching, Wright served as program director and head coach of the Kokokahi Gymnastics Center in Kailua, Hawaii, developing Class I National Junior Olympics gymnasts. He also worked with U.S.A. Gymnastics at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and was on the floor when the team won the gold medal.

Wright served on the local organizing committee for the 2007 VISA U.S.A. Women's Gymnastics Championships held at the HP Pavilion in San Jose. He helped to insure that the meet was run smoothly for all participants and spectators.

Wright has an extensive background in nursing and physical education. He graduated from the Academy of Health Sciences in Texas with a degree in nursing. He also studied physical education and recreation at the University of Hawai'i.

Wright served three years in the U.S. Army as a nurse attached to Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. He is a certified phlebotomy technician and a candidate for a California Nurse's License.







**Meghan Donahue**Assistant Coach

Meghan Donahue is in her third season as an assistant coach for the San Jose State women's gymnastics program. She was honored last year for her work with the Spartan team as she was named the 2009 NCAA West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

Donahue spent three seasons as a student assistant coach for the BYU women's gymnastics program after competing in the 2003 and 2004 seasons. She competed on the vault for her alma mater and scored a 9.800 five times during her freshman season. Donahue's sophomore season was cut short after the first three meets of the season due to a torn ankle tendon.

As a student assistant coach, Donahue assisted the coaching staff on the various apparatus and developed an ongoing conditioning program for the team. She created public relations material and promoted the team in various methods.

During her undergraduate days, Donahue worked in various positions in the athletics department. She was a strength and conditioning intern, supervising weight lifting for the women's soccer team. She was also a supervisor and coordinator of the BYU Football Game Host Program and the greeting workforce for BYU's major donors.

Donahue competed for Gymnastics World during her club competition. She was a two-time Level 9 and a Level 10 Vault Champion in Arizona.

A native of Arizona, Donahue graduated from Brigham Young University with a bachelor of science degree in exercise science in the spring of 2007. She was a fitness and wellness management major with a minor in psychology.



**Shella Martinez** Assistant Coach

Shella Martinez is in her seventh season as a member of the San Jose State women's gymnastics coaching staff. She brings over 12 years of coaching experience to the Spartans. Martinez is the beam coach and handles all choreography for the Spartans.

Prior to coming to San Jose State, Martinez spent five seasons as the Developmental Program Director and head coach for Pegasus Gymnastics Academy in Milpitas, Calif. During Martinez's career as a head coach she trained a Level 10 national competitor, Level 10 regional qualifiers, and Level 5, 6 and 7 state championship teams.

From 1995 to 1998, Martinez worked at Funtastics Gymnastics, in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho where she developed and implemented programs to aid in the teaching of fundamental gymnastics.

Martinez competed for the Gold Cup Gymnastics Academy in Albuquerque, N.M. Her personal achievements as a gymnast include competing at Nationals as a Level 10 gymnast and at Regionals as a Level 9 and 10 gymnast. In 1989, Martinez won the Level 8 New Mexico state championships.

Currently, Martinez attends San Jose State University and is working toward a bachelor's degree in biology.

**SJSU:** Shanice is in her third season as a member of the San Jose State women's gymnastics team.

2009: Shanice competed on the vault and floor for the Spartans. She was a first team All-WAC honoree on floor after tying for second with a career-best 9.875. On the floor, Howard received a 9.800 or better in four meets - at CS Fullerton, at Seattle Pacific, against Utah State and at the WAC Championships. One the vault, scored a 9.750 at Seattle Pacific and against Sacramento State.

2008: Howard competed on the vault and floor for the Spartans. She was a second team All-WAC honoree on vault and floor. Howard had a 9.800 on vault at the WAC Championships to tie for sixth place and a 9.850 on floor to tie for sixth place. On vault, Howard scored a season-best 9.850 at the UC Davis quadrangular meet in March. She added a 9.825 against Southern Utah, had a 9.800 in four other meets and averaged a 9.733. On floor, Howard tied for first against Southern Utah with a 9.850, and won the floor against UC Davis with a season-best 9.875. Howard received a 9.850 at the

UC Davis quadrangular in March. She scored a 9.700 or better in every meet but one and has a 9.777 average.

CLUB: Howard competed for South Coast Gymnastics under Chinese Olympic team members Xiaoping Li and Jia Wen. Howard, a Level 10 competitor, finished second in the all-around and on the vault at the 2007 Lady Luck Invitational in Las Vegas. She placed third in the all-around and captured the vault title at Chris Waller's Heart of a Champion Invitational 2007. Howard was a club teammate of current Spartan Katie Merritt.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Howard graduated from Tesoro High School in 2007. She lettered in track her freshman year where she did the long jump, 300 hurdles and relays.

PERSONAL: Shanice is majoring in kinesiology with a pre-professional emphasis and would like to work as a physical therapist after graduation. Twice a San Jose State Scholar Athlete, she is a two-time Academic All-WAC honoree and NACGC/W Scholastic All-America Team selection. She is a President Scholar and a Top-Five Scholar Athlete at San Jose State. In her spare time, she enjoys watching movies and reading. Jessica Khoshnood All-Around 5-3, Senior Seattle, Wash./ Gymnastics East

**SJSU:** Jessica is in her fourth year with the San Jose State women's gymnastics team.

2009: Khoshnood competed primarily on the bars and floor. On bars, she competed in all in 12 meets and scored a 9.700 or better in 10 meets including a 9.800 at Seattle Pacific and a 9.750 in final four meets of the year. Khoshnood performed on the floor in nine meets. She scored a 9.700 or better in seven meets including a 9.775 at Seattle Pacific and against Utah State. At the WAC Championships, she also competed on the beam and received an 8.900.

2008: Khoshnood was a bar specialist for the Spartans and competed in all 13 meets. She tied her career-best with a 9.800 against Southern Utah. Khoshnood has scored a 9.700 or better in six meets including a 9.775 against Sacramento State and Wisconsin-Stout.

**2007:** Khoshnood competed primarily on bars, beam and floor for the Spartans but also competed on the vault early in the season. On the vault, she scored a seasonbest 9.575 at Stanford and at Seattle

Pacific. On the bars, Khoshnood scored a season-best 9.800 at UC Davis at the end of the season and added a 9.775 at Southern Utah and a 9.750 twice.

Khoshnood scored a 9.850 on beam at Sacramento State and added a 9.750 versus CS Fullerton and at UC Davis at the end of the year. On floor, she scored a 9.800 at UC Davis and added a 9.700 at Seattle Pacific and at the WAC Championships. She tallied a 38.650 in the all-around at Seattle Pacific in her only all-around competition.

CLUB: Khoshnood competed for Gymnastics East and coaches John and Tammy Carney. A teammate of Kelli Fournier during club season, Khoshnood was the 2006 state and region II champion in the all-around. At the 2006 Junior Olympic National Championships, she finished seventh in the all-around, fifth on the bars and eighth on the beam.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Khoshnood graduated from Newport High School in 2006.

PERSONAL: Jessica is majoring in business with an emphasis in accounting. She is a three-time San Jose State Scholar Athlete and Academic All-WAC selection and a NACGC/W Scholastic All-America Team honoree. Her hobbies include watching movies and reading. She scored a 9.775 or better in four meets. Lee received a 9.800 at Seattle Pacific and a 9.775 at Sacramento State and at Southern Utah. Lee also performed on the floor in the first meet of the year at CS Fullerton where she scored a 9.050.

CLUB: Lee was a Level 10 gymnast at Flips USA Gymnastics in Reno. She played 45th in the all-around at the 2007 Level 10 Nationals Senior "B" group. She is a four-time Level 10 regional qualifier and qualified for the 2008 nationals. Lee was fourth in the all-around at the 2007 Nevada championships and 11th in the all-around at the 2006 Region I Level 10 competition. She was the 2004 bar state champion and the 2005 stat champion on beam and floor.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** Lee graduated from North Valley High School in Reno, Nev., in 2008.

PERSONAL: Aubrey is a communications major with a minor in graphic design. She enjoys drawing and photography. Lee is a San Jose State Scholar Athlete and an Academic All-WAC honoree. Aubrey E. Lee was born on January 1, 1990, in Reno, Nev.

2008: Louie competed on floor in seven meets and won at the UC Davis quadrangular in February with a career-best 9.750. She added a 9.725 in a home meet against UC Davis and a 9.700 versus Southern Utah. Louie also competed on the bars in the first meet of the season and had a 9.050.

Swann scored a 9.800 or better in nine meets. For three meets, Swann competed on the beam and scored a season-high 9.725 at Southern Utah. Swann also competed on the floor in the first three meets of the season.

2008: Swann competed in eight meets. Her first action of the season came on the bars in a home meet against Sacramento State and Wisconsin-Stout where she scored a 9.325. Swann competed on the vault in five meets with a season-best 9.750 against Southern Utah. She competed on the beam in three meets and had her best score, 9.750, at the NCAA West

# Jon Whitmore University President

Dr. Jon Whitmore started as the President of San Jose Staté University in August 2008.

Dr. Whitmore, whose Ph.D. is from the University of California, Santa Barbara in theatre history, returned to California after five years (2003-2008) as the Texas Tech University president and a professor of theatre.

His distinguished professional history in academia began in 1967 at Washington State University. Positions at Highline Community College in Seattle and the University of California preceded an 11-year tenure (1974-1985) at West Virginia University where he gained full professorship and was Interim Dean of the College of Creative Arts. Dr. Whitmore spent five years (1985-1990) at the University of Iowa as the Dean, Faculty of Arts and Letters and a professor of theatre.

He was the Dean of the College of Fine Arts, the Effie Marie Cain Regents Chair and a professor of theatre at the University of Texas (1990-1996) and the Provost and a professor of theatre at the University of Iowa (1996-2003).

The native of Seattle, Wash., earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in speech from Washington State University. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Ian, enrolled at the University of Iowa, and daughter, Amy, enrolled at Vanderbilt University.






