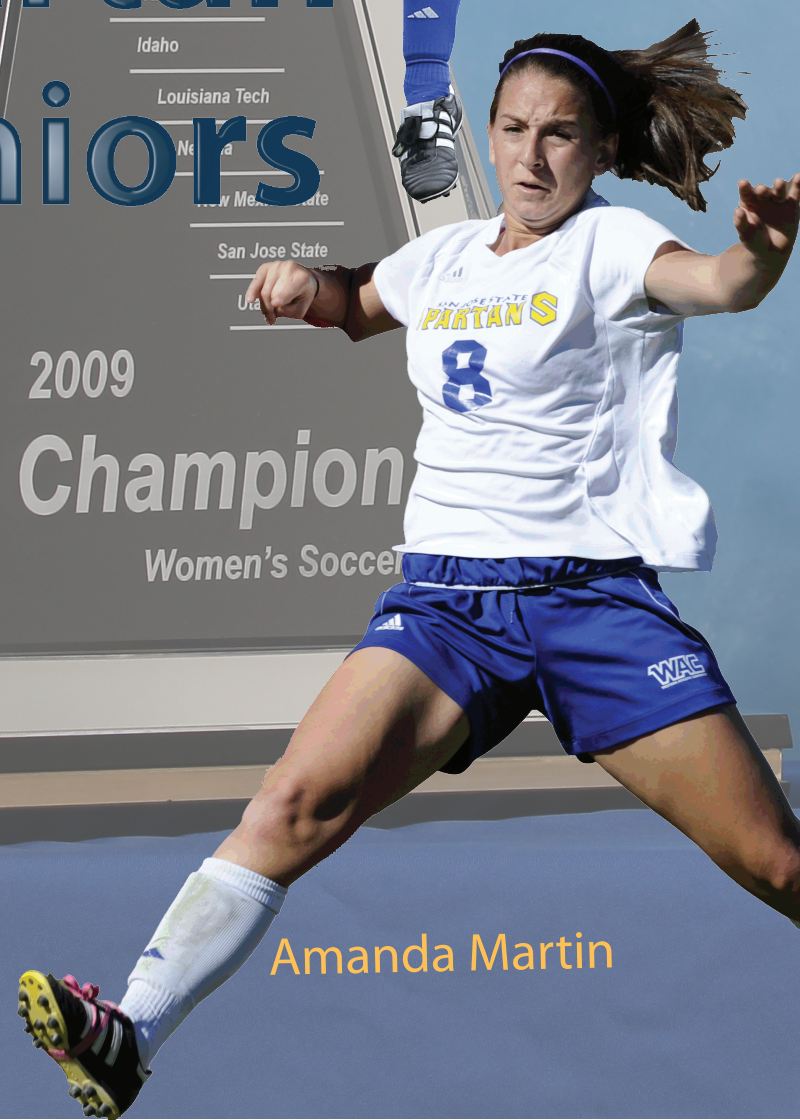

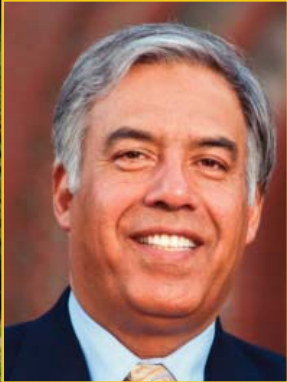

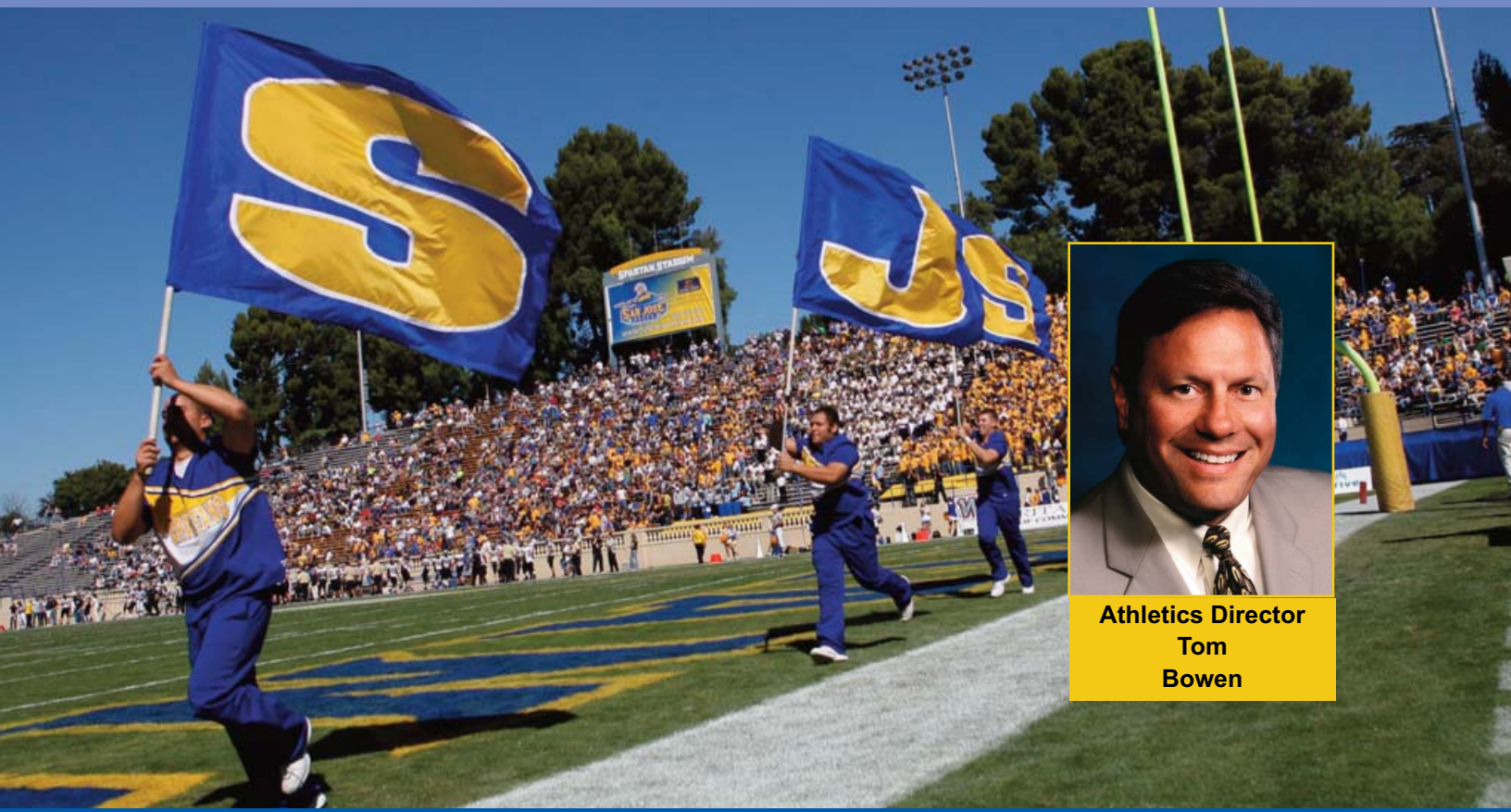

Jeff Leightman enters his fourth season with the Spartans. He was named the San Jose State University women's soccer head coach in February 2008.

In 2010, Leightman led the team to its second-straight regular-season conference title and winning campaign with a 12-7-2 record. San Jose State broke a team mark for most single-season wins against Western Athletic Conference opponents with six. The program received numerous awards from the 2010 All-WAC women's soccer teams with a Freshman of the Year distinction and three players earning All-WAC honors. Three more of Coach Leightman's players were named to the WAC All-Tournament Team.

Leightman quickly placed his stamp on the San Jose State program with the 2009 WAC regular season championship - the first for the university in its 15-year history. The Spartans notched their first winning record in 10 years with their 11-6-3 win-loss record. A single-season school record 14-match streak without a loss ignited by five consecutive shutout victories put San Jose State on the right track. Four Spartans were first-team All-WAC selections and one more earned second-team conference honors in addition to Leightman becoming just the second San Jose State women's soccer coach to be a WAC Coach of the Year.

The success on the pitch in his first three seasons with the Spartans parallels the team's academic success. San Jose State players have 27 Academic All-WAC awards since the 2008 season. In 2009 and 2010, the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) recognized the Spartans with one of its Team Awards for achieving a team grade-point average over 3.00 on a 4.00 scale. In 2010, San Jose State also had its first player in eight years earn an Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sports Scholar Award.



Leightman heads into the 2011 season with a 28-24-9 win-loss record at San Jose State and a 130-90-30 mark in 13 seasons as a major college head coach. He came to the Spartans after a successful 10-season run at Binghamton University.



A COAST-TO-COAST PROGRAM BUILDER

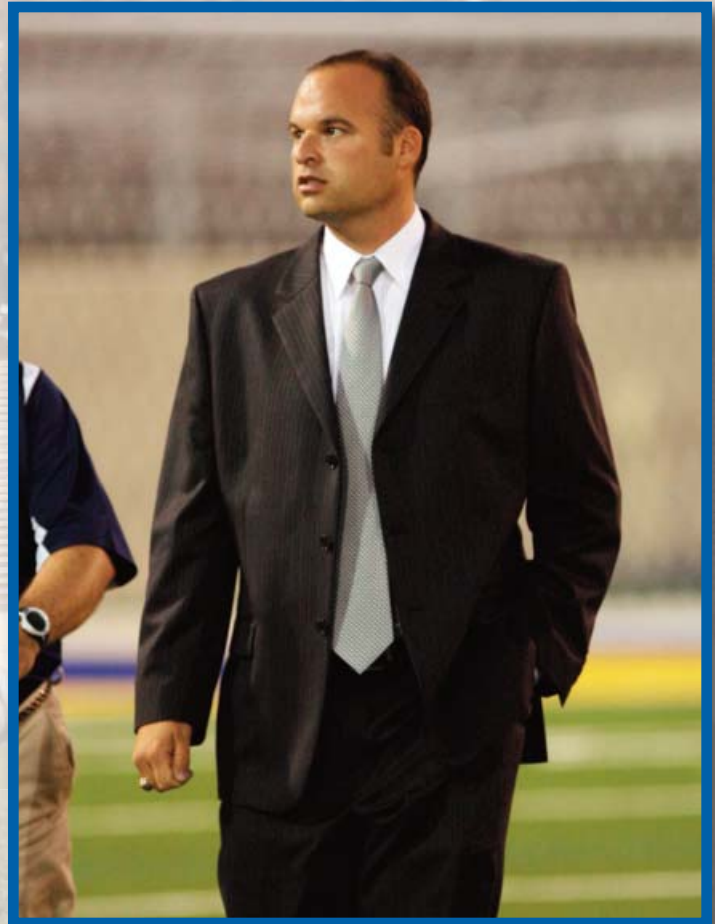
Coaching at his alma mater, he seamlessly transitioned Binghamton from a mediocre Division III team into a regionally-ranked Division I force in the East. Leightman left Binghamton for San Jose State as its winningest women's soccer coach, compiling an overall record of 102-66-21 from 1998 through 2007.

In 1998, Leightman's first year and the program's first in NCAA Division II, the Bearcats finished with a 14-3-1 record and the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) crown.

In 2004, Binghamton won the America East Conference title and earned an NCAA Championship Tournament berth in just its fourth season competing at the Division I level. The Bearcats' success resulted in Leightman receiving America East Conference Coach of the Year honors.

Over seven years of Division I competition, Leightman directed his squad to top-10 Northeast Region rankings by both the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and Soccer Buzz Magazine. In 2001, Soccer Buzz ranked Binghamton as the top first-year Division I program in the nation.

Respected by his coaching colleagues, Leightman served as the America East Women's Soccer Coaches' Chair from 2005-07, the National Chairman for the NSCAA/adidas rankings and the East Region Chairman for the NSCAA Scholar-Athlete All-America Committee.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP AND ODP EXPERIENCE

Leightman's coaching career began with a three-season tenure in 1993 as an assistant at Binghamton. The Bearcats went 39-13-8 overall during that span, earned a conference championship, was ranked second nationally in 1995 and played in the 1995 NCAA Division III Championship. He moved to the University of North Carolina for the 1996 season and was an assistant coach on the Tar Heels' NCAA Division I championship team. After a year as a Villanova University assistant coach, he returned to Binghamton as the women's team head coach.



Since 1999, Leightman has worked for the Olympic Development Program. Presently, he is the head coach of the DeAnza Force U17 team based in Cupertino, Calif. The Force competes in the Elite Club National League (ECNL), the most elite program in girls' youth soccer.

Craig Winans enters his sixth season as a member of the Spartans' coaching staff in 2011.

A central figure in San Jose State's current revival in women's soccer, Winans' recruiting efforts produced 13 present and past Spartans All-WAC honorees. Overseeing the team's academics program, 37 Spartans are Academic All-WAC award winners. In 2009 and 2010, San Jose State received a National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Awards.

Winans has been a staff coaching instructor for the California Youth Soccer Association (CYSA), based in Pleasanton, Calif., since 1994 and is on the Region IV Olympic Development Program (ODP) coaching staff.

Prior to joining the Spartans, Winans was the director of coaching of the Xtreme Soccer Club, based in Pacifica, Calif, and was the girls' head coach at Sacred Heart Cathedral Preparatory in San Francisco, Calif., from 2004 through 2006.

The 1981 San Francisco State University graduate is licensed to practice accounting in California and played college soccer while enrolled at the Air Force Academy.

The San Francisco native holds the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "A" coaching license, a USSF National Youth license, NSCAA Premier diploma and NSCAA National Goalkeeping diploma.



He was a United States Youth Soccer Region I staff coach and was the Director of Coaching for the BC United Fusion, a premier girls' youth soccer program, from 2004-07. He was the girls' head coach of the New York State West ODP U16 and U17 teams in 1999-2000.

Leightman earned a bachelor's degree majoring in biological sciences from Binghamton in 1995. He holds an NSCAA Premier diploma.

Dave Lovercheck enters his third season as an assistant coach with the San Jose State Women's soccer team. He joined the staff in 2009 as a volunteer assistant and was promoted to assistant coach in 2010.

In 2010, Lovercheck mentored Meghan Maiwald to a season in which she set a program record for shutouts in a season and led the WAC in total saves and saves-per-game, in addition to garnering WAC All-Tournament Team recognition.

In addition to his time working with the goalkeepers he is responsible for all aspects of team technical and tactical training, positional training, video analysis, scouting and is the recruiting coordinator for the Spartans.

Along with working at San Jose State, he is also involved with the MVLA Soccer Club (Mountain View/Los Altos) where he coaches the U14 girls Pride Black and Blue teams. He has also worked with the Olympic Development Program as well as several other area youth clubs, and he served as Head Coach and Director of Soccer at Gunn High School in Palo Alto, Calif. He was also involved with FC Gold Pride, a one-time member of the Women's Professional Soccer league in its inaugural season as the Head Equipment manager.

Coach Lovercheck played collegiately for Hunter College in New York, N.Y., where he was a four-year captain and two-time all-league selection. He also played for seven years for the Central Park Rangers FC. He earned a BS in Organizational Behavior and Leadership from the University of San Francisco in 2010.

Brigid Wood begins her first season at San Jose State as the volunteer assistant during the 2011-12 school year.

Wood arrives at SJSU from Washington & Jefferson College, where she spent two seasons as the assistant coach for the Presidents' women's soccer program.

While at Washington & Jefferson, the team won back-to-back Presidents Athletic Conference titles.

Wood graduated from Penn State-Harrisburg in 2008 with a degree in communications. She also attended Seton Hall University as a freshman and was a member of the women's soccer team.

She spent the 2008 season as an assistant coach for the Cornell University women's soccer program. While at Cornell, Wood served as the primary goalkeeper coach and assisted in gameday preparation and scouting of opposing teams.

Wood provided instruction at camps hosted by Gettysburg College, U.S. Naval Academy, University of North Carolina, University of Pennsylvania and Penn State University.

Wood holds an NSCAA national diploma, NSCAA national youth diploma and a NSCAA national goalkeeper diplomas.
