



Wayne Wright Head Coach 11th Season

Wayne Wright is in his 11th season as the head coach of the San Jose State women's gymnastics team. The Spartan program has made significant strides during Wright's tenure, breaking school records, winning conference championships and receiving team invitations to the NCAA West Regional.

Since 2003, the Spartans have competed as a team at five NCAA Regionals. In the years not competing at a team, at least two gymnasts have advanced to regionals. The team's best finish has been fourth in 2006 and 2011. Two gymnasts have Regional Championships – Thomasina Wallace on bars in 2009 and Katie Valleau on floor in 2011.

Wright has also coached three gymnasts at the NCAA Championships. In 2011, Valleau was the first Spartan to compete at the championships as an individual special-

ist after she tied for first on the floor at the regionals with a 9.900. Veronica Porte and Wallace advanced to the 2009 NCAA Championships in the all-around as the top-two qualifiers from the West Region.

The Spartans have broken every team school record since 2004 including the beam record in 2011 and the vault record in 2009. Every individual record has also been tied or broken over the past 11 years. Last year, two records were tied (beam and floor).

Outside the gym, Wright believes firmly in the importance of academics and athletics in a college education. The 2011 team posted the highest grade-point average among all 16 San Jose State intercollegiate teams. In his 10 seasons, 26 gymnastics have received 58 Academic All-WAC Awards, while 24 gymnasts received 45 NACGC/W Scholastic All-America recognition.

Wright's teams are also one of the top Spartan teams in giving back to the community. In the fall of 2011, the team participated in the 5th Annual SJSU Day of Service as they tagged books for a local, categorizing them by reading level and the quiz number and how many points the students earn in accelerated reading. The team participates in various activities throughout the season and participates in "Think Pink" month in February as all teams raise the aware-

ness of breast cancer research.

As an assistant coach, Wright was at Stanford from 1996- 2001 and at San Jose State from 1987-1996. While at Stanford, Wright helped coach the team to its first Pac-10 title in 1998 and an NCAA West Regional championship. During his first stint at San Jose State he coached Tara Law, the 1996 Big West floor champion, to the NCAA West Regional.

Before he began collegiate coaching, Wright served as program director and head coach of the Kokokahi Gymnastics Center in Kailua, Hawaii, developing Class I National Junior Olympics gymnasts. He also worked with U.S.A. Gymnastics at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and was on the floor when the team won the gold medal.

Active in the community, Wright served on the local organizing committee for the 2007 VISA U.S.A. Women's Gymnastics Championships held at the HP Pavilion in San Jose. He helped to insure that the meet was run smoothly for all participants and spectators.

Wright has an extensive background in nursing and physical education. He graduated from the Academy of Health Sciences in Texas with a degree in nursing. He also studied physical education and recreation at the University of Hawai'i.

Wright served three years in the U.S. Army as a nurse attached to Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu, Hawaii. He is a certified phlebotomy technician and a candidate for a California Nurse's License.




Liz Major Assistant Coach 1st Season

Former Spartan women's gymnast Liz Major begins her first season as a member of the San Jose State coaching staff in 2012.

Major graduated from San Jose State in 2007 with a degree in psychology. She was a four-time San Jose State Scholar Athlete and an Academic All-Western Athletic Conference honoree. Major competed for the Spartans from 2004-07 and specialized on bars her senior year.

After graduation, Major returned to her home state of Colorado where she received a master's degree in sport and performance psychology from the University of Denver in 2010. She was a club coach at Aurora School of Gymnastics where she worked with preschoolers through optionals and helped with choreography.



Shella Martinez Assistant Coach 8th Season

Shella Martinez is in her eighth season as a member of the San Jose State women's gymnastics coaching staff. She brings over 12 years of coaching experience to the Spartans. Martinez is the beam coach and handles all choreography for the Spartans.

Prior to coming to San Jose State, Martinez spent five seasons as the Developmental Program Director and head coach for Pegasus Gymnastics Academy in Milpitas, Calif. During Martinez's career as a head coach she trained a Level 10 national competitor, Level 10 regional qualifiers, and Level 5, 6 and 7 state championship teams.

From 1995 to 1998, Martinez worked at Funtastics Gymnastics, in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho where she developed and implemented programs to aid in the teaching of fundamental gymnastics.

SJSU: Aubrey is in her fourth season on the San Jose State women's gymnastics team.

2011: Aubrey competed on the vault, beam and floor in all 12 meets. She tied the Spartan beam record with a 9.900 at Southern Utah in February to win the event and had a 9.700 or better in five meets. On vault, she scored a career-best 9.725 at the WAC Championships. On floor, Lee scored a 9.700 or better in eight meets including a career-best 9.850 in a home meet against Boise State, UC Davis and Seattle Pacific.

2010: Lee competed in all 12 meets for San Jose State. She competed in every meet on the vault, 11 on the beam and five on the floor. She had her best meet at the WAC Championships with a 9.700 on vault, 9.800 on beam and a 9.725 on floor. Lee recorded a 9.800 on the beam in three meets – vs. California and Stanford, at Utah State and at the WAC Championships.



2009: Aubrey was a beam specialist for the Spartans. She was a first team All-WAC honoree on beam after finishing third at the WAC Championships with a season-best 9.850. She scored a 9.775 or better in four meets. Lee received a 9.800 at Seattle Pacific and a 9.775 at Sacramento State and at Southern Utah. Lee also performed on the floor in the first meet of the year at CS Fullerton where she scored a 9.050.



CLUB: Lee was a Level 10 gymnast at Flips USA Gymnastics in Reno. She played 45th in the allaround at the 2007 Level 10 Nationals Senior "B" group. She is a four-time Level 10 regional qualifier and qualified for the 2008 nationals. Lee was fourth in the all-around at the 2007 Nevada championships and 11th in the all-around at the 2006 Region I Level 10 competition.

HIGH SCHOOL: Lee graduated from North Valley High School in Reno, Nev., in 2008.

PERSONAL: Aubrey is a communications major with a public relations minor and would like to travel after graduation. She enjoys arts and crafts and participates in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Lee is a San Jose State Scholar Athlete and an Academic All-WAC honoree. 


SJSU: Casey is in her fourth season on the San Jose State women's gymnastics team.

2011: Casey competed on the floor in all 12 meets as a floor specialist for the Spartans. She had a 9.800 against Utah State and Wisconsin-Eau Claire, 9.775 at Southern Utah and scored a 9.700 or better in six meets.

2010: McCord competed in six meets, four on the vault and two on the floor. On the vault, her best score came at Boise State with a 9.700. She added a 9.550 in two other meets. McCord had a season-best 9.675 on the floor against Cal State Fullerton.

2009: McCord did not compete in a meet for the Spartans.





SJSU: Katie is in her fourth year on the San Jose State women's gymnastics team. She joined the team as a walk-on her freshman year and earned a full-ride scholarship her junior year.

2011: Valleau competed on the floor at the NCAA Championships where she scored a 9.725. She qualified for the championships after tying for first on the floor at the NCAA Corvallis Regional with a career-best 9.900. Katie was the first Spartan to win a regional floor title and the first to qualify as a specialist for the championships. A first team All-Western Athletic Conference honoree on floor, she tied for second at the conference meet with a 9.825. She did not receive a score lower than a 9.725 in 12 meets and spent much of the year ranked in the top-25 nationally on floor. Valleau had a 9.875 in two meets and a 9.850 in two meets. She won the floor at two other meets - California/ UC Davis with a 9.825, and a home meet against Sacramento State with a 9.850. Valleau competed on the vault in seven meets with a 9.650 at Southern Utah.



2010: Katie competed in 10 meets on the vault and all 12 meets on the floor. On the vault, she scored a 9.675 against Sacramento State and UC Davis and added a 9.650 at the WAC Championships. On the floor, Valleau scored a 9.875 against Stanford and California, a 9.850 against Cal State Fullerton and a 9.800 or better in four meets.



2009: Valleau competed on the floor in all 12 meets. She received her best score of the year with a 9.825 at the WAC Championships. She scored a 9.800 at Seattle Pacific and against Utah State and a 9.700 or higher in eight meets.

CLUB: Valleau competed for Mission Valley YMCA. She was second in the all-around at the 2008 Southern California Championships and ninth on the floor at the 2008 Region I Championships.

HIGH SCHOOL: Valleau graduated from the San Diego School of Creative and Performing Arts in 2008.

SJSU: Thomasina is in her fourth year competing on the San Jose State women's gymnastics team

2011: Thomasina competed in the all-around in 11 of the 12 meets. She was a first team All-WAC honoree on bars and a second team honoree in the all-around. On vault, she won the event at three meets and tied her career best with a 9.900 against Sacramento State. On bars, Wallace won the event at six meets and scored a 9.900 in a home quadrangular meet. She scored a 9.825 at the WAC Championships to tie for third. On beam, Wallace tied the school record with a 9.900 in the home quadrangular meet and won the event at two other meets. On the floor, Wallace recorded a career-high 9.925 against Utah State and Wisconsin-Eau Claire.

Wallace won the all-around at five meets. She scored a season-best 39.325 in the quadrangular meet with Boise State and added a 39.250 at Southern Utah, a home meet with Sacramento State and the NCAA Corvallis Regional. Wallace was fourth in the all-around at the regional and was the first alternate to the championships.

2010: Wallace competed in the all-around in the first 10 meets of the year before an injury forced her to miss the final two meets. She started the year strong by winning the all-around in the first three meets and had a season-best 39.325 in her final meet of the year at Utah State. Wallace scored no lower than a 38.500 in the all-around.

On the vault, Wallace won the event in the first meet of the year at UC Davis with a 9.825.

On the bars, she won at three meets and scored her season-best 9.925 at UC Davis to open the season. On beam, her best score came at Utah State with a 9.900. Wallace won the floor at Sacramento State with a 9.850 and added a 9.900 against Stanford and California at Spartan Gym.

2009: Thomasina compiled one of the best freshman seasons in school history. She was the first San Jose State gymnast to win an event at a regional meet, tying the school record with a 9.950 on bars at the West Regional in Seattle. Wallace was one of two Spartans to ad-

vance to the NCAA Championships in the all-around. At the championships, her best score came on bars with a 9.750.

Wallace is also the first Spartan to be a WAC Champion as she won the floor with a 9.900. She was selected the WAC Freshman of the Year, a first team All-WAC honoree on bars (9.875) and floor (9.900) and a second team All-WAC honoree in the all-around (38.750).

Wallace competed in all four events at all 12 meets. On vault, she recorded a 9.900 against Boise State and Seattle Pacific. On bars, she finished the year ranked among the top-15 performers in the country. Wallace scored a 9.900 or better in four meets. On beam, she scored a 9.850 at the NCAA West Regional. Also one of the top floor performers on the team, she scored a 9.900 three times – at UC Davis with Stanford, against Southern Utah at the WAC Championships.


In the all-around, Wallace recorded five wins and tied for the highest score at San Jose State with a 39.400 at the NCAA West Regional. She was a four-time WAC Gymnast of the Week.

CLUB: Wallace was a Level 10 gymnast for Charter Oak Gliders Gymnastics for coaches Stephen and Beth Rybacki. She trained with the United States Junior National Team during the 2008 summer. Wallace earned that right with her second place finish in the all-around with a 38.425 at the 2008 Junior Olympics Championships. She was the first Spartan to train as a member of the USA Junior National Team.

HIGH SCHOOL: Wallace graduated from Diamond Ranch High School in 2008.

PERSONAL: Thomasina is majoring in kinesiology and would like to attend physical therapy school after graduation. She enjoys watching movie, drawing and cooking in her spare time. She is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Wallace is a San Jose State Scholar Athlete and Academic All-WAC honoree. Thomasina Tyais Wallace was born on July 16, 1990, in Woodland Hills, Calif.






SJSU: Samantha is in her fourth season as a member of the San Jose State women's gymnastics team.


enth in the all-around. Lark won the floor at the 2009 Southern California Level 9 Championships.






SJSU: Alyssa is in her third year as a member of the San Jose State women's gymnastics team.




onships. Telles-Nolan qualified for the 2008
