The Mountain West



From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West (MW) has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 17th year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements over its first

16 years of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utah's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of two conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MW was founded in 1999. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide state-of-the-art basketball instant replay system.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky

Mountain range, which borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet — the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively, while Fresno State, San Diego State and San José State add a West Coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the Pacific Ocean.

ACADEMIC CONSORTIUM

From the outset, Mountain West member institutions have been committed to creating strong academic relationships, as well as athletic competition. To that end, the chief academic officers of each institution have explored academic exchange programs, library crossovers and shared research. In addition, the faculty athletics representatives routinely provide academic assistance and test-taking services for student-athletes visiting from fellow member institutions for competition.



OPPORTUNITY

The Mountain West provides a first-class athletic and academic experience for more than 5,100 student-athletes each year. Over the past 16 years, 42 Mountain West student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, and since the league's inception in 1999, an additional 30 student-athletes have been named MW Scholar-Athlete of the Year and awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships. Three Mountain West student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars.

Conference student-athletes are also given a voice regarding pertinent issues within the MW and NCAA governance structure through representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). The Mountain West SAAC consists of 23 representatives: two from each full member institution and one faculty athletics representative. The committee reviews and reacts to legislation and to other topics referred by the Conference constituent group or committees related to the student-athlete experience.



ACHIEVEMENT

The MW has produced 882 All-America selections among its 18 sponsored sports (men's swimming was discontinued as a Conference sport following the 2010-11 season) in the last 16 years, including a league-record 83 All-America honorees in 2010-11. A total of 156 MW student-athletes have also earned Academic All-America accolades in that span. The Mountain West has sent at least 25 teams to NCAA postseason event in each of the past 16 years, capturing three team national championships in women's cross country and producing 36 individual national championships in the sports of men's golf, men's cross country, and men's and women's indoor track & field and outdoor track & field.

Mountain West members have participated in 69 bowl games under the league umbrella, including four appearances in BCS games and one CFP game. The MW has earned 76 postseason bids in men's basketball, including 43 NCAA Tournament appearances and two NIT Final Four berths. MW women's basketball has tallied 67 postseason slots, including 34 NCAA bids, five Sweet 16 appearances and one Elite Eight berth since 2000.

Wyoming won the MW's first WNIT championship in 2007 with a win over Wisconsin. In women's volleyball, the MW has had 38 NCAA bids with nine Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. Women's soccer has earned 29 NCAA bids since 1999, with two Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. MW men's golf has had at least three representatives NCAA Golf Regionals in each of its 16 years, while women's golf has had at least three teams participate in NCAA Regionals 13 of the last 16 years.

SPORTSMANSHIP

Named for Sports Ethics Fellow by the Institute for International Sport in 1998, Commissioner Craig Thompson has been a driving force for sportsmanship within intercollegiate athletics. As part of its continuing growth and development, the Mountain West implemented an extensive Sportsmanship Initiative, endorsed by both the MW Joint Council and MW Board of Directors. The program is made up of several elements, which are both practical and philosophical in nature. While the MW has significant penalties in place to deal with vio<mark>latio</mark>ns, the Sp<mark>ortsm</mark>anship Initiative is primarily promotional and educational in nature. The goal is to develop an environment that fosters appropriate behavior from all Conference constituencies.

On September 16, 2013, Jamie Craighead, who coaches an up-tempo offense and stifling defense, was named the eighth head women's basketball coach at State University.

Entering her fourth season leading the Spartans', Craighead's teams have set and then broken the program's record for points scored in a season, which curre 2,511, and in 2014-15 set a San José State and Mountain West Conference single-game record when the Spartans scored 119 points in a win over Columbia.

Under Craighead's guidance the Spartans reached the semifinals of the 2015 Mountain West Championship Tournament. It marked just the second time in the history of the program that the team advanced that far in its conference championship tournament. In addition, the team's 15 wins were the most since the team won 18 games.

The 2013-14 squad established single-season marks for free throws attempted (726) and made (493) as well as three-pointers attempted (793) and made (2014-15, the Spartans set new marks for three-pointers attempted (872) and made (271), assists (501) and total field goal attempts (2,262).

In her three seasons, Craighead's players have earned six conference post-season awards for their play on the court. In addition, they have earned 20 Academ tain West (3.0+ GPA) and seven Mountain West Scholar-Athlete honors (3.5+ GPA), three Dean's Scholar (3.65+ GPA) and two President's Scholar designation as well as four Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sport-Scholar Award and a first-team Capital One Academic All-District VIII honor. Finally, student-athletes Ta'Rea Cunnigan, to all-time leader in scoring, and Emily Vann graduated Magna Cum Laude in 2015 and 2016, respectively.

Craighead came to San José State after spending four seasons at Sacramento State (2009-10-to-2012-13), where she was the winningest women's head bas in 20 years and the only coach to post a winning conference record at Sacramento State since they entered the Big Sky Conference in the 1996-97 season. Un guidance the Hornets reached the Big Sky Conference Tournament for just the fifth (2012) and sixth (2013) times in program history. In those appearances, State earned its first tournament wins and reached the semi-final round both years.

The youngest head coach in Division I when she took over the Hornets, Craighead's teams, playing a fast-break type offense, led the Big Sky Conference in scool of her four seasons.

Sacramento State set several program records in 2012-13 including field goals made, assists, blocked shots and fewest turnovers committed. In addition, the wins equaled the program's single-season record, which was set in the 1990-91 season. The Hornets led the Big Sky in points, 3-pointers, and assists and on end, topped the league in steals and blocks.

Also in 2012-13, Craighead coached Kylie Kuhns and Megan Kritscher, two of the top post players in the Big Sky Conference. Kuhns, at only six feet tall, broke and Big Sky career rebounding records during the year, while also leading the team in scoring. For her efforts, Kuhns earned All-Big Sky first-team honors. Kr shattered the Big Sky single-season blocks record and ranked fourth in the NCAA in blocks per game for the season.

In four seasons, nine of her players garnered All-Big Sky honors. She coached 2011-12 Big Sky Freshman of the Year Fantasia Hilliard, and 23 of her athletes r Academic All-Big Sky Conference honors for their work in the classroom.

Prior to accepting the top job at Sacramento State, Craighead spent the 2007-08 season as an assistant for the Hornets before being promoted to Associate He following year. Craighead started her coaching career in 2002 under two-time NCAA Division II Coach of the Year Gordy Presnell at Seattle Pacific University three years at SPU, the team posted an 89-5 record, won three PacWest Conference titles, qualified for the NCAA Division II Tournament each year and reacher pionship game in 2005. After her success in Seattle, she spent two seasons as an assistant at Portland State University before taking a position at Sacramento

As a collegiate player at the University of Oregon, Craighead led the Ducks to the 2002 WNIT championship after three appearances in the NCAA Tournament. finished her career, her 182 3-point field goals made ranked second all-time in Ducks history.



2015-16

Appeared in all 30 games, making one start...in 12.3 minutes a game, averaged 3.6 points, 2.6 rebounds, 0.8 assists and 0.7 steals...start at Nevada (2/17) was the first of her collegiate career...set career-highs in nearly every statistical category...reached double-figure scoring in four games including a career-high 15 points twice – against both Colorado State (1/27) and Utah State (2/27)...against Utah State drained a career-best five three-pointers... was 11-for-13 from the free throw line, including going a perfect 2-for-2 four times...had a career-high nine rebounds versus New Mexico (3/8) among her 77 boards on the season...three assists against Boise State (1/20) were a single-game high...in the games against Colorado State and at CSU Bakersfield blocked two shots...six times had two steals in a game.

2014-15

Appeared in 31 games all coming off the bench...averaged 2.5 points and 2.3 rebounds in 9.4 minutes per game...scored a career-high 10 points at UC Irvine (11/22)...twice grabbed a season-high six rebounds, at Wyoming (1/3) and at Utah State (2/18)...dished out a season-best two assists three times, vs. Columbia (11/16), vs. Southern Oregon (12/2) and at Wyoming... set a career-high with two blocks at Utah (11/14)...had a pair of steals at Fresno State (1/14) and at Utah State.

2013-14

Appeared in 29 of the team's 30 games, all coming off the bench...averaged 1.4 points and 2.1 rebounds in 11.4 minutes per game...against Utah State (1/4) recorded season-highs in points (8), rebounds (7) and assists (2)...also had two assists vs. San Francisco State (11/8), at Colorado State (1/8) and vs. Boise State (1/25)...made three steals vs. San Diego State (2/26)...played a season-high 23 minutes at Nevada (1/1).

2012-13

Redshirted the season.

HIGH SCHOOL

A 2012 graduate of the Windward School (coach Steve Smith) in Los Angeles, Calif. ...a member of the 2010-11 CIF Division IV State Champions averaging 7.3 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.5 steals...in her final two seasons the team was 58-9, 18-0 in Alpha League play and reached a No. 9 national ranking...earned All-Alpha League honors as a senior and received the team's Character Award...garnered three letters in track.

2015-16

Made 24 starts in 29 total appearances...averaged 18.1 points, 4.1 assists, 3.3 rebounds and 1.1 steals in 31.7 minutes per game...led the team in minutes, field goals, field goal attempts, three-pointers, three-point attempts, free throws, free throw attempts, assists and total points...526 points are the seventh most in a season for a Spartan...62 three-pointers rank sixth on the program's single-season list...her .839 free throw percentage (104-124) is the fourth highest in Spartans single-season history... points per game average ranked second in the Mountain West and 59th in the nation...total points for the season ranked 98th in the country and second in the conference...free throw percentage ranked 46th in the NCAA and third in the Mountain West...reached double digit scoring in 27 games including a team-high 31 points against South Dakota (12/8)...was the 24th player in SJSU history to surpass 30 point in a game...hits a single-game best five three-pointers against New Mexico State (12/17)...three times against Hawai'i (12/22), at San Diego State (2/20) and against Utah State (2/27) pulled down a single-game high six rebounds... single-game best eight assists came against UNLV (2/10)...picked the pocket of four Air Force Falcons (1/2), a season-best...ranked in the top-five in the conference in assists/turnover ratio, assist per game, field goal attempts, field goals, free throws, free-throw percentage, points per game, three-point field goals per game and three-point field goal percentage.

WEBER STATE

Played two seasons for the Wildcats...started in 50 of 58 appearances... averaged 10.4 points, 3.5 assists, 2.8 rebounds and 1.2 steals per game.

HIGH SCHOOL

A 2012 graduate of Hunter High School (coach Steve White) in West Valley, Utah...was a first-team all-state honoree as a senior as well as Region 2 and team MVP...named Utah High School Female Athlete of the Year as a senior... first-team all-state as a junior...as a sophomore at Bingham High School received all-state recognition, Region 3 and team MVP honors...a Deseret News Honorable Mention and Region 3 second-team selection as a freshman...compete in volleyball.

2015-16

Appeared in all 30 games, starting in 29 games...averaged 9.4 points, 6.2 rebounds, 0.9 assists and 0.4 steals in 19.5 minutes per game...had the team's highest shooting percentage (.482) and ranked second in total rebounds (186) and first in offensive boards (89)...was third in the team with 13 double-figure scoring efforts and led the squad in scoring seven times...twice – at CSU Bakersfield (11/22) and against South Dakota (12/8) scored a season-high 18 points...against CSU Bakersfield also had her best rebounding effort with 13...had a steal in 13 games...10 times dished out a game-best two assists...in six games, making at least five buckets, shot over .700 including a team and season-best 6-for-7 (.857) at Utah State (12/30)...ranked fourth in the Mountain West in offensive rebounds, seventh in rebounding, ninth in field goal percentage, 26th in scoring.

2014-15

Appeared in all 32 games making 11 starts...averaged 8.4 points, 4.9 rebounds and 1.3 steals in 15.0 minutes per game...led the team with a .463 shooting percentage...was 14th in the conference in steals per game (1.4) and 15th in offensive rebounds (2.1/g)...third among the team in total rebounds (157), second in offensive boards (63) and fourth in steals (41)... among 14 double figure scoring efforts, had a season-high 23 against Columbia (11/16) and had a career-best five steals...had three double digit rebound games with a high of 12 against Air Force (1/7)...two blocked shots at SDSU (2/21) was her best effort for the season...against Columbia took a career-high 20 shots...had 19 points and two steals against #14 California (11/28) on her way to Cal Classic All-Tournament honors.

2013-14

Made seven starts while appearing in all 30 games...averaged 10.7 points, 7.7 rebounds, 1.3 steals and 1.1 assists in 23.0 minutes per game... ranked second in the Mountain West in offensive rebounds (3.4/g), third in total rebounds, seventh in field goal percentage (.468) and ninth in defensive rebounds (4.3/g)...led the team in field goal percentage...second in rebounds (231) and first in offensive boards (101)...third in steals (38) and fourth in blocks (18)...nine double digit rebounding games are third most in the conference (most by any freshman) and second on the team... single-game high 16 boards came at Utah State (3/1)...had eight double doubles, most of any freshman in the MW, second overall and tops on the team...18 double figure scoring games with a season high 25 points vs. SFSU (11/8)...dished out a season-best four assist vs. WYO (1/18)...top steals performance was four vs. SFSU...single-game high of three blocks came vs. Utah State (1/4)...had season-bests in free throw attempts (12) and makes (7) at Utah State...three times hit double figure field goals in a game, with a high of 11 at Sacramento State (12/7).

HIGH SCHOOL

A 2012 graduate of Bellarmine Jefferson High School (Coach Jaclyn Johnson) in Burbank, Calif. ...averaged 15.2 points, 9.5 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 2.3 steals and earned first-team All-CIF Division IIIA honors for the four-time reigning Santa Cruz League Champions...as a junior was a member of the 2009 Bell-Jeff State Championship team...In 2010, the team reached the state semifinals and Smith earned second-team All-CIF honors.

JASMINE







In 1995 San José State women's basketball celebrated in 100th year. The team first played under the name of the San Jose Normal School in a game against Stanford in 1895.

The first intercollegiate athletic-sponsored women's basketball teams formed at San Jose State in 1968, but weren't formally established until 1971-72, with the evolution of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW). In 1982, the NCAA formally recognized women's basketball and sponsored a championship for the sport.


San José State offered its first women's scholarship to Lori Hogen in 1975.

On September 9, 2016, **Lora Alexander** became the fifth member of the women's basketball program to be inducted into the San José State Sports Hall of Fame.

The 1989 and 1990 All-Big West Conference honoree holds the career records for scoring average at 18.2 points and rebound average at 11.1 per game and is the only Spartan women's basketball player to average a double double for her career.

With 1,019 points, Alexander is the only SJSU women's basketball player to score 1,000 points in one's first two seasons in the program. In 1995, she was one of 14 players named to the San José State University Women's Basketball Team of the Century.



Sharon Chatman

Sharon Chatman, Hall of Fame Class of 2004, is the only women's basketball coach with a winning record (143-121) at San José State. She guided the Spartans to NorPac Conference titles in both 1978 & 1979 and from 1978 to 1981 her teams played in the postseason in four consecutive years.

In 10 years leading the program (1977-86), she had a winning season six times and won 20 or more games in 1979 and 1980.

Elinor Banks (1978-81), Hall of Fame Class of 1999, was the first women's basketball player inducted into the Hall of Fame and in 1979 the first to earn All-American honors. In 1978 & 79 she was a first team All-NorCal selection and a second team performer in 1980 & 81.

She holds the program's career record for rebounds (1,062), ranks second in blocks (156) and fourth in point (1,672).


Karen Mason

Karen Mason (1978-81), Hall of Fame Class of 2001, was a 1981 All-American and earned first team All-NorCal honors in 1979, 1980 & 1981.

For 25 years she held the program's career records for scoring (1,760), field goals (735), field goal attempts (1,686), free throws (290) & free throw attempts (467) and still ranks second in scoring and field goal attempts, third in free throws and fourth in free throw attempts.

Wanda Thompson (1978-81), Hall of Fame Class of 2005, was a first team All-NorCal honoree in 1980 and a three-time (1978, 1979 & 1981) second team selection.

In 1980, she set the single-season record for assists (211) and holds the program's career record with 742. She is the only basketball player, man or woman, to have at least 100 steals in two seasons and more than 150 assists in four seasons.



Rhoda Chew set the San José State single-game record for rebounds when she ripped down 21 against Santa Clara in the 1983-84 season. She equaled the mark the next year against Pacific. In the 1982-83 season she blocked a single-game record seven shots against Washington State.

In single-season records she ranks first in rebounds and rebounds per game (329 and 12.7 per game in 1983-84). Her .509 (1982-83) and .508 (1984-85) shooting percentages are sixth and seventh on the program's single-season list. She appears on the single-season blocked shots list three times No. 6 (51 in 1984-85), No. 7 (49 in 1982-83)

and No. 10 (37 in 1983-84).

For her career, Chew (1982-85) is the ninth leading scorer (1,188 points) in Spartan history. She ranks second in rebounding (946) and blocked shots (148), sixth in field goal percentage (.486), seventh in field goals ma<mark>de (484) and ninth in free th</mark>row attempts (366).



Mason ranks third in free throws made (290), fourth in free throw attempts (467), fifth in steals (204), eighth in games played (111) and 10th in rebounds (562).

Her name appears twice in the top-10 of single-season scoring (No. 7 - 517 in 1980-81 and No.8 -503 in 1979-80), field goals made (No. 3 - 212 in 1979-80) and No. 5 - 210 in 1980-81) and field *goal attempts (No. 4 - 495 in 1979-80 and No. 7 - in 1980-81).*

A two-time first team All-NorPac selection, she earned All-American honors after the 1980-81 season. On October 26, 2001 Karen Mason was inducted into the San José State Sports Hall of Fame.

Photographers

Credentials are issued to newspapers, wire services, video crews and team photographers. NCAA rules limit photographers to an area to the right side of the basket on each end of the court.

An NCAA Public Infractions Decision on October 26, 2016, centered on a former San José State University head women's basketball coach failing to meet his responsibility to set an atmosphere for rules compliance by conducting impermissible out-of-season countable athletically related activities (CARA) over three semesters and directing a nonqualifier student-athlete to participate in team CARA. The former head coach later provided false or misleading information regarding the nonqualifying student-athlete's participation. The NCAA Division I Committee on Infractions found that five violations occurred, three at Level II and two at Level III, beginning in the Spring 2011 semester and continuing through Spring 2012 semester.

Level II Violations

Impermissible Countable Athletically Related Activities [NCAA Bylaws 17.1.6.2.2 & 17.3.6 (2011-12 & 2012-13)]

On multiple occasions more than four women's basketball student-athletes participated in skill-related instruction sessions at the same time, when no more than four student-athletes could permissibly participate at a time.

Head Coach Responsibility [NCAA Bylaw 11.1.2.1 (2011-12 & 2012-13)]

During his tenure, the former head coach failed to promote an atmosphere of compliance within the women's basketball program in two areas: (1) instructing and permitting a student-athlete to participate in team activities, knowing that the student-athlete was not permitted to be involved in the activities and (2) conducting, with his coaching staff, the activities that resulted in Violation No. 1, knowing that no more than four student-athletes were permitted to participle at the same time.

Unethical Conduct [NCAA Bylaws 10.01.1, 10.1 & 10.1-(d) (2013-14 & 2014-15)] In 2013 and 2015, the former head coach violated the NCAA principles of ethical conduct and failed to deport himself in accordance with the generally recognized high standards of honesty and sportsmanship normally associated with the conduct and administration of intercollegiate athletics when he

knowingly provided the NCAA enforcement staff and/or institution with false or misleading information regarding his knowledge of and/or involvement in violations of NCAA legislation.

Level III Violations

Impermissible Participation by a Nonqualifier [NCAA Bylaw 14.3.2.2 (2012-13)]

In September 2011, September 2012 and April 2013, a student-athlete, under the direction of the former head coach, participated in out-of-season countable athletically related activities, strength and conditioning and skill-related instruction, approximately nine times while serving a year in residence as a nonqualifier.

Exceeding Coaching Limitations [NCAA Bylaws 11.7.1.1.1.4 & 11.7.4 (2012-13)]

In April 2013, the former head coach used an outside consultant to provide on-court instruction during a skill-related instruction session and demonstrate certain basketball skills to some members of the team. As a result, the number of countable coaches on the court exceeded the permissible level.

Length of Probationary Period

One year from October 26, 2016, through October 25, 2017
