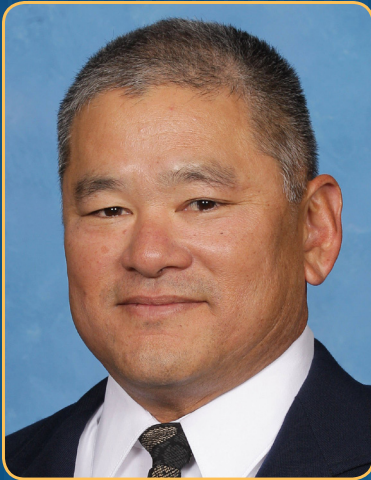

Dave Nakama **Head Coach** **3rd Season** **Willamette, 1984**

Dave Nakama was appointed as head baseball coach of the Spartans in September 2012.

Under Nakama, the Spartans posted the fourth-highest batting average (.286), the third-highest fielding percentage (.972) and the second-fewest errors (58) in the Western Athletic Conference in 2013 and the second-highest fielding percentage (.970) in the Mountain West in 2014.

Nakama came to San José State from the University of Washington, where he was the associate head baseball coach for three seasons. In a 20-plus year college coaching career, the Honolulu, Hawai'i native has 13 seasons of experience in the Pac-12 Conference divided between Washington (2010-12) and Stanford (1997-98, 2002-09).

A proven talent developer, Nakama has seen 79 of his former players drafted professionally. Of those, 22 have gone on to play in the major leagues, including current big-leaguers Jason Castro, John Mayberry Jr., Carlos Quentin and Jed Lowrie.

Four times since 2002, Baseball America rated Stanford's recruiting classes in the top 10 nationally. Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball ranked Washington's 2012 class among the best in the West.

In his 10 seasons at Stanford, the Cardinal won four Pac-10 Championships, five NCAA Regional crowns and appeared in the College World Series four times (1997, 2002, 2003, and 2008).

During Nakama's tenure, Stanford recorded their five best defensive seasons, including a program high .977 fielding percentage in 2005.

Nakama has head coaching experience at San Jose's Mission College (1992-96) and three seasons at San Francisco State (1999-2001). In five seasons at Mission College, his teams qualified for the 1995 and 1996 California Community College state championships. He was the 1996 Coast Conference Coach of the Year.

The 1984 graduate of Willamette University in Salem, Ore., earned his master's degree from the University of Northern Colorado in 1986. As a college player, Nakama was an infielder for the Willamette Bearcats.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Northern Colorado in 1984 and worked at the University of Iowa, Yavapai College (Prescott, Ariz.) and DeAnza College.

Nakama has three children: Samantha, Kirk and Brodie.

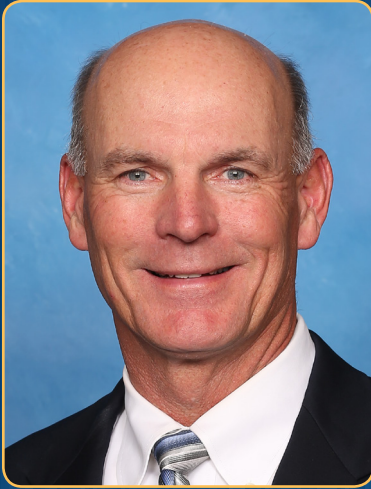

Tom Kunis **Assistant Coach** **8th Season** **San José State, 1991**

Tom Kunis, a nationally-regarded pitching coach with 19 seasons of NCAA Division I experience, returns for a third stint with the Spartans baseball program. The 2015 season will be Kunis' eighth as a Spartans assistant coach, having previously served from 1988-91 and 2009-11 under former skipper Sam Piraro.

"Tom Kunis brings a great deal of experience to our program," said head coach Dave Nakama. "He has a proven track record of success and I think that's something that will not only help develop our many young pitchers, but will help us in recruiting as well."

Nakama and Kunis coached together for six seasons (2002-07) at Stanford under Mark Marquess, where the pair aided the Cardinal to two Pac-10 conference titles and five NCAA Tournament appearances, including three Super Regional appearances and two College World Series berths.

The 2011 San José State pitching staff topped the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) in strikeouts (457), innings pitched (532.2) and fewest home runs allowed (17), and finished third in ERA (4.49). Juniors Roberto Padilla and Esteban Guzman finished with the third- and fourth-best ERAs in the

conference at 3.19 and 3.33, respectively, earning Padilla first-team All-WAC recognition and Guzman second-team honors.

Under Kunis' guidance, two Spartan hurlers received postseason honors in 2010. Starter Blake McFarland was named first-team All-WAC and was selected to the WAC All-Tournament team. Zack Jones, listed as a utility player, earned Freshman of the Year honors in the WAC, was selected to the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America team and was a first-team honoree on the All-Ping! Freshman Baseball Team. Jones, a two-way player, was the team's primary closer and finished the year with a 5-1 record and five saves.

In 2009, San José State won the regular season WAC title behind a pitching staff that led the league in team ERA. It was the first time the Spartans led the WAC in pitching since joining the conference in 1997. The Spartans' 4.66 ERA was nearly a full run better than second-place Fresno State's 5.61. San José State led the conference in complete games (6), shutouts (4), saves (17) and strikeouts with a school-record total of 453.

Three of the top six individual ERA marks in 2009 WAC play belonged to San José State hurlers. Ryan Shopshire became the first Spartan to earn WAC Pitcher of the Year hon-



ors, and was joined on the All-WAC first team by David Berner. Including Shopshire, Kunis coached four conference Pitchers of the Year since 2000.

From 1988-91, Kunis' first stint as a Spartan assistant, his pitching staff was the best in the Big West Conference for the first three of those four years. In 1989 and 1990, the program posted back-to-back 40-plus win seasons, the only time in school history.

Kunis served as the head coach at Ohlone College in Fremont, Calif., during the 2008 campaign. While he was an assistant at Stanford from 2000-07, the Cardinal posted a team ERA under 4.00 four times and nine of his pitchers were selected in the first five rounds of an MLB Draft.

From 1996-99, Kunis was the top assistant at Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, Calif. His rotations consistently ranked among the best in the WAC (1996) and Big West (1997-99).

He was the pitching coach at De Anza College in Cupertino, Calif., from 1991-94, when the Dons twice topped the Coast Conference in ERA. He served as the head coach for the 1995 campaign, earning a 31-14-2 record and a California state playoff berth.

Kunis began his coaching career as an assistant at West Valley College in Saratoga, Calif., from 1984-87.

A graduate of San Jose's Branham High School, Kunis earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from San José State and a master's degree in sports administration from Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif.

He and his wife, Kim, reside in San Jose with their five children, sons Austin, Tyler, Landon and Cooper, and daughter Megan.





Nicholas Enriquez **Assistant Coach** **3rd Season** **Menlo College, 2001**

Nicholas Enriquez joined the San José State University baseball coaching staff as an assistant in the fall of 2012. Enriquez entered the position with eight years of assistant coaching experience at the Division I level with Dartmouth College in Hanover, N.H.

At San José State, Enriquez instructs the team's infielders and coordinates recruiting efforts. During his time with the Spartans, San José State recorded the third-best fielding percentage (.972) in the Western Athletic Conference in 2013 and the second-highest fielding percentage (.970) in the Mountain West in 2014.

At Dartmouth, Enriquez was responsible for instruction of hitters and infielders as well as on and off campus recruiting evaluations. He assisted the 2009 and 2010 teams that were crowned as Ivy League champions, solidifying back-to-back appearances at an NCAA Regional.

In 2010, the Big Green got its first victory at an NCAA Regional in 23 years and the 2011 team won at least 30 games for the first time in program history. In 2012, the squad established the top mark in program history for fielding

percentage (.977) and was tops in the Ivy League with a team batting average of .298.

The 2001 Summa Cum Laude graduate of Menlo College in Atherton, Calif., began his coaching career as an assistant at his alma mater. He coached three seasons from 2001-04, instructing hitters and infielders.

Enriquez spent one season as an assistant (2003) and one season as a head coach (2004) of the collegiate summer league baseball Amsterdam Mohawks. The Mohawks were New York City Baseball League (NYCBL) champions during both seasons.

From 1999-2004 Enriquez was an associate scout in the Bay Area for Major League Baseball's Houston Astros. He specifically monitored all Monterey Bay and San Francisco area high schools. He also worked with the MLB Roadshow from May-August 2001, providing instruction to local teams in England, Germany, Holland, the Czech Republic and Scotland.

Enriquez currently resides in San Jose, Calif.



Jason Armstrong **Volunteer Assistant** **2nd season** **Trinity, 2004**

Jason Armstrong joined the San José State baseball team as a volunteer assistant in fall 2013. He serves as the team's hitting coach and also assists the team's infielders.

Before joining the Spartans, Armstrong was an assistant coach for the UC Davis Aggies during the 2011-12 seasons, and the volunteer assistant hitting coach during 2013. He worked specifically with Aggie outfielders and hitters, and was the first base coach during games.

In four years as the Aggies' hitting coach, Armstrong transformed the Big West's worst offensive team in 2010 into a top-three team in batting average, runs, hits, doubles, RBI's, total bases in 2013.

Armstrong earned a Bachelor of Science degree in 2004 from Trinity (Texas) University where he was an NCAA First-Team All-American shortstop. In addition, he was the 2004 SCAC and NCAA West Region player of the year as a senior. Armstrong holds eight of Trinity's single-season and career records.

His playing career continued as a professional with the Toronto Blue Jays organization when

he was drafted in the 25th round (747 overall pick) of the 2004 MLB draft.

Armstrong saw great success during the 2005 season when he batted .290 and was the offensive MVP for the Class-A Lansing Lugnuts. That same season, he was a Midwest League All-Star selection. Armstrong worked his way onto the Blue Jays' top-50 prospect list in 2006 before a shoulder injury ended his professional playing career.

Jason went on to earn a professional certificate for personal training from San Diego University for Integrative Studies in 2007. Additionally, he has a master's degree in recreation and sport sciences with a concentration in coaching education from Ohio University (2012).

Armstrong's other coaching experience includes spending the summer of 2009 as the hitting coach for the Brewster Whitecaps of the Cape Cod League.

The native of Menlo Park, Calif., now lives in Atherton, Calif., with his wife Kristina.

The only number in San Jose State baseball history to have ever been retired - #22 - belongs to former Spartan head coach Gene Menges, the second-winningest coach in the school's 94-year baseball history. He led the team for 17 seasons and compiled a 467-434-4 record. In 1978 and 1979, he was named Coach of the Year by the Northern California Baseball Association.

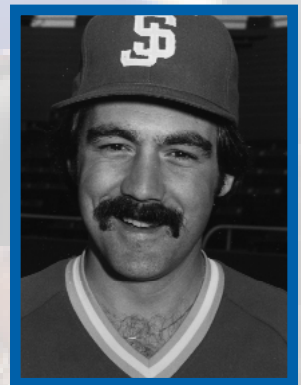
Menges earned his degree from San Jose State in 1951 and his master's degree in 1957. The quarterback of the 1948-50 Spartan football teams, his career totals still rank among the best in Spartan history. He joined the Spartan coaching staff in 1952 as an assistant baseball coach before assuming the head coaching duties in 1970. He has the rank of professor emeritus in the human performance department at SJSU, and is also a member of the San Jose State University Sports Hall of Fame.

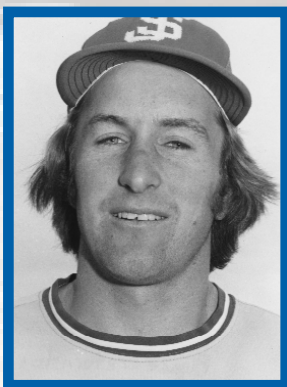

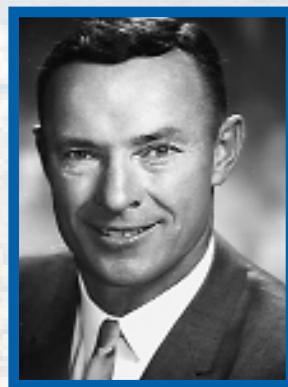

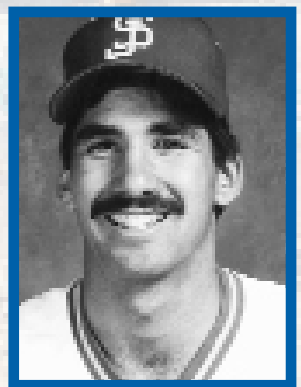
