# COACHING STAFF

## RON CARAGHER

Head Coach

**R**on Caragher accepted the head football coaching position at San José State University in December 2012.

Now entering his fourth season, Caragher took the San José State reins as the program transitioned into the Mountain West – arguably, the biggest competitive leap for the

123-year old program. There are two top half finishes in the conference’s West Division including the second-place tie in 2015 that led to an invitation and victory in the inaugural AutoNation Cure Bowl. The Spartans’ four consecutive bowl victories match the second longest active streak in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

The 2015 AutoNation Cure Bowl-winning team was proficient in many facets of the game nationally – second in fewest passing yards allowed and in net punting, fourth in fewest penalty yards per game, fifth in pass completion percentage and tenth in time of possession. San Jose State was 12<sup>th</sup> in third-down conversions at a school record 47.8 percent rate and 34<sup>th</sup> in total defense, the second season in a row in the top-35.

In 2013, he was a first-year San José State football head coach to produce a .500 or better winning percentage and a winning record in conference play with the Spartans. San José State finished 5-3 in its first Mountain West Conference season and 6-6 overall. In the university’s previous two moves into new

conferences in 1969/70 and 1996, San José State finished no better .500 in the league standings.

San José State concluded its 2013 season with its first victory over a top-20 team in 13 years when the Spartans outscored #16/ #13-Fresno State, 62-52. SJSU’s potent offense set single-season school records for total offense, most passing yards, most first downs and most field goals, and ranked in the top-20 nationally in passing offense and total offense per game.

In 2014, San José State ended a 17-season winless streak in overtime games with a comeback win at Wyoming. The Spartans were the top statistical team in the FBS for fewest passing yards allowed and finished 32<sup>nd</sup> overall in total defense.

Since 2013, the Spartans received 26 All-Mountain West first, second or honorable mention all-conference honors, had nine players accept post-season all-star game invitations and five become National Football League draft picks.

San José State’s academic achievements are noteworthy, too, in the last three years. The program was either second or third among the seven Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in California for its Academic Progress Rate score and was credited with an all-time high 975 (out of 1,000) score in 2015. Spartan football players earned 49 academic all-conference honors during his coaching reign.

For the 2016 season, Caragher will serve for the first time as a voter on the USA Today /ESPN coaches poll.

Caragher came to San José State after six seasons at the University of San Diego (USD). The Toreros compiled a 44-22 win-loss record and were the 2007, 2011 and 2012 Pioneer Football League co-champions. Overall in eight seasons, Caragher’s head coaching record is 53-37.

Twice, in 2007 and 2011, he was a nominee for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award recognizing the top head coach in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The 2007 team finished second in the final Sports Network Mid-Major Poll, ranked first among all FCS teams in scoring and passing efficiency and third in total offense.

In 2011, Caragher was the Pioneer Football League Coach of the Year after leading the Toreros to a third 9-2 win-loss record in five

seasons and a ranking in FCS Coaches Top-25 poll during the regular season.

San José State is Caragher's fourth university in a coaching career that includes seven bowl appearances between 1994 and 2016. The 1990 UCLA graduate got his first taste of college coaching as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1994. He was promoted to a full-time assistant's position in 1996. In seven seasons, he coached wide receivers, punters and kickers.

Before accepting the University of San Diego head coaching position, Caragher worked four years as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Kentucky. In 2006, the Wildcats posted an 8-5 record, was invited to a bowl game for the first time in seven years and concluded the season with a Music City Bowl victory over Clemson - Kentucky's first bowl win since 1984.

Born on January 24, 1967, in nearby Redwood City, Calif., the 49-year old Caragher grew up in San José and nearby Morgan Hill, and graduated from San José's Bellarmine Prep.

A college quarterback, Caragher played on the 1985 through 1989 UCLA teams that won four consecutive bowl games including the 1986 Rose Bowl.

Caragher and his wife, Wendy, the Spartans, SJSU professor Dr. Jean Novak, the University's communicative sciences and disorders department and San Diego-based Autism Tree Project Foundation (ATPF) collaborate on a mentoring program to provide support for local children with autism. Additionally, the Spartans partner with "Wipeout Cancer" to assist youngsters and families dealing with cancer.

The Caraghers have three sons - Josh, a sophomore at San Jose State, Ryan and Scott.

# COACHING STAFF

## ARNOLD ALE

Linebackers Coach



**A**rnold Ale joined the San Jose State University football coaching staff as the linebackers coach in February 2016.

Ale (pronounced Ah-leh) comes to San Jose State after three seasons (2013-15) as the defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at Long Beach City College. He also was the linebackers coach and special teams coordinator at Los Angeles Harbor College (2010-12). While at L.A. Harbor, he participated in the NFL's minority internship coaching program during the 2012 preseason with the Cincinnati Bengals.

The 1993 UCLA graduate was a linebacker at Notre Dame and UCLA where he was a teammate of Coach Caragher. In his one season at Notre Dame, the Fighting Irish completed a perfect 12-0 season and was the 1988 national champion. A three-year starter for UCLA, he was the 1991 John Hancock Bowl Most Valuable Player in the Bruins' 6-3 win over Illinois.

Professionally, Ale was a member of the 1993 Seattle Seahawks practice squad and played for the 1994 Kansas City Chiefs and 1996 San Diego Chargers. He also played one season for the 1996 NFL Europe World Bowl champion Scottish Claymores.

He began his coaching career in 1997 and spent two seasons as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Carson (Calif.) High. Ale was the head coach at St. Anthony High in Long Beach, Calif., in 2001 and Bishop Montgomery High in Torrance, Calif., from 2002 through 2009. One of his players at Bishop Montgomery was Chandler Jones, the San Jose State career leader in pass receptions.

Ale also earned a master's degree in kinesiology from the University of Central Missouri in 2012.

He and his wife, Sive, are the parents of daughters, Imeleta and Normalina, and sons, Uiolevanuseaulaoleolo and Reuben.

## AL BORGES

Offensive Coordinator  
Quarterbacks Coach

**A**l Borges joined the San José State University football coaching staff in February 2015 as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

In his first season with the Spartans, Borges coordinated one of the most balanced offenses in school history. The 2015 Spartans became the second in the program's modern era dating back to 1950 that rushed for at least 2,000 yards (2,378) and scored 20 touchdowns (24) and passed for more than 2,000 yards (2,882) and 20 touchdowns (21) in the same season. Each of his three quarterbacks completed at least 60 percent of his passes and 2016 senior Kenny Potter was the Mountain West's most accurate passer at 67.4 percent and an honorable mention all-conference honoree.



For Borges, he is reunited with Spartans head coach Ron Caragher. The two were part of the UCLA staffs during the 1996 through 2000 seasons when the Bruins won the 1998 Pac-10 championship and Rose Bowl and shared the conference title the previous season. At UCLA, he was a two-time finalist for the Broyles Award given annually to the top Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) assistant coach.

Borges has 28 seasons of major college experience with nine current FBS schools. His reach spreads from the Mountain West and Pac-12 in the west across the Mississippi River to the Big Ten and Southeastern Conference. Teams he coached played in 11 post-season bowl games and were ranked in the final national polls seven times.

The 1981 Chico State graduate has high school, community college and major college coaching experiences starting in 1975 as an assistant coach at Salinas (Calif.). He spent three seasons at Diablo Valley College (1983-85) and was appointed an offensive coordinator for the first time in 1985.

His first major college coaching opportunity was in 1982 as an assistant coach at the University of California coaching tight ends and outside linebackers. In 1986, he began a seven-season stint as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Portland State. He moved to Boise State in a similar capacity for the 1993 and 1994. The 1994 Broncos finished third in the final Sports Network NCAA I-AA poll.

Since 1995, Borges was an offensive coordinator at Oregon (1995), UCLA (1996-2000), California (2001), Indiana (2002-03), Auburn (2004-07), San Diego State (2009-10), Michigan (2011-13) and San José State (2015). In his four seasons at Auburn, the Tigers were ranked in the top-20 every year and had an undefeated season in 2004. UCLA finished in the top-10 in the 1997 and 1998 Associated Press polls. Oregon was ranked #18 in the final 1995 A.P. poll.

Running Backs Coach

**P**hil Earley joined the San Jose State University football staff in March 2016 as the running backs coach. Earley comes to the Spartans after four seasons as an assistant coach at Fresno State and brings 29 seasons of major college coaching experience to the Spartans.

The new Spartans assistant has coaching experiences in four current Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences, two former NCAA Division I-A leagues that no longer sponsor football, three schools with current ties to the Big Sky Conference of the Football Championship Division (FCS) and NCAA Division II institution Western Washington University, his first college coaching appointment.

When the 2016 season begins, Earley can claim to be the first to work on the staffs of the three California State University (CSU) system schools that compete at the NCAA's FBS level. Prior to his four seasons at Fresno State, he was the assistant to the offensive coordinator at San Diego State in 2009.

An offensive coordinator for 14 seasons, Earley is focused on coaching running backs for the first time. His running game experiences include coordinating offenses for the NCAA's 2001 Division I-A rushing champion, Chance Kretschmer of the University of Nevada, and 1,000-yard rushers at Cal Poly (Antonio Warren, 1995), Idaho (Joel Thomas, 1998) and Western Washington (Scott Lohr, 1989).

The 1980 graduate of Pacific Lutheran University received his bachelor's degree majoring in education. He earned a master's degree from Western Washington University in 1988 in education with an emphasis in sports psychology.

The native of Port Angeles, Wash., began his college coaching career at Western Washington in 1986 as an offensive line coach. He had the same responsibilities for the 1988 season at Weber State before returning to Western Washington in 1989 for his opportunity to be an offensive coordinator. Earley would go to serve as an offensive coordinator at Cal Poly (1994-96), Idaho (1998-99), Nevada (2000-03), Ohio (2004) and Idaho State (2010).

He served as the quarterbacks coach at Syracuse for three seasons (2006-08) and was the assistant to the offensive coordinator at Auburn (2005) and San Diego State (2009). Earley was Washington State's recruiting coordinator for two seasons (1992-93) and did the same for the 2012 and 2013 seasons at Fresno State.

He and his wife, Cinde, have two adult sons, T.J., and Alec.

Defensive Coordinator

**R**on English was named the San José State University football defensive coordinator in February 2016.

English served as a defensive coordinator at the University of Michigan and the University of Louisville and was the 2011 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year for Eastern Michigan University.

Twice, in 2007 and 2008, English was the nominee by Michigan and Louisville, respectively, for the Broyles Award given annually to the FBS' top assistant football coach. In 2006, Rivals.com named him its National Defensive Coordinator of the Year and one of the nation's top-25 college recruiters.

English was an assistant coach at the University of Michigan from 2003 through 2007. Four of those five Wolverine teams finished in the top-25 in scoring defense. Three were in the top-25 in total defense and pass defense efficiency. The 2006 Michigan squad was the national leader in rushing defense.

He was the first position coach at a FBS school to have two defensive backs receive consensus All-America status in the same season. Michigan safety Ernest Shazor and Wolverine cornerback Marlin Jackson each earned the distinction in 2004.

English was Eastern Michigan's head coach during the 2009 through 2013 seasons. In the last 30 years, he is one of only two Eastern Michigan football coaches to be named a Mid-American Conference (MAC) Coach of the Year. The 2011 squad finished with a 6-6 win-loss record, the most wins by an EMU team since 1995.

The Spartans' new defensive coordinator has 20 seasons of major college coaching experience in six NCAA Division I conferences and nine bowl game appearances. He began his college coaching career for Mount San Antonio College in 1993 and was a graduate assistant at Arizona State University for the 1994 and 1995 seasons.

After spending 1996 spring practice at Northern Arizona University, English coached defensive backs at San Diego State for the 1996 and 1997 seasons. He returned to Arizona State in 1998 for five seasons as the defensive backs coach.

The 1991 University of California graduate majored in social sciences. English was a four-year letterwinner and team captain for the Golden Bears football team. He earned his master's degree in educational administration from Arizona State in 1995. In 2014, English was awarded a Bill Walsh NFL Minority Coaching Fellowship by the Cleveland Browns.

He and his wife, Sophia, have three children - Simon, Sydney and Seth.

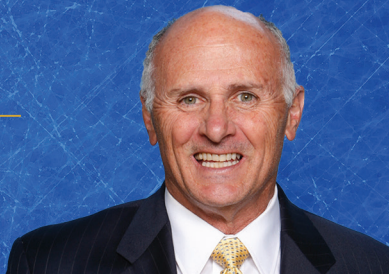

## DAN FERRIGNO

**D**an Ferrigno joined the San José State University football staff in February 2015 as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach. His lengthy college coaching experience paid off immediately with one of the best seasons for the Spartans in special teams and tight end position production.

Returning starter Billy Freeman was a first-team All-Mountain West selection and one of eight semifinalists for the annual John Mackey Award given to the nation's top tight end. Josh Oliver, a freshman in 2015, caught the game-clinching touchdown pass in the AutoNation Cure Bowl victory.

Ray Guy Award finalist Michael Carrizosa was third nationally in punting average, a first-team All-Mountain West selection and a second-team All-America. As a team, the 2015 Spartans set a school record for net punting average in a season.

The San Francisco native came to San José State after four seasons as the special teams coordinator and the tight ends coach at the University of Michigan.

Through the years, Ferrigno (pronounced furr-reen-yo) was part of 12 teams that played in a post-season bowl game and developed outstanding players in all phases of special teams play and pass receiving.

While at Michigan, placekicker Brendan Gibbons was a record-setting kick-scorer and Will Hagerup was named the Big Ten's Punter of the Year in 2012. At the University of California, he coached DeSean Jackson, one of the college game's most exciting players of the 2000's. Tony Gonzalez at Cal, Gavin Escobar of San Diego State and Devin Funchess of Michigan are three tight ends that blossomed under his coaching.

The 1978 San Francisco State University graduate began his coaching career at San Francisco's St. Ignatius High in 1975. Three years later, he was the wide receivers and tight ends coach at his alma mater. Ferrigno moved to nearby University of the Pacific for the 1979 season.

His first of three coaching tenures at the University of California began in 1980 as a graduate assistant. Oregon State (1987-95), Cal (1996-99, 2006-07), USC (2000) Oregon (2001-05) are the four Pac-12 Conference schools where he served as an assistant football coach. Ferrigno also coached at Western Michigan (1982-86) and San Diego State (2009-10). He was the special teams coordinator while at Oregon State, Cal, San Diego State and Michigan.

Ferrigno's one head coaching experience was at St. Mary's High in Albany, Calif., for the 2008 football season.

## ANDREW ROLIN

Wide Receivers Coach

**A**ndrew Rolin joined the San Jose State University football coaching staff in July 2013 as the running backs coach. A graduate assistant for the 2013 season, he was promoted to an assistant coaching position in March 2014. For 2016, he will coach the wide receivers and take over as the recruiting coordinator.

Last season, Rolin coached second-team All-American all-purpose player and first-team All-Mountain West running back Tyler Ervin, who would set a single-season school rushing record of 1,601 yards. Ervin finished 11<sup>th</sup> nationally in rushing yards per game and would be the Houston Texans' fourth round draft choice in the 2016 NFL Draft.

In his first season at San Jose State, the Spartans set single season school records for total offense yardage (5,919) and average yards per game (493.2). San Jose State was 15<sup>th</sup> nationally in total offense with its most diversified and effective ground game since 2006. By season's end, five players started at least one game as a running back with four freshmen handling the bulk of the load.

Redshirt freshman Jarrod Lawson, the team's leading rusher despite only rushing 10 times in the first four games, was named a CollegeFootballNews.com honorable mention Freshman All-American. Lawson's 788 rushing yards were a San Jose State freshman single season record and eighth best among all 2013 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) freshmen.

Lawson and two more freshmen Thomas Tucker, a converted defensive back, and Tim Crawley, capable of playing either running back or wide receiver, became the first trio of San Jose State running backs with 20 or more receptions each in a season since 1979.

**B**arry Sacks returned to San Jose State University in February 2016 as the defensive line coach.

He was a Spartan assistant first during the 1998 through 2000 seasons. In each of those three seasons, San Jose State defeated Stanford and upset of the #9-ranked and undefeated TCU, 27-24, on November 4, 2000. The 2000 Spartans finished with a 7-5 win-loss record – San Jose State’s first winning mark since 1992.

Sacks finished his 30th season as an assistant coach in 2015. Except for the 2001 season as the defensive coordinator for the San Jose Sabercats of the Arena Football League, his coaching career centers on coaching defensive linemen at the college level.

## ADAM STENAVICH

Offensive Line Coach



**A**dam Stenavich was named San Jose State University's offensive line coach in February 2015.

In his first season with the Spartans, Stenavich retooled an offensive line that resulted in one of the most balanced offenses in school history. San Jose State gained 2,378 yards rushing and rushed for 24 touchdowns and passed for 2,882 yards and 21 six-pointers. The 1976 Spartans are the only other San Jose State team to gain at least 2,000 yards rushing with more than 20 touchdowns and pass for 2,000 yards resulting in at least 20 touchdowns.

Individually, left tackle Wes Schweitzer was a second-team All-Mountain West player and the Atlanta Falcons sixth-round draft choice. Nate Velichko, a 2015 honorable mention All-ountain pick, started every game at right tackle after a season at right guard. Velichko's Mmove opened up the right guard position for Chris Gonzalez, one of two new starters in the offensive line last season.

Stenavich joined the Spartans after one season at Northern Arizona University. He helped the 2014 Lumberjacks to their consecutive top-half finish in the Big Sky Conference. Northern Arizona was one of the top offensive programs in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) ranking 16th in passing offense and 34th in total offense. Three of his five starters earned All-Big Sky Conference honors at the end of the season.

The native of Marshfield, Wis., began his coach career in 2012 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, the University of Michigan.

As a player, Stenavich was a three-year starting left tackle and two-time, first-team All-Big Ten Conference honoree for the Wolverines. He was the recipient of the University of Michigan's



2005 Hugh H. Rader, Jr., Memorial Award as the team's best lineman. Stenavich's college career included playing for the 2003 and 2004 Wolverine teams that won Big Ten championships. In 2015, the Leopards recorded their first winning season in 10 years with an 8-2 overall win-loss record, won the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) in 2015 with an undefeated conference record and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Division III playoffs. The La Verne coaching staff received the SCIAC's Conference Coaching Staff of the Year award.

Johnson was responsible for coaching the wide receivers and served as the team's video coordinator. In each of his two seasons, a La Verne wide receiver was named a first-team All-SCIAC award winner.

The native of Anaheim, Calif., graduated from the University of La Verne in 2014 majoring in business administration and played wide receiver for the Leopards' football program.

Interested in coaching since his days at Anaheim's Servite High, he also has eight years of experience as a wide receivers coach for the Armed & Dangerous Football Camp of Anaheim, Calif.

Johnson is pursuing a master's degree at San José State in counselor education.

One of the most durable San José State offensive linemen in recent years, Nicholas was primarily a right guard and played some center for the 2010 through 2013 Spartan teams. Mr. Ladouceur was a member of the 1974 through 1976 Spartan teams. The 1977 graduate would go on to become one of the most successful high school coaches in America winning 399 games, 93 percent of his games and being designated as national champions 11 times in a 34-year head coaching career all at De La Salle High in Concord, Calif.

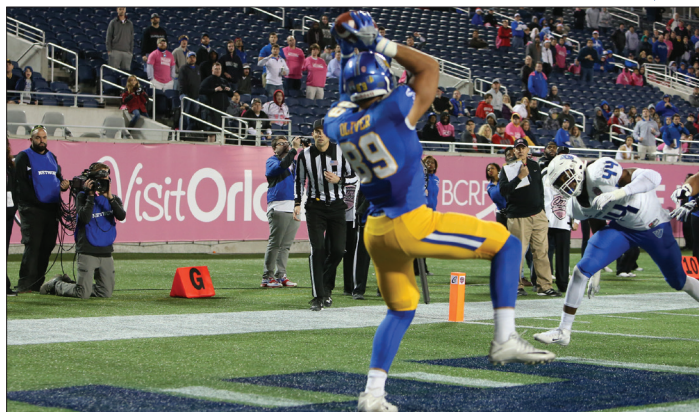

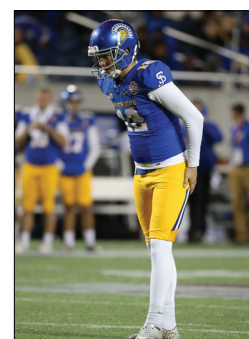

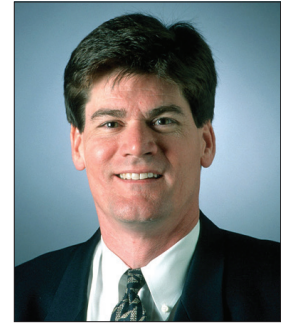

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. The MW continues to cultivate opportunities for more than 5,100 student-athletes each year to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship.

Over the past 17 years, 42 Mountain West student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. An additional 32 student-athletes have been named MW Scholar-Athlete of the Year and were awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships. Four Mountain West student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars.

Conceived on May 26, 1998, the presidents of Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference. Boise State University joined the Mountain West in 2011-12, followed by Fresno State and the University of Nevada. On July 1, 2012, the University of Hawai'i became a football-only member of the Conference. On July 1, 2013, San José State University and Utah State University joined the Conference, bringing to 11 the number of full-time member institutions and 12 football-playing members.

The Mountain West was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. In the inaugural year of the College Football Playoff system, Boise State earned the automatic slot into a New Year's Six bowl game as the highest-ranked champion from the Group of Five 5 conferences. The Broncos defeated then 10th-ranked Arizona, 38-30, in the 2015 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

Mountain West teams enjoyed a strong year in 2015-16. The MW sent a record eight teams to postseason bowl games. The league has earned 77 bowl bids since 1999 and holds a 42-35 (.545) all-time record. Entering 2016, the MW has six contracted bowl affiliations – the Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, Hawai'i Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Gilman New Mexico Bowl and NOVA® Home Loans Arizona Bowl. The league also has a secondary agreement with the Cactus Bowl.

The MW has produced 956 All-America selections among its 18 sponsored sports. A total of 167 MW student-athletes have also earned Academic All-America accolades. Mountain West have captured four NCAA team championships and produced 39 individual NCAA champions in seven sports.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. The majestic Rocky Mountain range borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet – the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively. Fresno State, San Diego State and San Jose State add a West Coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the Pacific Ocean.

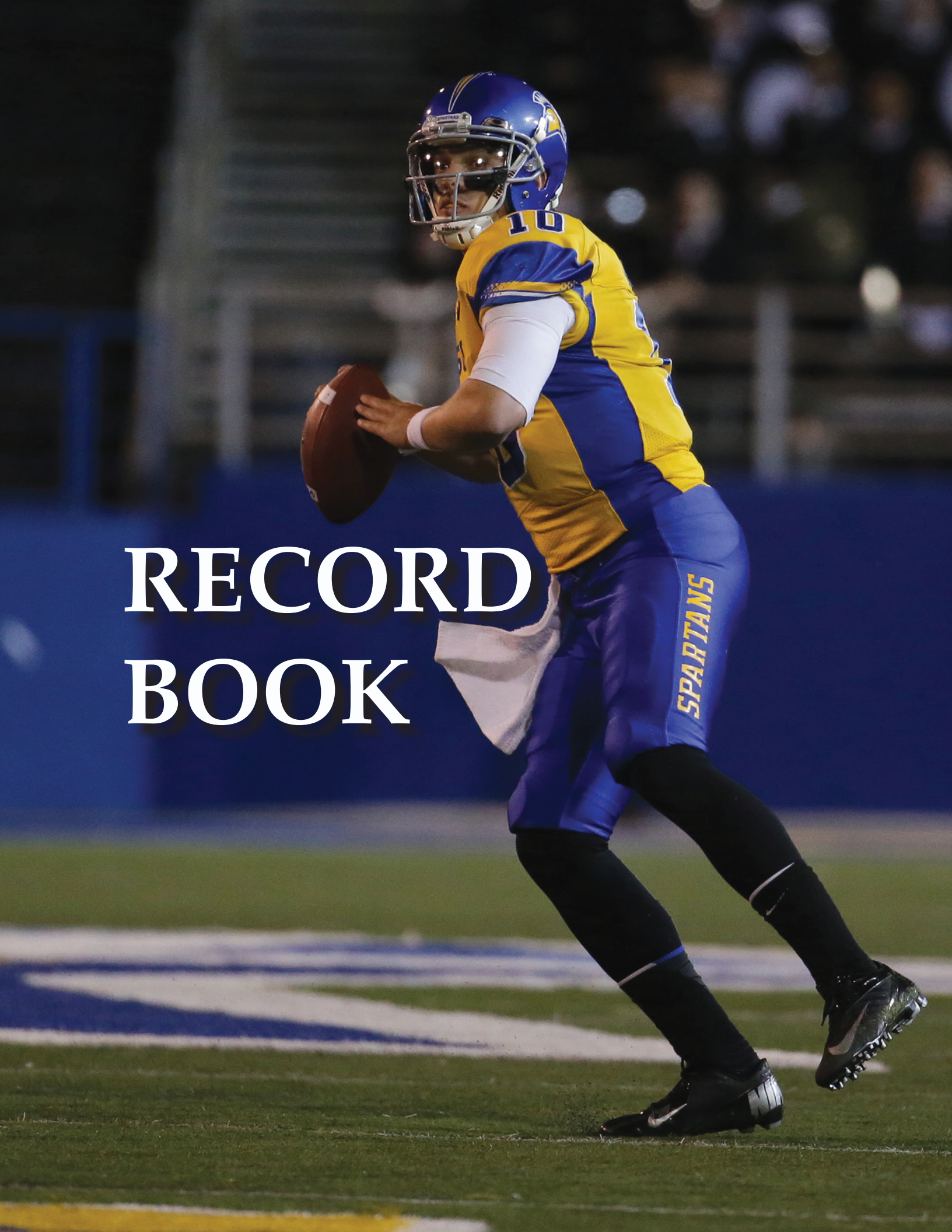

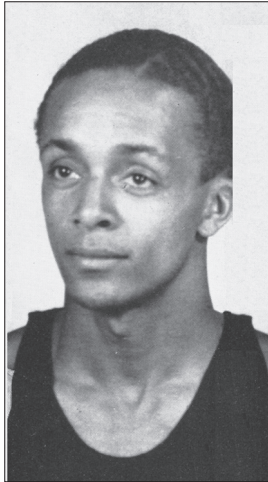

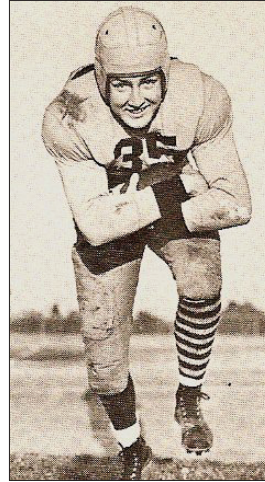


# RECORD BOOK

**L**loyd Thomas is the first San José State University football player to receive first-team All-America honors. The Spartan played as an end on the 1936, 1937 and 1938 teams that had a combined record of 27-7-1. He was an Associated Press Little All-America as a senior in 1938, one of the organization's first black All-America football players. Thomas also was a three-time letterwinner in basketball at San José State.

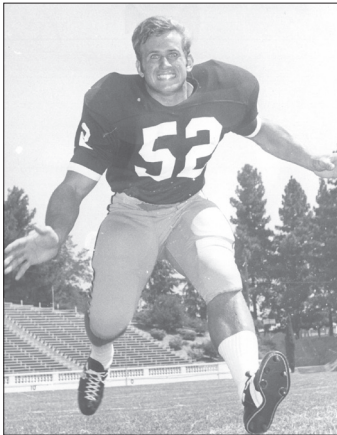

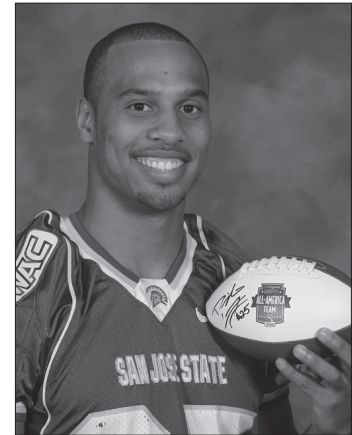
**L**eroy Zimmerman was a small college Associated Press first-team All-America back in 1939 – San José State University's first undefeated and untied season. The Spartans were 13-0 outscoring their opponents, 324-29. Zimmerman was the team's rushing leader, most proficient passer, led the team with eight interceptions and in scoring, and averaged 40.6 yards a punt. He was the first San José State player selected in a NFL draft when the Washington Redskins made him the 58th overall pick in 1940. He would go on to play nine seasons for five NFL teams.

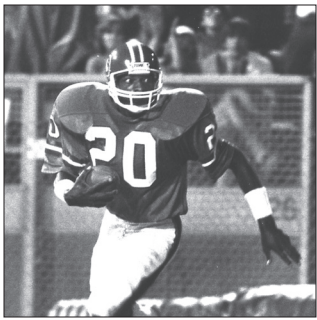

**D**ave Chaney was a two-time All-America linebacker. A United Press International second-team All-America as a junior in 1970, Chaney became the Spartans first major college first-team All-America when he was named to the Associated Press and Newspaper Enterprise Association 1971 teams. His greatest single-game performance was in the Spartans' 13-12 upset win over eventual Rose Bowl champion Stanford on November 13, 1971. Chaney was credited with 17 tackles, two fumble recoveries and intercepted a pass. His jersey number 52 was the first to be retired at San José State. After his college football career, he became a very successful high school tennis coach in Central California.

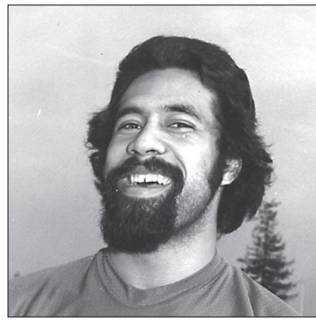
**C**harles Pauley was the NCAA Division I-A kickoff return leader in 2002 averaging a San José State single-season school 31.6 yards per return. The collegefootballnews.com first team and Associated Press third-team All-America returned kickoffs of 98 yards against UTEP and 97 yards at Stanford for touchdowns his senior season. Pauley was one of the most versatile players to wear a Spartan uniform. He played wide receiver, returned punts and kickoffs, gained yardage running the football and passed for four touchdowns in his two-year San Jose State career. As a junior in 2001, Pauley set a San Jose State single-game record of 355 all-purpose yards in a 64-45 win over Nevada. On the school's career list, he still ranks sixth for all-purpose running yardage and second in kickoff return average.

**D**wight Lowery is San José State University's only player with multiple first team All-America honors. In 2006, Lowery's school record nine interceptions tied for the nation's most and played a major role in the team's 9-4 win-loss record and New Mexico Bowl victory. He became the first San Jose State player to receive American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) All-America honors. Lowery repeated as an AFCA All-America in 2007. The New York Jets selected Lowery in the fourth round of the 2008 NFL draft. Now with the San Diego Chargers, he played for the Jets, Jacksonville Jaguars, Atlanta Falcons and Indianapolis Colts.

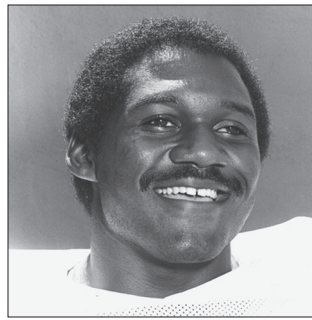

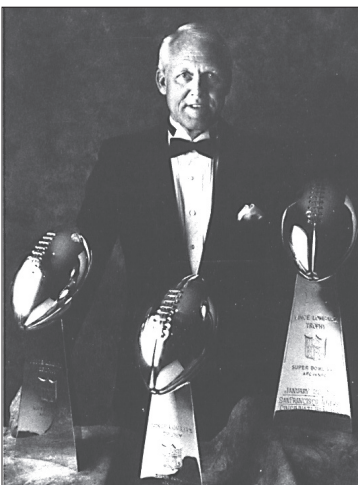

**A SPARTAN PASSED FOR 400 OR MORE YARDS IN A GAME:** Steve DeBerg threw for 404 yards at the University of the Pacific in a 50-30 win on November 13, 1976.

**A SPARTAN PASSED FOR 3,000 OR MORE YARDS IN A SEASON:** Ed Luther threw for 3,049 yards and 20 touchdowns in 11 games in 1979.

**A SPARTAN THREW FIVE OR MORE TOUCHDOWN PASSES IN A GAME:** Steve Clarkson threw six touchdowns in the 65-33 win at Fresno State on October 3, 1981.

**A SPARTAN THREW 50 OR MORE TOUCHDOWN PASSES IN A CAREER:** Craig Kimball threw 50 touchdown passes during the 1972 through 1974 seasons.

**A SPARTAN COMPLETED AT LEAST 60 PERCENT OF HIS PASSES IN A SEASON:** Danny Holman completed 61.5 percent (160-of-260) of his passes in the 1966 season.

**A SPARTAN CAUGHT 100 OR MORE PASSES IN A CAREER:** Ike McBee caught 106 passes for 1,571 yards and eight TDs from 1972 through 1974.

**A SPARTAN GAINED 1,000 OR MORE RECEIVING YARDS IN A CAREER:** Mack Burton gained 1,025 yards and scored 10 touchdowns on 72 receptions during the 1959 through 1961 seasons.

**A SPARTAN GAINED 2,000 OR MORE RECEIVING YARDS IN A CAREER:** Stacey Bailey gained 2,223 yards and scored 13 touchdowns on 123 receptions during the 1978 through 1981 seasons.

**A SPARTAN SCORED A TOUCHDOWN AT LEAST THREE DIFFERENT WAYS IN A GAME:** Chandler Jones scored on a run, a fumble recovery and a pass reception in the 28-27 win over Hawai'i on October 14, 2011.

**A SPARTAN THREW A TOUCHDOWN PASS AND SCORED AT LEAST TWO DIFFERENT WAYS IN A GAME:** Charles Pauley threw a 6-yard TD pass, scored on a 16-yard run and returned a kickoff 98 yards for a score in a 58-24 win over UTEP on September 28, 2002.

**A SPARTAN SCORED A TOUCHDOWN AT LEAST FIVE DIFFERENT WAYS IN A CAREER:** Walt Roberts scored touchdowns rushing, receiving, on a kickoff return, by interception and by punt return during his three seasons spanning 1961 through 1963.

**TWO CONSECUTIVE SAN JOSÉ STATE TOUCHDOWNS WERE ON PLAYS OF 90 OR MORE YARDS:** In the September 18, 2003 game with Nevada, Gerald Jones returned an interception 99 yards at the end of the second quarter. The first time San José State gained possession in the second half, Trestin George returned the kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown in a 42-30 loss.

**SAN JOSÉ STATE SCORED 50 OR MORE POINTS AGAINST A COLLEGE OPPONENT:** San José State defeated Pepperdine, 61-6, on October 9, 1948.

**SAN JOSÉ STATE SCORED 70 OR MORE POINTS AGAINST A COLLEGE OPPONENT:** San José State defeated Rice, 70-63, on October 2, 2004.



**SAN JOSÉ STATE SCORED A DEFENSIVE EXTRA POINT:** San José State earned two points when Duke Ihenacho picked up a blocked PAT and ran into the end zone in the 28-27 win over Hawai'i on October 14, 2011.

**SAN JOSÉ STATE PLAYED IN AN OVERTIME GAME:** San José State defeated UNLV, 55-48, on November 2, 1997.

**SAN JOSÉ STATE FINISHED A SEASON RANKED IN THE BCS STANDINGS:** San José State was listed 24th in the 2012 Bowl Championship Series standings.

**SAN JOSÉ STATE FINISHED A SEASON RANKED IN THE NATIONAL POLLS:** San José State was ranked 21st in the final 2012 Associated Press and USA Today / ESPN coaches polls.

San José State was scheduled to play two games in Hawaii to end the 1941 season. The Spartans were in Honolulu when the attack on Pearl Harbor occurred on December 7, 1941. Many players immediately joined the local police force or the armed services. The games against the University of Hawai'i on December 13 and Willamette College of Oregon on December 16 were cancelled.

The San José State University football team has played its home games in Spartan Stadium since 1933. The Spartans won the first football game played in the stadium, 44-0, over San Francisco State, on October 7. Since then, the Spartans have played 389 games over 80 seasons. The team's 100th win in the stadium came on October 21, 1967, against New Mexico, 52-14. The 200th victory occurred in 2005. SJSU's home field record is 234-138-17 entering the 2016 season.

Spartan Stadium currently seats 30,456 for football. Every seat puts the spectator either close to or right on top of the action. Two stadium expansions and renovations in the 1980's increased the seating capacity from 18,000 to over 30,000.

A FieldTurf surface replaced natural grass in 2009. Two new scoreboards - one on the East side and a state-of-the-art videoboard were installed in 2011.

The multi-purpose facility is the site of the school's annual commencement ceremony. Concerts, professional and collegiate soccer, religious convocations, band competitions and high school football games also take place at Spartan Stadium.

Five Silicon Valley Football Classics were held in Spartan Stadium. Air Force in 2000, Michigan State in 2001, Fresno State in 2002, UCLA in 2003 and Northern Illinois in 2004 were bowl-game winners. The 1999 Women's World Cup and 1999 NCAA Women's College Cup soccer events attracted record-setting crowds.

The largest attendance at a home football game was a 31,681 sellout crowd at the 2003 win over Grambling State. The game marked the first time under the current stadium configuration that San José State had a "sellout" prior to game day.

The largest crowd to attend any event in the stadium was estimated at 37,000 for a ZZ Top music concert.

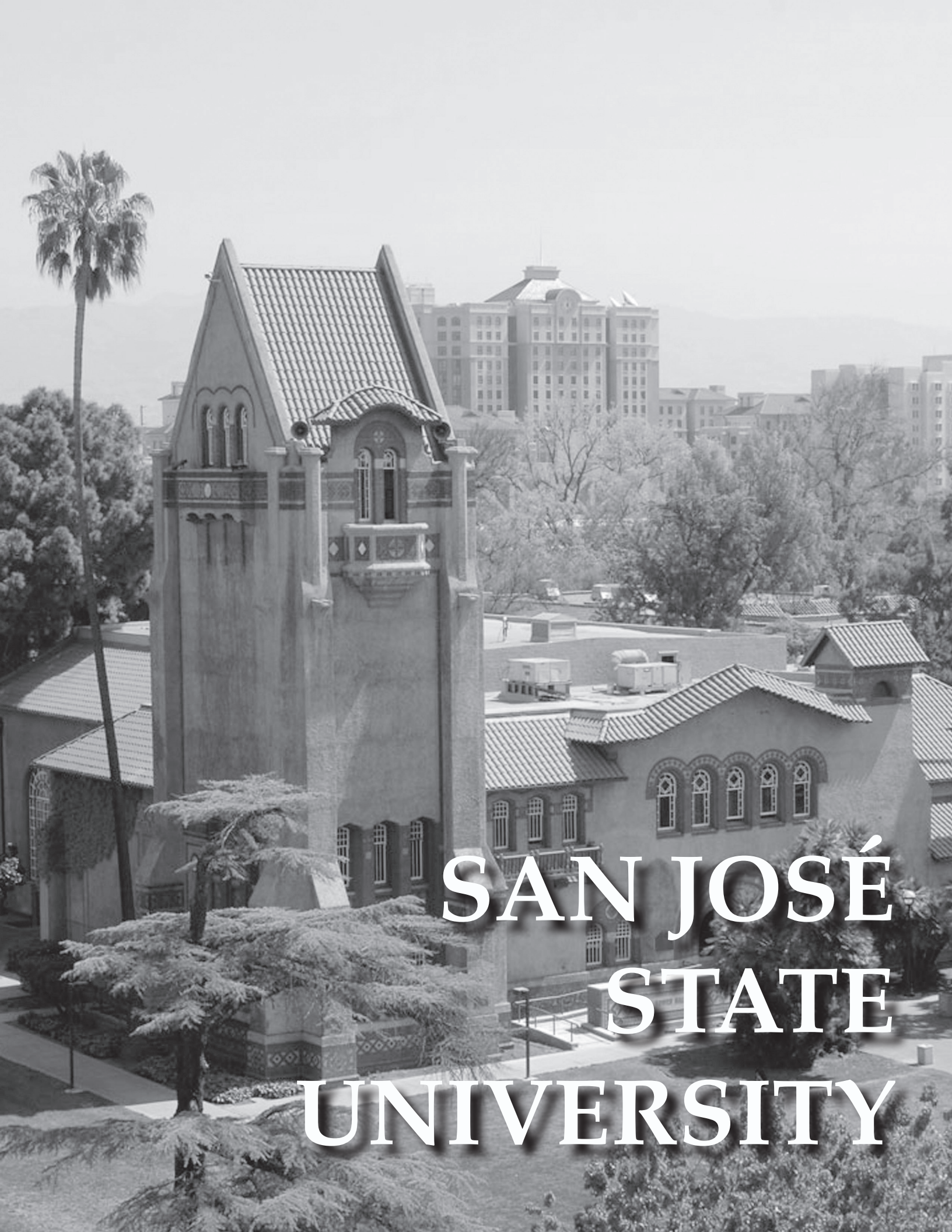

## DR. MARY PAPAZIAN

University President



**D**r. Mary Papazian, a seasoned leader with more than 25 years of teaching and academic administrative experience, joined San Jose State University (SJSU) as its 29th president on July 1, 2016. Papazian is firmly committed to student success; open, transparent and inclusive leadership; fostering a culture of curiosity and discovery; and building enduring campus and community partnerships.

Papazian most recently served as president of Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU) in New Haven, Conn. There, she demonstrated a singular focus on student success, establishing a task force in her first year as president to review practices and develop recommendations for change. Under her leadership, SCSU launched a predictive analytics advising tool and hired additional advisors in key areas to support first-year experience, sophomore, transition programs and degree programs. She developed partnerships with local community colleges to expand advising resources for prospective transfer students and established a summer scholarship program for undergraduate research.

Papazian also served as an exceptional steward, providing a vision for a fundraising initiative that, when launched, will be SCSU's first-ever comprehensive campaign. She secured the campus' first \$3 million gift along with a \$1.2 million bequest to establish its first endowed chair, in Autism and Special Education. Her fundraising efforts supported a new Academic Laboratory and Science Building that opened in fall 2015; expanded international education and study abroad programs; increased research opportunities for undergraduate students, and expanded scholarships to support student recruitment, retention and completion.

Prior to her tenure at SCSU, Papazian was the provost and senior vice president for Academic Affairs at Lehman College of The City University of New York (CUNY), managing a \$70 million budget that supported 450 full-time faculty members and 200 staff members. At Lehman College, she strengthened the research infrastructure by creating a research advisory board, hiring a new director of the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs, and developing a research handbook for faculty.

In addition to her high-level administrative experience, Papazian previously served as the dean of the College of Humanities and Social Sciences at Montclair State University in New Jersey, and associate dean of the College of Arts and Science at Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan. Papazian began her career in higher education at Oakland University, where she was an assistant, associate and tenured professor of English.

Born and raised in Southern California, Papazian holds a bachelor's, master's and Ph.D. in English from the University

of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). She and husband Dennis R. Papazian, founding director of the Armenian Research Center at the University of Michigan, Dearborn, have two adult daughters.

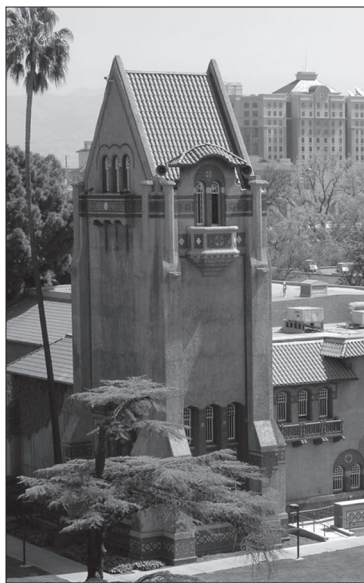

Located in the heart of the Silicon Valley, this university has aided the development of the computer industry and the resulting technological advances in our nation by providing the largest source of engineering, science and business graduates to Silicon Valley companies.

Graduating about 7,000 students annually, San José State University also provides the professional infrastructure for the region – from teachers to social workers to artists to law enforcement officers to nurses. The terms, “leaders and professionals,” describe not just the types of graduates who earn their degrees, but also the roles they assume in their communities and in their fields of endeavor.

San José State University's place in history is well-established. Founded in 1857, it was the first public institution of higher education on the West Coast. From its humble beginnings as a normal school to train teachers for the developing frontier, it has matured into a master's university offering 191 bachelor's and master's degrees.

The university's 32,000 students study in eight fully-accredited colleges: Applied Sciences and the Arts, Business, Education, Engineering, Humanities and the Arts, Science, Social Sciences and

Social Work.

One strength of the academic program is the broad general education curriculum that brings common elements -- critical thinking, writing and communication skills, and cultural pluralism -- to diverse studies. Academic strength also is seen in the university's nationally-recognized programs. Examples include the School of Music, the School of Art and Design, the School of Journalism and Mass Communications, the School of Nursing and the School of Library and Information Science.

In each discipline, quality teaching remains a priority. Tenured faculty teach introductory as well as advanced courses with an emphasis on small classes. Learning facilities include computer-equipped classrooms, the Western world's only undergraduate nuclear science facility and North America's largest Beethoven Center. Focusing on applied research, faculty receive a growing number of contracts and grants each year. From Moss Landing Marine Research Laboratory to the NASA Ames Research Center, faculty are exploring everything from the depths of the ocean to the surface of Mars.

San José State University also finds strength in its diversity. For first-generation students, it is a gateway to economic independence and social mobility. It is also an incubator of cultural and intellectual development and an opportunity for lifelong learning. Students range in age from first-time freshmen to college transfers to professionals seeking additional education. Student demographics – with ethnic pluralism – provide the benefits of multiple cultures and diverse student interests and activities. From residence life to athletic teams to social clubs to co-op jobs – student activities meet the needs of this diverse student body.

## GENE BLEYMAIER

Director of Athletics



**G**ene Bleymaier, one of the most-experienced and accomplished athletics directors in college athletics, was named San José State University's director of athletics on May 24, 2012.

In his four years, the Spartans' athletics and academic achievements cover a wide spectrum. Bleymaier led the University's transition into the Mountain West as its primary conference affiliation, added the sports of women's indoor and outdoor track and field and beach volleyball, reinstated men's water polo after a 34-year absence, conceived plans for new and upgraded athletics facilities, and successfully promoted San Jose State as a practice site for Super Bowl 50 and Copa America 2016, one of the world's most widely watched soccer tournaments.

Academically, San Jose State reported its highest-ever NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) multi-year department score – 976 (out of 1,000) in 2015. In 2016, a University-best three programs, men's cross country, women's cross country and women's water polo, received the NCAA's Public Recognition Award for a multi-year score in the top 10 percent nationally of their respective sports.

In athletics competition, San Jose State now has four consecutive football bowl victories after winning the 2012 Military Bowl and the 2015 Auto Nation Cure Bowl. The 2012 Spartans were listed in the final BCS standings for the first time in school history at #24, and were voted #21 nationally in the season-ending Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN coaches polls.

Since 2012, San José State's conference championships are in women's soccer, women's swimming and diving, women's tennis and softball. The Spartans finished an all-time best 106th out of 295 NCAA Division I programs in the final 2013 Learfield Sports Directors Cup standings that measure overall program success in national competition. San Jose State's teams and student-athletes also competed in NCAA post-season competition in men's cross country, men's golf, women's golf, women's gymnastics, women's swimming and diving, women's tennis, and women's outdoor track and field in the last four years.

Bleymaier came to San José State with an impressive array of personal and professional accomplishments from 30 years as Boise State University's athletics director.

He directed the Broncos through three conference affiliation upgrades to comprehensive conference and national success. Boise State posted 33 top-25 finishes in nine different sports. Most recognizable was Boise State football's ascension to a national brand. The Broncos were the only football program from 2009 through 2011 to finish in the top-10 each year in the final national polls and had six top-10 finishes in the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) standings between 2004 and 2011.

In 10 years of WAC membership, the Broncos were the only three-time winner of the Commissioner's Cup signifying the conference's best overall athletics program. There were conference championships in 11 sports. Boise State coaches

earned 31 Coach of the Year awards and Bronco student-athletes received conference Athlete of the Year awards 35 times and 68 All-America honors.

Academically, the Broncos consistently produced the highest Academic Progress Rate (APR) score among WAC football-playing members. The NCAA recognized Boise State in 2010 with a Public Recognition Award. The Boise State student-athlete population also produced a five consecutive semesters of cumulative grade-point averages over 3.00 per semester.

Bleymaier can take credit for conceiving Boise State's unique blue artificial turf for Bronco Stadium. Installed in 1986, it remains one of the most distinguishing playing surfaces in the United States. His fundraising acumen and vision led to the creation of enhanced practice and competition facilities for football, track and field, basketball, softball, tennis, and women's gymnastics over a 15-year span. New sports medicine, student-athlete support services and strength and conditioning facilities also were constructed.

In August 2013, Boise State unveiled the Gene Bleymaier Football Complex honoring his accomplishments at the University.

In 1997, he founded the post-season Humanitarian Bowl game. Now known as the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, the Boise-hosted game now is in its 19th year attracting top college football teams.

For his exemplary leadership, Bleymaier received the 2008 Astro Turf Athletics Director of the Year and the 2011 Bobby Dodd Athletics Director of the Year Awards. In 2009, he was one of five finalists for the Street and Smith's Sports Business Journal and Sports Business Daily Athletic Director of the Year Award and the only nominee from a non-automatic qualifying Bowl Championships Series (BCS) conference school.

The 1975 UCLA graduate was a three-year letter-winning tight end on the Bruins' 1972 through 1974 football teams. His college coaches were legendary San José State alum Dick Vermeil and Pepper Rodgers. Bleymaier was a third-team All-Pacific 8 Conference selection and was the 1974 recipient of the UCLA Alumni Association's Outstanding Senior Award.

Bleymaier earned a law degree from Loyola Law School in 1978. He served as a UCLA assistant athletics director before joining the Boise State athletics department in 1981 as an assistant athletics director. In 1982, he was promoted to the Broncos' athletics director.

**J**ohn Poch returned to San José State University in January 2009. As the Deputy Director of Athletics/External Operations, his duties include managing the department's external relations components of fund raising and community relations. He also has a lead role in the fund raising for the South Campus facility project.

Previously, Poch served as the Tournament Director of the 1999 and 2000 NCAA Women's College Cup hosted by San José State University and was an assistant coach for the Spartans' women's soccer team from 1995 to 2000. Under his direction, the 1999 College Cup attracted more than 28,000 spectators for two semifinal contests and the championship match. The 14,410 in attendance for the championship game remains the top attendance figure for any college women's soccer contest.

As a San José State assistant coach, he was on the ground floor of the new Spartan program. In its first five seasons, San José State posted a 53-44-3 overall win-loss record.

Poch is a successful youth soccer coach with United States Soccer Federation and National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) national licenses. He coached the San José Pioneer High School boys' teams to three Central Coast Section championships and was named the National Coach of the Year in 2001 by the NSCAA.

From 2000 through 2008, he was the executive director of the After-School All-Stars of Greater San José - a program targeting at-risk youths. In his eight years, After-School All-Stars grew from a two-person staff with a \$275,000 annual operating budget to a full-time staff of 36 and 230 part-time employees and a \$3.9-million budget comprised largely of dollars raised through his fundraising acumen and direction. More than 3,000 students from 50-plus elementary and middle schools in San José were After-School All-Stars beneficiaries.

In 2011, Poch completed course work in the Sports Management Institute - a collaboration of the Universities of Southern California, Texas, Michigan, Notre Dame and North Carolina. The Sports Management Institute provides a specialized executive management program for sports professionals.

He is a member of NACDA (National Association of College Directors of Athletics), NAADD (National Association of Athletic Development Directors) and AFP (Association of Fundraising Professionals) and remains well-connected in San José. He also serves on the board of directors for After-School All-Stars.

The 2001 San José State University graduate majored in kinesiology. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in sport management at San José State. As a student-athlete, he played football at West Valley College before enrolling at San José State.

John and his wife, Debora, a 1988 San José University graduate, are the parents of one daughter, Nicole.

**M**arie Tuite joined the San Jose State University athletics administrative team in an executive capacity in June 2010. Presently, she is the Deputy Director of Athletics/Internal Operations. She is adding the Senior Woman Administrator duties for the 2016-17 academic year.

From April through June 2012, Tuite also was the Interim Director of Athletics. In that time, she took a leadership role in San Jose State's invitation and acceptance to join the Mountain West Conference in July 2013.

Tuite oversees all of the Spartans' internal components and affairs. She manages the department's daily operations, has direct supervision of student services, compliance and business affairs, manages future football scheduling and serves as a sports supervisor for football, men's basketball, women's basketball and women's golf.

Her professional career includes executive positions at Pacific-12 Conference universities and the NCAA. She came to the Spartans from Seattle University where she was a Special Assistant to the Athletics Director. Tuite assisted Seattle University's transition to NCAA Division I athletics status.

Her first athletics administrative position was at Alma (Mich.) College in 1981 as the Director of Women's Athletics Programs and Activities. She joined the University of California women's athletics staff in 1984 as an assistant athletics director.

Tuite then relocated to the NCAA office in the Kansas City area and served as an Assistant Director of Championships from 1989 to 1994. She assisted the organization's sport committees in the administration of the National Collegiate Championships program and coordinated the Association's corporate partner, merchandising, promotional, and official ball programs for NCAA championships.

She returned to a campus setting in 1994 as a senior associate athletics director at the University of Washington. Her duties included overseeing the process and appointment of new head coaches, directing day-to-day operations including fiscal responsibility and leadership opportunities for numerous sports, and initiating and implementing "keys to success" for priority Husky sports programs.

A two-sport student-athlete and graduate of Central Michigan University, she was inducted into the university's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1990 as just the third female inductee. Tuite played field hockey and was a star basketball player who majored in physical education. She earned her master's degree from her alma mater in athletic administration.

Tuite is a member of NACDA (National Association of College Directors of Athletics), NACWAA (National Association of Collegiate Women's Athletics Administrators) and the Women's Sports Foundation. In May 2012, she was one of 41 local female executives honored at the 28th annual Tribute to Women Awards program by the YWCA Silicon Valley.

The native of Livonia, Mich., has two sons, Michael, a 2015 University of Washington graduate, and John.

**E**ileen Daley was appointed San Jose State University's senior associate athletics director for academics and student services in June 2016. Now in her 11<sup>th</sup> year at the University, she is in her second tenure with the University's athletics department.

In her new position, Daley will oversee the academic services program and address the overall academic goals for the Athletics Department. She will work in liaison roles with academic advising, University admissions and the NCAA and will manage the Spartans' 5th Year program, grant submissions and student orientation programs.

Daley's first San Jose State Athletics position was as the lead academic advisor in 2005. She was promoted to an assistant athletics director position for academic services in 2007. Daley was a central figure in the department's major improvement in the NCAA's measurement of Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores. Once saddled with an APR score for football below 900 (out of 1,000), San Jose State's score in the sport rose steadily during her tenure and beyond topping at 975 for the 2015 NCAA report.

Between 2011 and 2016, she served the University as the associate director for undergraduate admissions and outreach. She and her team were assigned to recruit undergraduate students for San José State with a focus on under represented demographic groups.

The 1995 Sonoma State University graduate majored in psychology and competed in track and field for two seasons. She earned a master's degree in sports psychology from John F. Kennedy University in 1997.

Daley was an assistant track and field coach at Petaluma (Calif.) High School before embarking on a career in athletics administration. As a graduate student, she was assigned to work on psychological performance enhancement with injured University of California Davis student-athletes. Daley worked at Sonoma State University (1998-99) in student-athlete support services and the California Interscholastic Federation (C.I.F.) for four years (1999-2003) as an assistant director focusing on educational programs. She was the academic coordinator for San Francisco State University Athletics (2003-05) before coming to San Jose State.

Chisholm, his wife, Lydia, and daughter, Karisse, live in San José.

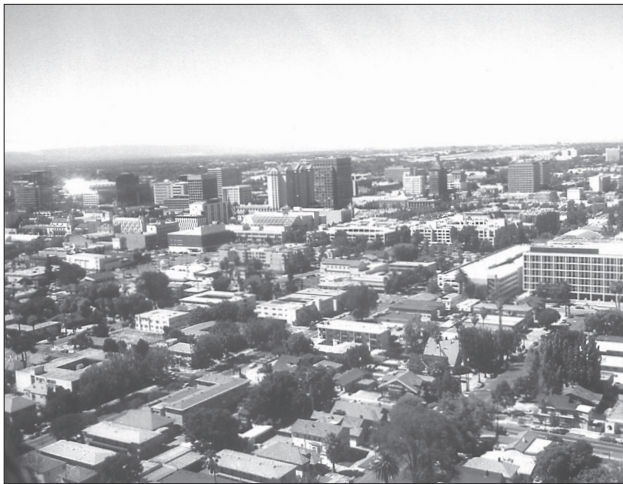
**D**arren Coelho, a San José State University athletics staff member since 2001 is the Assistant Athletics Director for Ticket Operations.

## Credential Requests

Credentials are issued for news and editorial coverage on a case-by-case basis to those filing game stories, accredited members from established media outlets, and personnel assigned by the sports information office. Requests should be directed to Lawrence Fan, Athletics Media Relations Director. The credential recipient agrees to all conditions set forth by the University relating to conduct and print, video, audio, digital and photographic game coverage.

## Press Box

The Spartan Stadium press box is located on the 7th Street side of the stadium and is an open-air facility. Carry a jacket. The press box remains open three hours after each contest.



## Game Day Parking

Media parking is located in Lot 4 on 7th & Humboldt Streets. Media parking passes for home games are issued by the athletics media relations office.

## Photographers

Credentials are issued to newspapers, wire services, video crews and team photographers. NCAA rules limit photographers to a wide area behind the restraining line around the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines.

## Play-by-Play Television

Contact Lawrence Fan in writing at least 30 days prior to a game concerning video play-by-play of San José State University home football games.

## Radio Broadcasts

The radio broadcast booth for the designated official flagship station of the visiting team at Spartan Stadium is Box B on the mezzanine level of the press box and has space for five working individuals. ISDN and regular telephone service are provided.

## Production Truck & Satellite Uplink Parking

Production truck and satellite uplink parking is on the 7th street side of the stadium. Arrangements must be made to park a truck overnight inside Spartan Stadium.

## Scouts

Space limitations prohibit seating and standing in the press box for scouting purposes.

## Spotters & Statisticians

Requests for spotters and/or statisticians should be placed two weeks prior to a home game.

## Statistics & Services

Game statistics, play-by-play accounts and post-game quotes are compiled and distributed. FAX service is available. A meal is available two hours before kickoff.

## Team Practices & In-Person Interviews

During the season, the Spartans practice in the morning. In-person, post-practice interview opportunities with the student-athletes, generally, occur at approximately 11:00 a.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Please contact the athletics media relations office in advance with your interview request.
