John Kennaday

Head Coach Ninth Season San José State, 1987

John Kennaday was appointed the San José State University men's golf coach in April 2005. His hire marked a return to his alma mater, where as a senior he was a 1987 All-American.

Kennaday is responsible for helping re-establish San José State's golf legacy. In the 2011-12

season, Kennaday became the first Spartans coach since 1982 to have a team win four times in the same season and the first since 1979 to win three consecutive tournaments.

A record setting day at the 2011 Dash Thomas Memorial (9/26-27) was just one of many highlights during the Spartans' fall run. Kennaday's team shattered the school record for a 36-hole score with a 542. Their 265 (-19) in the second round broke a 13-year school record for lowest 18-hole team score. The Spartans ended the season just as strong as they started, winning their first ever Western Athletic Conference (WAC) Championship and earning a second consecutive bid to NCAA Regionals. Senior Jay Myers also took medalist honors at the WAC Championship, making it two in a row for the Spartans after Mark Hubbard won it in 2011.

In the 2010-11 season, the Spartans received their first NCAA Regional Championship invitation in 14 years, posted a program-best second-place finish at the WAC Championship and placed in the top-half of the field in 10 of 12 tournaments.

Individually in 2010-11, Hubbard and Myers were first and second-team All-WAC players, respectively. It was the second time in three seasons the duo achieved the honor. During Kennaday's tenure, his players earned all-conference honors six times and



academic All-WAC recognition 10 times. Hubbard is also the most recent of eight Golf Coaches Association of America (GCAA) Scholar All-Americans which Kennaday has coached in his career.

Kennaday returned to San José State after spending six seasons as the head coach for the Santa Clara University men's golf team. The once-dormant program became competitive in the West Coast Conference and regionally under Kennaday. In 2001, he was named the conference Coach of the Year.

Kennaday currently manages and directs The Western Intercollegiate, the longest running men's college golf tournament west of the Mississippi River. "The Western", in 2014, is in its 68th year at the famed Pasatiempo Golf Course in Santa Cruz, Calif. He also oversees the Spartans' Friendraiser event that has attracted Spartan alums and PGA Tour winners such as the late Ken Venturi, Roger Maltbie, Mark Wiebe and Arron Oberholser for a day of instruction and goodwill.

Besides his San José State duties, Kennaday is the personal coach for Oberholser, a two-time Spartan All-American, winner of the 2006 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and a former top-50 ranked player in the world. In 2011, Kennaday was named one of two current coaches serving on the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee.

As a player, Kennaday was a two-time Coast Conference Most Valuable Player at Monterey Peninsula College before transferring to San Jose State. He was a 1986 and 1987 first-team All-Pacific Coast Athletic Association pick, and helped the Spartans to a 12thplace tie at the 1987 NCAA Championships.

He went on to play professionally on the Canadian PGA, Nike and Golden State Tours for seven and a half years. Kennaday set two course records during his playing career, at Rancho Canada West in Carmel, Calif., and at Spring Valley Golf Course in Milpitas, Calif.

His teaching career began in Milpitas, where he served as a teaching pro at the Mark Docak's Complete Golf School. He also was an assistant pro at the Spring Valley Golf Course.

Kennaday and his wife, Christina, have two sons, Jack and Benjamin. The Kennaday family resides in San Jose.

Matt Hovan

Assistant Coach First Season San José State, 2012

After a successful four-year career a member of the San José State men's golf team, Matt Hovan was appointed assistant men's golf coach in June 2013.

In 99 career rounds as a Spartans, Hovan averaged 73.48 strokes per round. His 72.82 stroke average for the 2011-12 season is the ninth lowest since 1978-79.


A second-team All-Western Athletic Conference performer in 2012, he help the team three straight wins to open the year. The regular season was capped with a fifth place finish, as an individual, and a WAC Championship for the team. The Spartans went on to compete at the NCAA Regional at Stanford Golf Club in Palo Alto, Calif.

Hovan's best finish was third-place at the 2010 Mark Simpson Invitational. He had five more top-5 finished and a total of 12 top-20 results in 32 starts.

The low round of his collegiate career, a six-under 66, came in the opening round of the 2011 Amer Ari Invitational and the second round of the 2011 Dash Thomas Memorial. His six-under 66 at the Amer Air is tied for the third lowest score to par in a round for a Spartan since 1997-98.

Hovan was a 2007 graduate of Serra High School in San Mateo, Calif. He led the team to the 2007 West Catholic Athletic League title as a senior, the 2006 Central Coast Section title as a junior and place third at the 2006 CIF State Championship.

As an amateur he competed in the stroke play portion of the 2008 and 2011 California State Amateur Championship. Hovan graduated in 2012 with a degree in business management from San José State and resides in San Jose, Calif.





Cody Blick Sophomore || 5-11 Danville, Calif.

2012-13: Averaged 72.84 strokes per round in 13 tournaments (39 rounds)...one of four golfers to play in each round on the season...eight top-20 and three top-10 finishes...best result was a tie for second at the Duck Invitational (3/25-26)...shot a team and Western Athletic Conference best 13 rounds under par...best single round was a 66 to open the U.S. Intercollegiate (3/28-30) among 10 rounds in the 60s...twice shot a season-best tournament score of 210, at the Amer Ari Invitational (2/6-8) and the Duck Invitational...15 of his 39 rounds were shot at par or better... one of two freshman in the nation to earn his conference's Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year and first team honors...competed in the NCAA Regional Championship as an individual and finished tied for 50th...San José State's most decorated freshman golfer as a member of the Western Athletic Conference.

HIGH SCHOOL: A 2011 first-team All-East Bay Athletic League honoree from San Ramon Valley (Calif.) High School...second place finish out of 120 at the 2010 Aiello Invitational at the Discovery Bay Country Club...a 2008 NCGA Junior Championship qualifier and also played junior amateur golf with the American Junior Golf Association, Northern California Professional Golf Association and the Northern California Golf Association.

CODY: A business communications major...aspires to be a professional golfer after college... enjoys playing golf and basketball in his free time...a member of Round Hill Country Club...born December 5, 1993 in San Ramon, Calif., and now calls Danville, Calif., his hometown.

2012-13: Averaged 75.96 strokes per round in nine tournaments (25 rounds)...best finish was a tie for 37th place in the Dash Thomas Memorial (9/24-25)...twice shot a best round of 71, at the Golfweek Conference Challenge (9/16-18) and the U.S. Intercollegiate (3/28-30)...the 71 at the Golfweek Conference Challenge was his lone round under par on the year... twice shot a tournament best 220, at the Dash Thomas Memorial and U.S. Intercollegiate...competed as an individual at the Amer Ari Invitational (2/6-8) and U.S. Intercollegiate.

HIGH SCHOOL: Played four years of varsity golf at Dublin High School.

Justin Estrada Senior || 5-10 Yuba City, Calif.

SPARTAN NOTES: In his fifth season as a Spartan...six career top-ten finishes and eight top-20 results...2012-13 second team All-WAC performer.

2012-13: Averaged 73.25 strokes per round in 12 tournaments (36 rounds)...one of four golfers to play every round in the season...best finish was T4th at the Itani Quality Homes Collegiate (9/10-11), which equaled his best finish as a collegian... shot his season best 211 in a 10th place finish at the Western Intercollegiate (4/13-14)...had five rounds in the 60s, including a career best 66 in the second round of the Alister MacKinzie Invitational (10/15-16)...11 of his 36 rounds were at level par or better...recorded the second most rounds under par, nine, on the team...had the second best scoring average in the squad and fourth best in the WAC.

2011-12: Played 39 rounds, third on the team averaging 72.95 strokes per round... shot a 68 in the opening-round of the WAC Championship (4/30)...shot 68-71-79-218 and T55th at the 2012 NCAA Regional Championship (5/17-19)... placed inside the top-20 in each of the team's five fall tournaments...T5th at the Palouse Collegiate (9/13-14)...shot in the 60's all three rounds at the Alister MacKenzie Invitational (10/17-10) and finished T7th...shot a two-under 70 in the final round of the Wolf Pack Classic (10/3-4) beloing SJSU win their third consecutive tournament.

2012-13: Averaged 76.52 strokes per round in seven tournaments (21 rounds)...best finish was a tie for third, in the WAC Championship (4/29-5/1)...twice shot a season-best 71 in the WAC Championship and recorded his best tournament total (221) that week... broke into the starting lineup in the final tournament of the Fall, the Gifford Collegiate Championship (11/5-7), and started every tournament for the rest of the year.

REEDLEY JUNIOR COLLEGE: Spent one year (2011) on the men's golf team and was an All-Central Valley Conference selection ...finished inside the top-ten individually at the 2011 CCCAA Men's Golf Championship...took medalist honors at Riverbend Golf Course in Madera, Calif., helping Reedley to a fifth consecutive conference tournament win...other top amateur golf finishes include fifth place at the 2011 Oakland City Championship and fourth place at the Atascadero City Championship.

HIGH SCHOOL: Was a member of the varsity golf team at Buchanan High School in Clovis, Calif....was an All-Tri-River Athletic Conference selection in 2010 as a senior.

LANDON: A communications major with a minor in business... enjoys playing ping-pong in his free time...born April 2, 1992 and calls his hometown Fresno, Calif.





Daniel Sémmler Senior || 5-7 Belmont, Calif.

SPARTAN NOTES: In his fifth season as a Spartan...Six career top-20 finishes.

2012-13: Averaged 74.05 strokes per round in 12 tournament (36 rounds)...best round of the season was a 69 at the Alister Mackinzie Invitational (10/15-16)...top finishes were a pair of 15th place ties, at the Dash Memorial (9/24-25) and Western Intercollegiate (4/13-14) ...other top-20 finish, a 16th place tie, came at the WAC Championship (4/29-5/1)...twice shot a career tournament-best score of 213, at the Alister MacKinzie Invitational (10/15-16) and Western Intercollegiate...had six rounds under par and a team-best four at even par during the year.

2011-12: Played the most rounds of his career this season with 33 and averaged 75.21 strokes per round...Played in all five of the team's fall tournaments...finished in a tie for 10th place shooting 71-76-74-221 at the Wolf Pack Classic (10/3-4) helping San Jose State to a victory...shot a career low three-under par 68 in the middle round at the Dash Thomas Memorial (9/26-27), went on to finish two-under for the tournament...Spartans as a team counted six out of nine rounds from Semmler during their win streak of three straight tournaments in the fall...finished the year with four rounds in red figure and two at level par.

2010-11: Played eight tournaments during the season including the 2011 NCAA Regional Championship...Became a lineup fixture in March and played in each of the last seven tournaments...Matched par for 18 holes with an opening round 72 at the Duck Invitational (3/21)...best finish was 13th at the WAC Championship...Was the Spartans' number-two finisher at the WAC Championship...The team counted his scores 15 out of the 21 rounds he played in team competition.

Ken Venturi 1931-2013

A member of the San José State Sports Hall of Fame and accorded Legend status, Ken Venturi was a highly-acclaimed high school golfer from San Francisco who played for the 1951 through 1953 Spartan golf teams. As a San José State golfer, he won the California State Amateur championship in 1951 and would repeat in 1956 before embarking on a career as a professional.

"Mr. Venturi was the epitome of what a gentleman golfer should be and he set that standard for this program from the very first day he set foot on the San José State campus. His high level of integrity both on and off the golf course is a model that every golfer who has played for San José State strives to achieve. His impact on the game he loved and on those who represent San Jose State cannot be understated," said San José State men's golf head coach John Kennaday.

"I've lost a dear friend and a mentor, but the world of golf has lost one of its greatest ambassadors. Kenny was truly a wonderful person and I will miss him everyday." Mr. Venturi consistently assisted the San José State men's golf program with his "Day with Ken" and "Friendraisers" fund-raising events. Becoming a better golfer and a better person from playing his game were at the core of his message.

Mr. Venturi joined the PGA Tour in 1956. He won 14 tournaments as a professional. His 1964 U.S. Open championship at the Congressional Country Club in Bethesda, Md., continues to be remembered as one of the greatest victories in the history of the sport.

Mr. Venturi gained even more notoriety in his second career as the lead analyst for CBS Sports' coverage of the PGA Tour. His 35 years as a commentator is acknowledged as the longest tenure in broadcast sports history.

Besides his San Jose State honors, Mr. Venturi was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in the lifetime achievement category on May 6, 2013.



NCAA Championship History



San José State, led by Bob Harris (middle), was the 1948 NCAA Men's Golf Champion. Harris earned Individual Medalist honors after finishing in first place in stroke play. Morgan Fottrell, Eli Bariteau, Ross Smith, Warren McCarty and Howard Verutti were also members of that championship the team.

In 50 years, between 1947 and 1997, the Spartans made the NCAA Championship field 32 times. Including its NCAA Championship in 1948, San José State recorded 15 top-10 finishes in that time. In 1964, Terry Small became San José State's second men's golfer to win Individual Medalist honors in stroke play at the NCAA Championship.

The 1997 Spartans, under head coach Art Williams, are the program's most recent NCAA Championship contenders. The squad featured Ted Bakelis, Jim Beste, Steve Grier, Lucas Horrobin, Brandon Kearney, Joseph Lucidi, Chad McGowan, Aaron Oberholser and Trent Tessler.

Transamerica-WFG Western Intercollegia

The Transamerica-WFG Western Intercollegiate, hosted by San José State, has flourished since its inception as the Northern California Intercollegiate in 1947 and in 2014 celebrates it 68th year.

Early fields were comprised of area junior colleges, business colleges and four-year schools. The 1950's brought growth until a gigantic field of 35 teams and 210 golfers descended upon Pasatiempo in 1962.

"The Western" became a prestigious invitational with a limit of 25 teams beginning in 1968. Since then, the strength of the field has grown, drawing teams from as far away as Hawai'i and Duke to the Alister MacKenzie-de-signed course.

The Western has served as a springboard to the PGA Tour. The late-Bob Rosburg and Ken Venturi, Johnny Miller, Ron Cerrudo, John Lotz, Dave Stockton, Al Geiberger, Tom Watson, Roger Maltbie, Peter Jacobson, Bobby Clampett, Mark O'Meara, Duffy Waldorf, Tiger Woods and Arron Oberholser have gone after the Western Intercollegiate championship during their college days.

The 50th Western Intercollegiate, held in 1996, became the first nationally-televised in-season collegiate tournament. In a stunning manner, San José State's Arron Oberholser overtook Tiger Woods of Stanford on the final four holes for the individual title.
