VIKINGS OPEN 2022 SEASON AT SAN JOSE STATE

The 2022 Portland State football season will open in similar fashion to past years as the Vikings will play on the road against an FBS-level program. The Vikings meet San Jose State at CEFCU Stadium on Thursday night in a 7:30 p.m. game. The contest will be televised on NBC Sports Bay Area, though not in the Portland area. A live stream can be accessed at the Mountain West Network (themw.com/watch/).

Portland State opens a very challenging month of play with San Jose State. After SJSU, the Vikings move on to play Washington of the Pac-12 on Sept. 10. Following a bye week, PSU opens Big Sky Conference play at number-three ranked Montana on Sept. 24.

The 2022 Viking football season will be a mixture of outstanding returning talent and high expectations for newcomers in vital roles.

PSU Head Coach Bruce Barnum, now in his eighth season, has 44 letterwinners back, including 19 starters with eight on offense, nine on defense and two on special teams. Portland State returns depth and experience at wide receiver, defensive end, linebacker and defensive back. The Vikings will look for newcomers at the key positions of quarterback, nose tackle and running back to step forward.

SO QB Dante Chachere appears poised to take over behind center after the graduation of Viking star Davis Alexander. The athletic Chachere has limited experience but begins his third year in the program. He will have a fleet of talented returning receivers led by SRs Beau Kelly, Mataio Talalemotu and Emmanuel Daigbe and SO Nate Bennett.

SR RB Andrew Van Buren is a transfer from Boise State that bolsters a young and unheralded backfield.

Two-time All-American DB Anthony Adams (13 career takeaways, 31 PBUs) anchors the defense, as does preseason All-American DE VJ Malo (10.5 sacks in 2021). SO LB Parker McKenna led the Vikings with 88 tackles last season and brings side-to-side speed to the team. PSU has a veteran defensive backfield led by Adams, SR S Xavier Bell, SR S Broderick Harrell and SR TR CB Isaiah Avery.

The Vikings were 5-6 last season, 4-4 in Big Sky Conference play.

San Jose State was 5-7 in 2021, including 3-5 in the Mountain West Conference-West Division. Head Coach Brent Brennen begins his sixth year at the helm.

The Spartans have four starters returning on offense and virtually the entire starting defense. Adding intrigue is the addition of quarterback Chevan Cordeiro, a transfer from the University of Hawai'i. Cordeiro faced the Vikings in the season-opener last year while playing for the Warriors. He was 18-25 passing for 305 yards, three touchdowns and one interception in a 49-35 Hawai'i win. He started 10 games for Hawai'i in 2021, passing for 2,793 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Defensively, SJSU is strong up front, featuring first team All-MWC lineman Viliami Fehoko and 2020 MWC Defensive Player of the Year Cade Hall. Also back is first team All-MWC linebacker Kyle Harmon (133 tackles in 2021).

STORYLINES

- Former SJSU defensive lineman EJ Ane transferred to Portland State last winter. Ane played in 28 career games for the Spartans, making 68 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks and a fumble recovery. He is expected to start for the Vikings against his old team.
- PSU SR RB Andrew Van Buren played against the Spartans twice while a member of the Boise State Broncos. He combined for 20 carries, 111 yards and a touchdown, and five receptions for 39 yards in the two games.
- The Vikings are 4-42 all-time against FBS-level competition, 2-19 against current members of the Mountain West Conference. Wins have come over Hawai'i (2000), New Mexico (2006), Washington State (2015) and North Texas (2015).
- The only other meeting between Portland State and San Jose State was an offensive showcase. The Spartans totaled 642 yards of offense, including 409 on the ground. A pair of long touchdown runs in the fourth quarter, totaling 161 yards boosted that number late. Despite committing six turnovers, the Vikings were able to still produce a decent offensive output with 458 yards and 35 points. But a two-minute stretch at the end of the first half turned a 14-14 game into a 28-14 halftime lead for the Spartans. The Vikings could never recover from there.
- PSU also played San Jose State and Washington back-to-back in the 2016 season (though in games 2/3).

LAST MEETING, Sept. 10, 2016: San Jose State 66, Portland State 35

San Jose, CA - The upset magic that Portland State produced in 2015 was missing as the Vikings moved up to play FBS-level San Jose State. The Spartans combined a dynamic offense while taking advantage of six Viking turnovers to come away with a resounding 66-35 win.

It was the most points Portland State has allowed in six seasons, and the most turnovers in recent memory.

The Spartans totaled 642 yards of offense, including 409 on the ground. A pair of long touchdown runs in the fourth quarter, totaling 161 yards boosted that number late.

Despite the six turnovers, the Vikings were able to still produce a decent offensive output with 458 yards and 35 points. But a two-minute stretch at the end of the first half turned a 14-14 game into a 28-14 halftime lead for the Spartans. The Vikings could never recover from there.

"The turnovers just crushed us. You are not going to win any games with six turnovers, especially

against a team like San Jose State. They were faster than us up front and in specials teams," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum.

"I will tell my team that this game does not define us. There are some silver linings here. The sky is not falling for us. San Jose State has a talented football team and they had a perfect day. Kudos to them."

San Jose State took charge with a 75-yard scoring drive in their first possession of the game. Quarterback Kenny Potter hit tight end Billy Freeman on a 36-yard touchdown pass just three minutes into the game.

The Vikings responded with some trickery. Quarterback Alex Kuresa threw a lateral pass to wide receiver Josh Kraght who surprised the Spartans defense when he threw the ball back across the field to Kuresa. Led by a host of blockers and a confused defense, Kuresa rambled down the left sideline for a tying touchdown of 78 yards.

On the first play of the second quarter, Potter scrambled for an eight-yard touchdown and the Spartans had the lead back at 14-7.

Following another Viking trick play - a fake punt that resulted in a 43-yard pass play - PSU had a chance to tie it again. But Kuresa was picked off in the end zone on a third-and-goal play.

Later in the second quarter, Viking running back Paris Penn put his stamp on the football game. Penn had consecutive runs of 22 yards, six yards, then went 36 yards for a touchdown. That tied the game at 14-14 with 6:14 left in the first half.

Then, late in the half, the the Spartans took control of the game. A one-yard TD run by Potter got San Jose State a 21-14 lead with 1:04 remaining the second quarter. After getting the Vikings to go three-and-out on their next offensive series, the Spartans closed out the half with another quick scoring drive. SJSU ran six plays in 40 seconds with Potter throwing a nine-yard touchdown pass to Tre Hartley with two seconds left in the half. San Jose State led 28-14 at halftime and never looked back.

The Spartans extended that lead to 42-14 with two quick touchdowns in the third quarter. At that point, the Vikings faced their largest deficit in two seasons and were unable to come back.

Penn caught a 22-yard touchdown pass mid-way through the period, but the Spartans tacked on 10 more to lead 52-21 going into the fourth.

Each team scored twice in the fourth as San Jose State cruised to the win.

Penn rushed 14 times for a career-high 137 yards and the one touchdown. He also caught three

VIKINGS vs. FBS COMPETITION

Portland State is 4-42 all-time against programs at the FBS level dating back to 1968. The Vikings play FBS members San Jose State (Mountain West Conference) and Washington (Pac-12) this season.

Athletically, Portland State has competed at virtually every level of competition, except the FBS. PSU began as Vanport Extension Center - a two-year school - in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference (NAIA) from 1950 to 1964. Portland State became a four-year institution in 1955 and competed at the NAIA level. PSU joined the NCAA in 1965 and competed at the College Division level (the fore-runner of NCAA II). PSU was an NCAA 1-AA member from 1978-80, then moved back to Division II in 1981, where it competed through the 1995 season. In 1996, Portland State moved to the Big Sky Conference and up to the NCAA 1-AA (now FCS) level. Below is a listing of all PSU games against members of the NCAA I FBS level of competition.

HEAD COACH BRUCE BARNUM



Bruce Barnum is in his eighth season as Portland State Head Football Coach and his 13th year overall with the program in 2022. Only one head coach, Tim Walsh, has had a longer tenure in PSU history.

Barnum has the distinction of earning FCS National Coach of the Year and Big Sky

Conference Coach of the Year in 2015 after leading PSU to its best season ever at the Division I level (9-3). The season included wins over FBS Washington State and North Texas, and five nationally-ranked FCS teams. The Vikings had their best season in Division I history (9-2) before losing to Northern Iowa 29-17 in the FCS Playoffs.

In his time as Head Coach, Barnum has molded the team in his image; tough, blue-collar and fundamentally-sound, instituting #BarneyBall.

Barnum spent his first five seasons at PSU as the Vikings' offensive coordinator. In his five seasons as offensive coordinator, the Vikings had tremendous success. In 2013, PSU set school-records for total offense (6,486 yards), offense per game (540.5), rushing offense (3,330 yards), rushing offense per game (277.5) and rushing touchdowns (36) while maintaining balance in the attack with 263.0 yards per game in the air, leading the nation in yards per completion (16.7). Portland State ranked third in the nation in total offense (first in the Big Sky) and third in rushing offense (second in the Big Sky). The Viking program has averaged 200+ rushing yards per game in all seven seasons that Barnum has been on the Park Blocks.

Barnum has more than 30 years of coaching experience and more than 15 years as an offensive coordinator. Barnum is the 14th head coach in the 76-year history of Portland State football.

Linebacker Anthony McNichols led the Vikings in tackles with eight and a sack.

QUICK SNAPS

WINS, LOSSES, AND THE BIG SKY

- Portland State was 5-6, 3-2 at home, 2-4 on the road in 2021.
- 2021 was Portland State's 29th season at the NCAA I FCS level (1978-80 (1-AA), 1996-2021). PSU is 140-173 in all games at the FCS/1-AA level.
- PSU is competing in its 27th season since moving back to FCS and the Big Sky Conference (1996-2022). PSU is 121-160 in that span, 78-56 in home games, 43-104 on the road.
- As a member of the Big Sky Conference (1996-2021) PSU is 80-115 all-time in league games, 47-51 at home, 33-64 on the road.
- Bruce Barnum (2015-22, 18-30 Big Sky, 26-43 overall) is the Vikings fourth Head Coach in the Big Sky Conference era. Previous coaches were: Tim Walsh (1993-2006, 42-41/90-68 all-time); Jerry Glanville (2007-09, 7-17/9-24); and Nigel Burton (2010-15, 13-27/21-36).
- The Vikings have never won a Big Sky title, but have tied for second five times (four times under Walsh and in 2015 under Barnum). PSU has made two NCAA FCS playoff appearances (2000, 2015).
- PSU's best record ever at the FCS level was 9-3 in 2015 (4-2 at home, 5-1 on the road).

ALL-CONFERENCE RETURNERS

The Vikings return four players that earned All-Big Sky Conference honors in 2021: 1st team: SR CB Anthony Adams (52T, 5 TFL, 5 PBU, 3 INT, 3 FR, 1FF); 2nd team: SR WR Beau Kelly (69 receptions, 981 yards, 10 TDs); SR DE VJ Malo (45T, 20 TFL, 10.5 SK, 3 FF, 2 PBU); Honorable Mention: SO WR Nate Bennett (50 receptions, 616 yards, 4 TDs)... Adams was named second team All-American by Hero Sports. He is now a two-time All-American (2019)...SR TE Malik Thirdgill was named to the Big Sky Conference Community Service team for contributions away from the field. Thirdgill is a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee on campus, was a co-creator of a Social Justice Team, has also been involved with PSU's freshman student-athlete mentorship program and is a volunteer with Holy Redeemer Athletics and Big Yard Foundation.

BIG SKY LEADERS

SR WR Beau Kelly led the Big Sky Conference in receptions (69), receiving touchdowns (10), total receiving yards (981) in 2021. He would have led in punt return average (14.4) but did not reach the required number of returns... SR CB Anthony Adams led the Big Sky in fumble recoveries (3) and had six total takeaways.

ALL-AMERICAN ADAMS

SR CB Anthony Adams is a two-time All-American - once as a safety and once as a cornerback. He led the nation in passes defended in 2019 (24; 19 PBUs, 5 INTs). He enters the 2022 season as the nation's leader in career passes defended (40; 31 PBUs, 9 INTs, plus 4 FRs).

Adams has been selected to five 2022 FCS Preseason All-America teams and was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List for the second time in his career. He was 12th in the balloting in 2019. Adams is also considered one of the top NFL prospects at the FCS level for 2023.

MALO-IFICENT TO OFFENSES

SR DE VJ Malo terrorized opposing quarterbacks in 2021. He made 10.5 sacks (2nd in the Big Sky), 20 tackles for loss (4th in the Big Sky) and forced three fumbles (1st in the Big Sky). His 20 TFLs are the second most for a season in school history, most ever at the Division I level and most since 1987. His 10.5 sacks rank eighth all-time, are the most at the Division I level and most since 1988.

Malo has been selected to four preseason All-America teams and preseason All-Big Sky.

WIDE RECEIVER U

Portland State has an embarrassment of riches at the wide receiver position in 2022, effectively returning five starting receivers, and a whole lot more. Consider these talents:

- SR WR Beau Kelly led the entire conference in receptions (69), receiving yards (981) and touchdowns (10) during the regular season.
- SO Darien Chase (54-579-4, 10 g)
- SO Nate Bennett (50-616-4)
- SR Mataio Talalemotu (42-573-3, 8 g)
- SR Emmanuel Daigbe (40-651-7 in 2019, missed 2021 due to injury)

Add to that group returners SR Marquis Spiker (9-112-0) and JR Deion Malone (injured in 2021), Boise State SR transfer Maclaine Griffin and four redshirt freshmen.

The Vikings started six freshmen, had eight making major contributions, and played 24 total freshmen in 2021... WRs Nate Bennett (50-616-4) and Darien Chase (54-579-4) were important members of the offense, while OLs Richard Estrella and D'Angalo Titali'i became starters... LB Parker McKenna led the Vikings in tackles with 88, including four tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Also on defense, ROV Tyreese Shakir became a starter, making 32 tackles, two interceptions, two fumble recoveries and four pass breakups. LB Justice Pagan made 39 tackles, 6.5 TFLs, two sacks and two pass breakups... on special teams, K Gianni Smith and LS Ryan Alvidrez were starters and steady performers.

- **FAMILY AFFAIR:** SR DE Jake Porter's father, Jason, was a four-year letterwinner in baseball at Portland State (1991-94). A cousin, FR OL Braylon Cornell, signed with the Vikings in 2022. Another cousin, Ellie Snook, is an All-Conference libero on the Viking volleyball team.
- **19 DEGREES:** Nineteen Portland State players have already earned their degrees, and/or are working on advanced degrees. They are: Anthony Adams, Shea Carstens, Emmanuel Daigbe, Boogie Davis, Isaiah Henry, Robert Holt, Beau Kelly, Deion Malone, Tyson Pauling, Jake Porter, Mataio Talemotu, Malik Thirdgill, Nathan West, Isaiah Avery, Xavier Bell, Broderick Harrell, Mike Irwin, Jaylen Larry and George Triplett.
- **FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE:** Offensive Line Coach Matt Leunen (OL/TE, 2005-09) is a PSU alum who played for the Vikings... Quarterbacks Coach Kieran McDonagh (2012-15) is also a PSU alum who was recruited by and played for Bruce Barnum... Wide Receivers Coach Darnell Adams (2012-17) joined the Viking staff this season.
- **GOING PRO:** Former Viking QB Davis Alexander finished his Portland State career in 2021 ranked number two in virtually every PSU passing category behind only Neil Lomax. Alexander is currently a member of the Montreal Alouettes.
- **SUPER PLAYERS:** Portland State had a pair of former players meet in the Super Bowl for the first time in history in February 2014. TE Julius Thomas ('10, Denver) and DB DeShawn Shead ('11, Seattle) both played in Super Bowl XLVIII. Shead returned to the Super Bowl in 2015 with the Seahawks. He joins Clint Didier and Ted Popson as former Vikings with Super Bowl rings. Thomas was named a Pro Bowl tight end in 2013 and 2014. In the 2014 off-season, he signed the richest tight end contract in the NFL to play for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Thomas retired in the 2018 off-season after a seven-year career that included 71 games, 226 receptions, 2,406 yards and 36 touchdowns. Shead, a starting corner with the Seahawks in 2016, missed 2017 due to an ACL injury, then signed and played with Detroit in 2018. Shead is now an assistant coach with the Seahawks.

2022 SEASON PREVIEW

The 2022 Viking football season will be a mixture of outstanding returning talent and high expectations for newcomers in vital roles.

Portland State returns depth and experience at wide receiver, defensive end, linebacker and defensive back. The Vikings will look for newcomers at the key positions of quarterback, nose tackle and running back to step forward.

Eighth-year Head Coach Bruce Barnum has 44 letterwinners back, including 19 starters with eight on offense, nine on defense and two on special teams.

OFFENSE

The graduation of three-year starter at quarterback, Davis Alexander, will alter the look of the Viking offense. It will be difficult to replace a player who ranks second all-time on PSU's passing lists (9,215 passing yards, 63 touchdowns, as well as 1,254 rushing yards, 25 TDs) but a handful of youngsters will compete during spring practice. They include SO Dante Chachere (6-3, 185) and RS FRs Jaden Casey (6-1, 190), Caden Filer (6-2, 200) and Mason Packer (6-0, 200), and SR Nathan West (6-3, 210). The Vikings also signed two freshmen to national letters of intent, Logan Gonzalez (6-3, 200) and Brooks Ferguson (6-5, 225), and added two transfers, freshman Keegan Stancato (6-4, 210) from Dixie State, and senior Mike Irwin (6-1, 205) from Tarleton State.

Chachere has the most experience, having appeared in 10 previous games in his career, but has only attempted two passes, completing one. He is known for his running ability, having compiled 140 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries. Casey, originally a transfer from Cal, played in one game last season, completing 1-3 passes.

In the backfield, the Vikings lose another talented senior, but have a host of very promising running backs coming up. Malik Walker (176 carries, 879 yards, 11 TD) had an outstanding senior season, but he is gone. The back receiving the most carries behind him was SO Jalynnee McGee (5-10, 195, 49-259-2), a powerful runner who showed a lot of ability when healthy, averaging 5.3 yards per carry. Speaking of health, SOs Jobi Malary (5-11, 225, 25-130-1 career) and JoJo Siofele (5-10, 205) were the "up-and-comers" two seasons ago. However, a variety of injuries have hindered both players. Expect them to have a big say in the running game in 2022.

PSU has added an intriguing player to the mix with transfer Andrew Van Buren (6-0, 240). The senior from Boise State rushed for 1,028 yards and 21 touchdowns in his career as a Bronco.

Also returning is JR Ahmir McGee (5-11, 215, 10-38-0), who got spot duty in 2021. He lends size and depth to the backfield. RS FR Treyvon Easterling (5-10, 210) is also vying to get into the mix.

Freshmen signees Quincy Craig (5-9, 185) and Elijah Lux (5-9, 180) are going to push the competition in the fall when they step on campus.

Portland State's wide receiving corps is easily the deepest position on the team. The hard part of handling this group won't be figuring out who should play, but figuring out how to get everyone enough reps. The Vikings essentially have four starting wide receivers returning, with a fifth former starter who was an All-Conference performer also expected back.

The Vikings were led by SR WR Beau Kelly (5-9, 165) in 2021. The slot receiver not only led PSU, but the entire conference, in receptions (69), receiving yards (981) and touchdowns (10) during the regular

season. Inexplicably, he was only selected as a second team All-Conference honoree, but his value is unquestioned.

On the outside SOs Darien Chase (6-1, 210, 54-579-4) and Nate Bennett (6-3, 195, 50-616-4) were brilliant as freshmen. Bennett has great length and impeccable route-running ability. Chase was simply a human highlight reel with his penchant for "degree of difficulty" catches. Also back is veteran SR Mataio Talalemotu (6-1, 180). Despite missing three games with injury, he was as effective as ever with 42 receptions for 573 yards and three touchdowns.

Kelly and Talalemotu, who have grown up together as Vikings, have combined for 215 receptions, 3,160 yards and 23 touchdowns in their careers.

If that group weren't enough, the Viking offense can throw in a wild card with SR Emmanuel Daigbe (6-1, 210). A third team All-Big Sky Conference selection in 2019 (40-651-7 in 2019), Daigbe has been hindered with a groin injury for the past two years, but should be ready to go this fall.

PSU also returns another tall and talented receiver in SR Marquis Spiker (6-3, 200, 9-112-0), as well as RS JR Deion Malone (5-7, 155), who will bring depth to the slot position as well as serve as a dynamic return man. Boise State senior transfer Maclaine Griffin (6-2, 200) as well as 2022 signees Omar Hammond (6-0, 170) and Jaylen Lynch (6-2, 175) have been added.

Four redshirt freshmen are back and looking for an opportunity at wide receiver as well: Malcolm Tatum (6-3, 200), Taylor Evans (6-0, 190), Jayden Brannan (6-3, 190) and Chance Miller (6-0, 180).

Like the receiving and running backs groups, Portland State has a solid returning group at tight end. The Vikings employed their tight ends more for blocking than receiving in 2021, but have a capable group in both disciplines. SR Malik Thirdgill (6-4, 240, 3-27-0) is one of nine fourth-year letterwinners on the roster. He and SR Anthony Rodriguez (6-3, 235, 4-26-0) have the most experience and figure to see the most snaps. Also back is SO Elias Spence (6-4, 225) and RS SO Kole Allen (6-3, 250). The Viking coaching staff signed talented freshmen Charlie White (6-2, 235) and Tanner Beaman (6-3, 220) for the coming season.

Portland State brings back an experienced starting offensive line for 2022. SR Tyson Pauling (6-5, 295) and JR Shiloh Ta'ase (6-3, 310) have combined for 36 starts over the past two seasons and will lead an overall talented, experienced group. SOs Richard Estrella (6-4, 305) and D'Angalo Titali'i (6-3, 320) were also starters in 2021.

RS FRs Manaia Fuertes and Logan Bruce showed promise in brief stints during the 2021 season, will provide depth and should be the future on the line. RS FR Dominic DeBerry did not see action, but will also get a look in 2022. PSU has brought in three NLI signees for 2022: Braylon Cornell (6-6, 285), Jake Cooper (6-5, 260) and Anthony Tena (6-4, 285).

Four newcomers expected to compete for playing time are transfers Jaylen Larry (6-3, 275) from UMass and Pedro Timoteo (6-3, 335) from Fresno State, and junior college prospects Sebastian Sias (6-3, 320) and Chandler Ross (6-5, 270) from Butte (CA) College.

DEFENSE

Portland State has a large group of returners and quality depth on the defensive side with nine returning starters and 27 letterwinners. One area the Vikings will look to reinforce is the defensive line – particularly at nose tackle.

Veteran Semise Kofe, who anchored the nose tackle spot the past few seasons, has graduated. The only other player with experience is SO Martin Salazar (5-10, 285) who played in five games as a true freshman before an injury sidelined his season. SR Boogie Davis (6-3, 275) also has played some snaps at nose, as well as defensive end, but played in only two games last season due to injury. A wildcard at tackle would be SR Moses Finau (6-1, 260), who impressed in the spring. The Vikings also have RS FR Jessie Brown (6-2, 280) vying for playing time at the spot.

SR EJ Ane (6-2, 275), an FBS transfer from San Jose State, is likely to have some say in replacing Kofe. Ane played in 28 games on the defensive line for San Jose State, making 68 career tackles. His size and experience brings a lot to the program.

The Vikings have experience at end with the return of SR starters VJ Malo (6-1, 270) and Jake Porter (6-4, 250). Malo took the conference by storm last season, making 45 tackles, 20 tackles for loss, 10.5 sacks and forcing three fumbles. He earned second team All-Big Sky Conference and should be primed for a big senior season.

Porter has played in 35 career games, matching All-American DB Anthony Adams, for most experience on the team. He has 21 career starts at defensive end and a good knowledge of the Vikings' defensive system.

The Vikings have a host of young players to back up. SO Kennedy Freeman (6-2, 240) showed promise as a pass rusher, but was another Viking whose 2021 season was cut short by injury. RS FRs Slade Shufelt (6-3, 225) and Zane Maningo (6-2, 250) add depth.

PSU has added JR transfer Dino Kahaulelio (6-0, 285) from City College of San Francisco who may also compete at nose tackle in 2022. Signees Mike MacNeill (6-1, 280) is a freshmen that will provide long term depth.

The Vikings should be loaded at linebacker. It begins with SO Parker McKenna (6-0, 220) who started every game at middle linebacker. He led the Vikings with 88 tackles, four tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. McKenna has the sideline to sideline speed needed in PSU's flex defensive system.

SRs Robert Holt (6-2, 225) and Tevita Tuitavake (6-0, 225) and SO Justice Pagan (6-2, 235) all have size, quality experience and starts on their resumes. Pagan, despite missing two games, ranked seventh on the team with 39 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and two sacks at buck linebacker last season. Holt (17 tackles) and Tuitavake (15 tackles) combined for a handful of starts. One of those three is likely to start at the whip linebacker, replacing the graduated Nic Ah Sam, who started every game there in 2021.

JR Isaiah Henry (5-11, 205) is another experienced player who should see increased time at linebacker, potentially at middle with McKenna.

Other returning letterwinners at linebacker include JRs Zack Mandera (6-1, 220) and Ian Crocker (6-1, 220). RS FR Spencer Delacruz (6-1, 220) will also get into the mix.

PSU signed FR LBs Elijah Mareko (6-2, 225), Joseph Nanai (6-1, 240) and Peyton Wing (6-0, 210) to the group in February, then added Utah State transfer Jaymason Willingham (6-1, 220) over the summer.

The back end of the defense is also loaded with experienced, talented players. The rover back position is a hybrid linebacker/defensive back role that returns two players who have been starters there in the past two full seasons. SO Tyreese Shakir (5-10, 175) took over as starter early in the 2021 season and had a big year as a freshman. He had 32 tackles, a sack, two interceptions, two fumble recoveries and four pass breakups. JR David Joseph (6-1, 200) has played in 28 career games and made nine career starts, mainly at rover. He had 27 tackles last season at rover, on special teams and spot duty in the defensive backfield. Both players will be a key to the Viking defense in 2022.

The Vikings will have a senior-laden back four that is loaded with experience, talent and playmakers.

PSU returns both starting cornerbacks and has excellent depth at the position. SR Anthony Adams (6-0, 185) is the face of the Viking defense, having started all 35 career games at PSU. A two-time first team All-Big Sky Conference selection – once at safety and once at cornerback – he was a consensus first team All-American in 2019 after leading the nation in passes defended. After PSU opted out of the 2020 season due to COVID, Adams may have dropped from the minds of some national media, but his performance was just as strong in 2021. He made 52 tackles, five tackles for loss, had three interceptions, three fumble recoveries, five pass breakups and forced a fumble as the Vikings' boundary cornerback. He was named to one All-America team, but missed the others. Certainly, he should be front of mind as one of the best defensive backs in the nation in 2022. Adams goes into the season with 165 career tackles, 14.5 tackles for loss, 31 pass breakups and 13 career takeaways (9 INT, 4 FR). His 40 career passes defended (30 PBU, 9 INT) are the most of any returning FCS player in the nation.

At field cornerback, SR Evan Camarena (6-0, 185) returns after 11 starts and 29 tackles last season. He, along with Adams, is backed up by three SOs who saw a lot of playing time and performed well in 2021. Semaj Bolin (5-10, 170) and Davion Gaines (6-0, 170) saw significant action and will contend for more time at corner. Bolin had 11 tackles and an interception to lead that group. SO Michael Jackson (6-2, 185) also returns with experience, giving the Vikings excellent depth. RS FRs Jalen Boston (5-11, 170) and Ronan Gay (6-1, 185) make the cornerback position even deeper.

Portland State returns starters and depth at the safety spots as well. SR Xavier Bell (6-2, 200) took over the SAM role after transferring in from Arizona last year. He proved to be one of the Vikings' key players on defense, ranking third on the team in tackles with 50 and leading the team with seven pass breakups. SOs Day Day Bright (5-10, 170) and Travis West (5-6, 160) are young but experienced players at safety.

SR Broderick Harrell (5-11, 200) did not find his best role in the defensive backfield until mid-season last year when he took over at free safety. Like Bell, Harrell was an FBS transfer from UTEP who became a playmaker for the Vikings as well. He was fourth on the team with 48 tackles, had five pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

Returning letterwinner Shea Carstens (5-10, 185) was primarily a special teams contributor but also lends depth to the defensive backfield. RS SO Jake Urena (5-9, 180) will also battle to get into the mix at the safety position.

Four National Letter of Intent signees will come in as freshmen in the defensive backfield this fall: Elijah Gipson (5-11, 170), Duhron Goodman (5-11, 190), Michael Hurst (5-11, 190) and Ezriel Vasquez (5-11, 170). The Vikings also signed Liberty University transfer Isaiah Avery (6-0, 175).

SPECIAL TEAMS

The Vikings return SO K Gianni Smith (6-1, 205) for 2022. Smith took over as the starter early in 2021 following an injury to PSU's previous kicker. He handled the role well, converting all 29 extra-point attempts and 5-8 field goals.

A walk-on, Fyodor Henrichs-Tarasenkov comes to PSU after a strong performance at the Chris Sailer Kicking Camp.

PSU will need to fill the punter role. Princeton transfer George Triplett (5-10, 190) signed with the Vikings during the spring. Smith can also punt and will compete to play.

SO LS Ryan Alvidrez (5-11, 215) returns after having a clean sheet on snaps in his true freshman season.

The Vikings look forward to the return game of JR Deion Malone. Initially slated to be the return man for PSU in 2021, an injury prevented him from competing. SR Beau Kelly is also back and has served as punt returner for three seasons. His 14.4 yard return average in 2021 would have led the Big Sky Conference, but he did not have enough returns to qualify.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PORTLAND STATE AND VIKING FOOTBALL

Portland State University, located in Portland, OR, is the second-largest school in the state of Oregon with 23,979 students. It was founded in 1946 as Vanport College - a two-year institution.

Athletically, Portland State began as a junior college in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference at the NAIA level from 1950 to 1964, winning three OCC football titles (1962, 1963, 1964). PSU became a four-year institution in 1955.

Portland State joined the NCAA in 1965 and competed at the College Division level (the forerunner of NCAA II). PSU was an NCAA 1-AA member from 1978-80, then moved back to Division II in 1981, where it competed through the 1995 season. The Vikings were members of the Western Football Conference from 1982 to 1992, winning six conference championships. PSU made eight NCAA II playoff appearances from 1987 to 1995.

In 1996, Portland State moved to the Big Sky Conference and up to the NCAA 1-AA (now FCS) level. The Vikings made their first playoff appearance at their current level in 2000. In 2015, Portland State had its best season ever at the Division I level, compiling a 9-3 record and reaching the NCAA playoffs.

Portland State's football program has produced such legendary figures as Coach Mouse Davis, quarterbacks Neil Lomax and June Jones, Tom Oberg (the first Viking to play in the NFL), Coach Pokey Allen (who led the Vikings to two NCAA II National Championship appearances), and some 30 players who have appeared in the NFL.

In 2014, three former Vikings reached NFL Championship games: Julius Thomas with Denver, DeShawn Shead with Seattle and Jordan Senn with Carolina. Thomas and Shead went on to meet in Super Bowl XLVIII with their respective teams and Shead became a Super Bowl Champion - just the third former PSU Viking to do so (Clint Didier, Ted Popson). Shead made a return appearance to the Super Bowl in 2015, while Thomas was selected to his second Pro Bowl in as many years. He later signed a free agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars, making him the highest paid tight end in the NFL.

Portland State football plays at Hillsboro Stadium, west of downtown, a 7,200-seat stadium.

PORTLAND STATE

Portland State should always be referred to as "Portland State", NEVER by just "Portland". An acceptable alternative to "Portland State" is "PSU". The nickname for both the men's and women's teams at Portland State is "Vikings". The women's teams should NEVER be referred to as the "Lady Vikings" or "Lady Viks". An acceptable alternative to "Vikings" is "Viks".

2022 SEASON NOTES

THE SCHEDULE

Portland State will play a traditional 11-game football schedule in 2022, featuring two FBS opponents and a rigorous eight-game Big Sky Conference slate that includes three FCS playoff programs. The Vikings have five games at home and six on the road in 2022.

The Vikings open on the road against their FBS opponents, San Jose State on Sept. 1 and Washington on Sept. 10. Ironically, they faced those two opponents in succession in 2016 season. The Spartans come off a 5-7 season in the Mountain West Conference which included a win over former Big Sky Conference foe Southern Utah. The Huskies come off a 4-8 season in the Pac-12 Conference that included a 13-7 upset loss to Montana of the Big Sky.

PSU will have a bye week before leading into its' Big Sky Conference season opener against no less an opponent than 2021 FCS semifinalist Montana. Portland State travels to face the Griz in Missoula on Sept. 24. Montana finished 10-3 in 2021, 6-2 and tied for third in the Big Sky.

PSU returns home to host Northern Arizona, a program it has not faced since 2019, on Oct. 1. The Lumberjacks had a record matching the Vikings at 5-6, 4-4 in the Big Sky, in 2021. The teams have met only three times in the past decade (2014, 2017, 2019) due to the size of the Big Sky Conference.

The Vikings played their final, non-conference game on Oct. 8 at home, hosting NCAA II Lincoln (CA) University. It will be a first-ever contest against an opponent from the bay area that was 1-8 in its inaugural season of 2021.

PSU will make it three straight home games for the first time since the first three games of the 2003 season when its hosts Weber State on Oct. 15. PSU beat the Wildcats in 2021, knocking off 24th-ranked WSU, 30-18, in Ogden. Weber State was 6-5 overall, 5-3 in the Big Sky in 2021.

For the second year in a row, PSU will play at Idaho. The Vikings lost 42-35 last year to the Vandals who finished the year at 4-7/3-5 overall.

Portland State closes out October at Eastern Washington. The Eagles were 10-3 in 2021, reaching the FCS Quarterfinals. They tied for third in the Big Sky at 6-2 with Montana. PSU lost to Eastern, 42-28, in the season finale of 2021. This year's game marks the first time since 2011 that the Vikings and Eagles do not play each other in the final regular season game.

November opens with back-to-back home games. Portland State hosts Northern Colorado on Nov. 5, then Sacramento State on Nov. 11. The Vikings and Bears last played in 2019 in Greeley, a 38-30 PSU win. Last season, the Big Sky Champion Hornets beat the Vikings 49-20 in Sacramento. The Hornets finished the year a perfect 8-0 in the Big Sky, 9-3 overall. Northern Colorado was 3-8/2-6 in 2021.

The season finale will take place Nov. 19 at Cal Poly. Portland State beat the Mustangs at Hillsboro Stadium this past year, 42-21. Cal Poly was 2-9/1-7 in 2021.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- This is the 76th season of Portland State football (1947) and 27th season as a member of the Big Sky Conference.
- Year in and year out Portland State football has one of the most challenging Football Championship Subdivision schedules in the country, and 2022 will be no different. The Vikings will play three 2021 FCS playoff teams (Montana, Eastern Washington and Sacramento State). Sacramento State was the Big Sky Conference Champion (8-0). PSU's opponents were a combined 35-29 in Big Sky games last year, 49-44 overall.
- PSU faces five teams in 2022 that were on the schedule in 2021 (Weber State, Idaho, Eastern Washington, Sacramento State, Cal Poly).
- The two FBS-level programs are San Jose State and Washington. It will be the second all-time meeting with the Spartans and the third meeting with the Huskies. PSU is 4-42 all-time when playing "up" against FBS programs. Wins have come over Hawai'i (2000), New Mexico (2006), Washington State (2015) and North Texas (2015).
- Portland State has its latest home-opening start (Oct. 1) since 2010 (Oct. 2).
- The last time PSU played three straight home games (Oct. 1-8-15) was in 2003 (Sept. 4-13-20).
- Portland State is playing one lower division program in 2022, Division II Lincoln (CA) University. The Vikings are 19-0 in games against lower division opponents since moving to Division I in 1996.
- The Big Sky Conference has been reduced to 12 teams in 2022. Southern Utah left the conference to join the Western Athletic Conference. Portland State faces just eight of the other 11 members. PSU will miss Big Sky schools Montana State, UC Davis and Idaho State in 2022.

2021 REVIEW

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- After an opt-out season in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Portland State football program returned to a full season of competition in 2021. With two games to play in the season, the Vikings were still in contention for a post-season berth. However, losses to Big Sky Conference Champion Sacramento State and fifth-ranked Eastern Washington in the final two weeks had the Vikings finish the year at 5-6 overall, 4-4 in Big Sky Conference games. The 4-4 mark was PSU's best since the 2015 season. The

- The Vikings had six players earn All-Big Sky Conference honors: 1st team: JR CB Anthony Adams (52T, 5 TFL, 5 PBU, 3 INT, 3 FR, 1FF); 2nd team: JR WR Beau Kelly (69 receptions, 981 yards, 10 TDs); SR QB Davis Alexander (266-432, 3,075 yards, 21 TDs, 12 INTs, 6 rushing TDs); JR DE VJ Malo (45T, 20 TFL, 10.5 SK, 3 FF, 2 PBU); Honorable Mention: FR WR Nate Bennett (50 receptions, 616 yards, 4 TDs); SR DT Semise Kofe (37T, 5.5 TFL, 2.5 SK).
 - JR CB Anthony Adams was named second team All-American by Hero Sports. He is now a two-time All-American (2019).
 - JR TE Malik Thirdgill was named to the Big Sky Conference Community Service team for contributions away from the field. Thirdgill is a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee on campus, was a co-creator of a Social Justice Team, has also been involved with PSU's freshman student-athlete mentorship program and is a volunteer with Holy Redeemer Athletics and Big Yard Foundation.
 - JR WR Beau Kelly led the Big Sky Conference in receptions (69), receiving touchdowns (10), total receiving yards (981), and would have led in punt return average (14.4) but did not reach the required number of returns... JR CB Anthony Adams led the Big Sky in fumble recoveries (3) and had six total takeaways.
 - SR RB Malik Walker was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Week after an Oct. 30 win over Cal Poly. Walker rushed 14 times for 116 yards and two touchdowns in the game. Walker finished the season third in the Big Sky in rushing (879 yards) and second in touchdowns (11).
 - FR WR Nate Bennett was named to the 22-player Jerry Rice Award Watch List during the season. The Jerry Rice Award recognizes the top freshman in the nation at the end of the season. He finished 19th in the balloting... SR QB Davis Alexander was selected to the 46-member Walter Payton Award Watch list. The Payton Award is given annually to the top offensive player in the nation at the FCS level.
 - SR QB Davis Alexander finished his career second all-time in virtually every passing category at Portland State, trailing only Viking legend Neil Lomax, including total offense (10,473 yards), passing yards (9,215), touchdown passes (63), completions (708-1,223). Alexander also had 25 career rushing touchdowns (7th all-time), and with 88 total touchdowns ranks behind only Lomax.
 - JR DE VJ Malo had 20 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks on the season. Both numbers were the most ever by a Viking at the FCS level, and the most by any Viking since 1988. He was second in TFLs and fourth in sacks in the Big Sky, ranking fifth and 11th in the nation, respectively.
 - Portland State had 20 student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Sky Conference honors.

GET ON THE BUS: THE AMERICANA TOUR

Portland State Football Coach Bruce Barnum is renowned for taking his team on the bus to as many road games as possible. He calls it "The Americana Tour." It has made for some long bus rides, but Barnum often lets his team out to see the sights. Barnum also feels it promotes team unity (and saves a few dollars in the budget). In the past seven years, PSU has logged 23,298 bus miles with a "program record" of 4,906 in 2016.

- Coach Barnum led his first "Americana Tour" in 2015, which included bus rides to Pullman, WA, Pocatello, ID, San Luis Obispo, CA, and Cheney, WA. In all, the Vikings logged 4,394 bus miles and approximately 80 hours round trip to those four destinations (PSU also flew on two road trips). The Americana Tour included such things as dozens of on-bus movies, a stop to buy a lottery ticket on the way home from beating Washington State, a practice on Boise State's blue turf, a sight-seeing trip to Alcatraz (in which equipment manager Mike Haluska was left on the island... but soon retrieved), and a midnight McDonald's run at a lonely truck stop in eastern Oregon. In addition to the economy of the bus trips, Barnum contends the time together draws the Viking team closer.
- The 2016 Americana Tour included round trips to San Jose, Seattle and Sacramento (twice). There was also a return bus ride from Ogden, UT and a shorter trip from Las Vegas to Cedar City... the trip to San Jose was a total of 1,340 miles. It included a stop off at Oregon Wildlife Safari and the obligatory In-and-Out Burger visitation in Medford... on the trip to Southern Utah, PSU flew into Las Vegas, took in the Criss Angel Show at the Luxor Hotel and made another midnight In-and-Out run... while traveling to Weber State, PSU visited Temple Square and the Hogle Zoo... after a pair round trips to Sacramento (UC Davis and Sacramento State), PSU had accumulated 4,906 bus miles for the season.
- The 2017 season was limited to just three bus trips: Oregon State, Idaho State and Eastern Washington. There was also a bus portion from San Jose, CA to Cal Poly. And, Portland State's trip to Corvallis was a mere 168 miles round trip. The Americana Tour bus trip to Pocatello, ID was 660 miles one way, 1,320 miles round trip. The Vikings made a stop in Pendleton and toured the Pendleton Rodeo Museum and Hall of Fame, as well as a stop along the Snake River... the Vikings had bus travel from San Jose Airport to San Luis Obispo for the game at Cal Poly. It was 376 miles round trip and included a stop over on the Monterey Peninsula on the way down. No golf was played... the final week's bus trip from PSU to Eastern Washington was 339 miles one way, 678 round trip. That made the Vikings' Americana Tour for 2017 a total of 2,542 miles.
- In 2018 Portland State made bus trips to five different states. They included Nevada (1,156 miles round trip), Oregon (218 miles), Idaho (718 miles), Montana (1,098 miles) and Sacramento State (1,158 miles). That made for a total of 4,348 bus miles.
- The 2019 Americana Tour started early as the Vikings bussed to Camp Rilea Armed Forces Training Center in Warrenton, OR (176 miles round trip) for the first three days of preseason practice. The Vikings

stayed in the barracks, ate at the mess hall and practice on a makeshift field on the Helipad. Numerous team bonding exercises took place, including bowling night, a beach bonfire and three hours of liberty in Seaside, OR... only three bus trips are on the docket for 2019. They include Boise State (864 miles round trip), Idaho State (1,326 miles) and Eastern Washington (678 miles)... on the trip to Boise State, the Vikings pulled off the freeway for a couple of hours in Pendleton to enjoy the world famous Pendleton Roundup rodeo... FR OL Shiloh Ta'ase thrilled his teammates on the way to Eastern Washington when the team stopped for lunch in Kennewick. On a dare, Ta'ase leaped into the Columbia River in the midst of chilly 33-degree temperatures... Total bus miles for 2019 were 3,044.

- PSU's lone game at Montana in spring 2021 included a 1,098-mile round trip.
- In 2021, the Americana Tour began with a bus ride to Washington State. The round-trip to Pullman was 775 miles... the Vikings flew to Las Vegas, then bussed up to Cedar City for a game with Southern Utah. A team photo in front of the legendary "Welcome to Las Vegas" sign was part of the journey. Following a PSU win, the busses took a celebratory cruise down the Las Vegas strip at midnight on the return trip. That round trip was 342 miles... Portland State made the 6+-hour bus drive to Idaho on Oct. 9 (via an overnight stay in Spokane), totaling 791 miles round trip... the Vikings bussed to Sacramento to take on the Hornets. The round trip was 1,058 miles. That increased the season bus miles to 2,966.
- The 2022 season will be low-key bus travel, as the Vikings bus to only Washington (356 miles round trip), Idaho (718 miles round trip) and Eastern Washington (680 miles round trip). That totals a mere 1,754 bus miles for the season.
