The Mountain West i\|! <br> From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West (MW) has been
committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MW continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its 17th year, the MW has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

## ACADEMIC CONSORTIUM

## ACADEMIC CONSORTIUM

From the outset, Mountain West member institutions have been committed to creating strong academic relationships, as well as athletic competition. To that end, the chief academic officers of each institution have explored academic exchange programs, library crossovers and shared research. In addition, the faculty athletics representatives routinely provide academic assistance and test-taking services for student-athletes visiting from fellow member institutions for competition.

The Mountain West has marked several achievements over its first 16 years of existence, most notably becoming the first to establish a sports television network dedicated solely to an intercollegiate athletic conference (The Mtn.). The Mountain West also was the first to experiment with the coaches' challenge in the college football instant replay system, and was the first non-automatic-qualifying BCS conference to participate in four BCS bowl games, winning three. Additionally, the Mountain West was the first conference to have a member institution with No. 1 overall picks in both the NFL and NBA drafts in the same year (Utan's Alex Smith and Andrew Bogut, respectively in 2005). With San Diego State's Stephen Strasburg claiming the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLB Draft, the Mountain West is one of two conferences to have the No. 1 selection in each of the NFL, NBA and MLB drafts since the MW was founded in 1999. In 2011-12, the Mountain West was among the first conferences to implement a league-wide state-of-the-art basketball instant replay system.

The Mountain West is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West boundaries, including the majestic Rocky

Mountain range, which borders five MW institutions (Air Force, Boise State, Colorado State, New Mexico and Utah State). The high plains ofWyoming (elevation 7,220 feet - the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert cities of Las Vegas and Reno, home to UNLV and Nevada, respectively, while Fresno State, San Diego State and San José State add a West Coast influence with their locations in Central, Southern and Northern California. The inclusion of the Hawai'i football program extends the Mountain West footprint to the beautiful islands in the Pacific Ocean.

## OPPORTUNITY

The Mountain West provides a first-class athletic and academic experience for more than 5,100 student-athletes each year. Over the past 16 years, 42 Mountain West student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, and since the league's inception in 1999, an additional 30 student-athletes have been named MW Scholar-Athlete of the Year and awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships. Three Mountain West student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars.

pertinent issues within the MW and NCAA governance structure through representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). The Mountain West SAAC consists of 23 representatives: two from each full member institution and one faculty athletics representative. The committee reviews and reacts to legislation and to other topics referred by the Conference constituent group or committees related to the student-athlete experience.


ACHIEVEMENT
The MW has produced 882 All-America selections among its 18 sponsored sports (men's swimming was discontinued as a Conference sport following the 2010-11 season) in the last 16 years, including a league-record 83 All-America honorees in 2010-11. A total of 156 MW student-athletes have also earned Academic All-America accolades in that span. The Mountain West has sent at least 25 teams to NCAA postseason event in each of the past 16 years, capturing three team national championships in women's cross country and producing 36 individual national championships in the sports of men's golf, men's cross country, and men's and women's indoor track \& field and outdoor track \& field.

Mountain West members have participated in 69 bowl games under the league umbrella, including four appearances in BCS games and one CFP game. The MW has earned 76 postseason bids in men's basketball, including 43 NCAA Tournament appearances and two NIT Final Four berths. MW women's basketball has tallied 67 postseason slots, including 34 NCAA bids, five Sweet 16 appearances and one Elite Eight berth since 2000.
win over Wisconsin. In women's volleyball, the MW has had 38 NCAA bids with nine Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. Women's soccer has earned 29 NCAA bids since 1999, with two Sweet 16 berths and one Elite Eight appearance. MW men's golf has had at least three representatives NCAA Golf Regionals in each of its 16 years, while women's golf has had at least three teams participate in NCAA Regionals 13 of the last 16 years.

## SPORTSMANSHIP

Named for Sports Ethics Fellow by the Institute for International Sport in 1998, Commissioner Craig Thompson has been a driving force for sportsmanship within intercollegiate athletics. As part of its continuing growth and development, the Mountain West implemented an extensive Sportsmanship Initiative, endorsed by both the MW Joint Council and MW Board of Directors. The program is made up of several elements, which are both practical and philosophical in nature. While the MW has significant penalties in place to deal with violations, the Sportsmanship Initiative is primarily promotional and educational in nature. The goal is to develop an environment that fosters appropriate behavior from all Conference constituencies.

# Jamie Craighead <br> Head Coach I Third Year I Oregon, 2002 

On September 16, 2013, Jamie Craighead, who coaches an up-tempo offense and stifling defense, was named the eighth head women's basketball coach at San José State University.

Entering her third season leading the Spartans', Craighead's teams have set and then broken the program's record for points scored in a season, which currently stands at 2,511, and in 2014-15 set a San José State and Mountain West Conference single-game record when the Spartans scored 119 points in a win over Columbia.

Under Craighead's guidance the Spartans reached the semifinals of the 2015 Mountain West Championship Tournament. It marked just the second time in the 41-year history of the program that the team advanced that far in its conference championship tournament. In addition, the team's 15 wins were the most since the 2004-05 team won 18 games.

The 2013-14 squad established single-season marks for free throws attempted (726) and made (493) as well as three-pointers attempted (793) and made (245). In 2014-15, the Spartans set new marks for three-pointers attempted (872) and made (271), assists (501) and total field goal attempts $(2,262)$.

In her two seasons, Craighead's players have earned four conference post-season awards for their play on the court. In addition, they have earned 13 Academic All-Mountain West (3.0+GPA) and four Mountain West Scholar-Athlete honors (3.5+GPA), two Dean's Scholar (3.65+GPA) and one President's Scholar designation (4.0 GPA+) as well as an Arthur Ashe, Jr. Sport-Scholar Award and a first-team Capital One Academic All-District VIII honor. Finally, Ta'Rea Cunnigan, the school's all-time leader in scoring, graduated Magna Cum Laude in 2015.

Craighead came to San José State after spending four seasons at Sacramento State (2009-10-to-2012-13), where she was the winningest women's head basketball coach in 20 years and the only coach to post a winning conference record at Sacramento State since they entered the Big Sky Conference in the 1996-97 season. Under her guidance the Hornets reached the Big Sky Conference Tournament for just the fifth (2012) and sixth (2013) times in program history. In those appearances, Sacramento State earned its first tournament wins and reached the semi-final round both years.

The youngest head coach in Division I when she took over the Hornets, Craighead's teams, playing a fast-break type offense, led the Big Sky Conference in scoring in each of her four seasons.

Sacramento State set several program records in 2012-13 including field goals made, assists, blocked shots and fewest turnovers committed. In addition, the team's 19 wins equaled the program's single-season record, which was set in the 1990-91 season. The Hornets led the Big Sky in points, 3-pointers, and assists and on the defensive end, topped the league in steals and blocks.

Also in 2012-13, Craighead coached Kylie Kuhns and Megan Kritscher, two of the top post players in the Big Sky Conference. Kuhns, at only six feet tall, broke the school and Big Sky career rebounding records during the year, while also leading the team in scoring. For her efforts, Kuhns earned All-Big Sky first-team honors. Kritscher shattered the Big Sky single-season blocks record and ranked fourth in the NCAA in blocks per game for the season.

In four seasons, nine of her players garnered All-Big Sky honors. She coached 2011-12 Big Sky Freshman of the Year Fantasia Hilliard, and 23 of her athletes received Academic All-Big Sky Conference honors for their work in the classroom.

Prior to accepting the top job at Sacramento State, Craighead spent the 2007-08 season as an assistant for the Hornets before being promoted to Associate Head Coach the following year.


## Dan Muscatell

As̈sistañt Coäch I Second'Year I Western Washington, 1983.



The 2015-16 season is the second in which Dan Muscatell serves the San José State women's basketball team as an assistant coach.

Muscatell's primary responsibilities are scouting, scheduling, coaching the team's half-court defense and rebounding. In addition, he assists in recruiting as well as game and practice film breakdown and is the program's camp coordinator and team camp director.

Muscatell comes to San José State after five seasons (2010-14) as an assistant at Oregon. Among other student athletes, he recruited Jillian Alleyne to Eugene, Ore. In 2013-14, Alleyne was honored with several national awards including Honorable Mention All-American from both the Associated Press and FullCourt.com. Alleyne set Pac-12 and program records for rebounds (494) and double-doubles (28) in a season as well as a single-game rebounding record (27). In his five years at Oregon, Duck players earned all-conference recognition 15 times and 22 times were honored for their academic excellence.

Prior to Oregon, Muscatell spent six years (2004-09) as head coach at Sacramento State, the final two with Craighead as an assistant on his staff. He coached seven student-athletes to All-Big Sky honors, including 2004-05 conference Newcomer of the Year Kim Sheehy. Off the court, 24 players received Big Sky all-academic accolades, culminating in 2009 with their second consecutive NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Award. Of 21 student-athletes that reached senior eligibility 20 graduated.

Prior to Sacramento State, he spent four years as an assistant coach at Oregon (1999-03) and among his recruits and players was Jamie Craighead. During his tenure the program won a Pac-10 championship (2000) while compiling 74-49 overall and 42-30 conference records. The team made three postseason appearances during that four-year stretch. They participated in the 2000 and 2001 NCAA Tournaments and were champions of the 2002 WNIT Tournament.

Muscatell was responsible for bringing in one of the nation's top recruiting classes in 2001. He has coached or recruited six former WNBA players along with current New York Liberty forward Cathrine Kraayeveld.

A graduate of Western Washington University with a bachelor's degree in physical education/psychology (1983) and a master's degree in administration (1990), Muscatell and his wife, Terri, have three children: Keely, Jessica and Drew.

# Jourdan uThlara 

Assistant Goach I Third Year I Sacramento State, 2009

In 2015-16, Jourdan Willard enters her third season as an assistant coach with the San José State women's basketball program.

Willard's primary responsibilities for the Spartans include coordinating all recruiting efforts, serving as the program's academic coordinator as well as on court player development and assisting with the offense. Among other responsibilities with the team, she also serves as the director of the Spartans' elite camps.

Willard came to the Spartans after spending five years working on the women's basketball staff at Sacramento State. She began her coaching career as an undergraduate assistant for the Hornets in 2008-09 and was elevated to the team's director of basketball operations the following season. In 2010-11 she was appointed as an assistant coach and held that position for the next three seasons primarily developing the program's perimeter players.

In 2012-13, Willard mentored one of the top players in the Big Sky Conference in Kylie Kuhns. Kuhns broke the school and Big Sky career rebounding records during the year while also leading the team in scoring. For her efforts, Kuhns earned All-Big Sky first-team honors.

Willard began her collegiate playing career at Nevada (2005 \& 2006). She then transfered to Sacramento State and played parts of two seasons (2007 \& 2008) before her career was cut short by injury.

Willard earned a degree in business/marketing from Sacramento State in 2009 and is currently working on a master's degree in education with an emphasis in gender equity from the same institution.

In her fourth season as a Spartan...holds San José State career record for blocked shots (163) and the single-season record (64)...third on the career rebounding list with 819... 327 rebounds in 2012-13 are a freshman record and are second on the single season list... 276 boards in 2013-14 are eighth in the San José State single-season list... 43 blocked shots in 2013-14 are good for ninth on the team's single-season list. . .could become the second player in San José State women's basketball history to reach 1,000 career points and 1,000 career rebounds.

## 2014-15:

Made 21 starts in 32 appearances. . .averaged 7.2 points, 6.8 rebounds and 1.8 blocks in 18 minutes per game. . . broke the program's career blocked shot record vs. Utah State (3/9). . .led the team and finished the season fourth in the MW in blocks... 16 rebounds versus Wyoming (2/14), a team-high, one of five double figure rebounding efforts. . .6.8 rebounds per game ranked second on the team and 12th in the MW... eighth in the league and led the team in offensive rebounds $(2.5 / \mathrm{g})$. . second on team in defensive rebounds $(4.1 / \mathrm{g})$ which ranked 12th in the league. . .moved from eighth to third place on the program's career rebounds list. . shot 44.3 percent, second best on the team. . .single-game high 18 points versus Air Force (1/7) . . . season-high three steals versus Utah State (3/9)had three double-doubles on the year versus UNLV (1/10), Fresno State (2/4) and Wyoming (2/14).

## 2013-14:

Appeared in 29 games and made 28 starts...averaged 8.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, 1.5 blocks and 1.3 assists in 23.7 minutes per game...led the team in defensive \& total rebounds as well as blocks...finished second in the MW in total rebounds and defensive boards ( $6.1 / \mathrm{g}$ )...first in offensive rebounds ( $3.4 / \mathrm{g}$ ) and third in blocks $(1.5 / \mathrm{g}) .$. six double doubles, second on the team and third in conference... 20 rebounds vs. Colorado State (3/4) was MW high...double digits rebounds in 13 games, second most in MW...reached the 500 -career points with 16 vs. Wyoming (1/18)...double digits in points 12 times with season-high 19 vs. Kansas City (12/21), where she also grabbed 18 rebounds...season-best six steals vs. Wyoming...became the fourth player in program history to reach the 100 -shots blocked plateau for her career.

## 2012-13:

Made 28 starts in 30 appearances...averaged 11.4 points, 10.9 rebounds, 2.1 blocks, 1.7 steals and 0.8 assists in 28.4 minutes per game...set the program single-season blocks (64) and blocks per game average (2.1) records...set the San Jose State freshman rebounding record (327)... 19 rebounds against Cal State Northridge (12/1) equaled an Event Center record as did eight steals against UTSA (12/31)...led the WAC in rebounds, blocked as well as offensive (3.93) and defensive rebounds (6.76) and ranked 18th in scoring...13 double-doubles, 10 which came in WAC play...season-high 24 points against Southern Utah (12/8)...blocked a single-game high six shots at San Francisco (12/15)...dished out a season-best three assists at New Mexico State (2/14)...finished the season ranked NO. 25 in the nation in rebounding and NO. 28 in blocks.

HIGH SCHOOL: A 2012 graduate of Inderkum High School (coach Phillip Hampton) in Sacramento, Calif.... a four-year letterwinner, her teams went a combined 86-26 overall, $38-4$ in Tri-County League play...averaged double-figure scoring and rebounding each of her four years...a three-time Tri-County League champion, earned League MVP honors as a freshman, junior and senior and was team MVP in each of those years...set team records for points, field goals, field throw, free throw percentage and rebounds in a career...
