LOU TULLY Head Coach

Lou Tully is in his 14th season as San Jose State University's women's water polo head coach. As the Spartans' only head coach, he has taken a program from infancy to perennial national power.

Playing in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF), the nation's most competitive conference, Tully has led the Spartans to top-10 national finishes in each of the last four years and nine overall.

The 2009 season was one of the team's best under extenuating circumstances. In August 2008, Tully was diagnosed with multiple myeloma – a cancer of the plasma cell. Following effective treatments and proper care, Tully coached team practices and was on the deck for most local matches. The Spartans won 20 matches for just the second time, defeated nine top-10 teams in the process, set a single-season school record scoring 377 goals and finished sixth in the final national coaches' poll. Tully was named the 2009 MPSF Coach of the Year.

His Spartans have earned 13 All-America honors and All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation recognition on 19 occasions. Since 2002, the Spartans also have earned 34 MPSF All-Academic Awards. His head coaching record is 181-194, not counting the 2009 season.

Tully joined San Jose State in 1996 after coaching the boys and girls teams at Leland High School in San Jose.



He began his coaching career in 1966 at Menlo College, where he coached water polo and swimming. Tully also coached at various local high schools, winning league championships at Mt. Pleasant High School in 1977 and at Leland in 1997. His top high school players included All-Americans Mike Castaneda, Steve Lynn, Norman Villanueva, Tres Threatt and Brent Vanderkam.

Besides coaching the Spartans, Tully has overseen and coached the San Jose Splash, a club team he started for local junior women's players.

An experienced official, Tully has officiated at every level, including the Junior Olympic Nationals, U. S. Senior Men's and Women's National Championships, community college state championships and NCAA Division I men's and women's matches.

The 1967 San Jose State graduate majored in physical education and played four seasons of collegiate water polo. He went on to earn his master's degree in physical education from San Jose State in 1972. Tully also holds a California Life Teaching Credential. He and his wife, Susan, have two adult children, Megan and Ian. The Tullys reside in San Jose.

Johnny Bega is in his fourth season as a member of the San Jose State women's water polo coaching staff.

BEGA

After two seasons as the assistant coach, he is in his second season as the associate head coach. A year ago, Bega did much of the coaching on the deck during San Jose State road matches.

He joined the Spartans after spending the 2006 season as the volunteer assistant at Santa Clara University.

His coaching background is a blend of NCAA Division I and an international experiences fore more than a decade. He was the USA National Zone 11 junior girls and youth boys head coach. From 1997 until 2001, he coached water polo in Japan, Hungary, Brazil, Greece and Holland.

From 1996 until 2002, he was the head coach of the Long Beach Shore Aquatics club team. The club won five gold, seven silver, and four bronze medals at the Junior Olympics.

As the high school level, his teams won the C.I.F. Boys Division I title three times when the assistant coach at Wilson High School in Long Beach, Calif. In 2001, he directed Marina High of Huntington Beach, Calif., to the Sunset League boys and girls titles.

The 1999 Long Beach State graduate majored in vocational education. Bega and his wife, Alex, reside in Menlo Park, Calif.

Doug Robinson is in his 11th season as the Spartans' volunteer assistant.

He has coached high school water polo at several area schools and is in his 19th year as a middle school alternative schools teacher for the Santa Clara County Office of Education.

Robinson played water polo at Live Oak High School in Morgan Hill, Calif., and continues to compete as a member of the Bay Area Masters' Water Polo Club.

The 1988 graduate of Cal Poly resides in Campbell.
