San José State-No. 1 Stanford Post-Match Notes

San José State is the first team this season (seven matches) to hold Stanford scoreless in the first half.

David Sweeney's eight saves are the highest by a Spartan freshman in the Simon Tobin era and the most since Oct. 14, 2012 (Emmanuel Espinosa, 10 vs. UNLV).

Sweeney's eight saves is SJSU's highest this season and the program's most since Oct. 18, 2018 (Alex Clewis, 11 at No. 15 Air Force).

SJSU had held the Cardinal scoreless for a stretch of 167 minutes prior to the team's 52nd minute goal tonight.

Stanford has been ranked No. 1 nationally in each of the team's last three meetings with San José State.

Midfielder Max Allen now leads the team with 16 shots heading into the start of conference play on Saturday.
