

2011-12 Season Notes

• San Jose State returns three starters and 11 players from the 2010-11 team that won 17 games, posted its first winning season since 1994 and was invited to the 2011 College Basketball Invitational.

• San Jose State seeks back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since the 1986 and 1987 seasons.

• San Jose State is coming off of back-toback single-season record free throw shooting. Last season's Spartans led the Western Athletic Conference with a school record 75.4 percent figure.

• The Spartans spent nine days in Italy playing three exhibition games. San Jose State was 2-1 in its 2011 summer tour.

• **Keith Shamburger** is San Jose State's top returning scorer at 12.4 points a game. He played more minutes (1,034) than ant other conference freshman last season.

• Forward **Wil Carter** was fifth in the WAC in rebounding at 8.0 per game. His 265 rebounds matched the seventh best single-season mark at San Jose State.

• For the first time since 1990, San Jose State was credited with more assists than turnovers in a season. The Spartans were one of four WAC teams in 2011 with a positive assist-to-turnover ratio.

GEORGE NESSMAN Head Coach 7th Season



George Nessman was appointed the San Jose State University men's basketball head coach in March 2005. As he heads into his seventh season, the program is positioned for near and long-term competitive and academic success.

The accomplishments are numerous in his first six seasons. Prior to Nessman's arrival, single-digit season win totals were the norm. The 2010-11 season is the current high-water mark. The Spartans posted their first winning record in 17 seasons, advanced to the semifinal round of the Western Athletic Conference Tournament for the first time, won more games in one season since 1981 and returned to post-season action for the first time since 1996.

San Jose State heads into 2011-12 with four straight seasons of 13 or more wins. The Spartans have not done that since 1985 through 1988.

The 2009-10 Spartans were the university's best playing at home in years with a 10-4 win-loss record. A seven-game home floor winning streak at The Event Center is the longest since the building opened in 1989 and the longest by a Spartan squad

since the 1981 team won 10 in a row on a home court. The 2010 team set school records for most points scored (2,289) and free throw accuracy (72.8 percent) in a season.

The 2008-09 team's five road victories were the most by a Spartan team in eight seasons, part of a 13-17 record and helped San Jose State finish in a sixth place tie in the conference standings - the best WAC finish since 2000.

The 2007-08 team was one of the nation's most improved based on win totals. The Spartans cap-



tured the season-opening First Shot Exempt Tournament hosted by Middle Tennessee State. San Jose State picked up road wins against Big Sky Conference champion Portland State and topped cross-county rival Santa Clara for the first time since 2003.

The Spartans were the most successful WAC team in 2007-08 in games decided by four points or less with a 9-4 record. Wins in The Event Center over Nevada and Utah State were part of San Jose State's first winning record



at home since 2000-01. A Western Athletic Conference Tournament victory for the first time since 2002 capped the best San Jose State season in seven years.

His second season, 2006-07, clearly was one with a youth movement in place. With the third youngest team in the country based on previous major college playing experience, his team doubled its conference win total from his first season at the helm.

Nessman is the first San Jose State men's basketball coach to successfully organize a summer overseas tour. The Spartans spent a week in the United Kingdom in 2007 and spent nine days in Italy in 2011.

The European trips are consistent with his philosophy of placing the program in the spotlight. The Spartans played at Duke, Texas Tech and Michigan State with Nessman facing coaching legends Mike Kryzyewski, Bob Knight and Tom Izzo, respectively.

In his first season, the Spartans ended long road losing streaks both in conference and non-conference action. Home attendance increased by 20 percent.

In his first six seasons at San Jose State, his student-athletes earned eight Western Athletic Conference All-Academic awards. Guard Adrian Oliver was a two-time first-team All-WAC pick and a 2011 Lute Olson All-American. Guard Justin Graham was named to the 2011 All-Defensive team and was an honorable mention All-WAC choice. Both are pursuing professional careers in Greece and the NBA's Developmental League, respectively.

Nessman took over the Spartans' position after one season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of California in 2004-05.

Coaching Staff



Entering his 24th season as a head coach, his teams at the high school, community college and major college levels have won 424 games, placed first in a league or conference nine times and won a state championship. He is 68-119 at San Jose State.

One of his most significant coaching accomplishments was directing Porterville College to a 33-4 win-loss record, a Central Valley Conference title and the school's first California Community College championship in 2000. Between January 2000 and February

2001, Porterville College won 40 consecutive games covering two seasons – one of the longest winning streaks in the California Community College system's history.

The 2000 California Community College Coach of the Year produced five 20-game winners in nine seasons and a 178-76 win-loss record. Before his arrival, Porterville had four consecutive losing seasons and did not have a plus-.500 winning percentage in 11 years. Nearly 90 percent of the sophomores he coached at Porterville and Bakersfield Colleges continued their college careers at four-year institutions.

In addition to his coaching duties at Porterville, he served the school as its director of athletics from 1995 through 2001 and was the academic advisor for athletics in 2001-02.

The 1981 University of California graduate started his coaching career at age 22 as the junior varsity and cross country coach at Salesian High School in Richmond, Calif.



After three seasons, he became the boys' varsity basketball assistant coach at Concord, California's De La Salle High School in 1984. Two seasons later, he took over the head coaching position at De La Salle and went on to produce a 155-48 win-loss record, five conference championships, one North Coast Section crown and four appearances in the Northern California Tournament of Champions. Two of his most prominent Spartans were future NBA players Jon and Brent Barry.

The 52-year-old native of Stamford, Conn., has two master's degrees – one in education from San Francisco State University in 1988 and a second in physical education and recreation from Saint Mary's College in 1993. Nessman is the only current coach in the Western Athletic Conference to earn two master's degrees. He and his wife, Nancy, have four children – Joshua, a student at San Jose State; Veronica, a University of California graduate; Peter and John.

"Our main goal for our team is to master our system so the system serves you as a player instead of you serving it. As you do that, the game slows down for you. It becomes easier for you. That's been a big emphasis for our guys. See and understand what you are looking at. That's a big teaching point." – Head coach George Nessman

BRENT DAVIS Assistant Coach





Brent Davis joined the San Jose State University staff as an assistant coach in May 2005. Davis came to the Spartans after serving as the head coach at Bakersfield College.

He earned his bachelor's degree majoring in social science from San Diego State University. Davis went on to earn a master's degree in physical education from Azusa Pacific University in 2002.

Davis began his coaching career in 1997 as an assistant coach at Redwood High School in Visalia, Calif. After one season, he moved to San

Diego Mesa College where he served as an assistant coach for three seasons.

The Tulare, Calif., native worked as an assistant coach for George Nessman at Bakersfield College during the 2003 and 2004 seasons before being named head coach.

He and his wife, Aimee, live in San Jose. Aimee completed her doctoral program in physical therapy at the University of the Pacific in October 2007. They are the parents of a daughter, Ellie.

TALVIN HESTER Assistant Coach



Talvin Hester joined the San Jose State University men's basketball coaching staff in June 2010 as an assistant coach.

Hester spent five seasons (2006 through 2010) on the Prairie View A&M staff and earned promotions to the position of associate head coach. He helped the Panthers to winning records in 2009 and 2010. Prior to 2009, Prairie View suffered five consecutive losing seasons, failed to win at least 10 games in each of those seasons and did not have back-to-back winning records for a 50-year span.



The Panthers emerged as one of the top defensive teams in the Southwest Athletic Conference (SWAC) and in the country. In 2010, Prairie View ranked in the top-15 nationally in field goal percentage defense (14th) and three-point field goal percentage defense (11th) last season.

Hester broke into coaching in 2002 at North Lake College in Irving, Texas. His wide-ranging coaching resume includes stops with the Texas Rim Rockers of the United States Basketball League as an assistant coaching intern and the Dallas Mustangs AAU team for one season. He was an assistant coach at Texas College in Tyler, Texas for the 2005 season before going to Prairie View A&M.

A 2003 Texas Wesleyan University graduate, he majored in interdisciplinary studies. Hester played his college basketball at Dallas Christian College.

The Toledo, Ohio native was born in July, 1968. His wife, Jamieka, is an elementary school teacher who specializes in teaching English as a second language. They have a daughter, Rhyan Nicole Hester.

Western Athletic Conference

Now in its 50th year of existence, the Western Athletic Conference continues to evolve and feature some of the nation's best intercollegiate competition. One thing that remains unchanged is the persistent nature of the schools in the WAC to advance their programs to contend at the top levels of the NCAA.

The WAC provides its student-athletes the chance to travel to scenic destinations and gain exposure in some of the nation's most diverse markets. In addition, the WAC's student-athletes work to achieve the highest levels of success with the academic support of their respective institutions.

The WAC has experienced tremendous success. The WAC has sent 35 teams to bowl games since 2001. The conference has sent teams to BCS bowl games in three of the last five seasons including Hawai'i's appearance in the 2008 Sugar Bowl.

In men's basketball, the WAC has sent

at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in 24 of the past 28 seasons. Every current school in the WAC has competed in the NCAA Tournament since 1990. In baseball, the WAC boasts two national champions since 2003.

In 2001, the WAC partnered with ESPN for coverage of football and basketball giving the conference national exposure. The WAC also officially added WAC.tv in 2006 to give fans streaming internet access to many of its postseason championships.

The first championship was held in November 1962, when Arizona won the men's cross country title and New Mexico followed with the first WAC football title. Arizona finished second in the NCAA College World Series and, less than three years later, Arizona State claimed the league's first NCAA title when the Sun Devils won the College World Series trophy. Fresno

State was the last WAC school to earn an NCAA team title when it won the College World Series in 2008.

Since 1962, several changes have occurred. UTEP and Colorado State became members in 1967, while Arizona and Arizona State withdrew on June 30, 1978. The WAC then added San Diego State (1978), Hawai'i (1979) and Air Force (1980). Before 1990, the WAC sponsored championships only in men's sports. However, a merger with the High Country Athletic Conference formed a single conference under one administrative structure, and the 1990-91 athletic year was the first in which both men and women competed under the WAC name.

Fresno State was added in 1992, and then in 1996, the women's programs from Air Force and Hawai'i along with six new schools (UNLV, Rice, San Jose State, SMU, TCU and Tulsa) came into the WAC. Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State,

UNLV, New Mexico, San Diego State, Utah and Wyoming withdrew on June 30, 1999. Nevada (2000), Boise State (2001) and Louisiana Tech (2001) were added while TCU withdrew following the 2000-01 season.

The current membership was established on July 1, 2005, when Idaho, New Mexico State and Utah State joined the

WAC after Rice, SMU, UTEP and Tulsa withdrew. For the 2012-13 season, Denver, Seattle, UT Arlington, UTSA and Texas State replaces withdrawing members Boise State (2011), Fresno State (2012), Hawai'i (2012) and Nevada (2012).

Presently, the WAC crowns team and individual champions in 19 sports - eight men's and 11 women's. For the men, there are championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field. Championships for women are held in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track and fi eld, outdoor track and field and volleyball.

In the 2010-11 academic year, San Jose State won WAC team championships in women's soccer and women's golf and an individual title in men's golf.



He has published eight books, more than 85 articles, and several chapters in various books. Additionally, he has presented at numerous national and international conferences on topics ranging from quality and energy to systems theory. Qayoumi is a senior member of the Institute of Electrical and electronic Engineers and has served as a Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award examiner and senior examiner.

For Qayoumi, he returns to San Jose State where he served as the Associate Vice-President for Administration from 1986 to 1995 and as an adjunct professor from 1983 through 1995.

During his six years at California State University, Northridge, Qayoumi achieved the rank of professor of engineering management. He was a tenured professor of engineering at Cal State East Bay.

The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Library, located on the main campus of San Jose State University opened in August 2003. A first-of-its-kind collaboration between a city and a university, the \$177-million, 475,000 squarefoot library provides a center for life-long learning. Students, faculty and the community have access to the information they will need for educational and personal growth throughout their lives.

The 10-floor library features:

- 3,623 seats
- 1,800 seats wired for the internet
- 400 public computers
- 135 databases of information
- 4 computer instruction laboratories
- 112 workstations available in the computer instruction labs
- 37 group-project rooms



Students can walk from class to the library for study sessions and research work without crossing a street.

The Event Center







The Event Center, located in the heart of the San Jose State University campus on the corner of Seventh and San Carlos streets, is the home of the Spartan basketball teams.

The \$36-million facility is comprised of The Event Center and an Aquatics Center. Students, faculty and staff members, alumni and the surrounding communities use the facility.

Groundbreaking occurred October 1, 1986. The Aquatics Center opened in May, 1988. Originally named the Recreation and Events Center, The Event Center opened in May, 1989. The first intercollegiate athletic contests in The Event Center were the Spartan basketball season openers on November 24, 1989.

The arena can seat 5,000 for athletics events and 5,600 for concerts. The arena is large enough to attract major performing artists, yet small enough to provide a personal experience for everyone. In December 2003, The Event Center playing surface was renamed Walt McPherson Court in honor of San Jose State University's most successful men's basketball coach. New locker facilities also were part of a comprehensive SJSU Athletics capital campaign project. In 17 seasons under McPherson from 1941 through 1960, the Spartans won 264 games, won three conference championships, played twice in the NAIA Tournament and made the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1951.

Also in the recreation area of The Event Center are 10 racquetball courts, a large weight room, a mini-gym, and an aerobics room.

The Aquatics Center swimming pool is home for the San Jose State University women's swimming team. The pool is one of the largest pools ever constructed in the state of California. The pool dimensions are 200 feet long and 75 feet wide.

Tom Bowen, Director of Athletics

om Bowen was named San Jose State University's director of intercollegiate athletics on December 20, 2004. Under his leadership, San Jose State is a viable Division I-A intercollegiate athletics program with proven athletics and academic successes and financial achievements to his credit.

"CULTURE OF CHAMPIONS"

At the core of Bowen's mission for San Jose State University athlet-

ics is building a Culture of Champions academically, athletically and in the community. To reach that end, the Notre Dame alum instilled a greater sense of purpose, commitment and execution by student-athletes, coaches, staff, alumni and friends.

The Spartans have balanced their budget or produced a modest surplus five straight years under his direction. He has re-invested these gains back into the 400-plus student-athlete population and the 16 intercollegiate Spartan teams.

tunities for the Spartans locally, regionally and nationally. First, there was the creation of Spartan Sports Properties in conjunction with national multi-media partner Learfield Communications and a 2011 agreement with IMG College Ticket Solutions to bring San Jose State athletics to the broadest spectator base possible.

Bowen continues

An integral member of the University's presidential staff, Bowen has a meaningful role in the University's \$200-million Capital Campaign Fund, "Acceleration." The department's increased vis-

ibility the last five years also coincided with significant donations coming to the University and to the Spartan Foundation the department's fund-raising component.

Since taking over, San Jose State produced the first Spartan teams to post three consecutive .500 or better records in the Western Athletic Conference football standings. In a longer span from the end of 2005 through 2008, San Jose State had one of the best home field records among the Football Bowl Subdivision schools in California. The 2006 Spartans capped their finest season in many years, posting a 9-4 overall record and capturing the New Mexico Bowl championship.

Athletics accomplishments add to his Culture of Champions go bevond football. In 2011, men's basketball ended a 17-year absence in post-season play; men's golf was in NCAA Regional action for the first time since 1997; women's soccer and women's golf repeated as a WAC champion; and women's water polo was fifth nationally in the final 2011 coaches' poll. Baseball, a 2009 WAC regular-season champion, posted another 35-win season in 2011. Women's gymnastics is entrenched as a NCAA Regional Championship qualifying team.

Spartans have earned All-America honors in football, women's golf, baseball and women's water polo. San Jose State had its second women's gymnastics individual NCAA Regional champion in three years in 2011. Freshmen from three sports (football, women's soccer and gymnastics) were named the 2011 WAC Freshman of the Year. Gymnast Shanice Howard was named the 2011 Arthur Ashe Jr., Sports Scholar Award winner by Diverse Issues in Higher Education. Twenty more studentathletes were honored nationally and more than 100 at the conference level for academic achievements in 2010-11.

Bowen's vision for student-athlete success and excellence led to the creation of a Student Success Services component. Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores, as measured by the NCAA, continue rising under his watch. San Jose State's seven Public Recognition awards ranks at the top among current WAC members.

Since his arrival, coaches in women's soccer, baseball, women's golf, water polo and softball have received conference Coach of the Year recognition.

In 2008, the most recent national study by Texas A&M University on behalf of the NCAA, San Jose State was named as one of 12 Division I universities cited for Overall Excellence in Diversity.

A VALUED PROFESSIONAL

Bowen's proven administrative and managerial record at San Jose State has resulted in meaningful national appointments in college athletics. He is the WAC representative on the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) Oversight Committee Athletics Directors Advisory Group. In 2011, he completed a term as one of eight FBS directors of athletics serving on the 24-member NCAA Division I Football Issues Committee. Both football appointments were a first for a San Jose State director of athletics.

At the conference level, the San Jose State athletics director helped negotiate the competitive and financial terms involving the departure of three conference members in June 2012.

He was the Tournament Director for the 2010 NCAA Men's Basketball Division I Championship first and second rounds games played in San Jose. In 2009, Bowen was one of 12 named to serve as a mentor to aspiring women and ethnic minority athletics administrators in the NCAA Fellows Leadership Program.

Bowen came to San Jose State after serving three years as the Director of Community Affairs and the executive director of the 49ers Foundation for the San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League. He directed all of the team's fund-raising activities and was responsible for alumni and current player participation in the community.

His Division I experience at the collegiate level includes athletics administration positions at the University of California and Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif. As an assistant and associate director of athletics at the University of California from July 2000 through September 2002, he was responsible for athletics fund-raising. Bowen was credited with developing the first comprehensive planned giving program for the Golden Bears.

At Saint Mary's College, he was the Director of Foundations and Corporate Relations from May 1995 to January 1997 before being appointed to an associate director of athletics position by the president of the college. From January 1997 through April 2000, he managed the athletics department's budget, directed a corporate sponsorship program and interacted with the academic senate, faculty and university personnel on student-athlete issues. His first professional leadership appointment in athletics was at De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. From 1987 through 1995, he held the positions of athletics director and assistant football coach.

EDUCATION & COMMUNITY

The 1983 graduate of the University of Notre Dame majored in theology/sociology and spent six years studying for the priesthood with the Holy Cross Fathers. Bowen went on to earn a master's degree in administration/education from the University of San Francisco in 1990.

Active throughout the entire Bay Area, he has been named to the San Jose Mercury News' Top-25 Most Powerful Sports Figures in the Bay Area. He serves on the board of the San Jose Sports Authority. He is an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco School of Sports Management and at San Jose State University's Department of Kinesiology where he teaches sports management classes. Bowen is a frequent speaker and panelist at national workshops focusing on intercollegiate athletics and for local major businesses on the topics of leadership, management and motivation.



Under Bowen's leadership, basketball is on the rise at San Jose State University.

He is a Level 2 certified member of the College Athletic Business Management Association (CABMA) and has memberships in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and the National Society of Fund Raising Executives.

The Denver, Colo., native and his wife, Mia, are the parents of three children: sons, Andrew and Peter, and, daughter, McKenna.

John Poch Senior Associate Athletics Director/ Deputy Director of Athletics



ohn Poch returned to San Jose State University in January 2009 as a Senior Associate Athletics Director/Deputy Director of Athletics. His duties include managing the tepartment's external relations components of fund raising and community relations and serving as the sports supervisor for baseball and women's tennis. As the driving force, the Spartan Foundation raised a record \$1.7-million during its 2011 annual fund-raising drive for student-athlete scholarships.

Previously, Poch served as the Tournament Director of the 1999 and 2000 NCAA Women's College Cup hosted by San Jose State University and was an assistant coach for the Spartans' women's soccer team from 1995 to 2000. Under his direction, the 1999 College Cup attracted more than 28,000 spectators for two semifinal contests and the championship match. The 14,410 in attendance for the championship game remains the top attendance figure for a Women's College Cup contest.

As a San Jose State assistant coach, he was on the ground floor of the new Spartan program. San Jose State posted a 53-44-3 overall win-loss record.

Poch is a successful youth soccer coach with United States Soccer Federation and National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) national licenses. He coached the San Jose Pioneer High School boys' teams to three Central Coast Section championships and was named the National Coach of the Year in 2001 by the NSCAA for the Youth Girls Competitive category.

From 2000 through 2008, he was the executive director of the After-School All-Stars of Greater San Jose - a program targeting at-risk youths. In his eight years, After-School All-Stars grew from a two-person staff with a \$275,000 annual operating budget to a full-time staff of 36 and 230 part-time employees and a \$3.9-million budget comprised largely of dollars raised through his fundraising acumen and direction. More than 3,000 students from 50-plus elementary and middle schools in San Jose were After-School All-Stars beneficiaries.

In 2011, Poch completed course work in the Sports Management Institute – a collaboration of the Universities of Southern California, Texas, Michigan, Notre Dame and North Carolina. The Sports Management Institute provides a specialized executive management program for sports professionals.

He is a member of NACDA (National Association of College Directors of Athletics), NAADD (National Association of Athletic Development Directors) and AFP (Association of Fundraising Professionals) and serves on the board of directors for After-School All-Stars.

The 2001 San Jose State University graduate majored in kinesiology. As a student-athlete, he played football at West Valley College before enrolling at San Jose State.

John and his wife, Debora, a 1988 San Jose University graduate, are the parents of one daughter, Nicole. Marie Tuite Senior Associate Athletics Director/ Chief Operating Officer



arie Tuite joined the San Jose State University athletics administrative team in an executive capacity in June 2010 as the Senior Associate Athletics Director/Chief Operating Officer.

At San Jose State, Tuite oversees all of the Spartans' internal components and affairs. She manages the daily operations of the department, has direct supervision of student services, compliance and business affairs and serves as sports supervisor for men's and women's basketball, women's swimming and diving, women's water polo.

Her professional career includes executive positions at Pacific-12 Conference universities and the NCAA. She came to the Spartans from Seattle University where she was a Special Assistant to the Athletics Director. Tuite assisted the University's transition to NCAA Division I athletics status and provided administrative leadership to the men's basketball program successfully negotiating a facility lease of the 17,000-seat Key Arena and a local radio contract with an ESPN broadcast affiliate.

Her first athletics administrative position was at Alma (Mich.) College in 1981 as the Director of Athletic Programs and Activities for an 18-sport intercollegiate program. She joined the University of California women's athletics staff in 1984 as an assistant athletics director.

Tuite then relocated to the NCAA office in the Kansas City area and served as an Assistant Director of Championships from 1989 to 1994. She assisted the organization's sport committees in the administration of the National Collegiate Championships program and coordinated the Association's corporate partner, merchandising, promotional, and official ball programs for NCAA championships.

She returned to a campus setting in 1994 as a senior associate athletics director at the University of Washington. Her duties included overseeing the process and appointment of new head coaches, directing day-to-day operations including fiscal responsibility and leadership opportunities for numerous sports, and initiating and implementing "keys to success" for priority Husky sports programs.

A two-sport student-athlete and graduate of Central Michigan University, she was inducted into the university's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1990 as just the third female inductee. Tuite played field hockey and was a star basketball player who majored in physical education. She earned her master's degree from her alma mater in athletic administration.

Tuite is a member of NACDA (National Association of College Directors of Athletics), NACWAA (National Association of Collegiate Women's Athletics Administrators) and the Women's Sports Foundation.

I am just happy to be at a point in life that I can do something like this....My family and I are proud to create this legacy that will always serve as a reminder of how much San Jose State means to me."


"San Jose State has been a stepping stone that has provided me an education, a degree and of course, the tools I needed to be successful in the NFL." – Jeff Garcia

Garcia was a quarterback on the 1991, 1992 and 1993 San Jose State teams. As a sophomore, he was third nationally in passing efficiency. He led San Jose State to its first win in school history over a Big Ten Conference team, the University of Minnesota, and went on to receive honorable mention All-America recognition in 1992. The school record holder for total offense with 7,274 yards was named the Outstanding Offensive Player at the 1994 East-West Shrine All-Star Game in Palo Alto, Calif.

Professionally, he played five seasons (1994-1998) for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League, was a four-time all-star and led the team to the 1998 Grey Cup championship. Garcia joined the San Francisco 49ers in 1999 and took the team to playoff appearances in 2001 and 2002. He continued his NFL career with the Cleveland Browns (2004), Detroit Lions (2005), Philadelphia Eagles (2006, 2009), the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2007-08), and the Houston Texans (2011). Garcia earned his undergraduate degree as a business administration major from San Jose State University through the National Football League's Continuing Education Program.






The men's and women's golf teams play at outstanding courses within a 30-mile radius.

Notes to the Media

Credential Requests: Press table, photo, and scouting credential requests should be directed to: Lawrence Fan, Athletics Media Relations Director. Credentials are limited to working press filing game stories, accredited representatives of the media and personnel assigned by San Jose State University.

Directions to The Event Center: Walt McPherson Court in The Event Center is located on the corner of Seventh and San Carlos streets. Easiest freeway access is Interstate 280. Take the Seventh street exit and follow the signs to San Jose State University.

Media Parking: Parking is available at the San Jose State University Seventh Street garage. Arrive at least an hour before tipoff to avoid congestion. The garage parking fee is \$8.00.

Television crew members involved with play-by-play telecasts should park the production truck at the Center's loading dock a minimum of five hours before tipoff. Play-by-play television contractual arrangements must be made with the sports information office in advance.

Telephones: For commercial radio stations, ISDN and/or regular dial lines are available at a courtside location. When placing a long-distance call from Walt McPherson Court, dial "7" and call "COLLECT.

Statistics & Services: Complete game statistics and play-by-play accounts will be distributed as soon as they become available. FAX service is available.

Photographers: The photography areas at The Event Center are limited to the baseline areas at each end of the floor. No standing during live-ball situations. Courtside work stations are available with advance notice.

Strobe lights: Photographers interested in using strobe lights must secure joint permission from The Event Center and the sports information office. Photographers are not allowed in the catwalks above the court during the game.

Scouts: Passes are issued to scouts in accordance with conference and NCAA guidelines. Advance notice is appreciated.

Press Room Food Service: Typically, soft drinks and light foods are available in the media work room kitchen. Media members can purchase solid food from one of The Event Center's concession stands located on the mezzanine level.


