San José State-Utah State Postgame Notes

San José State improved to 6-3 with Wednesday's victory, the program's best record through nine games in 15 years (also started 6-3 in 2004-05).

Utah State's 21 first half points was the lowest for a San José State opponent this season.

The 21 points marks the fewest allowed by SJSU in the first half of a road game since January 30, 2016 (19 at Air Force).

The 76-61 win marked the program's second straight victory over Utah State and its sixth in the last nine meetings between the two teams.

The Spartans now have two road victories on the 2019-20 campaign. This marks the quickest the program has reached multiple road wins since the 2004-05 team won three in its first seven games (at UC Irvine, at San Francisco, at New Mexico State).

Wednesday's victory gives SJSU the program's fifth win in its last six conference openers.

SJSU scored the game's first 14 points and did not surrender a basket in the contest's first six and a half minutes.

San José State had seven players score in the first nine minutes of Wednesday's contest.

The Spartans did not allow a field goal in the final 4:45 of the game.

Sophomore Ayzhiana Basallo reached the 20-point plateau for the ninth time in nine games. The point guard leads the conference with 22.9 points per game.

San José State has now won five of its last six games.
