



Expect The Unexpected



San José State freshman keeper Paige Simoneau was on the bench for 118 minutes before she became the hero who denied two New Mexico PKs and sent the Spartans to the championship match of the 2015 Mountain West Tournament.

Her performance after sitting on the bench for that long was amazing enough. But adding to the moment was that the freshman came on to replace the Spartans' senior captain and Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Zoe Makrigiannis. The decision by head coach Lauren Hanson, led to a seemingly once-in-a-lifetime type victory.

That is, until two nights later when the exact same scenario played out again in the championship match against host and No. 1-seed San Diego State. Simoneau came through yet again. She came off the bench having not played in the entire match, and stopped SDSU's second PK attempt. After the Aztecs' third try went off the left post, it came down to another Spartan freshman, Darriell Franklin, who put her shot in the back of the sending SJSU to its first NCAA Tournament since 2000.

Following the celebrations on the field, Simoneau, who had appeared in just five matches throughout the year, was named the Tournament's most valuable player. Hanson said afterward that she knew Simoneau would come in for penalty kicks prior to the beginning of the championship.

Heading into her third season as the San José State University head women's soccer coach, Lauren Hanson has the program on the steepest ascent in its 20-year history.

Hanson, the 2015 Mountain West (MW) Coach of the Year, will lead San José State on its MW title defense in fall of 2016. The title, won against San Diego State at the SDSU Sports Deck, was the first MW championship for any sport at SJSU since aligning with the conference in 2013.

Hanson, the winner of NCAA Women's College Cup championships as a coach and player, was made the sixth head women's soccer coach at San José State University on December 18, 2013. She has already given the Spartans a taste of the NCAA tournament, which happened for just the second time in program history in 2015.

The Spartans exceeded the seventh-place MW preseason prediction by far, finishing 8-3-0 in conference play and going all the way to the NCAA Tournament. Eight wins in conference play are the most in program history, one of many records broken during the team's run in 2015.

Hanson coached five players in 2015 to All-MW honors including senior keeper Zoe Makrigiannis, who was named the defensive player of the year.

The Spartans finished 3-14-1 overall the year prior to Hanson and her staff's arrival. In the first year under Hanson's direction, the team had a marked improvement in a number of statistical categories that led to an 8-8-3 overall record. That year, the Spartans doubled their offensive output, scoring 22 goals after just 10 went into the net in 2013. The defense also saw a huge lift, allowing 18 goals when the year before it gave up 33.

In 2015, the Spartans had the number one defense in the MW, with a 0.56 goals against average and a league-best seven shutouts.

Hanson won both of her NCAA Women's Cup championships with the University of Portland. In 2005, she was an assistant coach with the Pilots and in 2002, was the team captain of Portland's championship team. Her college coaching career began at her alma mater in 2004.

In 2005, Portland completed an undefeated season (23-0-2) en route to its second NCAA Women's College Cup championship. In 2006, Hanson was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) West Region Assistant Coach of the Year. Portland earned a berth to the NCAA Women's College Cup in four of her five seasons on the Pilots' staff.

As the University of Oregon's Associate Head Coach during the 2009 through 2011 seasons, she coached the Ducks' backline and was the program's recruiting coordinator.

As Lauren Orlando, Hanson enjoyed an illustrious playing career as a four-year centerback for Portland. She was a member of three Pilot teams to play in the NCAA Women's College Cup. The 2000 and 2001 clubs reached the semifinals, and she captained the 2002 Pilots to the program's first NCAA Women's College Cup championship.

Hanson also has national team playing experience. She was a member of the United States Women's National Team in 2001 and competed on the U-18 and U-21 U.S. women's national teams. Hanson played one season professionally after she was the ninth-overall selection in the 2003 Women's United Soccer Association (WUSA) draft by the New York Power.

A native of Lake Forest, Calif., Hanson graduated from Portland in 2003 with her Bachelor of Arts degree. She and her husband, Travis, have two children, Cole and Taylor.

NCAA championship-level experience as a player and a coach is on the way to San Jose in the form of new women's soccer assistant coach Rob Baarts. Spartans' head coach Lauren Hanson made the announcement that the two will reunite to guide the reigning Mountain West champions beginning with the 2016 season.

Baarts comes to San José State after 12 seasons as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's soccer programs at the University of Portland. Baarts and Hanson assisted the Pilot women's team to a 23-0-2 regular season record and a national championship in 2005.

In 2009, Baarts guided both the men's and women's programs into the postseason, and the women's program advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the fourth consecutive year.

As an assistant, Baarts was responsible for all recruiting activities, opponent preparation and team travel. In addition, the Portland men's and women's soccer programs have had a 96 percent graduation rate in the last seven years under Baarts' academic progress direction. More than a dozen Pilots which played under Baarts have gone on to play professional soccer.

Baarts was no stranger to the postseason during Portland's successive runs to the NCAA Men's Tournament. He captained the 1988 Pilots to a perfect regular season, and the program's first-ever NCAA semifinal appearance. The four-year starter (1987-90) still ranks second all-time in the program's history for his 13 career game-winning goals.

Baarts played professional indoor soccer for 10 years, spending eight seasons (1992-99) with the Portland Pride and Pythons.

His coaching career began at the youth level with the Portland City United. Baarts coached the boys varsity team at Sunset High School in Beaverton, Ore., from 1991-2003. He was the league's coach of the year back-to-back seasons in 2001-02.

Baarts and his wife Jen are the parents of four sons Tyler, Carter, Tanner and Jaxson, and one daughter, Nina.



ADRIANNE FASS

Assistant Coach
Second Season

Adrienne Fass was appointed as an assistant coach for San José State University women's soccer in July of 2015, a year after she joined the Spartans as a volunteer assistant in summer of 2014.

Entering her third season at SJSU, Fass has helped guide the Spartans to one of the biggest two-year turnarounds in NCAA Division I soccer. Under her assistance alongside the 2015 Mountain West Head Coach of the Year, Lauren Hanson, the Spartans finished 8-3-1 in league play, won the Mountain West Tournament and appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2000.

Fass is responsible for player instruction, opponent scouting and match preparation. She coordinates team travel, and is also dedicated to assisting the team's community relations outreach.

Fass came to the Spartans after serving as an assistant coach at Foothill College for five seasons. During that time, the Rams won Coast Conference championships in 2009, 2010 and 2012. The 2013 team advanced to the California Community College Final Four and finished ranked 17th nationally for two-year institutions.

In her first season with the staff Fass helped lead the Spartans to an 8-8-3 overall record and 5-5-1 in Mountain West play. The .500 record came one year after the team finished 3-14-1 and 2-7-1 in conference play. The team doubled its offensive output in 2014, scoring 22 goals after just 10 went into the net in 2013. The defense also saw a huge lift, allowing 18 goals when the year before it gave up 33.

The 1999 graduate of the University of Florida majored in exercise and sports science. As a college player, she played on Gators teams that compiled a combined record of 82-11-3 during the 1995 through 1998 seasons, made three NCAA Tournament appearances and won the NCAA Championship her senior season in 1998.

Fass earned United States Soccer Federation (USSF) Class C, B and A coaching licenses and a National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Director of Coaching License. She is a past recipient of the USSF's Robert McNulty Award given to the coach who best exemplifies performance, attitude and devotion when earning the Federation's Class C coaching license.

Adrienne and her husband Jason are parents to two daughters, Addy and Harper.

Postseason History



The San José State women's soccer team advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in program history in 2015. Like the first appearance in 2000, the Spartans took on perennial NCAA women's soccer giant Stanford. Despite a 2-0 loss to The No. 1-seeded Cardinal, The Spartans held their heads high on the way out of Cagan Stadium after a historic season had officially come to a close for the Mountain West Tournament champions.



Spartan fans were at a loss for words after witnessing SJSU advance out of the Mountain West Tournament semifinal in heart-stopping fashion. The photo above of keeper Paige Simoneau swarmed by teammates conveys the essence of the match perfectly. Simoneau's surprise appearance where she stopped two New Mexico penalty kicks after sitting 118 minutes on the bench goes down as one of the greatest stories in San José State women's soccer history. Simoneau went on to stop another PK in the championship match. After the Spartans were crowned champion, she was named the tournament's most valuable player.



Darriell Franklin was the clutch player for San José State all season long, and things were no different in the 2015 Mountain West Championship. She netted the final PK for the Spartans in the semifinal match against New Mexico. Then, drilled another PK in the final minute of regulation to send the championship match into overtime. But the freshman wasn't done yet as she put the dagger in host San Diego State with yet another penalty kick, this time to clinch the Mountain West title and the program's second NCAA Tournament berth since its inception in 1996.






