La Verne-San José State Postgame Notes

The 128 points scored by San José State sets a program record for scoring in a single game. The previous high of 119 was set in a 119-76 victory over Columbia on Nov. 16, 2014.

The 66-point win breaks a record for margin of victory that has stood since 1979. The previous mark of 65 was set on Jan. 6, 1979 (96-31 vs. Cal Poly).

SJSU's 44 made field goals matches the school record for makes in a single game, a mark that has stood since Jan. 4, 1979 (44 vs. Arizona).

128 points is the second-most scored by a Division I team this season (132 for Coastal Carolina vs. Wesleyan).

The Spartans had a trio of players finish the afternoon with double-doubles. They were paced by a 19-point, 13-rebound performance for forward Tyra Whitehead. Point guard Danae Marquez added 15 points and 12 assists off the bench while sophomore Raziya Potter totaled 13 points and 10 assists herself.

Freshmen Kalina Obrey and Miyah Lewis-Hampton each scored their first-career points in the victory.

San José State is now 6-0 at home this season and has won seven of its last eight games.

The win improves the team's record to 8-3, marking the first time the program has been five games above .500 since the 2004-05 season.
