

OSCAR CRESPO Head Coach

San Jose State head coach Oscar Crespo begins his third season as head coach at his alma mater. A 1990 graduate, Crespo was named program's sixth head coach in March of 2007.

In two seasons, Crespo has led the Spartans to the semifinal match of the WAC Tournament in each year. Crespo recorded his first collegiate win with a 3-0 sweep of Grambling State on August 24, 2007.

The Spartans won two tournaments during Crespo's first season - ASU/Bancorp South Classic and the UVU/La Quinta Inn & Suites Invitational. San Jose State defeated Pacific-10 foe Arizona State, 3-1. The team also got a jolt in its final non-conference match of the year as a 5.6 earthquake shook Spartan Gym in game two against Pacific on October 30, forcing the cancellation of the match.

In two years, six Spartan players have received All-WAC recognition, while seven were named to the Academic All-WAC team.

Rooted in fundamentals, Crespo believes in the well-rounded student-athlete. He wants each member of his team to be a successful student in the classroom and a solid athlete on the court.

Prior to accepting the Spartan position, Crespo spent seven years as a member of the University of Nevada volleyball coaching staff. From 2000-01, he was the Wolf Pack's assistant head coach before being promoted to associate head coach prior to the start of the 2002 season.

His primary areas of focus at Nevada were athlete training and development; opponent scouting and evaluation; recruiting; setter development; drill development and individual and team skill evaluation; development of defensive and offensive systems, and statistical analysis of individual and team play.

His recruiting expertise helped the Pack sign the 23rd-ranked volleyball recruiting class for 2006 according to PrepVolleyball.com. Crespo was instrumental in Nevada's recent success of participating in four of the last five NCAA Tournaments.

A member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, USA Volleyball, and the Northern California Volleyball Association, Crespo is an accomplished coach with international experience. He spent the spring of 2002 coaching a USA College All-Star team in France, Holland and Belgium.

In the spring of 2007, Crespo was an assistant coach for the USA Volleyball Federation/Bring It Promotions (Senior) Select Team.

The USA/BIP team, which included former Spartans Jennifer Senftleben and Jessie Shull, traveled to Argentina to play the Argentinean National team as well as top club teams around Buenos Aires.

Crespo's vast coaching experience also includes stints at the University of California (1995-98), Saint Mary's College (1993-94) and De Anza College.

Crespo received a bachelor's degree in art history from San Jose State and was a member of the men's club volleyball team. Crespo and his wife, Lisa Ice-Crespo, a three-time All-American volleyball player at San Jose State, reside in Los Gatos with their three children: Ryan, Rachel and Karly Nicole.





Jeanine Haldi Assistant Coach

Former San Jose State player Jeanine Haldi begins her fourth season as an assistant coach on the Spartan volleyball staff.

Haldi serves as the recruiting coordinator for the Spartans. Her other duties include travel, summer camps, team compliance and team defense.

Haldi played for San Jose State from 1999 to 2002 and finished her four-year career with 982 digs, ranking sixth all-time. Considered the first libero in Spartan history as the position was instituted her senior year, Haldi led the 2002 team with 370 digs. She played in two NCAA Tournaments (2000 and 2001) including the 2001 upset of Santa Clara when she had eight block assists in the win.

During the 2005-06 school year, Haldi worked in the San Jose State Athletics Department as a compliance assistant while completing her master's degree at the University of San Francisco. In 2005, she worked in the University of California Athletics Department as a sponsorship intern.

Haldi has coached at the club level for eight years, serving as a club director.

Prior to her appointment at San Jose State, Haldi coached at the high school and junior college levels. Her 2003 high school team reached the NorCal final four.

A three-time Scholar-Athlete, Haldi graduated from San Jose State in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and sport management. She received her master's degree from the University of San Francisco in May 2006.



Annie Feller
Assistant Coach

Annie Feller begins her second season as a member of the Spartan coaching staff after returning to collegiate coaching last season.

Feller was the head coach at Santa Clara from 1993-98, where she had four winning seasons and made three NCAA tournament appearances. She recorded two 20-win seasons (1993, 22; 1998, 20). Her 1993 team won the West Coast Conference title.

After serving as an assistant coach for three seasons (1990-92), Feller took over the head coaching duties for the 1993 season. Her first team posted a then-school record regular season wins, won its second straight WCC title and earned a spot in AVCA/Tachikara Top 25 poll for the first time in school history.

Prior to her Santa Clara stint, Feller was an assistant coach at Hawaii as a member of Dave Shoji's coaching staff. She helped Hawaii to a 1988 national runners-up finish.

An All-American at UC Riverside, Feller led her team to the 1986 NCAA Division II National Championship and was Reebok's Division II Player of the Year. A three-time CCAA first team pick, she was a 1986 Broderick Award nominee and UC Riverside's Female Athlete of the Year twice. Feller was a 1993 inductee into the UC Riverside Hall of Fame.

Feller graduated from UC Riverside in 1987 with a bachelor of arts degree in psychology. She received a master of arts degree in education administration from Santa Clara in 1994.

Feller resides in Saratoga with her husband Steve and their children Kevin and Adam.


